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## ABSTRACT

This Kids Count report examines state and countywide trends in the well-being of Florida's children. Demographic information is presented along with a statistical portrait for the state and for each county based on the following indicators: (1) birth, including births to unwed mothers, teen births, early prenatal care, low birth weight, and infant mortality and deaths; (2) well-being, including child deaths, teen violent deaths, dissolutions of marriage with children affected, and child abuse and neglect; (3) youth and the law, including delinquency, juvenile detentions, and transfers to adult court; and (4) education, including graduation rate, non-promotions, dropouts, disciplinary actions, academic performance on standardized tests, and students eligible to participate in free/reduced lunches. The bulk of the report presents state and countywide data on demographic information and the indicators for 1997-98. Thirteen appendices list state- and countywide data, with some indicators listed by race or age categories. The report concludes with information on terminology and data sources. (SD)

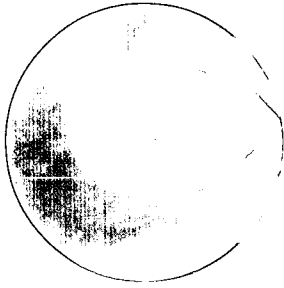
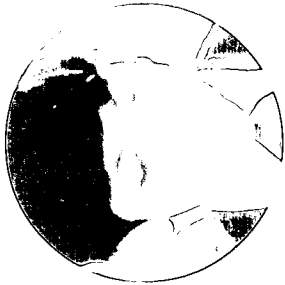
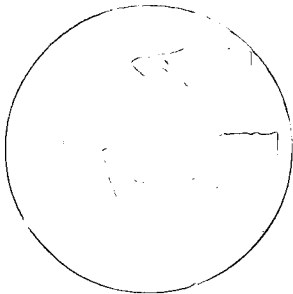
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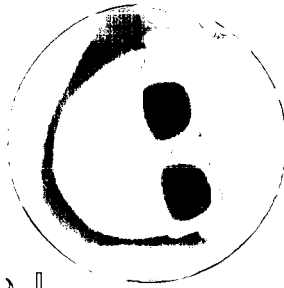
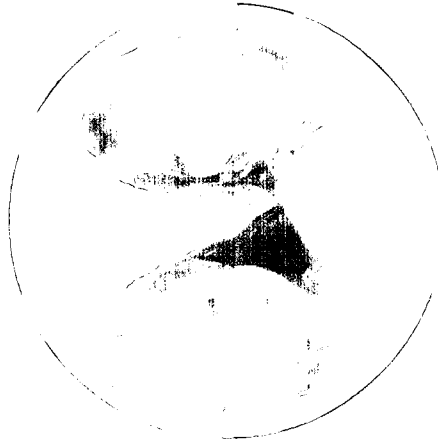

The Institute comprises four departments:

The Department of Community Mental Health (CMH) focuses on improving behavioral healthcare services through research and education, placing emphasis on effective interventions for special needs populations, including adults with the most

severe and disabling mental illnesses. The USF Center for HIV Education and Research educates medical and mental health professionals on treatment and prevention of HIV/AIDS.

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The Department of Child and Family Studies (CFS) is committed to enhancing the well being of children and families. Emphasis is placed on the needs of children with serious emotional disturbances or developmental disabilities, and the needs of children at risk because of exposure to abuse, neglect, violence, and long-term poverty. CFS hosts the Center for the Study of Children's Futures (Florida Kids Count), the Center for Autism and Related Disabilities, Florida's Center for Parent Involvement, and the Banyan Center, serving families adopting children with special needs. CFS also houses two federally funded national centers. The Research and Training Center for Children's Mental Health is dedicated to improving services for children and adolescents with serious emotional disabilities and

their families by strengthening knowledge of effective services and systems of care. The Rehabilitation Research and Training Center on Positive Behavioral Support is a national research and training effort to develop and disseminate effective, practical, and empirically validated procedures for improving support for individuals with disabilities and problem behaviors.

The Department of Aging and Mental Health (AMH) conducts research, program evaluations, training, education, and consultations addressing the immediate and longer term mental health, substance abuse, and support system needs of older adults. The Department also emphasizes the needs of caregivers and families caring for aging family members; health care professionals serving the mental health and substance abuse needs of older persons; and the aging, mental health, and substance abuse service systems.

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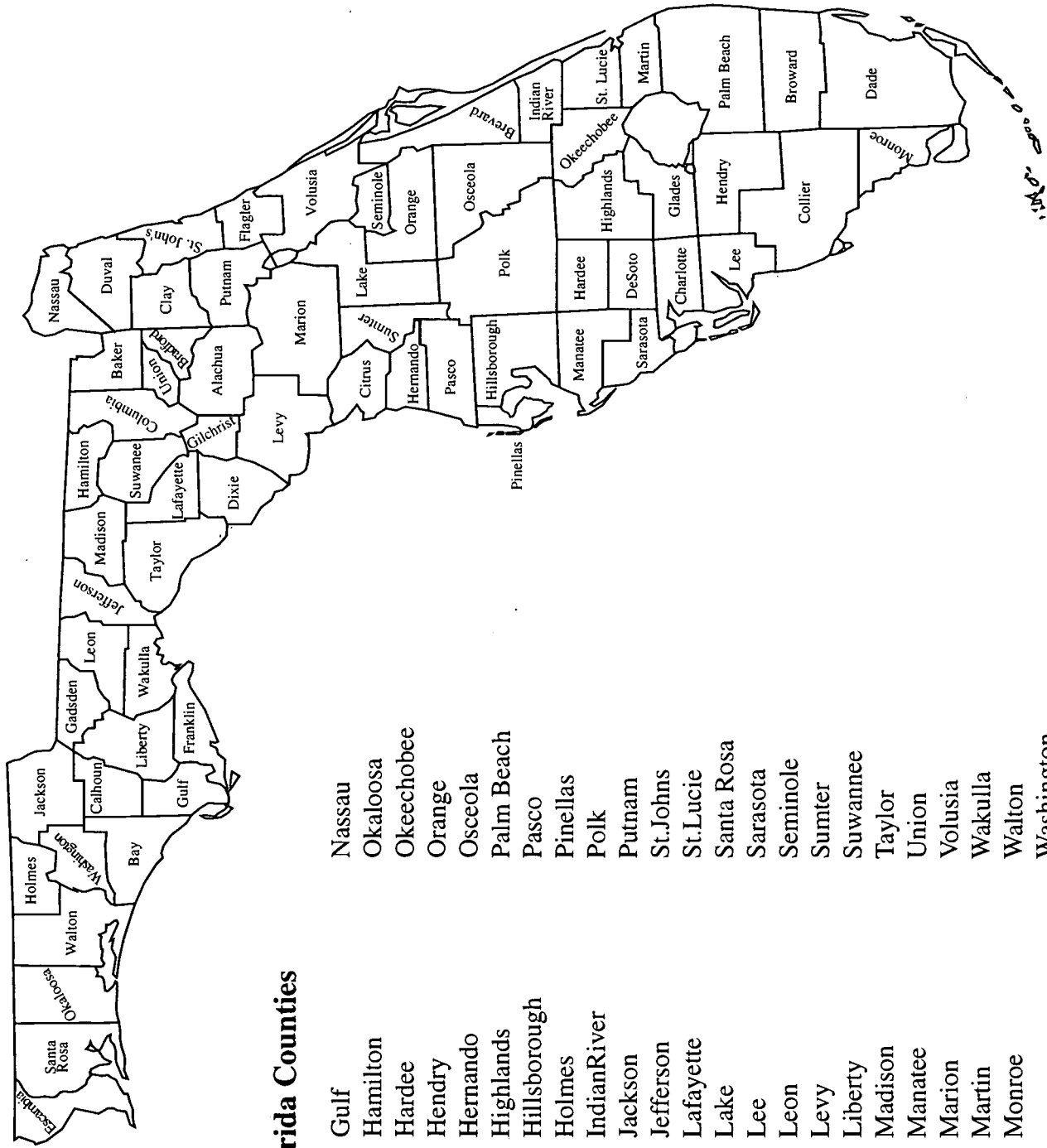

## Terminology and Sources

### Population & Economics

Total Population - the combination of the white and nonwhite population.

White - includes persons who indicated their race as "White" or reported entries on the U.S. Census, such as Canadian, German, Italian, Lebanese, Near Eastern, Arab, or Polish.

Nonwhite - includes persons who indicated their race as "Black or Negro" or reported entries on the U.S. Census, such as African-American, Afro-American, Black Puerto Rican, Jamaican, Nigerian, West Indian, or Haitian; or persons who classified themselves as American Indian, Eskimo, Aleut; or persons who reported in one of the Asian or Pacific Islander groups; or those persons classified as "Other Race", including multiracial, multiethnic, or a Spanish/Hispanic origin group.

### Births, Deaths, and Child Well-Being

Vital Statistics - data on births and deaths were reported by the usual "place of residence" (events occurring to Florida residents regardless of the place of occurrence). For births and fetal deaths, the mother's residence was used when it differed from the father's residence. Race entries were usually counted as stated on birth and death certificates, with such designations as "Hispanic" classified as "white". Designations such as "biracial", "multiracial", "mixed", or "nonwhite" are classified as "Other Entries". Data on all live birth and fetal death were based on the race of the mother.

Percents are calculated as follows:

Total	- indicator divided by all live births then multiplied by 100.
White	- indicator divided by all white live births then multiplied by 100.
Nonwhite	- indicator divided by all nonwhite live births then multiplied by 100.

Birth Rate - defined as the number of births per 1,000 resident population. Birth rates were obtained from Florida Vital Statistics. Midyear population estimates were furnished by the Office of Planning & Budgeting, Executive Office of the Governor.

Teen Birth Rate (fertility rate) - the number of births to age specific females per 1,000 female population of the same race and age group.

Teen Births - the number of births to females under age 20.

Low Birth Weight - infants who weighed less than 2,500 grams (5 lbs. 8 oz.) at birth.

Early Prenatal Care - births to mothers of all ages by race, and total who received prenatal care in the first three months of pregnancy.

Infant Mortality Rate - the number of deaths to individuals less than one year of age per 1,000 live births.

Teen Violent Death Rate - the number of deaths from homicides, suicides, and accidents to teens 15 to 19 years old, per 10,000 teens of the same race and age group. Rates should be interpreted with caution due to low numbers of teens or deaths in some counties.

Closure Status of Initial Report - the closure status of the initial report made to the Florida Abuse Hotline, which alleged maltreatment of a child by a parent, adult household member, or a person responsible for the child's welfare. Numbers reflect the most serious finding after the Family Service Response System has completed their investigation.

Verified and Some Indication Maltreatment - the number of maltreatments in which a protective service investigation determined that a specific injury or harm was the result of abuse, neglect, or threatened harm, or the investigation determined that there were some indicators that abuse, neglect, or threatened harm occurred. A maltreatment count.

Children Affected by Dissolution of Marriage - the minimum number of children under age 18 who were affected by the collective number of dissolution's of marriage. Data on marriage and dissolution of marriage are by place of occurrence only; there is no interstate exchange of these records. Florida dissolutions of marriage are granted only to legal residents.

### Education

Race is defined as follows:

- White, Non-Hispanic - a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East.
- Black, Non-Hispanic - a person having origins in any of the black racial groups in Africa.
- Hispanic - a person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban or South or Central American origin or other Spanish culture or origin regardless of race.

## Terminology and Sources

Public School Enrollment - the number of students enrolled in the Florida public school system. The student membership count is conducted in the Fall of each school year.

Non-Public School Enrollment - the number of students reported as in attendance in a private elementary or secondary school in Florida; based on a February count.

High School Competency Test (HSCT) - an untimed, multiple-choice test of a student's ability to apply basic mathematics and communication skills to real-world situations. It is administered to eleventh grade students and is a statewide graduation requirement. Data reflect the percent of eleventh grade students passing each section on the first attempt.

Disciplinary Actions - the number of disciplinary actions, including in-school suspensions, out-of-school suspensions, corporal punishments, expulsions and other alternative placements. More than one disciplinary action per student may have occurred during the year.

Non-Promotion - the retention of a public school student in the same grade rather than advancing the student to the next appropriate grade level.

Dropout - the number of students during the year who were age 16 or over and withdrew or voluntarily removed self from school before graduation for reasons including marriage, entrance into the military, failed HSCT, hardship, court action, expulsion, or pregnancy and did not receive any of the certificates of completion; did not meet the attendance requirements; did not transfer to any other school at any level (including vocational or adult) in or out of Florida; or, exceeded the maximum age for a disabled student in accordance with the district's policy.

Graduation Rate - the percentage is calculated by dividing the number of first time ninth graders into the number of students who receive, four years later, a high school diploma, a certificate of completion, a special certificate of completion, and students 19 years of age or younger who receive a general equivalency diploma.

Free and Reduced School Lunch Program - the National School Lunch Program of the Child Nutrition Program is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and administered through the Florida Department of Education. Schools and Residential Child Care Institutions are eligible to participate in the programs if they are nonprofit and serve children less than 21 years old. Eligibility is based on reported income. The calculation percent eligible, presented on the At A Glance pages, the denominator is the total public school enrollment for the State or the specific county. The calculation percent eligible by race, presented in the appendices, the denominator is the total eligible to participate (all races) for the State or the specific county.

### Youth and the Law

**Cases** - if the same juvenile was referred, for several offenses on the same date, these were counted as one case. If the youth was referred on another date for one or more charges, that would be counted as another case, always selecting the most serious offense for tracking purposes.

**Youths** - the measurement of Youths was developed to measure the number of delinquents in Florida rather than the number of times they get in trouble with the law. If the same youth is referred for several offenses during that year these would not be counted, using only the most serious offense charged during that period.

**Received or Referred**- the number of delinquency referrals reported to the Client Information System (CIS). The number of cases is counted by unduplicating the number of referrals reported received on the CIS by client identifier and the date the referral was received. The number of youths referred is determined by counting only the most serious offense for which a youth is charged during any fiscal year.

**Reported Detentions** - the number of delinquency cases or youths with a placement in detention during the interim between arrest and case disposition.

**Transfers to Adult Court** - the number of juvenile cases or youths reported on the CIS as having jurisdiction transferred for disposition in the state's adult courts. Transfers for processing in adult court can occur by direct filing of a bill of information by a state attorney, a waiver of jurisdiction by a juvenile court judge, or an indictment by a grand jury.
