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ABSTRACT

This report, comprised largely of statistical tables, presents Westchester Community College's (WCC) 1998 Fact Book. This report is divided into the following topics: accomplishments, administration, admissions, budget, curriculum, demographics, disabled students, enrollments, EOC, ESL students, faculty, financial aid, full time enrollment students, graduates, minorities, municipalities and legislature districts, non-credit, off-campus sites, physical plant, remedial education, student success rate, transfer, and WCC at a glance. WCC's significant institutional accomplishments for 1998-1999 are divided into two parts. Part 1 looks at significant accomplishments during the past academic year (1997-98), which outlines results for the following items: physical plan, senior personnel additions, program initiatives, fiscal activities, and degree and certificate changes. Part 2 looks at significant accomplishments during the current/next academic year (1998-99), which includes an outline of accomplishments for the physical plant, senior personnel additions, and program initiatives. 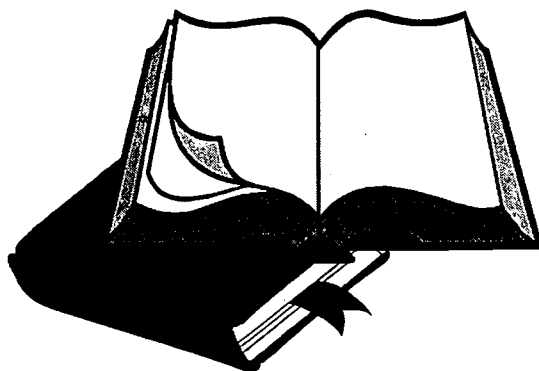

WESTCHESTER COMMUNITY COLLEGE (34000)

MISSION STATEMENT:

The mission of the Westchester Community College is to provide and foster life-long learning for the residents of the County. Through credit and non-credit courses and programs leading to an Associate Degree or college certificate, the College provides (at convenient on-and off-campus locations) high-quality, low-cost, comprehensive education to meet the career, transfer, avocation, remedial and recreational needs of the Westchester community. It seeks to be accessible, community centered, comprehensive, adaptable and dedicated to life-long learning.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

- Westchester Community College ranks among the 30 community colleges in the SUNY system: sixth in total credit student enrollments, and first in non-credit enrollments. We had a Fall, 1998 headcount of 10,603 students in credit classes, and a like number in non-credit courses.
- Diversity of the student body: a 56 percent of the total credit student body is female, and 35 percent students of color. In the 1998 graduating class, students were born in 39 other countries.
- Colleges to which Westchester Community College students have successfully transferred include all the other colleges in Westchester County, and to Wharton, Harvard, Vassar, Cornell, Columbia, Stanford, and Dartmouth.
- Percent of those who go straight to work upon graduation, and remain right here in Westchester County: 79%. They work for virtually all the major corporations in the County, small businesses, government, hospitals, etc.
- Average salary earned by first-time employees upon graduation from the College: \$33,000.
- DSS clients are being placed in work settings. 88 percent of the JobSTAR graduates have been placed in positions which have enabled them to get off welfare: 97 percent of their cases have been closed for a year or more. The average salary of the two-year graduates from these programs has been \$28,000; however, average salary of graduates from one-year certificate programs is only \$15,000.
- Amount of financial aid administered: \$7,457,808.
- Number of full-time students (unduplicated) receiving financial aid: 3,292.
- Numbers of programs of study at the College: 40 Degree programs granting an Associate Degree, and 17 Certificate programs.
- The Library now provides access to 26,000 libraries around the world through the OCLC system, and to 115 libraries and 6.5 million volumes and several select databases through the PALS-WALDO consortium. We have Internet access through the library.

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WESTCHESTER COMMUNITY COLLEGE (34000)

- The College's physical plant consists of 218 acres which includes 20 buildings, approximately 25 acres of parking lots and approximately 22.7 acres of athletic fields.
- All our public facilities have been made handicapped accessible.
- In addition to the lovely 218 acre campus, 13 off-campus sites offer courses to both credit and non-credit students. Over the past quarter of a century, the College has offered classes in over 33 public schools from Yorktown to Yonkers, 31 companies from AT&T to Texaco, 40 civic associations from the American Red Cross to the Yorktown Chamber of Commerce, in over 18 public libraries, from Armonk to Yonkers, in 4 penitentiaries, in 23 hospitals, and in 13 nursing homes. Accessibility is our watchword.
- The public uses the College facilities for more than just courses. Last year over 300,000 individuals used the facilities for meetings, from the American Heart Association's Save a Heart Program, to the BOCES Conference on Education, to the Lower Hudson Valley Citizen Bee Competition, the National Conference of Christians and Jews meeting, a free concert by the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, the Teachers College Roundtable on Quality Schooling, meetings of the Westchester Photographic Society, the Westchester Personal Computer Users Group, and many others.
- Cost per student in comparison to our sister 29 SUNY community colleges: \$600 less!
- The College provides continuing education to the populace of the County. On-site courses in business and industrial locations, distance learning via television and computer, and other novel ways bring the College closer to the people.
- The Westchester Community College Foundation raised \$2.3 million dollars from private sources for the Annual Fund and the Partners in Education campaign; distributed \$480,000 in scholarships and \$5,000 in emergency aid to students; established seven new \$75,000 faculty chairs; actively involved 150 volunteers in campus projects; sponsored thirty-five "friend and fund raising" events; and established a Native Plant Center, the first affiliate of the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center in Austin, Texas.
- The Office of College-community Relations expanded the College's Web site; initiated new print, electronic media, and public relations campaigns; instituted a series of new publications; and expanded the College's Speakers' Bureau.
- The Cultural Arts Fund expanded its outreach by sponsoring a greater number of multi-cultural performances for students and the community at large at the College.
- 100% of students (total of 40) completing EOC's EMT-D program passed State Certification Exam.
- Developed and implemented two new certification program including Computer Service Technician A+ Certification and Nurse Technician Program which leads to certification as EKG and Phlebotomy Technician.
- Enhanced and redesigned ESL program to transition students into vocational training program. Enhancements include appointment of an Assistant Professor/Coordinator, and Assistant Professor/Counselor (Spanish Speaking).
- Developed and implemented a Medical Billing and Coding Clerk program.

NEW INITIATIVES FOR 2000

- A series of new digital music electives will be offered at the Peekskill Facility.
- Among the new initiatives for the next year we plan to provide computer training for County employees.

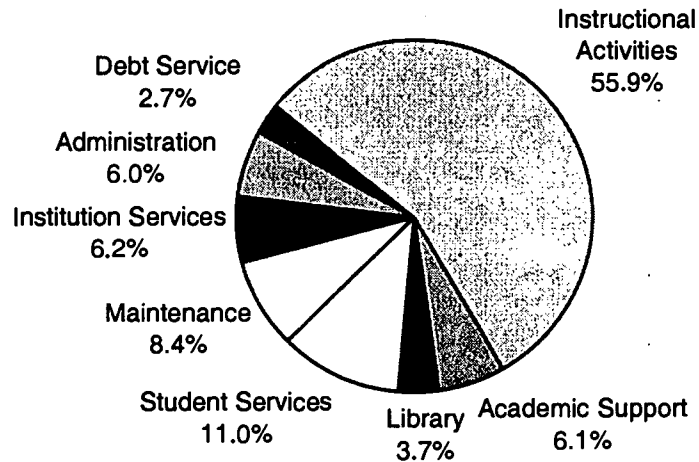

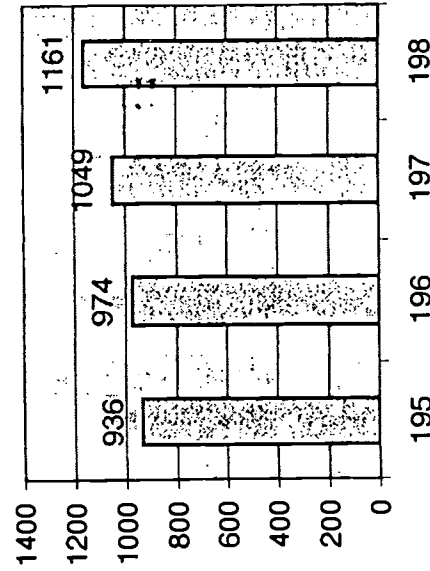

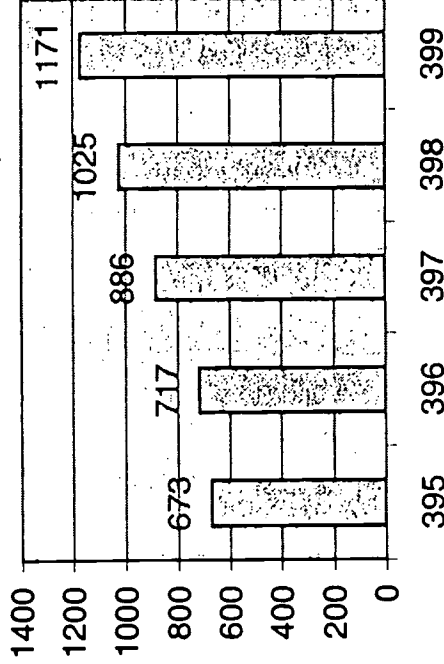

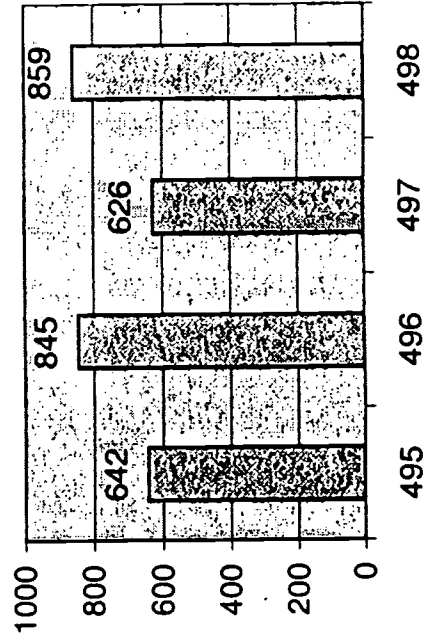
ESL Registrations, Fall Semesters, 1995-1998

ESL Registrations, Summer Terms, 1995-1998



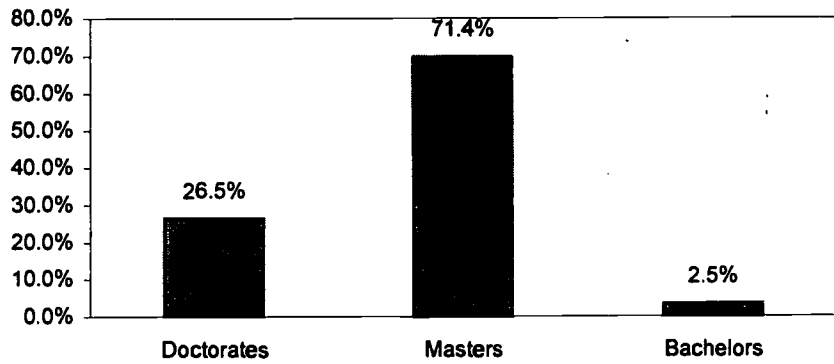

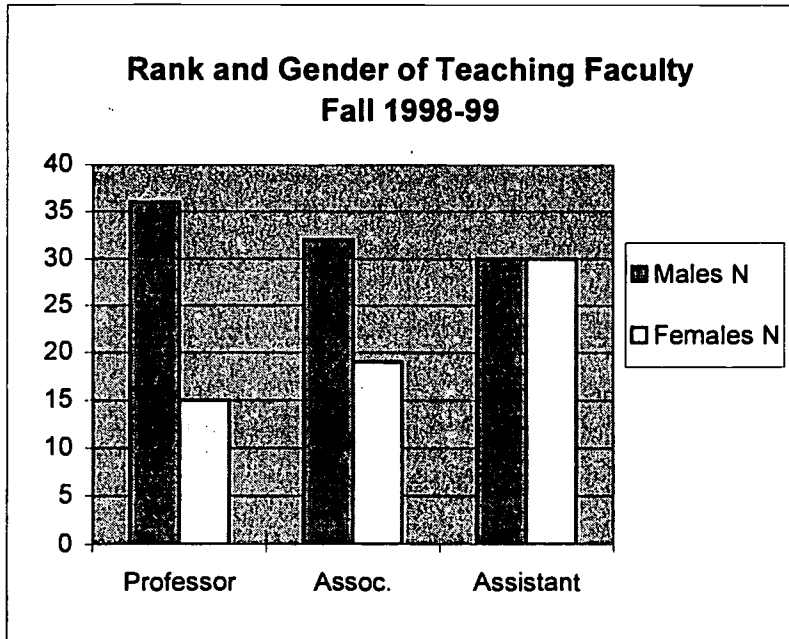
1998-1999 Full-time Faculty: Highest Degree Earned

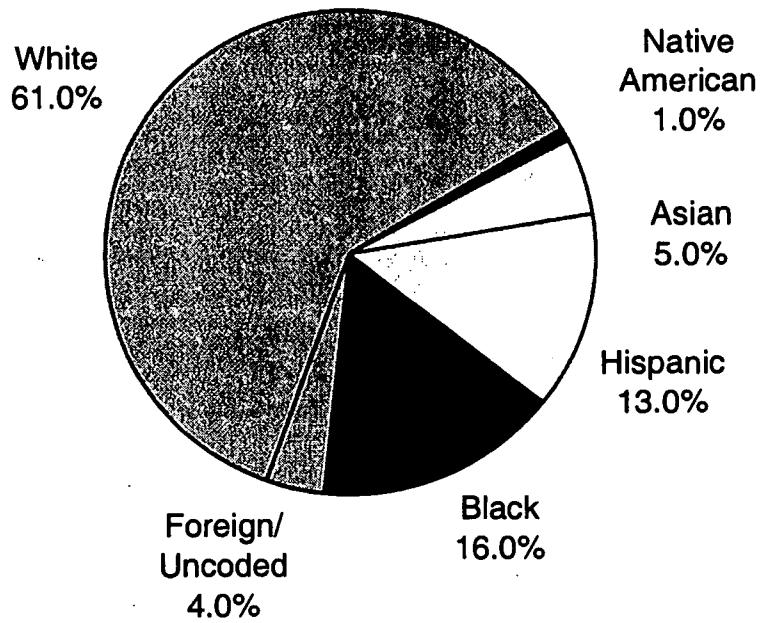

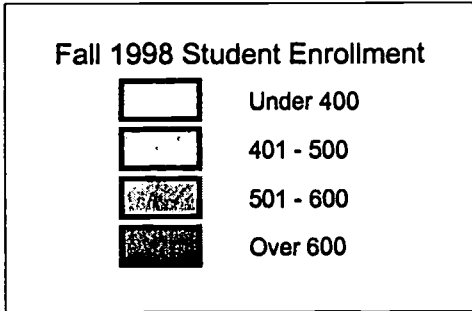
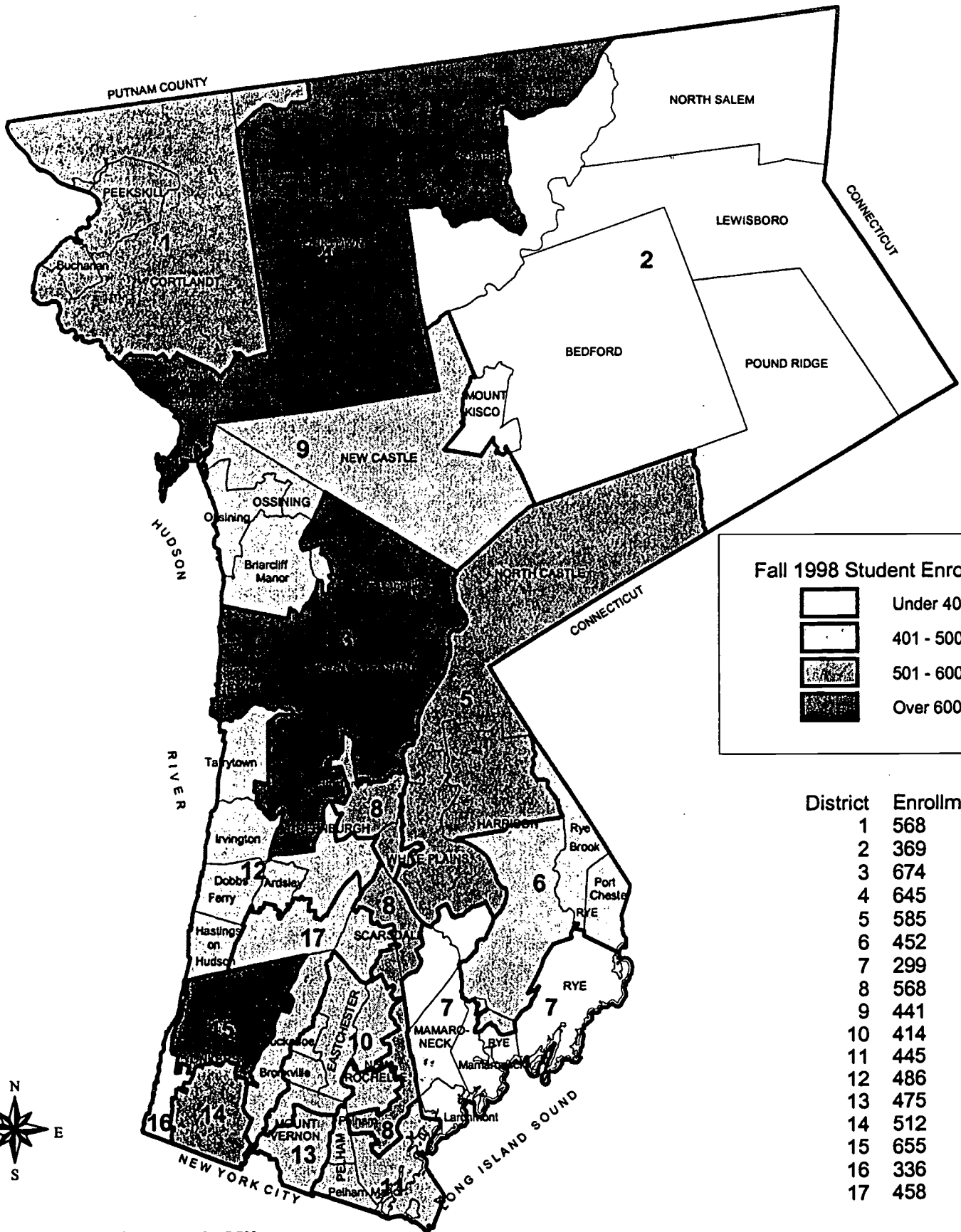

Using the guidelines set forth by the federal *Student Right to Know Act*, the completion rate for first-time, full-time students enrolled initially at Westchester Community College in Fall 1995 in a degree program who graduated within 3 years or transferred to a 4-year college without graduating is 397 out of 1,282 or 31.0%.

This is not the complete picture, however. Our studies show that many students take longer than three years to complete a degree. For example, of the first-time, full-time students who began in Fall 1995, 214 or 16.7% were still enrolled in Fall 1998. If these students are included, a total of 611 students or 47.7% have or are experiencing *student success* at WCC.

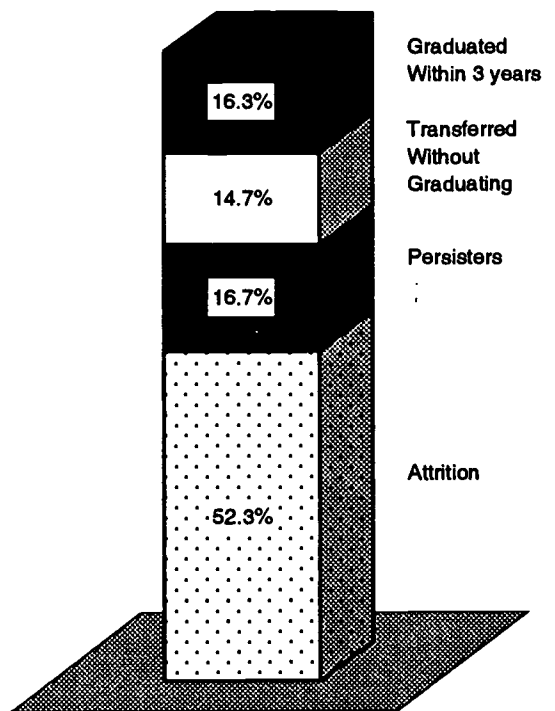
