ABSTRACT

This report presents information on the residence and migration of first-time freshmen for the State of Hawaii for the Fall 1996 semester. The information presented is for first-time freshmen only. The first-time freshmen population discussed in this report is divided into three groups: (1) those residents of Hawaii who chose to main in the State to attend either a University of Hawaii (UH) campus or private degree-granting institution; (2) those Hawaii residents who chose to leave the State to enroll in institutions on the U.S. mainland; and (3) those first-time freshmen who came to Hawaii from other states or from foreign countries. Information is further broken down by type of institution attended: public versus private and four-year versus two-year. Findings show that UH seems to be the first choice for most Hawaii-resident first-time freshmen. The vast majority of students in-migrating to Hawaii attend private rather than public UH institutions. In contrast, slightly more than half of out-migrating students attended private institutions. The percentage of Hawaii resident first-time freshmen remaining in the state and proportion of first-time freshmen enrolled in the state who are Hawaii residents have declined since 1992. Overall, 21.9% more students left Hawaii than entered. Appendices include lists of U.S. mainland institutions with ten or more Hawaii resident first-time freshmen enrolled in Fall 1996, as well as lists of the 50 states with the number of Hawaii-resident first-time freshmen enrolled in each state. RESIDENCE AND MIGRATION OF FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN THE STATE OF HAWAII, FALL 1996

Introduction and Sources

This report presents information on the residence and migration of first-time freshmen for the State of Hawai'i for the Fall 1996 semester. Two sources have been used: the National Center for Education Statistics report, entitled: "Residence and Migration of First-Time Freshmen Enrolled in Degree-Granting Institutions: Fall 1996;" and the NCES Fall 1996 Integrated Post-Secondary Education Data System (IPEDS) enrollment survey file EF96_C: "Fall enrollments of first-time freshman by residence." The information presented here is for first-time freshmen only.

Description of the Tables

The first-time freshmen population discussed in this report may be divided into three groups: those residents of Hawai'i who chose to remain in the State and attend either a UH campus or a private degree-granting institution; those Hawai'i residents who chose to leave the State to enroll in institutions on the U.S. mainland; and those first-time freshmen who came to Hawai'i from other states or from foreign countries. The report presents information on Fall 1996 first-time freshmen as a whole as well as recent high school graduates. Recent high school graduates are those first-time freshmen who enter college in the fall semester immediately following graduation from high school. (This group of students comprises the traditional core of first-time freshmen.) Information is further broken down by type of institution attended: public versus private and four-year versus two-year.

Table 1 summarizes information on Fall 1996 first-time freshmen who were residents of the State of Hawai'i, and includes both students who chose to remain in Hawai'i as well as those who attended institutions on the U.S. mainland. (Note that the IPEDS survey includes only U.S. institutions of higher education – Hawai'i residents attending foreign institutions are not included.) Table 2 provides information on first-time freshmen who attended Hawai'i degree-granting institutions, and includes both residents who chose to remain in Hawai'i as well as non-residents who came to Hawai'i from the U.S. mainland or from foreign countries. Table 3 summarizes the migration of first-time freshmen for the State, and includes enrollment by institution for those students, both resident and non-resident, entering Hawai'i colleges. Table 4 provides "going rates" for the recent high school graduate population. These going rates show the percentage of the total number of June 1996 Hawai'i high school graduates who entered U.S. institutions of higher education in the Fall 1996 semester. Tables 5 and 6 provide historical information on Hawai'i resident first-time freshmen and first-time freshmen enrolled in the State, respectively. (Note that the NCES migration survey is conducted every two years; three surveys have been completed since inception.) Appendix A lists U.S. mainland institutions with ten or more Hawai'i resident first-time freshmen enrolled in Fall 1996. Appendix B lists the 50 states with the number of Hawai'i resident first-time freshmen enrolled in each state.

Migration of First-Time Freshmen - Highlights

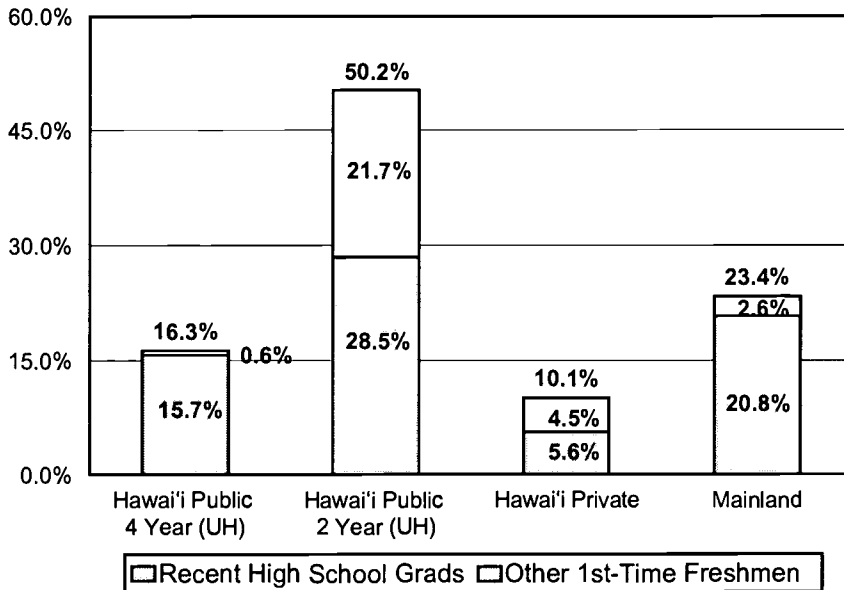
- In Fall 1996, the population of Hawai'i resident first-time freshmen totaled 9,936 (Table 1). Of these, 7,611 (76.6%) chose to remain in Hawai'i, while 2,325 (23.4%) chose to attend college on the U.S. mainland (Figure 1). Of the total, two-thirds (66.5%) chose to enroll in the UH system.
- In Fall 1996, first-time freshmen enrolled in Hawai'i degree-granting institutions totaled 9,519 (Table 2). Of these, 7,611 (80.0%) were Hawai'i residents while 1,908 (20.0%) were from the U.S. mainland or foreign countries.
- The out-migration rate for Hawai'i in Fall 1996 of 23.4% was greater than the in-migration rate of 20.0%. However, both rates were higher than the national average of 17.1%. In sum, 417 more students left Hawai'i than entered.
- The out-migrating Hawai'i residents were overwhelmingly recent high school graduates (Hawai'i: 89.0%, U.S.: 80.1%). Most (50.9%) enrolled in private four-year institutions (Table 3 and Figure 3). In contrast, only 58.2% of in-migrating students were recent high school graduates.
- The vast majority (86.4%) of first-time freshmen in-migrating to Hawai'i attended private rather than public (UH) institutions (Table 3 and Figure 4). In comparison, the U.S. rate for migration to an out-of-state private college was 52.7%.
- The State of Hawai'i going rate of recent high school graduates into all U.S. degree-granting institutions in Fall 1996 was 56.5% (Table 4 and Figure 2). The going rate for Hawai'i public institutions (UH) was 35.2%, while the going rate for Hawai'i private institutions was 4.5%. The going rate of Hawai'i recent high school graduates into mainland institutions was 16.8%.
- Since Fall 1992, the proportion of resident first-time freshmen remaining in Hawai'i has declined from 81.6% to 76.6% (Table 5 and Figure 5). The proportion of first-time freshmen enrolled in the State who are residents has declined from 83.4% to 80.0% (Table 6 and Figure 6).

Conclusion

The University of Hawai'i seems to be the first choice of most Hawai'i resident first-time freshmen. Two-thirds (66.5%) of the Fall 1996 resident first-time freshmen chose to enroll in the UH system. Both the in-migration and out-migration rates for Hawai'i were slightly higher than the comparable national rates. However, 21.9% more students left Hawai'i than entered. The vast majority of students in-migrating to Hawai'i attended private rather than public (UH) institutions. In contrast, slightly more than half of out-migrating students attended private institutions. The percentage of Hawai'i resident first-time freshmen remaining in the State, although still very high, has declined since 1992. The proportion of first-time freshmen enrolled in the State who are Hawai'i residents has also declined.

Residence and Migration of First-Time Freshmen, Fall 1996

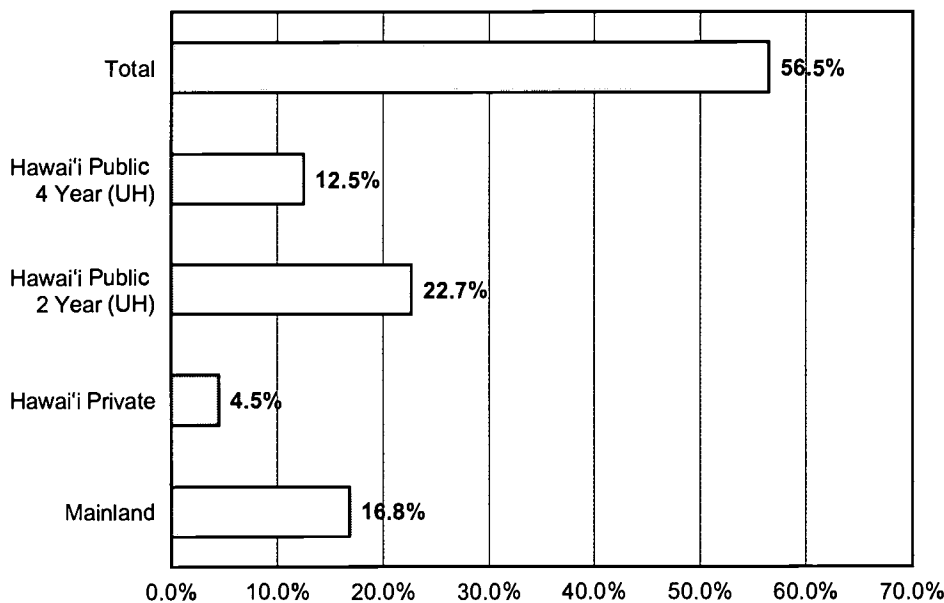

High School Graduates

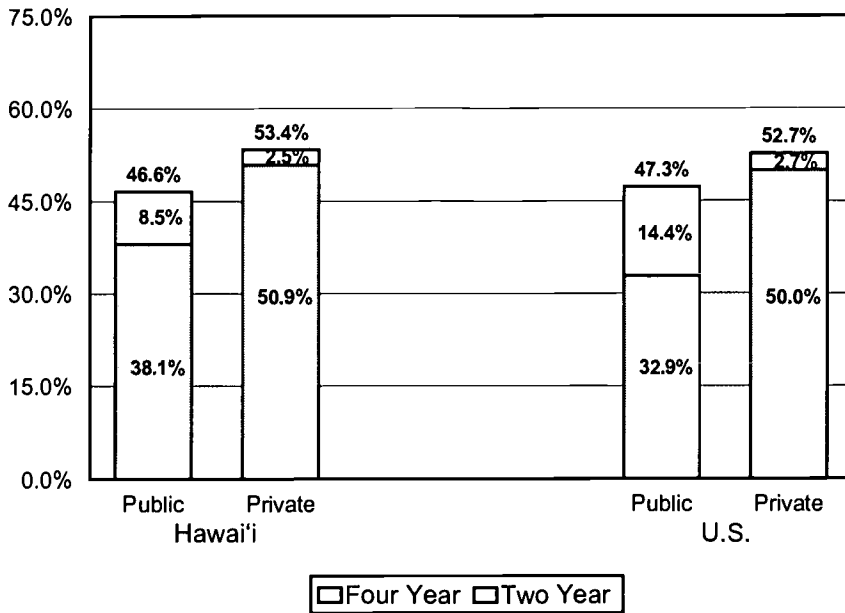


What percentage of June 1996 Hawai'i high school graduates enrolled in college in Fall 1996?

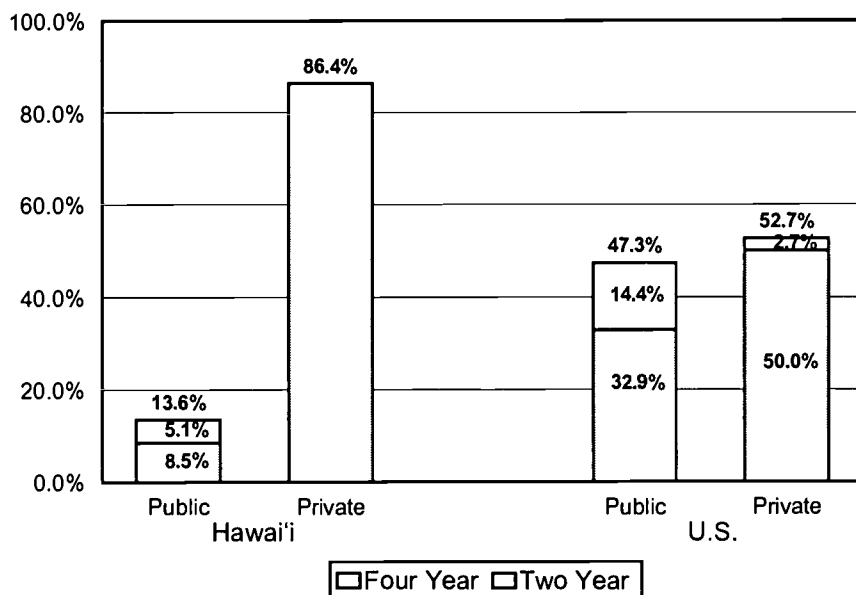

Students Entering the State

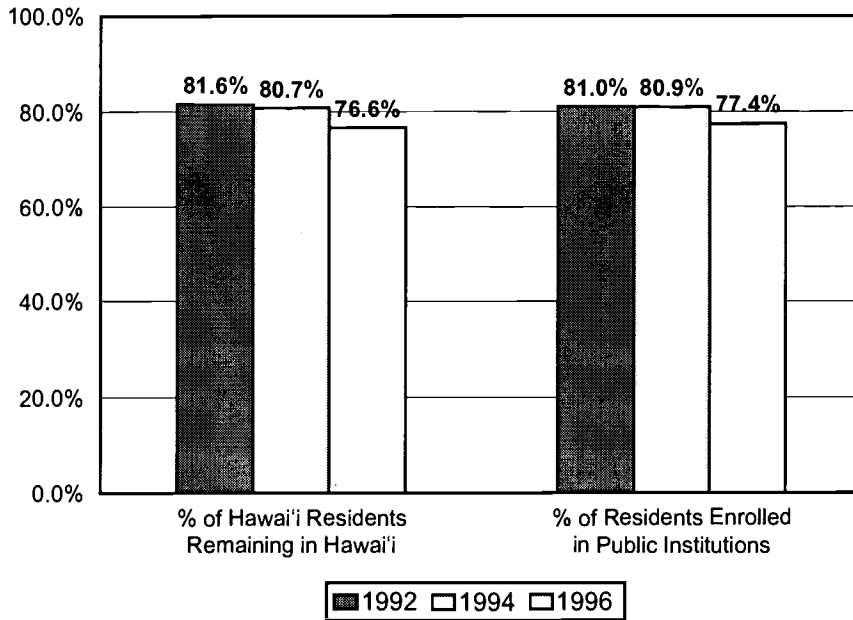


Where did the first-time freshmen who came to Hawai'i in Fall 1996 attend college?

Residence and Migration of First-Time Freshmen, Fall 1996

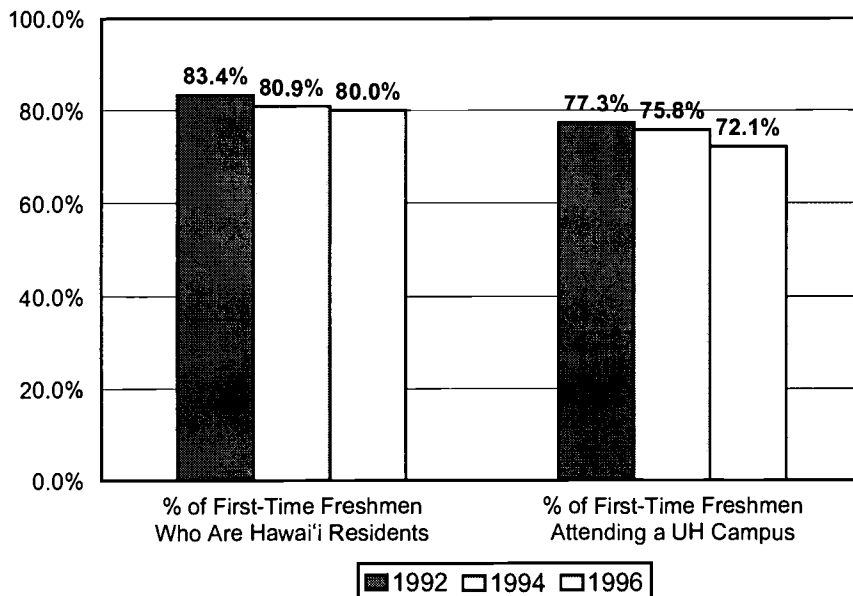
