ABSTRACT

This report presents data on enrollment, degrees conferred, faculty, and financing for West Virginia institutions of higher education. The data tables examine the characteristics of the 26 institutions in West Virginia's university and state college system, including five- and ten-year trends showing enrollment growth and progress in such areas as student access and diversity. A map showing institution locations and a list of the institutions precedes the tabular material. Tables are grouped into four chapters: (1) enrollment (1990-99), including credit headcount enrollment, full-time equivalent enrollment, in-state enrollment, student age distribution, and continuing education activity; (2) programs offered, degrees conferred, and completers of teacher certification programs, including programs and degrees at public and independent institutions, completers of approved teacher certification programs (1998-99), and total degrees conferred (1989-99); (3) faculty and staff characteristics, fall 1999, including academic rank of full-time instructional faculty, highest degree held by part-time faculty, age of full/part-time faculty, instructional faculty by ethnicity, tenure of instructional faculty, and average nine-month salary; and (4) fiscal data, 1998-99, including statements of current funds revenues, expenditures, transfers and other changes for the combined system, university system statements, state college system statements, and student tuition and fees. PREFACE

Statistical data on the enrollment, degrees conferred, faculty, and financing of West Virginia public higher education was first compiled in the early 1970's. Since 1982, this information, together with data from the state's independent colleges and universities, has been published in its present form as *The Statistical Profile of Higher Education in West Virginia*. Eastern West Virginia Community and Technical College was established during the 1999-2000 academic year, but its student data systems are currently administered by West Virginia Northern Community College. Therefore, in this issue of the *Statistical Profile of Higher Education in West Virginia*, Eastern West Virginia Community and Technical College will not have its enrollment and personnel statistics separately reported.

While the tables contained in this document only begin to depict the characteristics of West Virginia's twenty-six colleges and universities, the following pages offer insight into various dimensions of students, programs offered, degrees awarded, faculty, and finances. Five and ten-year trends indicate enrollment growth and progress in such areas as student access and diversity. Both the University System Board of Trustees and the State College System Board of Directors believe this kind of information is vital to their decision making.

This publication would not be possible without the continuing cooperation of numerous personnel at each of the public and independent institutions of higher education in the state. These individuals provide the data which form the basis for the tables in this report, and we gratefully acknowledge their assistance.



CHAPTER 1

Enrollment

The tables which follow summarize data submitted by West Virginia's public and independent institutions of higher education. Various information is collected throughout the entire academic year. This chapter illustrates this information for the three enrollment periods during the year, and shows data by the numerous indicators reported. Additionally, five and ten-year trends have been included. In order to present a more complete picture of enrollment, this chapter also includes a table summarizing continuing education activities.

Highlights of Public College and University Data

Fall 1999

- Credit headcount enrollment continued to rise to 76,751, a 0.58% increase over Fall 1998. Two-thirds of the institutions experienced growth in enrollment.
- Full-time, male, female, in-state, and out-of-state populations all saw increases in students.
- Eighty-six percent of students reported were classified as undergraduates; 80% were residents; 70% were full-time; and 55% were female.
- Total enrollment included 6.4% minority students, a slight increase over the Fall 1998 figure.
- The average student age has seen virtually no change since last year: 24.2 for undergraduate students and 25.6 for all students.
- Full-time equivalent enrollment was 61,477, a 0.73% increase over Fall 1998. Sixty percent of the institutions experienced an increase in FTE enrollment.

Definitions of the various enrollment categories used by the Central Office of the State College and University Systems appear on the following page.

DEFINITIONS

Career-Technical Student-A lower-level undergraduate enrolled in a postsecondary certificate, diploma, or associate degree program of less than four years which prepares students for immediate employment.

Continuing Education-Non-credit seminars, workshops, institutes, short courses, etc., serving individuals and entities in a variety of educational, research, and service roles.

Credit Headcount Enrollment-A physical count of students enrolled in one or more courses for credit.

First-Professional Course-A course designed primarily for students enrolled in a program leading to a first professional degree.

First-Professional Student-A student enrolled in a program leading to the first professional degree in Dentistry (D.D.S.), Law (J.D.), Medicine (D.O. or M.D.), or Pharmacy (Pharm.D.).

First-Year Graduate Student-A graduate student who is enrolled in a master's degree program or who has completed fewer than 36 semester hours of graduate credit.

Foundation Level Course-A course which is preparatory for admission to a career-technical, college transfer, or four-year or five-year bachelor's degree program.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Student-A statistic derived from the student credit hour output of an institution.

A. **Undergraduate FTE**: the equivalent number of students derived by dividing by 15 the total undergraduate student credit hours produced per semester in foundation, lower-level, and upper-level courses.

B. **First Professional FTE**: the equivalent number of students derived by dividing by 15 the total first professional student credit hours produced per semester in first professional courses (Law and Pharmacy only).

C. **Graduate FTE**: the equivalent number of students derived by dividing by 12 the total graduate student credit hours produced per semester in graduate courses.

D. **Medical FTE**: the same as the headcount enrollment (Dentistry and Medicine only).

Graduate Level Course-A course designed for students enrolled in a graduate degree program and normally limited to students holding a bachelor's degree.

Graduate Level Student-A student enrolled in a master's or doctoral degree program other than the first professional degree programs in Dentistry, Law, Medicine, and Pharmacy.

In-State Student-For West Virginia public institutions, a student who is paying in-state fees, excluding those involved in an SREB Common Market, Reciprocity, or Metro program; for West Virginia independent institutions, a student who lists West Virginia as the permanent address prior to enrolling in the institution.

Lower-Level Student-An undergraduate enrolled in a postsecondary career-technical, certificate, diploma, or associate degree program, in a two-year college transfer program, or in a four-year or five-year bachelor's degree program who has not completed the sophomore year.

Non-Credit Student-A student who is enrolled only in non-credit courses or who is auditing credit courses.

Out-of-State Student-For West Virginia public institutions, a student who is paying out-of-state fees or who is involved in an SREB Common Market, Reciprocity, or Metro program; for West Virginia independent institutions, a student who does not list West Virginia as the permanent address prior to enrollment in the institution.

Part-Time Student-A student enrolled for credits equal to fewer than 75 percent of the normal full-time load. For most undergraduates this would mean fewer than 12 semester hours.

Unclassified Student-A student who cannot be classified by level. Many unclassified students are permitted to take a limited or special selection of degree-credit courses without regard to requirements for a degree.

Undergraduate Student-A student who has not yet obtained a bachelor's degree.

Upper-Level Course-A course designed for juniors and seniors which is not normally open to freshmen and sophomores.

Upper-Level Student-An undergraduate enrolled in a bachelor's degree program who has completed the sophomore year.

CHAPTER 2

Programs Offered, Degrees Conferred, and Completers of Teacher Certification Programs

The tables in this chapter present degrees offered, degrees conferred, and completers of approved teacher certification programs during the 1998-99 academic year by the public and independent institutions of higher education in West Virginia, as well as ten-year trends in total degrees. The section detailing programs of study offered by West Virginia institutions includes certificate programs of one-year duration at the undergraduate level which the rest of the chapter omits.

Definitions

The National Center for Education Statistics' publication, *A Classification of Instructional Programs*, provided the background for the academic areas of study by which degrees were reported in this chapter.

Associate's Degree - A degree awarded upon completion of at least two, but fewer than four, years of work beyond high school.

Bachelor's Degree - A degree granted upon completion of an educational program requiring at least four, but not more than five, years of academic work in the liberal arts, sciences, or professional fields.

First Professional Degree - A degree which signifies the completion of the academic requirements for a selected profession, which is based on an educational program requiring at least two academic years of previous college work for entrance, and a total of at least six academic years of college work for completion. First professional degrees included in this report are the Doctor of Dental Surgery (D.D.S.), the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), the Doctor of Osteopathy (D.O.), the Juris Doctor (J.D.), and the Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.).

Master's Degree - A degree customarily granted upon successful completion of one (sometimes two) academic years of work in the liberal arts and sciences beyond the bachelor's degree. The master's degree in professional fields is an advanced degree beyond the first professional, but below the Ph.D., degree.

Post-Master's Degree - A degree awarded upon completion of an organized program of study beyond the master's degree, but which does not meet the requirements of academic degrees at the doctoral level.

Doctoral Degree - The highest academic degree in a given discipline or profession, based generally on three or more years of graduate work, satisfaction of a foreign language requirement, and completion of a special study resulting in a dissertation approved by a committee of the faculty.

CHAPTER 3

Faculty and Staff Characteristics, Fall 1999

The faculty tables in this chapter present faculty characteristics and remuneration at each West Virginia public institution of higher education. They include only those faculty who receive money disbursed by the institutions. The table on page 50 includes all instructional and other faculty; all other tables in this chapter exclude faculty in the medical/dental schools, although other health sciences faculty in the areas of nursing and pharmacy are included. These populations may differ from nationally recognized definitions for faculty, particularly those used in the data collections for the United States Department of Education, the American Association of University Professors, and the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

This chapter also contains a table showing classified and non-classified staff, including those in the medical/dental schools and other health sciences.

Definitions

Full-Time Classified and Non-Classified Staff: All employees other than faculty and who are employed by the institution in a full-time capacity.

Full-Time Instructional Faculty Member: A person employed by the institution in a full-time capacity, either in teaching and/or research with perhaps additional administrative or other duties. The full-time instructional faculty member's primary function is to teach. Graduate assistants, teaching fellows, lecturers, and laboratory assistants are included only if they meet the preceding criteria.

Full-Time Other Faculty Member: A person employed full-time in an academic capacity and granted faculty rank, but whose primary assignment is not instructional. These assignments may include extension, research, public service, etc.

FTE Instructional Faculty: A statistic combining the number of full-time instructional faculty members and the equivalent percentage for part-time instructional faculty members.

Highest Degree Held by Faculty: The number/percentage of faculty possessing a terminal degree (doctoral or professional) is one indicator of academic quality of an institution. The proportion of faculty with a doctorate also influences the expenditures for faculty salaries.

Nine-Month Salary: A typical academic year contract, which may be for nine or ten months of service to the institution. Whether the contract salary is paid in nine or twelve monthly increments is not relevant. The amounts shown under nine-month salary data do not include summer school salaries, which are not a part of the regular academic year. Salaries of faculty who are paid on a 12-month basis are multiplied by .818 to arrive at a nine-month salary.

Part-Time Faculty Member: A person employed in a part-time capacity, usually employed on a per-course basis. Part-time faculty do not usually receive fringe benefits, and, since remuneration is based solely on teaching load rather than on advising and administrative duties, pay may be at a substantially lower rate than that of full-time faculty.

CHAPTER 4

Fiscal Data, 1998-99

Traditionally, the higher education governing boards have played an active role in the management of all facets of public higher education. Among their many responsibilities are the supervision and control of the financial affairs of the public institutions. This chapter summarizes the current fiscal operations of the State College and University Systems of West Virginia. Information presented in this report is drawn from audited financial statements provided by each institution after the close of the fiscal year. The period covered by this report extends from July 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999.

Fiscal accountability initiatives of the two public higher education governing boards have been incorporated into the following pages. These initiatives require each institution to utilize standardized reporting categories and to change their current accounting practices from a cash basis to an accrual basis format to conform with reporting standards and principles established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and National Association of College and University Business Officers.

Tables in this chapter are grouped by system. Although certain comparisons among institutions and systems are possible, and often beneficial, the reader should recognize that any interpretations drawn may be distorted due to differences in mission, enrollment, academic programs, funding levels, geographic locations, faculty characteristics, and other factors. Institutions may also vary with respect to the degree to which they undertake research, public service, and provide services of a non-educational nature to students, faculty and staff.

Glossary of Terms

Revenue Category Descriptions:

Tuition and fees include all tuition and fees charged to students for educational purposes. Refunds to students are subtracted from the figure. The value of waivers is included in this amount with a corresponding amount shown in the expenditure for student aid.

Government appropriations include all unrestricted amounts received for current appropriations and all current restricted funds received that have been expended. These funds do not include governmental grants and contracts.

Government grants and contracts are those unrestricted resources received by grants, contracts, and cooperative agreements with government agencies for current operations, and all resources received through restricted grants, contracts and cooperative agreements to the extent expended.

Private gifts, grants, and contracts represent amounts received from non-governmental entities, including amounts received for the furnishings of goods and services of an instructional, research or public service nature. These amounts are also segregated into unrestricted and restricted classifications.

Income from investments category shows the amount of revenue generated from interest income and gains and losses on investments.

Sales and services of auxiliary enterprises are those entities operated for the purposes of providing goods, services and facilities to students, faculty and staff and for which a fee is charged for services. Examples of these enterprises are residence halls, food services, intercollegiate athletics, college unions and bookstores.

Sales and services of educational activities includes revenues that are incidental to the educational activities to which they are associated. These sources might include film rentals, laboratory testing services and publications revenues.

Other sources category accumulates a variety of items which might include miscellaneous rentals and sales, unallocated revenues, and other incidental receipts for which there is no specific category.

Educational and General Expenditures:

Instruction includes expenditures for all activities that are part of an institution's instructional program. This would incorporate 1) credit and non-credit courses; 2) academic, vocational, and technical instruction; 3) remedial and tutorial instruction; 4) regular, special and extension sessions; and 5) department chairpersons and administrators for whom instruction is an important role.

Research includes all expenditures for activities specifically organized to produce research, whether commissioned by an agency external to the institution or separately budgeted by an organizational unit within the institution.

Public service encompasses funds expended for activities established primarily to provide non-instructional services beneficial to individuals and groups external to the institution including community service and cooperative extension activities. This category is comprised of endeavors such as conferences, institutes, general advisory services, reference bureaus, radio and television, consulting, and similar non-instructional services to particular sectors of the community.

Academic support represents those funds expended for services that support the institution's primary missions. It includes libraries, museums, academic administration, educational media services, academic personnel development, course and curriculum development and other direct support of instruction, research and public service.

Student services includes expenditures for offices of admissions and the registrar and activities with the primary purpose of contributing to students' emotional and physical well-being, as well as intellectual, cultural, and social development outside the context of the formal instruction program. These programs would include student activities, cultural events, student newspapers, intramural athletics, student organizations, counseling and career guidance, student aid administration and student health services.

Operation and maintenance of plant incorporates all expenditures of current operating funds for the operation and maintenance of plant, including payments to provide services and maintenance related to grounds and facilities.

This category also includes utilities, insurance, fire protection, and similar items, but does not include expenditures made from the institutional plant fund accounts.

General institutional support reports the expenditures for central executive-level activities concerned with management and long-range planning for the entire institution such as planning and programming, legal services, fiscal operations, administrative data processing, space management, employee personnel and records, purchasing, security, and printing.

Scholarships and fellowships includes expenditures for scholarships, waivers, and fellowships from restricted or unrestricted funds. These are typically in the form of grants resulting from selection by the institution or from an entitlement program.

Transfers and Other Changes:

Transfers and (Additions) Deductions details the transfer of funds between fund group and other changes to the fund group that would not be appropriate to display elsewhere.

Auxiliary Enterprise Expenditures:

Auxiliary enterprise expenditures are those costs associated with furnishing goods and services to students, faculty, and staff which are not included in the Educational and General expenditures, and for which a fee is charged although not necessarily equal to the cost of the goods and services. It is intended that Auxiliary Enterprises be self-supporting.







Regular Student Tuition and Fees

Regular student fees in the State College and University Systems, although commonly referred to as tuition, are comprised of five distinct components: tuition, registration, higher education resource, faculty improvement and college fees. Funds generated by these fees are administered in different ways and used for various purposes as identified below:

Tuition Fees

With the exception of WVU Institute of Technology (WVUIT), WVU at Parkersburg, Potomac State College of WVU, WVU off-campus students and the WVU Medical Center, Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College and West Virginia Northern Community College funds collected from the Tuition Fee component are deposited in a single special revenue account of the Board and expended for debt retirement and projects, subject to legislative authorizations contained in the annual budget bill. The above designated institutions and extension programs and the WVU Health Sciences Center are permitted by separate sections of the State Code to retain their tuition fees in institutional special revenue accounts and use them to defray regular operating expenses.

Registration Fees

Funds collected at all institutions from this fee, except WVUIT, are also deposited in a single special revenue account for the board to expend for debt retirement, building repairs and alterations and capital improvement projects, subject to legislative authorizations contained in the annual budget bill.

Higher Education Resource Fee

The higher education resource fee is governed and authorized by West Virginia statute. Eighty percent of the money is retained at the campus for library and library related expenses as well as those expenses related to the improvement in quality and scope of student services. Twenty percent of the collections are to be expended by the boards for system operating costs excluding personal services. Currently, each board returns about fourteen of the twenty percent to the campuses and dedicates approximately half of the remaining six percent for student aid.

Faculty Improvement Fee

The faculty improvement fee is a statutorily created and directed fee. It is collected at each campus to implement, to the extent funds are available, the higher education minimum salary schedule for faculty which is defined in statute. However, this intent does not exclude the use of these funds for merit increases or salary adjustments that rectify inequities or accommodate competitive market conditions.

College Fees

College fees are authorized and governed by statute for the purpose of supporting extracurricular activities of the students. The governing boards annually approve all changes to be made in any of these fee components, relying extensively on institutional recommendations with respect to the college fees.
