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ABSTRACT

The purpose of this study was to investigate changes in full-time faculty at the Florida Community College System (FCCS) between 1994 and 1998. During this period, the number of headcount students served by the FCCS declined. The total number of instructional faculty declined from 4,743 in 1994 to 4,586 in 1998, a drop of 3 percent. The number of male instructors declined eight percent and the number of female instructors increased by two percent. By fall 1998, the male/female ratio had changed from 52.5%/47.5% to 50.1%/49.9%. The number of black instructors declined from 463 to 437, a drop of six percent. Hispanic instructors increased from 267 to 290, a gain of nine percent. Instructors classified as "other," including Asians and Native Americans, increased by eleven percent. There was a larger decline in continuing contract faculty than in faculty as a whole. 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Changes in Full Time Faculty - Fall 1994 to Fall 1998

Introduction

The unduplicated headcount of students served by the Florida Community College System (FCCS) has declined between 1994-95 and 1998-99. This has been accompanied by a similar decline in the number of FTE's (full time equivalent) generated and the number of full-time faculty required to provide instruction. The purpose of this Data Trend is to investigate if different segments of faculty have been impacted in different ways. The groups considered were based on both gender and ethnicity. Due to the small number of Asians and American Indians employed by the institutions, these two categories were grouped together to form Other.

The gender and ethnic categories are considered for both (a) full time instructional faculty, and (b) full time instructional faculty on continuing contract, the System equivalent to tenure.

Instructional Faculty

Total instructional faculty declined from 4,743 in Fall 1994 to 4,586 in Fall 1998. This represented a three percent decrease (-3%). There were 2,490 male instructors in Fall 1994. By fall 1998, this number had declined to 2,299 for a loss of eight percent (-8%). Female instructor showed the opposite pattern, increasing from 2,253 to 2,287 for a gain of two percent (2%). By Fall 1998 the male/female ratio had changed from 52.5% male/47.5% female to 50.1% male and 49.9% female.

Black faculty changed from 463 in Fall 1994 to 437 in Fall 1998, a change of minus six percent (-6%). Hispanic faculty increased from 267 to 290 during this same period for a change of nine percent (9%). The Other group experienced the largest

percentage change, an increase of eleven percent (11%). However, this represented an increase of only nine individuals, from 79 to 88. The largest numerical change occurred in white faculty. This group declined from 3,934 to 3,771, a loss of four percent (-4%).

Instructional Faculty on Continuing Contract

Faculty on continuing contract in the FCCS have been employed at least three years and have meet various requirements related to their teaching ability. Being placed on continuing contract is often compared to the process of receiving tenure. Teaching is the main emphasis for community colleges rather than the combination of teaching, research and public service often found in four-year institutions.

There was a larger numerical decline in continuing contract faculty than in faculty as a whole. One possible explanation is that many community college faculty are members of the "baby boom" generation and the leading edge of that group has reached retirement age. The retirement of a large portion of senior faculty is something all sectors of education are scheduled to face in the next three to five years.

The percentage loss of male faculty in this category was significantly larger than female. Males declined from 1,994 to 1,773 or eleven percent (-11%). Females dropped only twenty-four positions from 1,684 to 1,660 or one percent (-1%).

Black continuing contract faculty were essentially steady, changing from 334 to 336, an increase of one percent (1%). Hispanic and Other faculty also increased. Hispanic faculty rose from 193 to 225 for a change of seventeen percent (17%). Other faculty increased from fifty-one to fifty-eight, or fourteen percent (14%). The entire decline was concentrated in white faculty which went from 3,100 to 2,814 or a loss of nine percent (-9%).

Conclusion

Based upon the information contained in this report, there is no indication that females or minorities have been adversely impacted by the recent declines in Florida's full time community college faculty. Indeed, minorities and females have tended to increase, while whites and males have declined. These data show the FCCS is taking seriously its commitment to increasing diversity in its employment practices as well as in the student body.

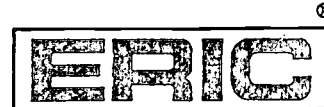

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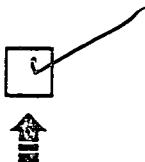
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
