## ABSTRACT

This publication presents data on student financial aid trends in the University of Wisconsin (UW) System. Tables include: an overview of student financial aid trends; sources of aid for UW System students; loans; grants; the Federal Work Study Program; characteristics of financial aid recipients; and student indebtedness. Highlights noted include: total financial aid dollars provided to UW System students (\$453.9 million); total loan dollars provided to UW System students (\$309.9 million); total grant dollars provided to UW System students (\$132.6 million); percentage of financial aid from federal, state, and institutional sources (83 percent, 8 percent, and 5 percent, respectively); total number of students receiving financial aid (81,237); and average loan debt of a Wisconsin resident receiving a bachelors degree in 1998-99 (\$14,835). Appended tables include: UW System financial aid dollars by institution, 1998-99; UW System financial aid recipients by institution, level, and residency for 1998-99; UW System student financial aid dollars by institution, level, and residency for 1998-99; state grants received by UW students; financial aid grants to UW System students; and proportion of financial aid grants to total aid. **OVERVIEW OF STUDENT FINANCIAL AID TRENDS**

Overall, 81,237 UW System students, 53 percent of total enrollment, received \$453.9 million in financial aid in 1998-99 (Table 1). Compared to 1997-98, the number of financial aid recipients increased by 1,492 and dollars increased by 13.2 million. More than one-half of the undergraduate students (56%) received some financial aid (including non-need based aid) in 1998-99.

**SOURCES OF AID FOR UW SYSTEM STUDENTS**

Five of every six financial aid dollars (83%) to UW students were provided or underwritten through a federal program (Table 2). Aid from state sources represented less than one-tenth (8%) of all aid, a percentage that has remained stable for the past four years. Institutional aid accounted for five percent of the aid received by UW students. Institutional aid is made up primarily of scholarships funded through sources such as private donations to UW institutions.

### **LOANS**

Loan aid continues to make up the largest component of financial aid to UW students. Loan dollars make up 68% of total financial aid dollars and 80% of financial aid recipients received some kind of loan (Table 3). Forty-two percent of enrolled UW System students received a loan in 1998-99.

**GRANTS**

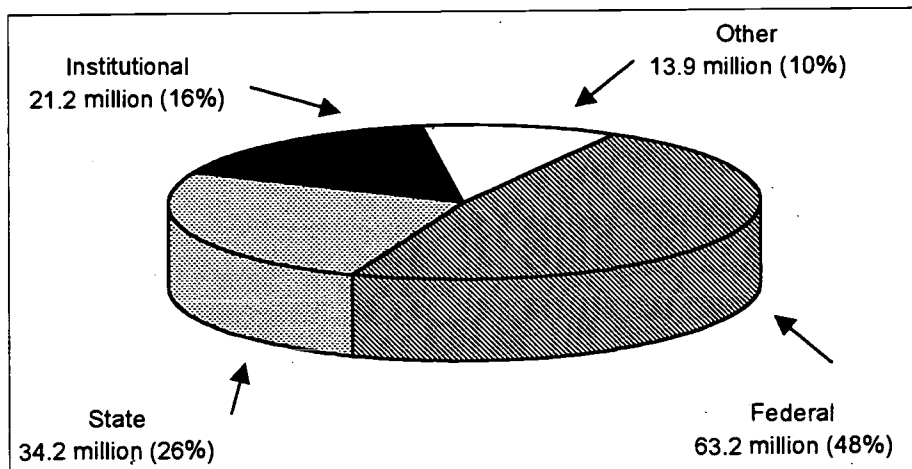
Grant aid made up 29% of financial aid dollars and 57% of financial aid recipients received a grant of some kind in 1998-99 (Table 4). The proportion of grant dollars to total aid increased two percentage points from the past year although the percentage of financial aid recipients who receive grants has remained steady for the past three years. However, the proportion of grant dollars to total aid remains well below that of the late 1980s and early 1990s.

In 1998-99, federal grants comprised the majority of grants (48%) received by UW System students followed by state grants at 26% (Figure 1). Grants in the "other" category are provided by other states to non-resident students.

The largest need based state grant program available to Wisconsin residents attending a UW institution is the Wisconsin Higher Education Grant (WHEG). Slightly more than one out of every six resident undergraduate students (17%) received a WHEG award in 1998-99 (Table 5). Other state grant programs are described in Appendix D.

**FEDERAL WORK STUDY**

In 1998-99, \$11.5 million dollars were provided through the Federal Work Study (FWS) program, a work program that includes both federal and state contributions. In 1998-99, 9,199 students participated in this program which accounted for 3% of all financial aid dollars (Table 6).

**CHARACTERISTICS OF FINANCIAL AID RECIPIENTS**

Twenty-eight percent of all aid recipients, 22% of undergraduate students and 86% of graduate students, were independent students and therefore received no parental contribution towards educational costs (Table 7). A higher percentage of non-resident undergraduate students are dependent (78%) compared to resident undergraduate students (71%).

Seventy-three percent of all enrolled UW System multicultural students received some form of financial aid in 1998-99 (Table 8). Ninety percent of these students had demonstrated financial need as defined by the Federal Needs Analysis Methodology.

**STUDENT INDEBTEDNESS**

UW resident undergraduate students who received loans (both need and non need-based) during their academic careers, had an average debt of \$14,835 at graduation in 1998-99 (Table 9). This represents a 4.5% increase from 1997-98. The proportion of resident undergraduate debt coming from non-need based loan programs continues to increase and has increased from 8% to 34% since 1990-91. Sixty-one percent of resident undergraduate students who graduated in 1998-99 had loan debt at graduation compared to 52% of graduates five years ago. Table 10 shows cumulative student loan debt by UW institution.

Although the percentage of students graduating with loan debt has increased in the past few years, the student loan default rate for UW System students fluctuated between 3.8% and 4.2% since 1992 (Table 11). The student loan default rate for UW graduates is significantly lower than the student loan default rate of all borrowers nationally showing that the great majority of student loan borrowers are able and committed to making their loan payments.

## TECHNICAL NOTES

This Informational Memorandum presents annual data on the amount of financial assistance provided to UW System students. Unless otherwise noted, figures are based on student financial aid data provided to UW System Administration by the UW institutions via the Financial Aid Central Data Request. The total number of aid recipient figures represent the total number of students (undergraduate, graduate, residents, non-residents) receiving any type of financial aid (with exceptions noted below). Students often received more than one type of aid so the cumulative total for students aided through grant, work, and loan programs will not equal the grand total. Other important caveats include:

- Details in the text and tables may not add due to rounding.
- The data reported in this Informational Memorandum do not include graduate assistantships/fellowships and tuition remission grants.
- Work study includes only dollars provided through the Federal Work Study program and ROTC. It does not capture other on and off-campus employment.
- Loan data do not include private non-federally-guaranteed borrowing activity.
- Residency for fee-purposes is determined by the Registrar at each institution. Non-residents are defined as all students with residency other than "resident" including Minnesota and Michigan reciprocity agreement students. Students with missing residency information have been included with Wisconsin residents.
- Graduate enrollment includes enrollment in professional programs.
- Financial need is defined by Federal Needs Analysis methodology.
