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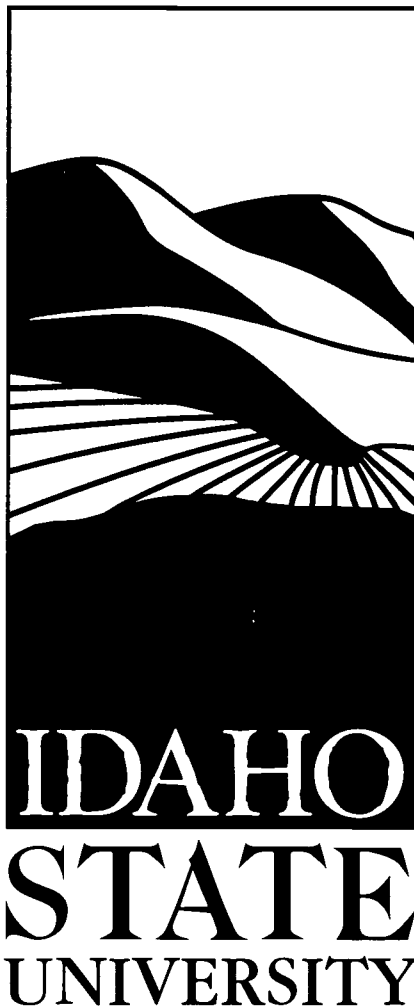
ABSTRACT

This report provides basic statistical data for Idaho State University, and includes both point-of-time data as well as trend data. The information is divided into sections emphasizing students, programs, faculty and staff, finances, and physical facilities. Student data includes enrollment, geographical distribution, student/faculty ratios, credit hours, demographic data (fall 1998 semester; 5-year comparison), and age distribution. Similar information is also provided on students for the spring 1999 semester. The section on degrees and certificates includes academic degrees offered and awarded and applied technology certificates and degrees offered and awarded. Faculty and staff statistics include total Idaho State University employees, employee full-time-equivalent history, number of full-time faculty, faculty salaries, faculty salary comparisons, exempt nonfaculty salaries, and administrative salary comparisons. Financial data includes student fees, student financial aid awarded, state appropriate analysis, operating budgets, revenues, and expenditures. Physical facilities data includes physical plant assets, replacement values, square footage, housing occupancy report, library collection, and class data. (JM)

INTRODUCTION

This is the 23rd in a series of statistical portraits developed by the Office of Institutional Research. It has been designed to provide the faculty, administration, and other interested persons with a basic statistical portrait of the university. Some of the information provides a snapshot of the university at a particular point in time, while other data portrays trends over a period of time.

The information is divided into sections which emphasize students, programs, faculty and staff, finances, and physical facilities.

Several assumptions have gone into the preparation of this resource book. First and most importantly, there is a basic assumption that information about the status of the university is one of the most significant tools in effective educational decision making. Second, there is the assumption that the availability of information about the university in a centralized and relatively easy to use format will help improve the level of knowledge about the institution and will help assure that consistent information is provided to any general inquiries. Finally, the series of fact books can be utilized to provide trend data over many years for a wide variety of institutional characteristics. However, because we are constantly working to improve the usefulness of this document, changes have been and will continue to be made in the content and format, so all data may not be available over the entire series.

In this line, we do welcome suggestions from readers of the document about how we might make it more useful or more understandable. If there is information which does not appear in this portrait or if something could be presented in a more useful form, please contact the Office of Institutional Research. Our primary purpose is to be of assistance in making information accessible to its users. Any comments or suggestions that will enable us to do our job better will be given every consideration.

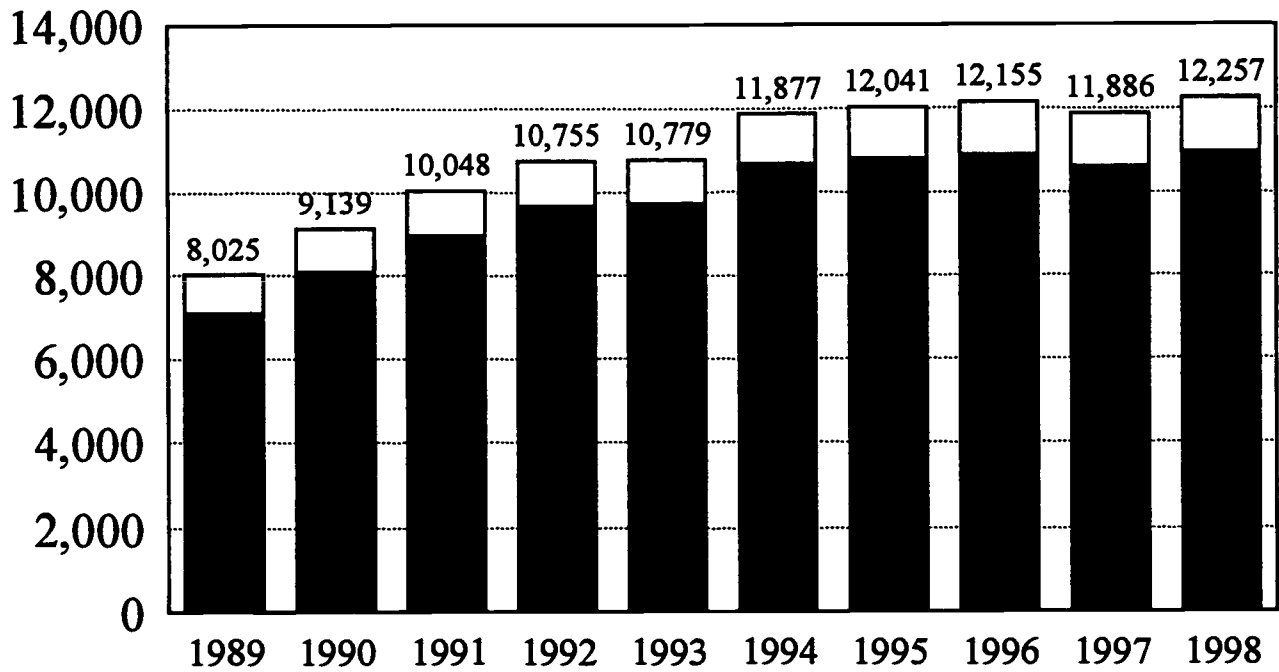

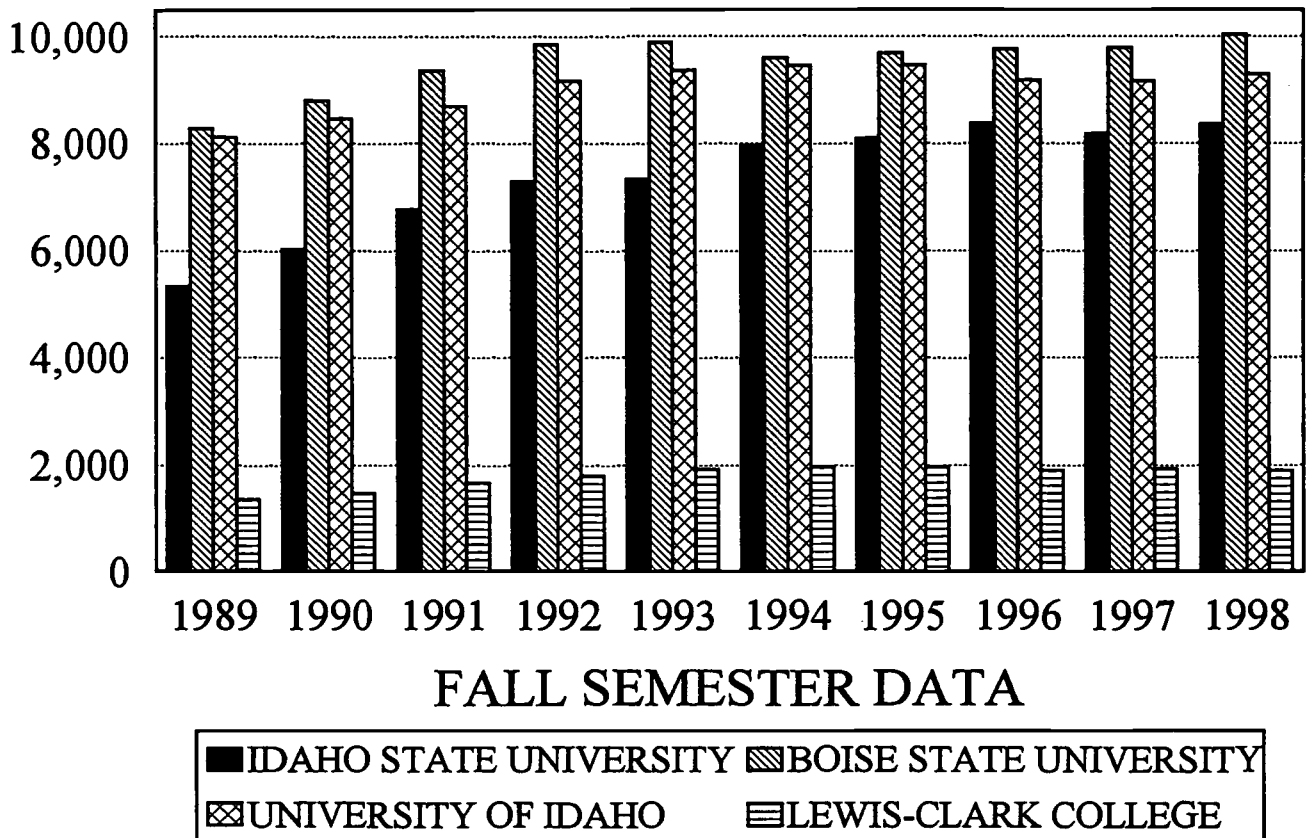

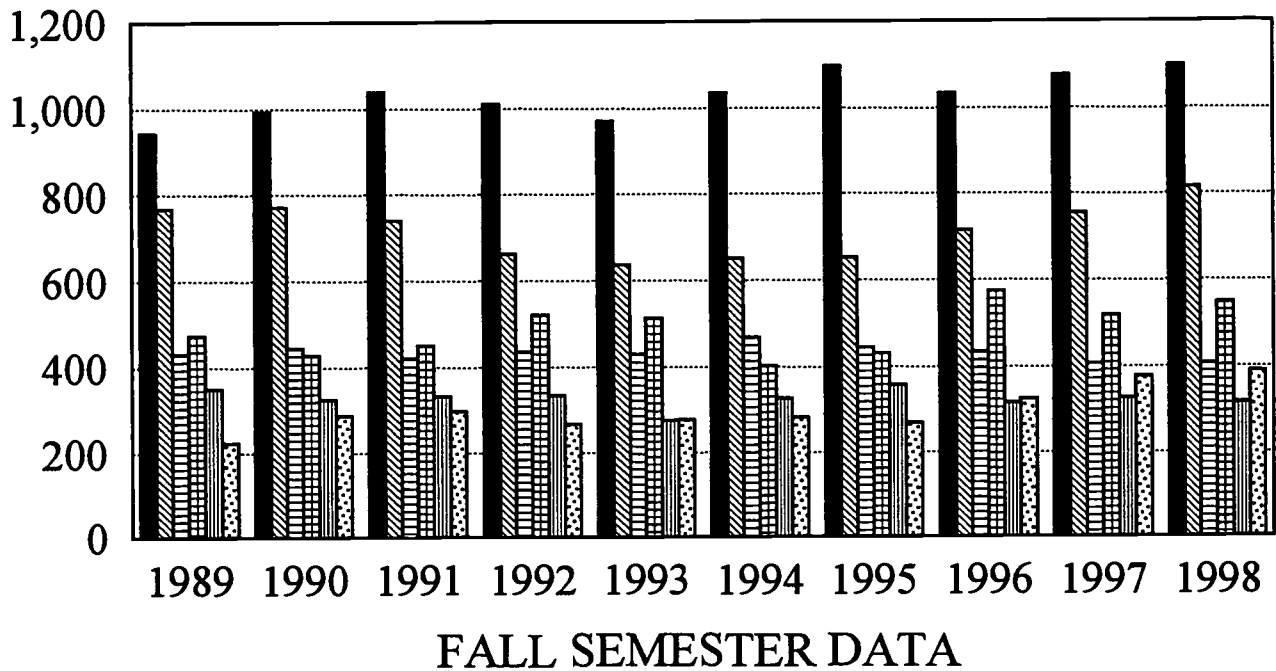

I.S.U. STUDENT AGE DISTRIBUTION TOTAL ENROLLMENT ACADEMIC AND APPLIED TECHNOLOGY



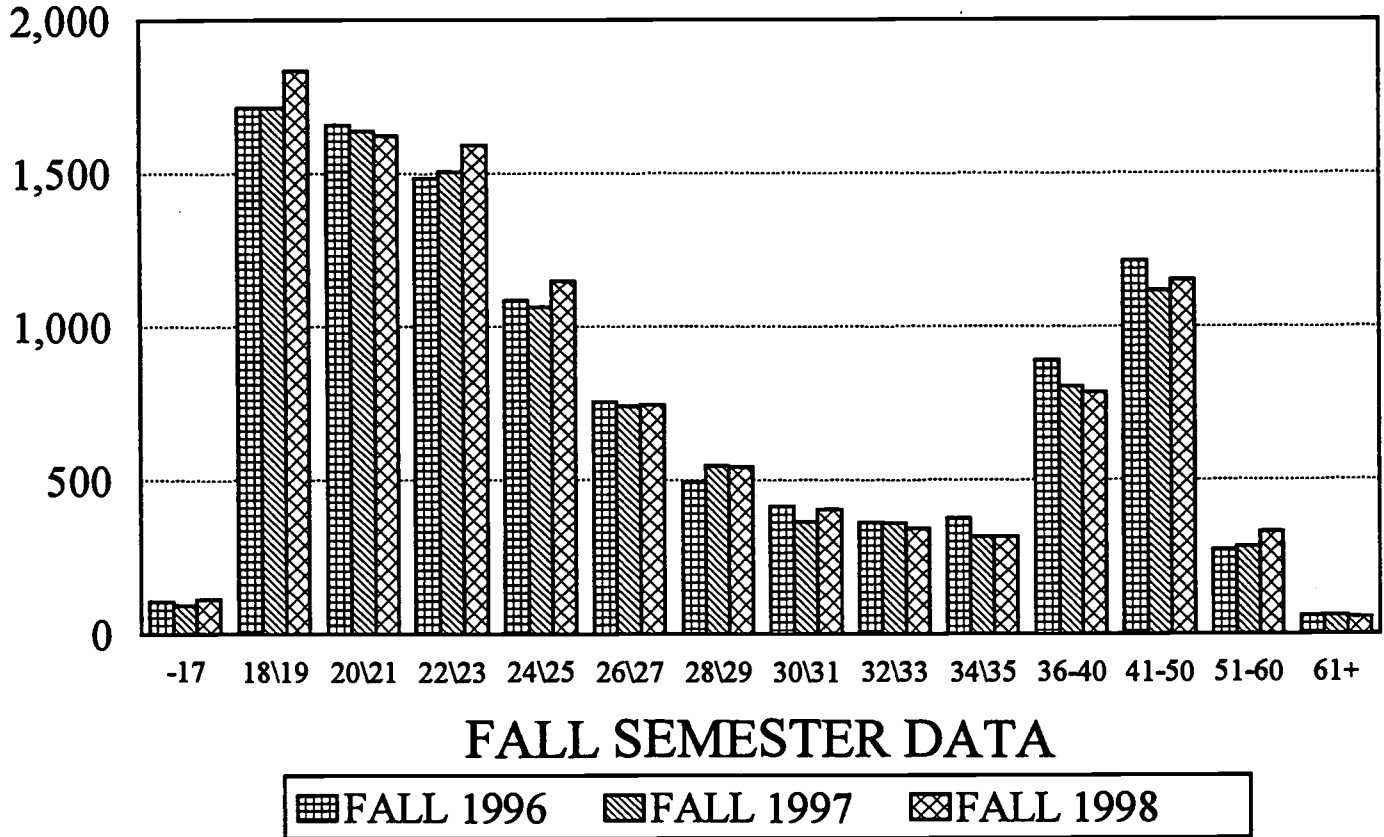

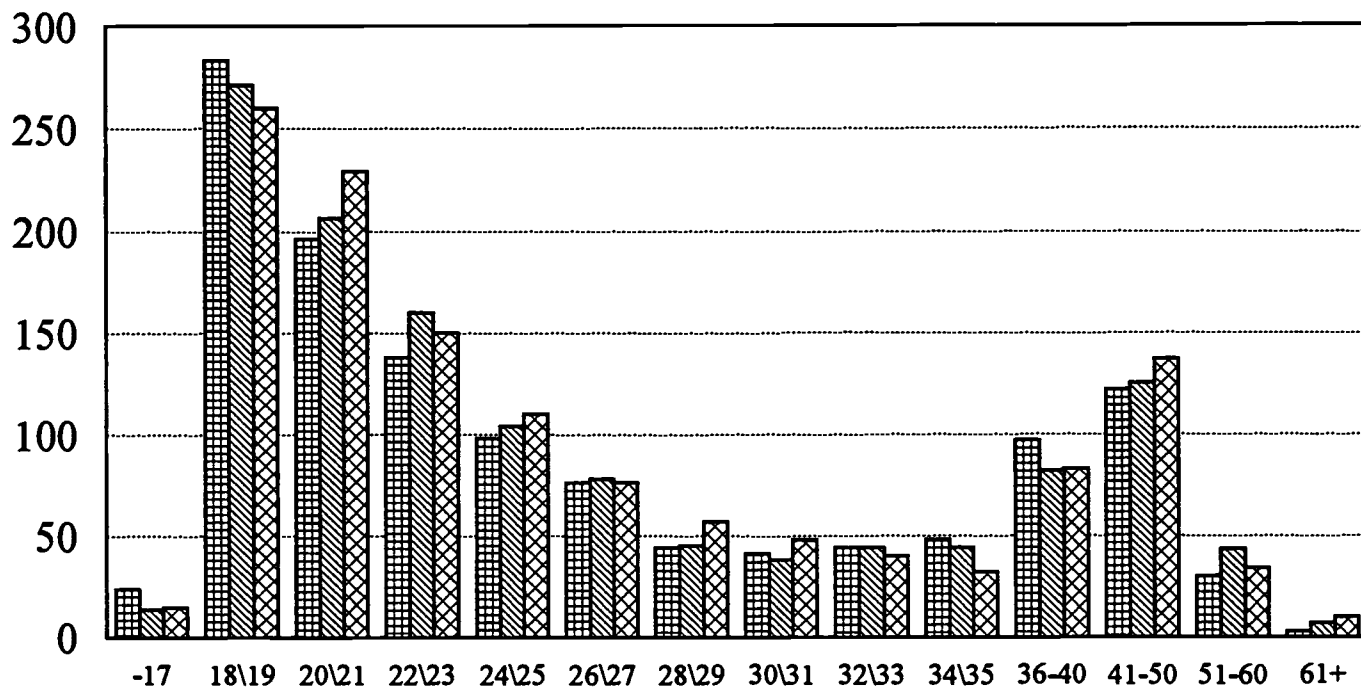

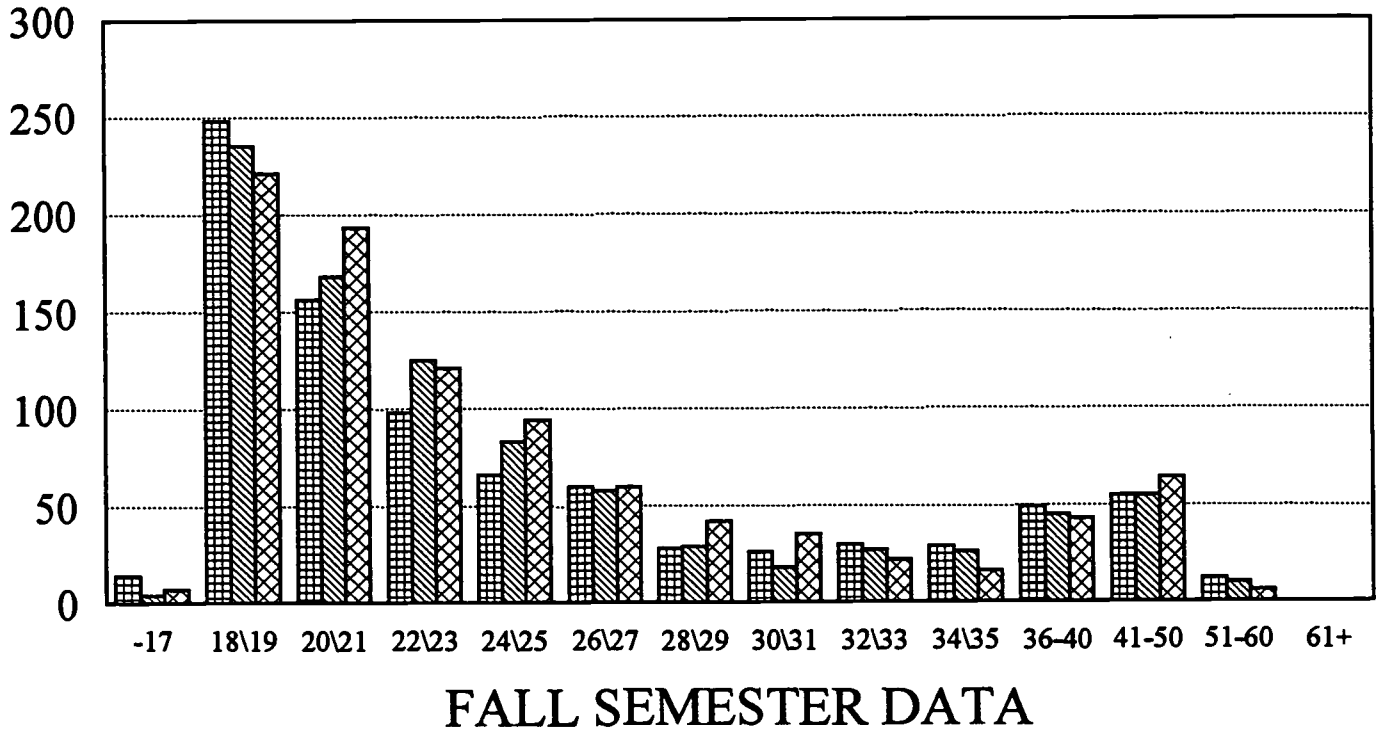

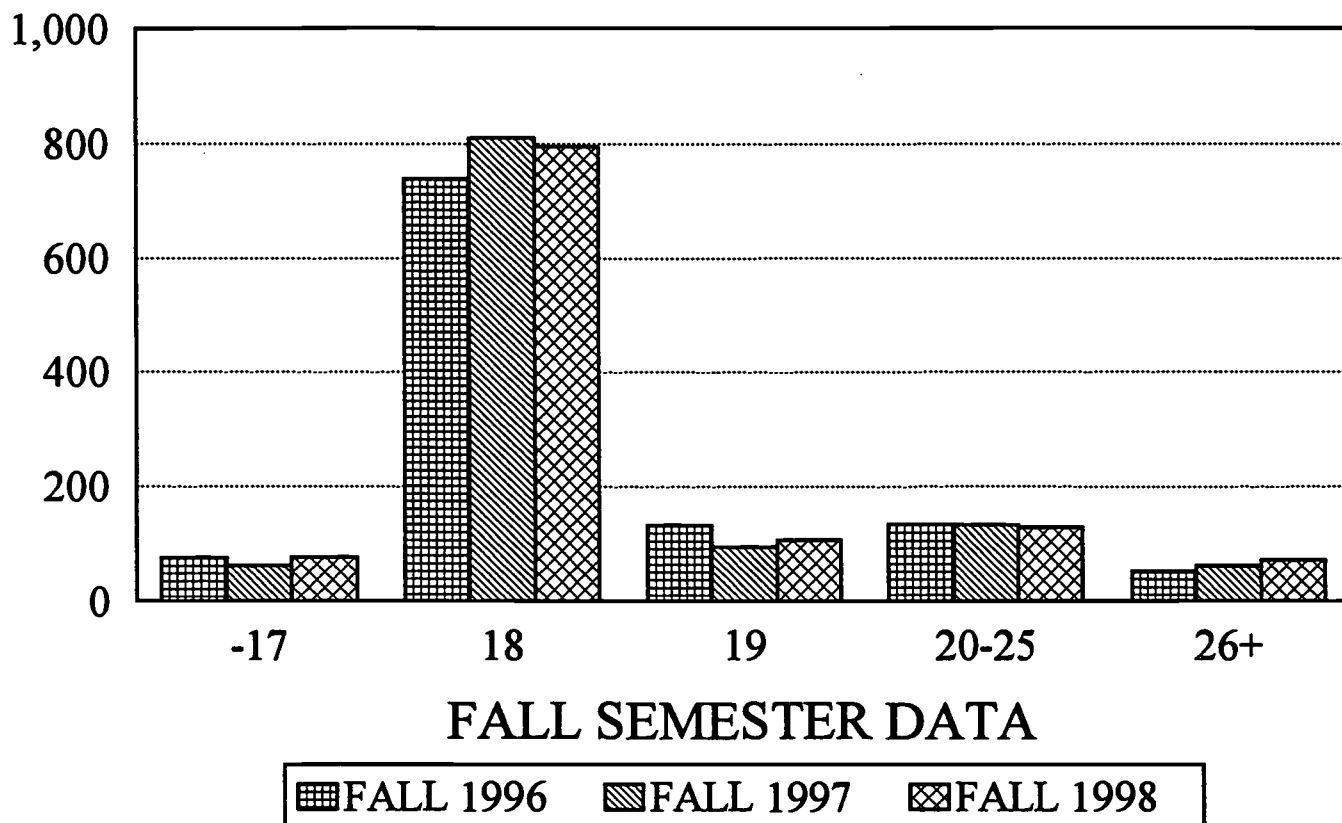

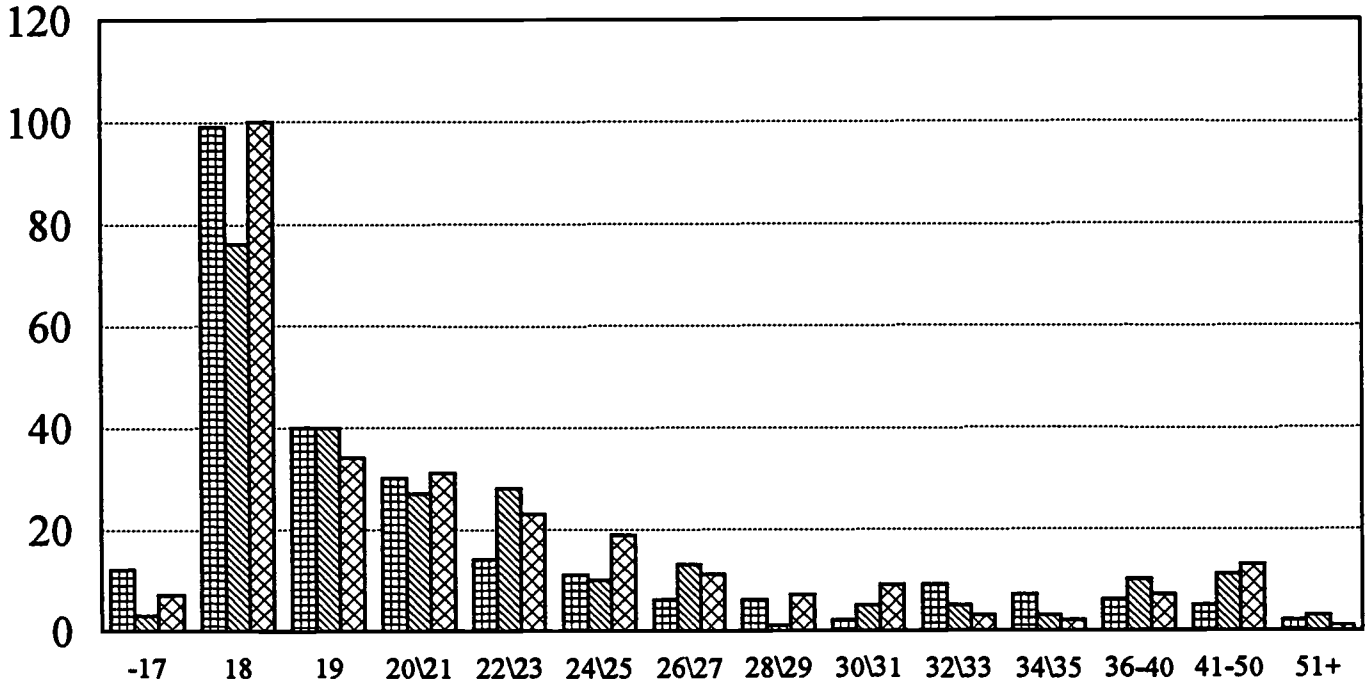

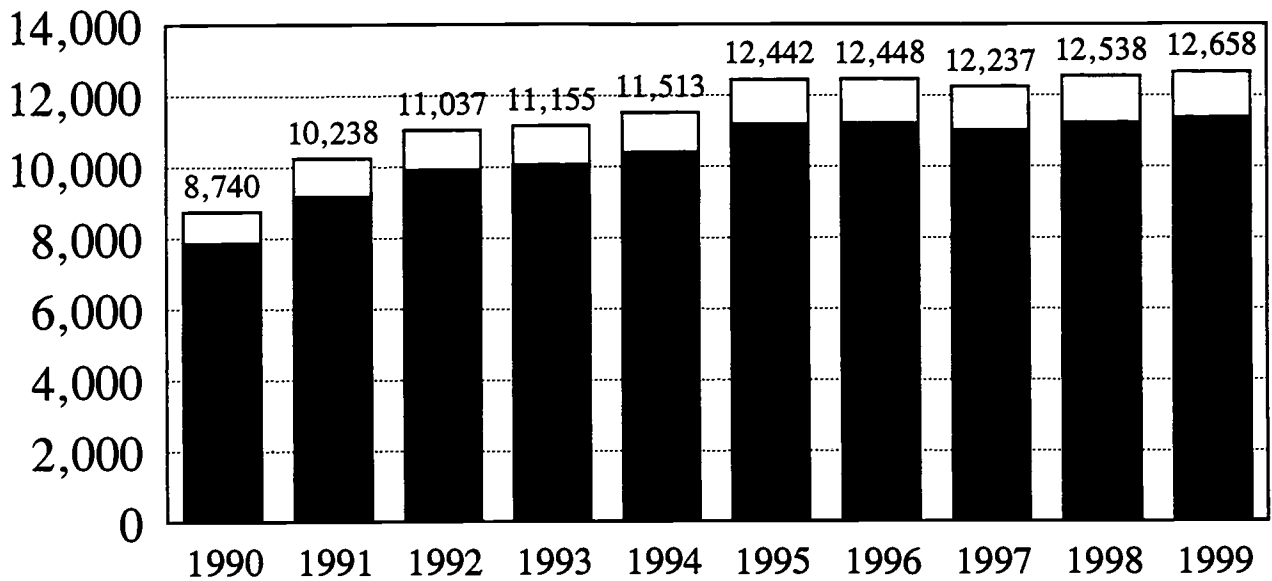

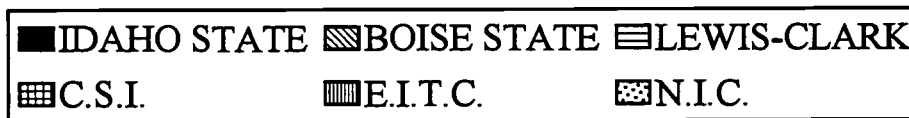

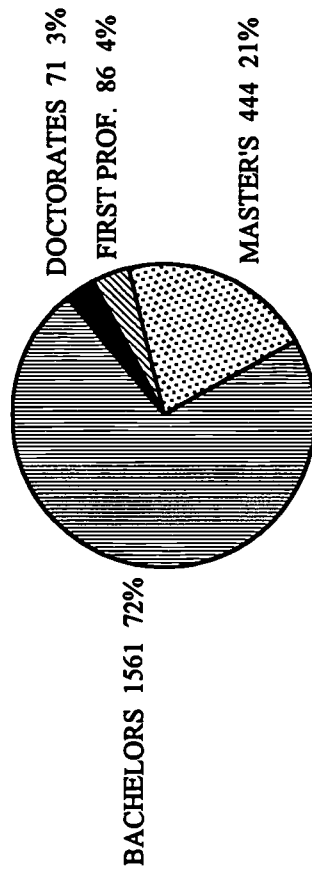
DEGREES AWARDED DURING FISCAL YEAR 1997-98 AT IDAHO UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGE



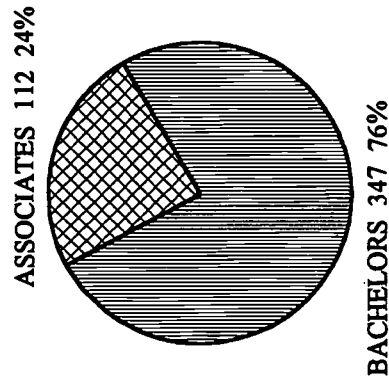

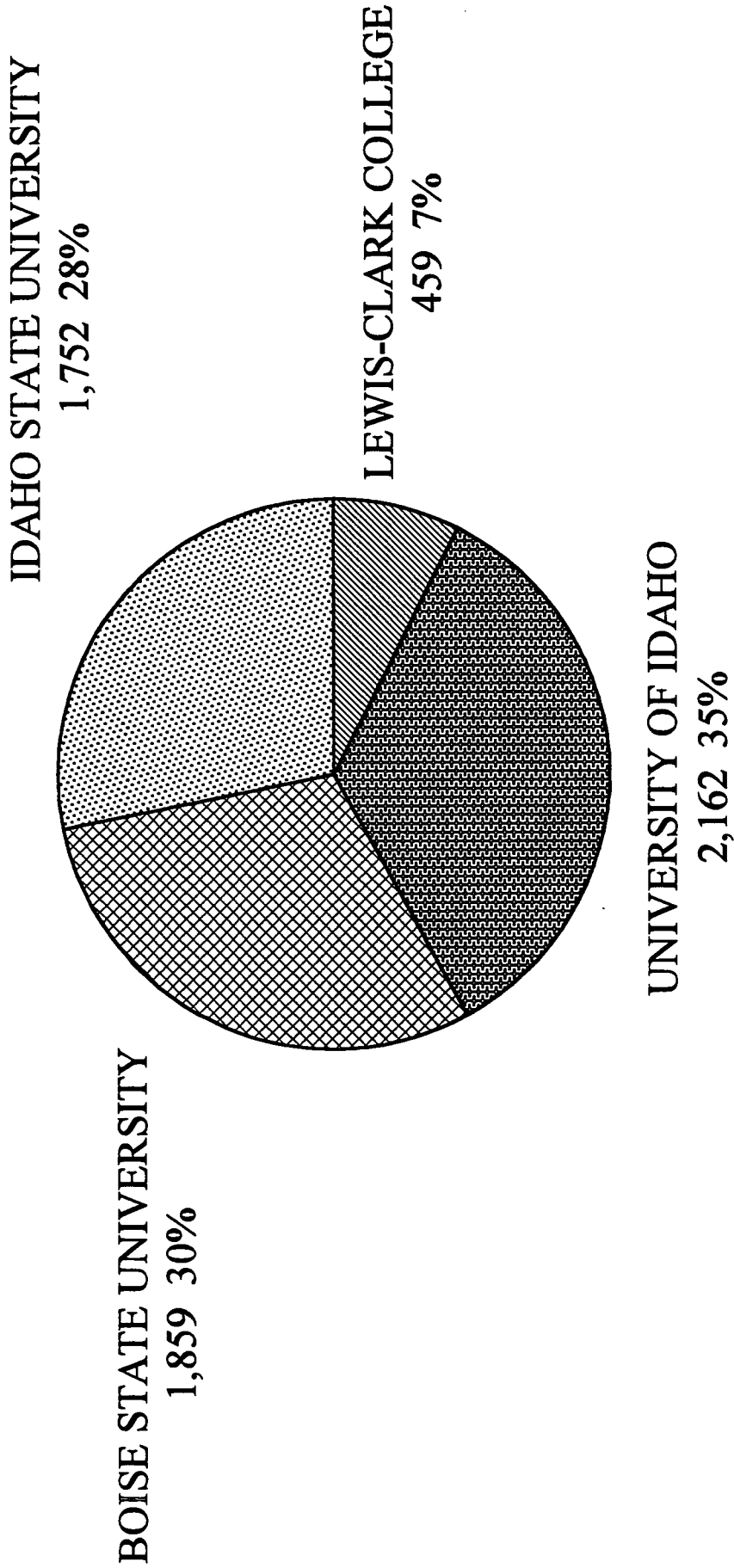

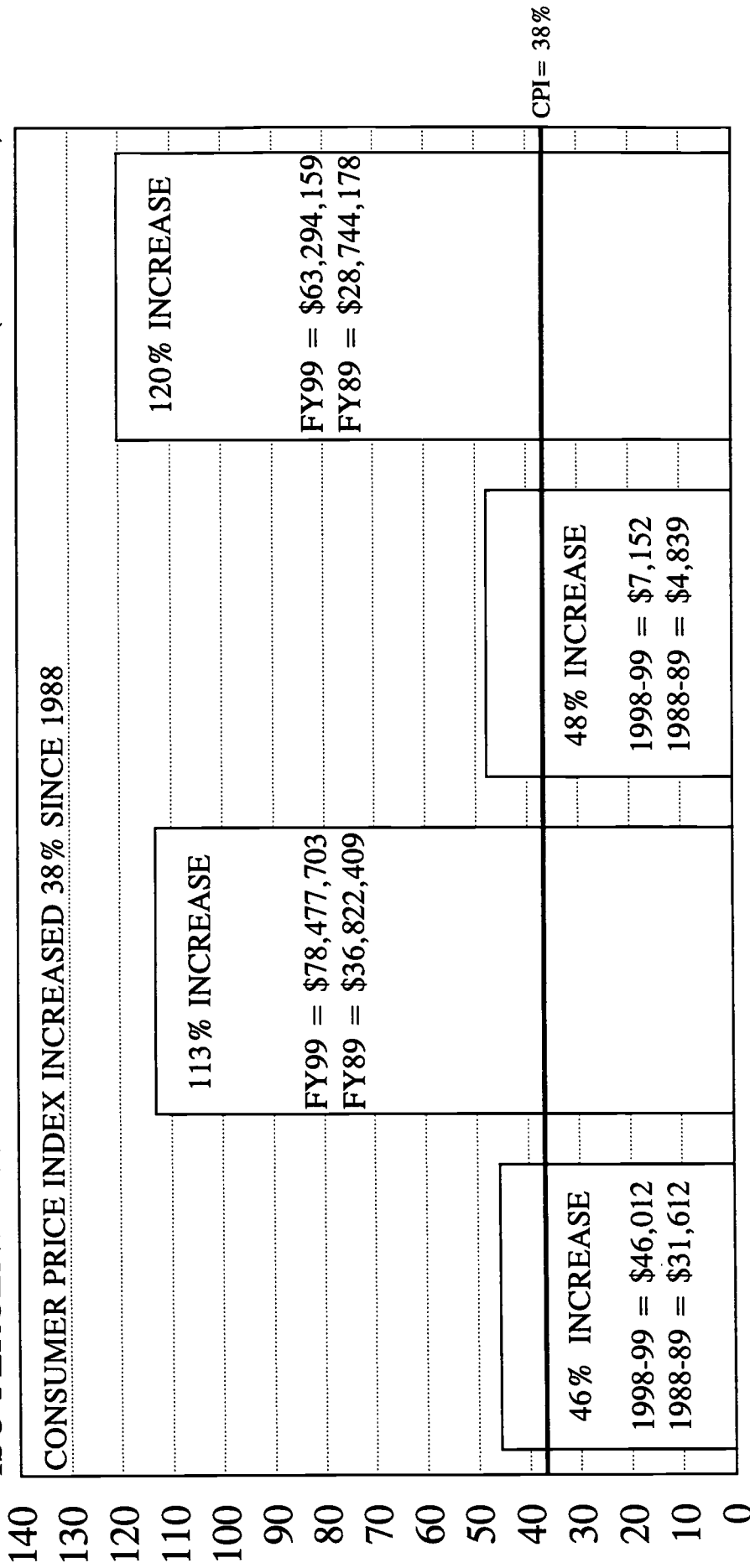
INCREASES IN SALARIES AND BUDGET (1988-1998) RELATIVE TO CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

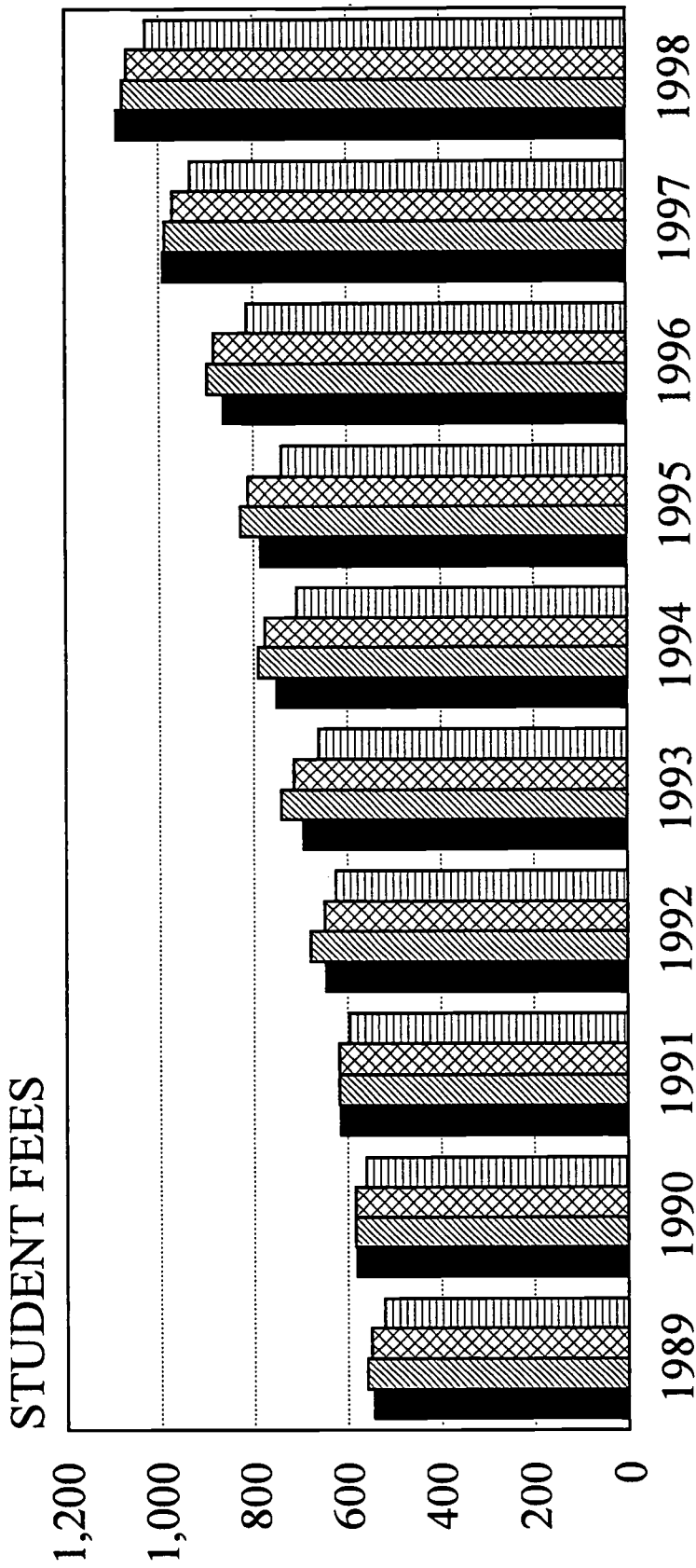

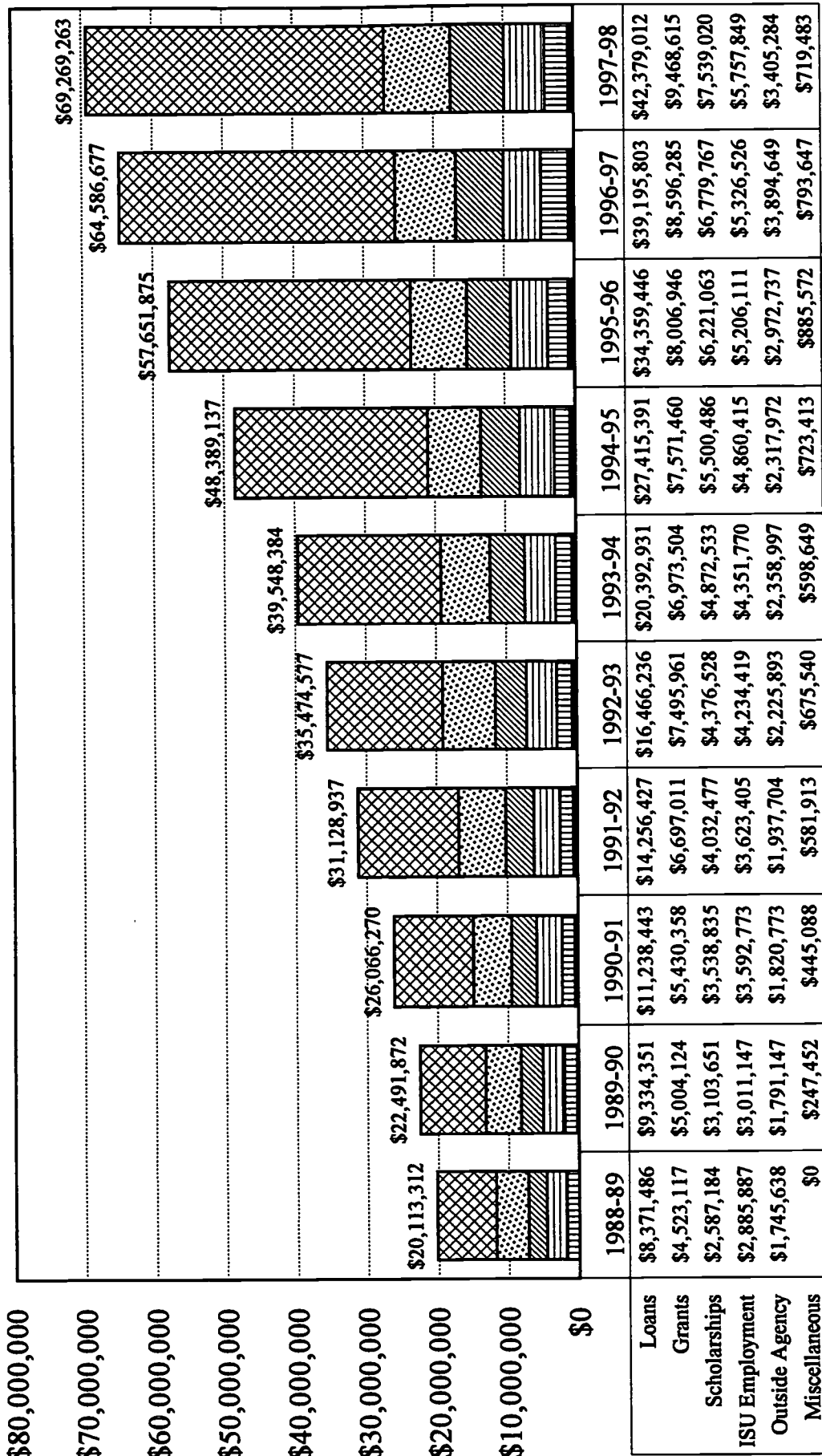

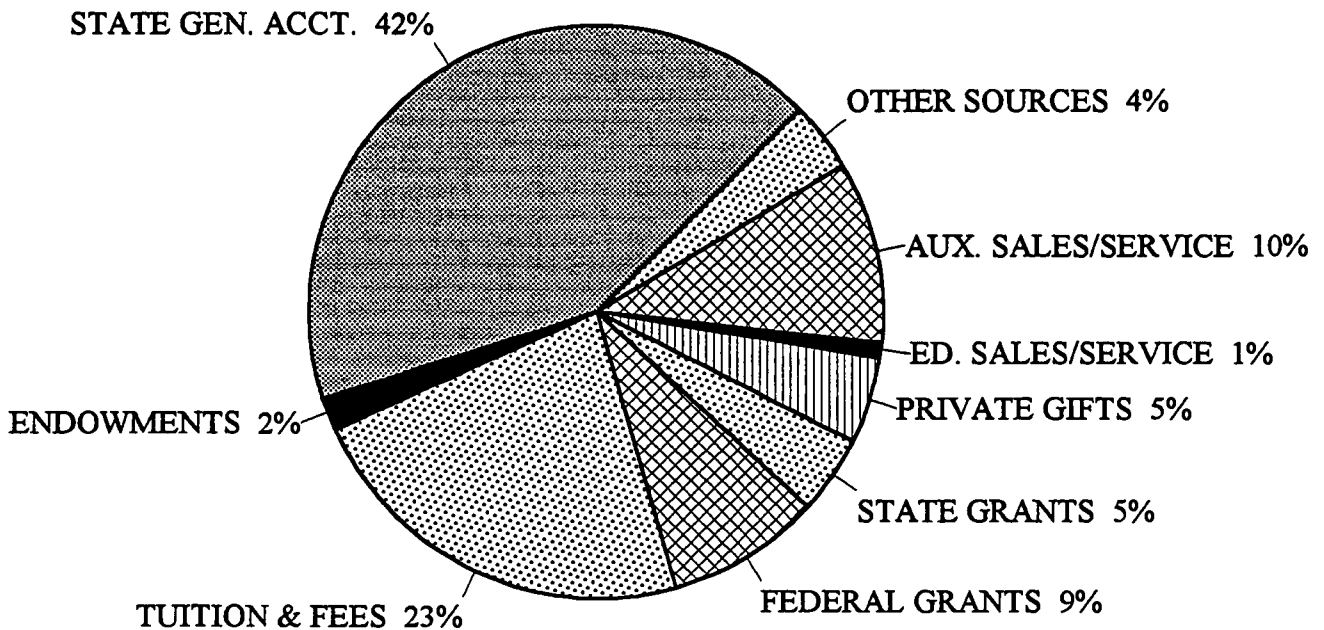

IDAHO STATE UNIVERSITY CURRENT FUNDS REVENUES FISCAL YEAR 1998



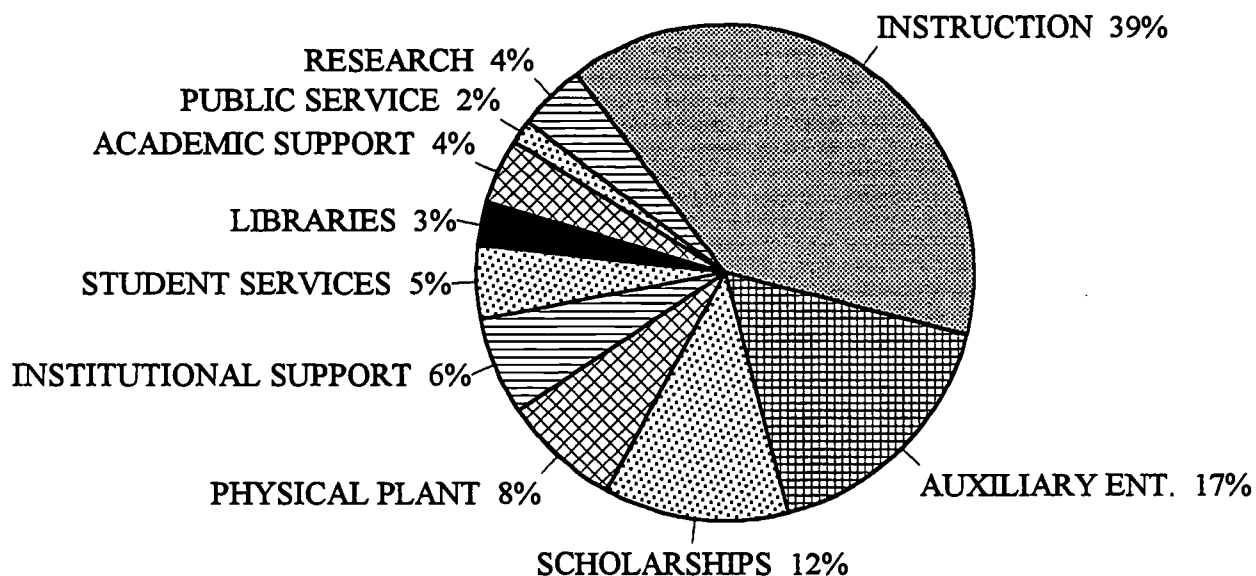

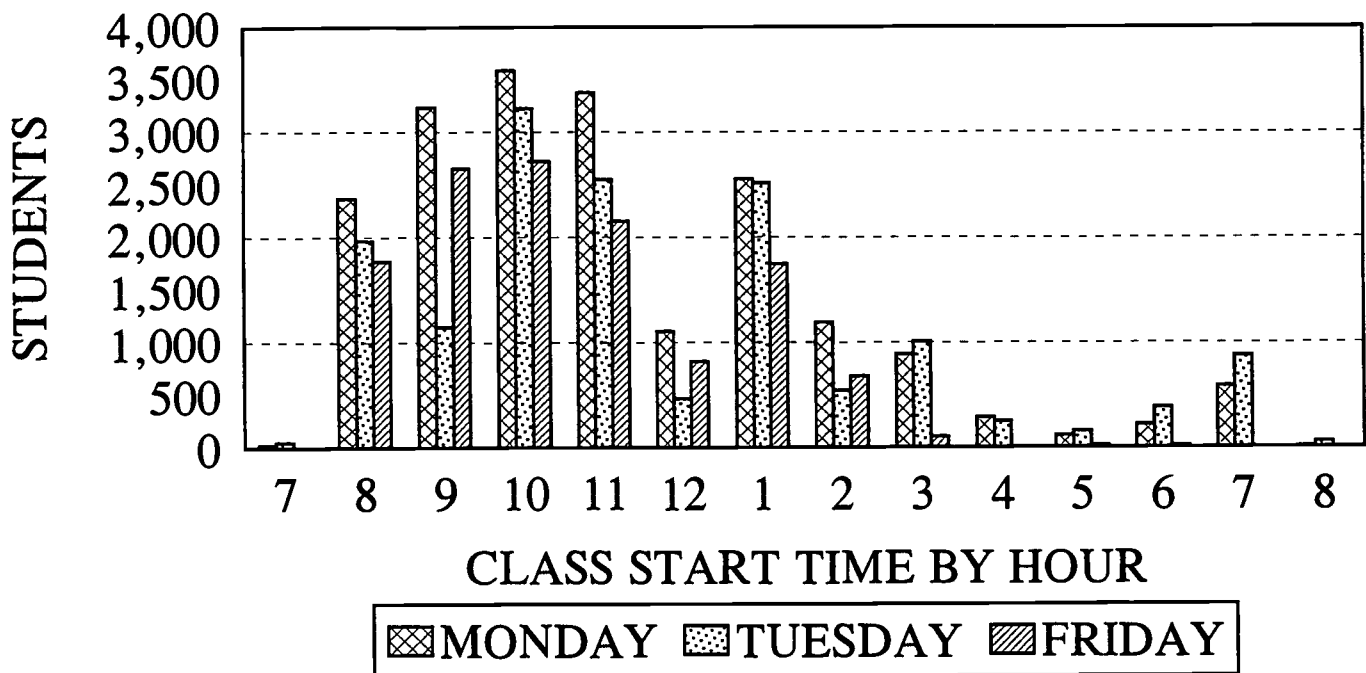

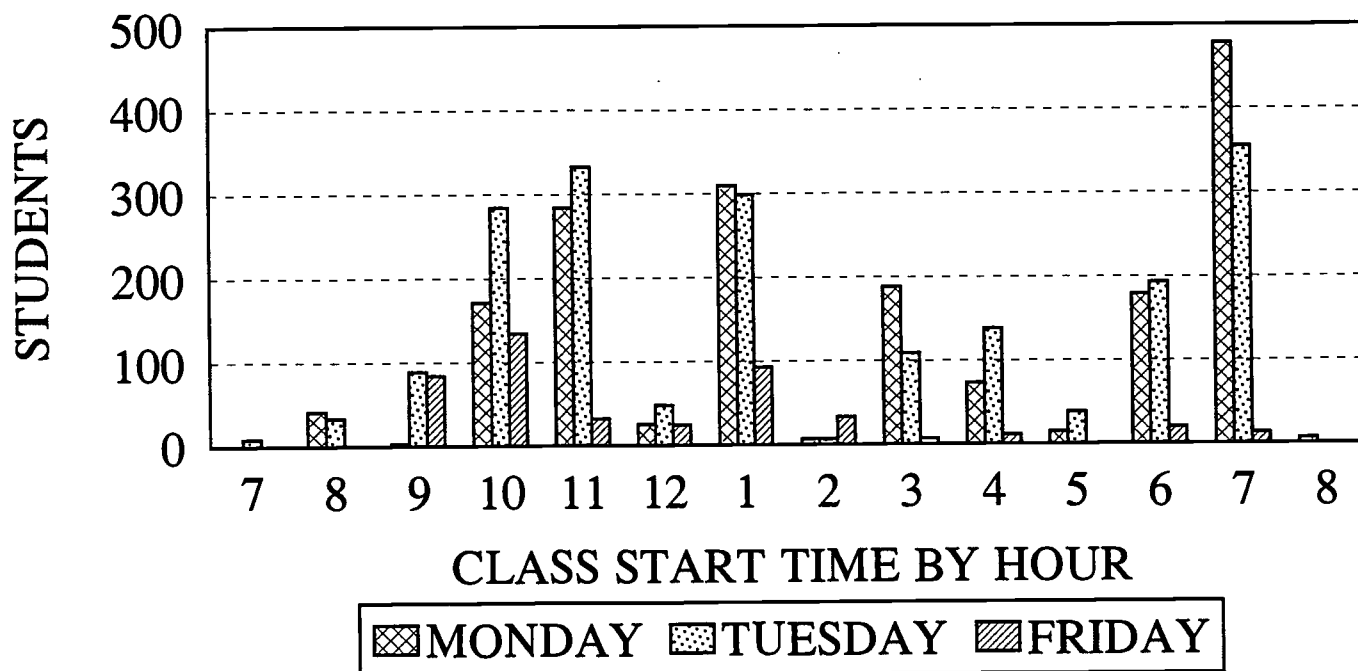

STUDENTS IN ACADEMIC CLASSES HELD IN IDAHO FALLS FALL SEMESTER, 1998

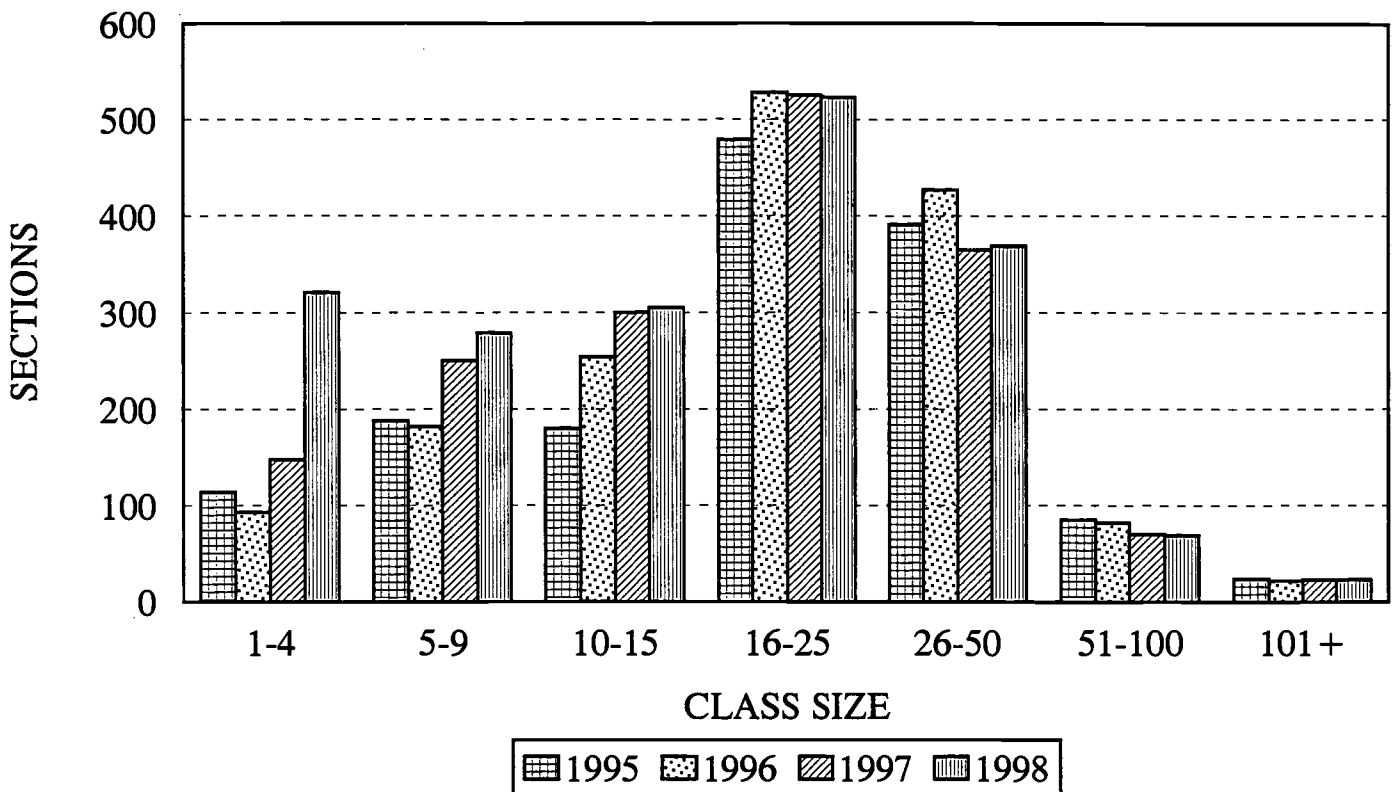
