ABSTRACT

The Alabama Public Library Service (APLS) is charged with improving library services throughout the state to ensure that all citizens have access to quality library and information services. Part of this charge includes the responsibility for receiving and administering federal funds to the more than 200 public libraries in Alabama. Federal Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) monies are spent on statewide projects at the APLS. These projects include providing reference services, interlibrary loans, audiovisual materials, continuing education programs, consultant services to the public libraries, coordination of a statewide children's summer library program, and special needs services. This document describes the use of these federal funds for 1998 library programs and services in Alabama's seven congressional districts. When public library service areas are included in two congressional districts, they are listed in each district and noted by an asterisk. The 1998 LSTA Advisory Council members, APLS Executive Board, and APLS Division Directors are listed at the end of the document. (AEF)

Library Services and Technology Act

The Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) P.L. 104-208, assists the state of Alabama in the extension and improvement of public library service throughout the state. Funds may be used for the following:

- 1) Establishing or enhancing electronic linkages among or between libraries:
- 2) Electronically linking libraries with educational, social or information services;
- 3) Assisting libraries in accessing information through electronic networks;
- 4) Encouraging libraries in different areas, and encouraging different types of libraries, to establish consortia and share resources;
- 5) Paying costs for libraries to acquire or share computer systems and telecommunications technologies; and
- 6) Targeting library and information services to persons having difficulty using a library and to underserved urban and rural communities, including children (from birth through 17) from families with incomes below the poverty line (as defined by the Office of Management and Budget).

The Library Services and Technology Act provides state-administered grant funds, and in Alabama, the administration rests with the Alabama Public Library Service.

The LSTA falls within the definition of a categorical grant and it is permissive legislation in that it does not define the specific actions that must be taken in order to fulfill this mandate.



Alabama Public Library Service

The Alabama Public Library Service is charged with improving library services throughout the state to ensure that all citizens have access to quality library and information services.

Part of this charge includes the responsibility for receiving and administering federal funds to the more than 200 public libraries in Alabama.

Federal Library Services and Technology Act monies are spent on statewide projects at the Alabama Public Library Service. These projects include providing reference services, interlibrary loans, audiovisual materials, continuing education programs and consultant services to the public libraries.

Other major statewide projects funded through LSTA include the coordination of a statewide children's summer library program. In 1998, more than 57,000 children participated in the program. The agency also collects and interprets statistics and provides a professional training program to promote quality public library service through the development of professional librarians.

LSTA monies also provide library services to the institutionalized mentally ill and mentally retarded, to young adults at a youth correctional facility in Alabama and to persons served by the Alabama Institute for the Deaf and Blind.

At APLS, the Alabama Union List of Serials, ALICAT, the state union catalog, and other technology and equipment are funded by LSTA dollars.



District One includes the counties of Baldwin, Clarke (portion), Escambia, Mobile, Monroe and Washington. LSTA-funded programs in District One include a \$6,584 grant to Loxley Public Library to fully automate the library's services.

Also in District One, the **Flomaton Public Library** received a \$3,915 grant to provide a program for children at risk in Flomaton and Escambia County. The specific programs to be implemented include after school and summer programs targeted for youths from high-risk backgrounds.

District Two LSTA grants include a \$13,005 grant to **Troy Public Library** for library automation, including adding more computers for the public access catalog; upgrading existing systems; establishing a library local area network; developing a web page; mounting an automated catalog on the internet, adding full text periodicals and other databases and to provide stand-alone personal computers to utilize some CD-ROM titles.

Also in District Two, **Greenville-Butler County Public Library** received a \$16,648 grant to help establish a resource room for use by public librarians in Butler, Crenshaw, Conceuh and surrounding counties. The resource room will provide educational and instructional materials and equipment to be used in conjunction with children's programs in libraries in the area.

Projects funded in this district include a \$2,931 grant to **B.B. Comer Memorial Library** to fund a six-part program designed to encourage parents of culturally deprived children to enjoy the benefits of reading and the use of technology to retrieve materials to enhance their parental skills.

Also in District Three, the Anniston-Calhoun County Public Library received a \$3,600 grant to upgrade the automated circulation and collection management system used to provide service to the library's blind and physically handicapped users.

In District Four, Guntersville Public Library received an \$8,354 grant to upgrade to a Windows NT operating system to more easily link to three other libraries in the county.

Another District Four LSTA project was an \$11,866 grant to Gadsden-Etowah County Public Library to replace 17 terminals with personal computers to accommodate the new client/server technology that will allow the library to provide more than text-based data to its patrons.

District Five LSTA grants include a \$66,170 grant to Huntsville-Madison County Public Library. The library's Outreach Department will partner with the Child Care Management Agency of North Central Alabama, the Huntsville Junior League and Alabama Public Television to develop and implement reading readiness training for parents and for those who care for young children.

Also, Rogersville Public Library received a \$15,702 grant to automate the areas of registration, cataloging, circulation and reference, and for the purchase of a stand-alone system for interlibrary loans.

LSTA monies in the amount of \$10,000 were awarded to Harrison Regional Library System to provide library services to the at-risk children, youth and instructors at the Shelby County Juvenile Detention Center. In addition, working with the Detention Center, the Harrison Regional Library will provide programming targeted for at-risk students at middle and high schools throughout the county.


