ABSTRACT

The information in this publication was reported by state education agencies to the National Center for Education Statistic for the Common Core of Data. It relates to student membership in public schools and school districts in the United States and outlying areas during the 1998-1999 school year , and to revenues and expenditures for fiscal year (FY) 1997. The 100 largest public school districts, representing less than 1% of all school districts in the United States were responsible for the education of 22.9% of all public school students. These districts employed 20.6% of U.S. public school teachers and accounted for 16.6% of all public schools and 18.9% of public high school graduates. The 100 largest school districts had larger school sizes than the average school district and higher mean pupil/teacher ratios. Three states, Florida, Texas, and California, accounted for about 40% of the 100 largest school districts. The proportion of minority students in these districts was 66.9%, compared to 38.8% in all school districts, and 52% of students in these districts were eligible for free and reduced price lunch, compared with 38% of students in all school districts. In FY 1997, current expenditures per pupil in the 100 largest school districts ranged from a low of \$2,902 in Puerto Rico to a high of \$11,578 in the Newark School District, New Jersey. While the numbers of students, teachers, and schools has increased between 1988-1989 and 1998-1999, the proportion of the national total that the 100 largest school districts comprised was essentially unchanged. Highlights

The information provided in this publication was reported by state education agency officials to the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) for the Common Core of Data (CCD). It relates to student membership in public schools and school districts in the United States and outlying areas during the 1998–1999 school year, and to revenues and expenditures for fiscal year 1997.

- The 100 largest public school districts, representing less than 1 percent (0.6) of all school districts in the nation, were responsible for the education of 22.9 percent of all public school students (table A).
- The 100 largest districts employed 20.6 percent of the nation's public school teachers, and accounted for 16.6 percent of all public schools and 18.9 percent of public high school graduates (table A).
- The 100 largest school districts had larger school sizes than the average school district (705 compared to 510). In addition to larger school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also had a higher mean pupil/teacher ratio, 18.3 to 1 compared to 16.5 to 1 for the average school district (table A).
- Three states, Florida, Texas, and California, accounted for about 40 percent of the 100 largest school districts (appendix D).
- The proportion of minority students in the 100 largest school districts was 66.9 percent compared to 38.8 percent in all school districts (table C).
- Among schools that reported free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, 52 percent of the students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible for free and reducedprice lunch compared to 38 percent of all students in reporting states (table C).
- In fiscal year 1997 (1996–1997 school year), current expenditures per pupil in the 100 largest school districts ranged from a low of \$2,902 in the Puerto Rico Department of Education to a high of \$11,578 in Newark School District, New Jersey (table 10).
- While the numbers of students, teachers and schools has increased between 1988–1989 and 1998–1999, the proportion of the national total that the 100 largest school districts comprised was essentially unchanged (table D).

Discussion

Introduction

This publication provides basic descriptive information about the 100 largest school districts (ranked by student membership) in the United States, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of Defense (overseas) schools and outlying areas (American Samoa, Guam, Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands). For the sake of simplicity, when discussing characteristics, the term "nation (or United States)" is used to refer to all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of Defense (overseas) schools and outlying areas. This is different from most NCES reports, which only include the 50 states and the District of Columbia in the United States totals. Almost one in every four public school students in this nation is served by one of these 100 districts. They are distinguished from smaller districts by characteristics in addition to sheer size, such as average and median school size, pupil-teacher ratios, number of high school graduates, number of pupils receiving special education services, and minority enrollment as a proportion of total enrollment.

Information about the characteristics cited above is found in the fourteen basic tables. Four text tables provide national and 100 largest school district data and precede the basic tables for the purpose of establishing a meaningful context for the information on the 100 largest districts. Following the basic tables, appendix A lists the 500 largest school districts with some identifying information and basic statistical data. Appendix B is an alphabetical list of the 500 districts and their rank by size. Appendix C provides the same data as table 1 but for the 1988–1989 school year. Appendix D provides the number of the 100 largest districts by state. On all basic tables and appendices, with the exception of appendix B and D, districts are presented by decreasing order of size.

Overview of the 100 Largest Districts

In the 1998–1999 school year, there were 16,542 public school districts, over 92,000 schools and 47.4 million students in public education in the United States and its outlying areas. There were 2.9 million teachers in the 1998–1999 school year and 2.5 million high school graduates in the 1997–1998 school year. The 100 largest school districts made up less than 1 percent of all total public school districts but served 23 percent of the total public elementary and secondary school students (table A).

The 100 largest school districts represent 17 percent of schools and employ 21 percent of all teachers. The 500 largest districts make up 3 percent of all school districts and serve 20.2 million students, or 43 percent of the total public elementary and secondary school student population in the United States.

All of the 100 largest school districts have at least 45,000 students and 25 of these school districts have over 100,000 students. The largest school district in the country is the New York City Public Schools, with 1,072,628 students enrolled in 1,162 schools. (The New York City School District is so large it has more students than the sixth-through tenth-ranked school districts added together). The second largest school district is the Los Angeles Unified School District with 695,885 students in 650 schools (table 1). The New York City and Los Angeles Unified School Districts are larger in size than twenty-seven states, five outlying areas, and the Bureau of Indian Affairs and Department of Defense (overseas) schools¹.

Ninety-two of the 100 largest districts reported staff by type. In 88 of those districts, 45 percent or more of their staff were teachers, and in 4 of these districts over 60 percent were teachers. At the national level, 52 percent of staff were teachers¹. Only 16 of the 92 districts that reported staff by type had over 1 percent of their staff assigned to district administration (table 11).

Where Are the 100 Largest School Districts?

The District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico each have only one school district for the entire jurisdiction, and each is represented among the 100 largest school districts (table 1). There are 34 states and jurisdictions that contain at least one of the 100 largest school districts. Two states,

Florida and Texas, each have 14 districts among the 100 largest, California has 11. Only a few other states have more than one district represented in the 100 largest: Georgia and Maryland each have 5, Louisiana, North Carolina, Tennessee, Utah, and Virginia each have 4, Ohio has 3, and Arizona, Colorado, Minnesota, Nevada, and New York have 2. The following states each have one school district among the 100 largest: Alabama, Alaska, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Washington, and Wisconsin (appendix D).

As expected, these 100 largest districts tend to be in cities and counties having large populations, with administrative offices typically located in large cities and their environs. Many of the districts are in states where the school districts have the same boundaries as counties. Over 70 percent of these districts are located in coastal and gulf coast states.

How Do These Districts Compare With the Average School District?

General Characteristics

By definition, the 100 largest school districts are large, and when compared to the membership distribution of all school districts, they are considerably larger than most. In the 1998–1999 school

year, 71 percent of all regular school districts² had memberships of fewer than 2,500 students while all of the 100 largest school districts had memberships of at least 45,000 students (table 1). Even though only 14 percent of regular school districts had 5,000 or more students, 68 percent (or 2 out of 3) of students were served by these districts (table B) (see the Methodology section for a definition of regular districts and schools).

The average school district in the United States has 5.6 schools compared to the 100 largest school districts, which average 154.1 schools per district (table A). Two of the largest school districts, New York City Public Schools and the Puerto Rico Department of Education, have over 1,000 schools (table 1). The 100 largest school districts, on average, serve considerably more students (108,579 compared to 2,863) and employ more teachers (5,933 compared to 174) per district than the average school district in the nation (table A).

School Characteristics

The 100 largest school districts have more students per school than the average school district, 704.5 compared to 509.8 (table A). In fact, 12 of the 100 largest school districts had an average regular school³ size of over 1,000 students (table 4). In addition to larger school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also have a high mean pupil/teacher ratio, 18.3 to 1 compared to 16.5 to 1 for the average school district (table A). Among the 100 largest districts, half the schools in the Jefferson County School District, Kentucky were below the median pupil/teacher ratio of 24.0 to 1 and half the schools in the St. Paul School District, Minnesota were above the median pupil/teacher ratio with 9.8 to 1 (table 7).

The number of high school graduates as a percentage of all students in the 100 largest school districts was lower than that of the average school district: 4 percent of students were graduates in the 100 largest school districts compared to 5 percent for the average school district (table A).

Seventy-four of the 100 largest school districts reported Title I eligible schools and programs. The percentage of Title I eligible schools in the 74 districts varied widely, from less than 1 to 95 percent. Furthermore, of the 74 districts reporting, a large number reported that these schools were also Title I school-wide eligible (table 12).

Student Body Composition

The 100 largest school districts are not homogeneous and certain student characteristics, such as race/ethnicity, poverty level, and disability status, vary across the districts.

The 100 largest districts, with 23 percent of the nation's public school students, served 40 percent of the 18.4 million minority public school students⁵. The proportion of minority students in the 100 largest school districts is almost double the proportion of minority students in all public schools. In the 1998–1999 school year, 67 percent of the students in the 100 largest school districts were minority students compared to 38 percent of students nationally (table C). In fact, 8 out of the 10 largest school districts had over 75 percent minority student membership (table 8).

The numbers of student in different racial/ethnic categories are reported at the school level and are aggregated up to the school district level. The national figure was calculated by taking the percent of minority students among those districts that reported race/ethnicity (99.2 percent of districts) and applying this to the total number of public school students.

Even with the relatively high minority membership in the 100 largest school districts, 44 of the 100 largest school districts report 50 percent or more of their students as white, non-Hispanic (table 9). Of these 44 districts, 11 reported minority representation of less than 25 percent of their student body (table 8). In 18 of the 100 largest districts, half or more of the membership is black, non-Hispanic. Ten districts report the majority of students are Hispanic; 3 of these are among the largest 5 districts. In Hawaii, which is one district, the majority of the students are Asian/Pacific Islanders. It is also interesting to note that San Francisco Unified School District has 49.9 percent Asian/Pacific Islander students (table 9).

The 100 largest school districts also have a disproportionate percentage of students eligible for the free lunch program relative to all public school districts. Among schools that reported free lunch eligibility, 52 percent of students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible compared to 38 percent of students in all districts (table C). Of the 90, 100-largest school districts that reported data on free lunch, 42 districts reported over 50 percent of their students eligible for the free lunch program (table 9).

Twelve percent of students in the 100 largest school districts had individualized education programs (IEPs) for students with disabilities. In the largest school district, New York City Public Schools, 14 percent, or 147,674 students, were reported to have IEPs (table 3). Only 3 percent of schools in the 100 largest school districts were special education schools (table 2).

Revenues and expenditures for fiscal year 19976

In school year 1996–1997, \$307 billion dollars were collected for public elementary and secondary education in the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and outlying areas: 22 percent (\$69 billion) of this revenue went to the 100 largest school districts. Of the \$69 billion revenue to the 100 largest school districts, a little less than one-third (\$20 billion) was received by the 5 largest school

districts (New York City Public Schools, Los Angeles Unified, Puerto Rico Department of Education, City of Chicago School District, and Dade County School District). The dollars from the federal government received by 99 of the 100 largest school districts comprised from 2 to 16 percent of all revenues to the district, the exception was Puerto Rico (28 percent) (derived from table 10).

The 100 largest school districts spent \$60 billion (22 percent) of the \$273 billion in current expenditures spent on the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and outlying areas in 1996–1997. The two largest school districts, New York City Public Schools and Los Angeles Unified, spent one out of every five dollars expended by the 100 largest school districts. All of the 100 largest school districts devoted more than 50 percent of their current expenditures to instruction. Of the 100 largest school districts, New York City Public Schools spent the greatest proportion, 71 percent, on instruction.

The current expenditures per pupil were \$5,923 for all districts in the 50 states and the District of Columbia, slightly higher than the \$5,653 in the 100 largest school districts. Of the 100 largest school districts, 15 districts spent more than \$7,000 per pupil (with Newark City School District, New Jersey, spending the most at \$11,578 per pupil) and one school district, Puerto Rico Department of Education, spending less than \$3,000 per pupil (table 10). (See the Methodology section for a further definition of specific revenues and expenditures).

Changes in the 100 largest school districts between 1988 and 1998

While there was a lot of movement within the 100 largest school districts over time, between the 1988–1989 and 1998–1999 school years, the 100 largest districts remained very similar. Only 10 of the 100 largest districts in the 1998–1999 school year were not in the 100 largest in the 1988–1989 school year. Clark County School District in Nevada was the only district to move into the largest 10 districts between these years (it moved from a rank of 19 in 1988–1989 to 9 in 1998–1999) (table 1 and appendix C). Clark County includes the Las Vegas metropolitan area, which was the fastest growing metropolitan area in the country in the early nineties?

The number of students in the 100 largest school districts increased by 16 percent between 1988–1989 and 1998–1999, the number of teachers increased by 34 percent, and the number of schools increased 9 percent. However, while the numbers of students, teachers and schools in the 100 largest school districts have increased between these two years, the proportion of the national total these numbers comprised was essentially unchanged. For example, the number of students in the 100 largest school districts went from 23.2 percent of all districts in 1988–1989 to 22.9 percent in 1998–1999 (table D).

Basic Tables

Table 1 presents basic data: numbers of students receiving educational services; full-time equivalent (FTE) teachers; 1997–1998 graduates; and schools for each of the 100 largest districts. Also shown is information to fully identify each school district and its city, state, and county, since the name of the district is not always sufficient for this purpose. On this and all the other tables, the districts are shown in decreasing order of size (pupils in membership as of October 1998). Since the districts are arrayed by number of pupils, it is easy to note the differences in the numbers of teachers, graduates, and schools as they relate to districts of similar size. For example, Prince George's County Public Schools, Maryland, though smaller in size than San Diego City Unified, California, has more graduates and teachers.

For all school districts other than the Massachusetts and Tennessee school districts, the teacher count was derived from the school universe survey. (For a more detailed description of the surveys see the methodology section).

Table 2 presents the number of schools in the 100 largest districts, by type of school. All but one of the districts have specialized schools devoted to special, vocational, or alternative education. It can be seen from this table that districts vary widely in their use of specialized versus general schools in educating students with special needs. This table also includes schools that do not have students.

Table 3 presents the numbers of students assigned to these schools. It should be noted that students attending a specialized school are often counted at their nonspecialized (regular) home school rather than at the specialized school they attend. The number of students having Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act-Part B, is shown in the last column of table 3.

NOTE: In tables 4 through 9, only schools with student membership (or regular schools with student membership, as specified in table 4) are used in the data sets from which these tables are derived. In tables 5 through 9, this restriction to schools with membership was required to determine pupil membership by grade in order to determine school categories.

Table 4 provides information on school characteristics in the 100 largest school districts by displaying an array of school size (pupils in membership) at different percentile levels, as well as mean school size for each district (computed using regular schools having membership). For example, in New York City Public Schools the table shows that the smallest 25 percent of the schools have a pupil membership of 558 or fewer, while the largest 25 percent have a membership of 1,166 or more. Dividing all the students in regular schools by the number of such schools yields a mean, or average, size of 961.9 students. If all the regular schools in New York City were listed by size, the school at the mid-point on the list (the median) would have 817 pupils in membership.

The average school size ranges from a low of 410.3 pupils (Puerto Rico Department of Education) to a high of 1,263.3 (Gwinnett County School District, Georgia) for these districts. The largest school in these districts, and also the largest school in the United States, is the 5,296-student Roosevelt Senior High in the Los Angeles Unified District, California.

In table 5, data are given on the number of students assigned to graded (three categories) and ungraded levels. In accounting for their students, 54 of the 100 largest districts assign all of their students to numbered grades and 46 use the "ungraded" status for some students in some settings,



such as special education, vocational education, and other specialized and alternative programs. In this table, students assigned to all types of schools are counted in the grade for which they are reported.

Table 6 answers the question of how many "elementary" and "high" schools there are in the 100 largest school districts. Since nearly every conceivable grade span is found among the 15,000 schools in the 100 largest districts, the following four categories are used: primary (low grade of prekindergarten to 3; high grade up to 8), middle (low grade 4 to 7; high grade 4 to 9), high (low grade 7 to 12; high grade 12), and other (all other configurations, including PK, K, or 1 to 12). Although 95 of these school districts have some schools in the "other" category, only in the Puerto Rico school system is the number very high (226, or 15 percent). However, there are several districts in Florida in which the proportion of schools that are other than primary, middle or high exceeds that in Puerto Rico, although their absolute numbers do not. These are: Volusia and Polk Counties (21 percent); Pinellas County (20 percent) and Palm Beach County School District (19 percent).

Table 7 presents median pupil/teacher ratios for the schools found in the categories established in table 6. Since teacher counts by school were not available for Massachusetts and Tennessee, no pupil-teacher ratio could be calculated for the districts in these states. Among the 100 largest districts, the median pupil/teacher ratio for all schools in a district varied from 9.8:1 in St. Paul School District, Minnesota to 24.0:1 in Jefferson County School District, Kentucky.

Table 8 gives the number of schools in each district in five ranges of percent minority student membership, as well as the overall minority student percentage for each district. In this report, minority is defined as all race/ethnicities other than white, non-Hispanic. Eight out of the 10 largest school districts have more than 75 percent minority student membership.

Whereas table 8 deals with the number of schools in each district having a strong minority presence of any kind, table 9 presents the percentage of students in the district by specific racial/ethnic category. This table illustrates that some school districts are made up of many minority groups while others have high concentrations of one minority group. For example, the New York City Public Schools have 38 percent Hispanic students and 36 percent black students while the Philadelphia City School District has a much higher percentage of black students (65 percent) than any other minority group.

Also shown in table 9 is the number of students eligible for free and reduced-price lunch. Responses in this data category were available for 90 districts out of the 100 largest. Among these districts, the percentages of students eligible for free and reduced-price lunch under the National School Lunch Program vary greatly. Of the 90 districts that did report free and reduced-price lunch, 42 districts reported that over 50 percent of their students were eligible for free and reduced-price lunch.

Table 10 deals with the school district revenues and expenditures and is based on fiscal year 1997 (which is school year 1996-1997) local government financial data collected by the Governments Division of the U.S. Census Bureau. It presents the amount of revenue received by source (local, state, and federal); current expenditures and those current expenditures for instruction; and, current expenditures per pupil in membership for fiscal year 1997. Data for Puerto Rico were obtained from the National Public Education Financial Survey. Among the 100 largest school districts, Newark City School District, New Jersey, had the highest expenditure per pupil (\$11,578), and Puerto Rico Department of Education, the lowest (\$2,902). Overall, there were 15 school districts with per pupil expenditures greater than \$7,000 and 4 school districts with per pupil expenditures less than \$4,000.



Table 11 presents the different types of staff in each district. Teachers represented the largest proportion of staff, followed by other staff (instructional support, guidance counselors, library media staff, LEA administrators, School Administrators, and other staff). Of the 92 districts reporting staff by type, 88 districts reported that 45 percent or more of their staff were teachers, 4 districts had over 60 percent teachers. For those districts that did not report one of the staff categories the percentage distribution across all types of staff could not be calculated.

Table 12 reports the number and percentage of students in Title I eligible schools and school-wide programs. The 1998–1999 school year was the first year the CCD collected this information. Not all states were able to report this information. The percentage of Title I eligible schools in districts that provided the information varied widely, from less than 1 to 95 percent. Of 70 districts that reported at least one Title I school, 26 reported that 100 percent of Title I schools were also Title I school-wide eligible.

Table 13 also reports new data items for the 1998–1999 school year, magnet and charter schools. Only 50 of the 100 largest districts reported magnet schools, while 80 districts reported they had charter schools. Most districts reported no magnet or charter schools.

A few of the new items for 1998–1999 asked for the numbers of students receiving services for limited English Proficient (LEP) and migrant students. Table 14 reports these totals for those districts that provided this new information. Fifty-two of the 100 largest districts reported the number of students receiving migrant services in the previous school year. Fresno Unified School District, California, reported the most migrant students served at 8,983 students. Fresno also reported the most migrant students served in migrant summer services, 5,155. Seventy-two of the 100 largest districts reported students served in limited English Proficient (LEP) programs. Santa Ana Unified School District, California, reported the highest percent LEP students, 67.9 percent.

How to read this table: Using Dade County as an example, the table shows that smallest 25 percent of the schools have a pupil membership of 635 or less, while the largest 25 percent have a membership of 1,322 or more. If all the regular schools in Dade County were listed by size, the school at the mid-point on the list (the median) would have 889 pupils in membership. Dividing all students in regular schools by the number of such schools yields a mean, or average, size of 1,098.6 students. The standard deviation is a measure of how schools in the district are distributed between the minimum and maximum compared to the mean. Smaller standard deviations indicate the schools in the district are closer to the mean value while larger standard deviations indicate that school size is spread more widely across the range of possible values.

Methodology

The primary source of the nonfiscal data for this report is the 1998–1999 Common Core of Data (CCD). Information was reported to NCES by state education agencies in the spring of 1999. There are three nonfiscal CCD surveys collecting basic descriptive data on public education in the nation: the school (Public School Universe Survey), local education agency (Local Education Agency Universe Survey), and state (State Nonfiscal Survey) forms. Fiscal data are gathered at the state level by NCES in the National Public Education Finance Survey (NPEFS) and at the local level in the Annual Survey of Local Government Finances (F-33 series of the Census of Local Governments) conducted by the Governments Division of the Bureau of the Census. The most recent year for which data are available from the Annual Survey of Local Government Finances is 1997. A CCD coordinator in each state education agency provides all responses. Since the information is supplied by state education agencies, any data item missing for one school district is generally missing for other districts in the same state.

Districts represented in this report are of various physical sizes and geographic locations. Three of the 100 largest districts, District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico, are also states. Some districts comprise a good deal of a state's total student membership, while others make up only a fraction of the state's total student membership.

Response Rates

Notwithstanding the item nonresponse situations cited below, most of these data represent school-district level figures. District-level data were provided by all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Department of Defense (overseas) schools, and five outlying areas: American Samoa, Guam, Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. The Bureau of Indian Affairs and Department of Defense (overseas) schools and the outlying areas are included in the national totals in this report.

Item Nonresponse

There were some items for which data were not available at the desired levels. The following nonresponse situations in the CCD school and agency universe surveys relate to information presented in this report: no teacher counts for Massachusetts and Tennessee (school universe); no data on free lunch eligibility for Arizona, District of Columbia, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, and Washington (school universe).

Fiscal national data were taken from the 1996-1997 NPEFS. Fiscal data for Puerto Rico were taken from the 1996-1997 NPEFS as well.

Definitions

Alternative Education School—A public elementary/secondary school that: 1) address needs of students that typically cannot be met in a regular school, 2) provides nontraditional education, 3) serves as an adjunct to a regular school, or 4) falls outside of the categories of regular, special education, or vocational education.

Bureau of Indian Affairs schools and districts—A school or district that is directly funded by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of the Interior.

Charter school—A new CCD data item in the 1998-1999 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. A school which provides free public elementary and/or secondary education to eligible students under a specific



charter granted by the state legislature or other appropriate authority, and designated by such authority to be a charter school.

Current expenditures—Funds spent for operating local public schools and local education agencies, including such operating expenses as salaries for school personnel, student transportation, school books and materials, and energy costs, but excluding capital outlay and interest on school debt.

Federal revenues—Federal revenues include direct grants-in-aid to school or agencies, funds distributed through a state or intermediate agency, and revenues in lieu of taxes to compensate a school district for nontaxable federal institutions within a district's boundary.

Free and reduced-price lunch eligible—Number of students who are eligible for the Free and Reduced-Price Lunch Program under the National School Lunch Act. Any school that reported more than 95 percent eligible students is adjusted on the CCD files to 95 percent for reasons of student confidentiality. Caution should be used when interpreting these data, six states did not report free lunch eligibility, many others may have included reduced price lunch students or reported participation instead of eligibility data.

Graduates—Students who completed the course of public elementary and secondary education offered by the school district and who received a high school diploma, high school equivalency, or other requirements of completion as defined by state law or policy during the period September 1997 through August 1998.

Guidance counselors—Professional staff assigned specific duties and school time for counseling students and parents, learning problems, evaluating student abilities, and assisting students on career and personal development.

Individual Education Program (IEP)—As used here, refers to written instructional plan for students with disabilities designated as special education students under the Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA-Part B) which includes: 1) statement of present levels of educational performance of a child; 2) statement of annual goals, including short-term instructional objectives; 3) statement of specific educational services to be provided and the extent to which the child will be able to participate in regular educational programs; 4) projected date for initiation and anticipated duration of services; and 5) appropriate objectives, criteria and evaluation procedures and schedules for determining, on at least an annual basis, whether instructional objectives are being achieved.

Instructional expenditures—Current expenditures for activities directly associated with the interaction between teachers and students. These include teacher salaries and benefits, supplies (such as textbooks), and purchased instructional services.

Instructional support staff—Includes instructional coordinators and supervisors and instructional aides.

LEA administrators—Local education agency superintendents, deputy and assistant superintendents, and other persons with district-wide responsibilities such as business manager and administrative assistants.

Limited-English-Proficient (LEP) Students—A new CCD data item in the 1998-1999 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. Individuals who 1) were not born in the United States or whose native language is a language other



than English; or 2) come from environments where a language other than English is dominant; or 3) are American Indians and Alaskan Natives and who come from environments where a language other than English has had a significant impact on their level of English language proficiency; and who, by reason thereof, have sufficient difficulty speaking, reading, writing, or understanding the English language, to deny such individuals the opportunity to learn successfully in classrooms where the language of instruction is English or to participate fully in our society.

Library/media staff—Professional staff members who are assigned specific duties and school time for professional library and media service activities. Includes library/media specialists and support staff.

Local revenues—Include revenues from such sources as local property and nonproperty taxes, investments, and revenues from student activities, textbook sales, transportation and tuition fees, and food service revenues.

Magnet school—A new CCD data item in the 1998-1999 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. Regardless of the source of funding, a magnet school or program is a special school or program designed to attract students of different racial/ethnic backgrounds for the purpose of reducing, preventing, or eliminating racial isolation and/or to provide an academic or social focus on a particular theme.

Migrant students— A new CCD data item in the 1998-1999 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. A migrant student as defined under 34 CFR 200.40: 1) (a) Is younger than 22 (and has not graduated from high school or does not hold a high school equivalency certificate), but (b), if the child is too young to attend school-sponsored educational programs, is old enough to benefit from an organized instructional program; and 2) A migrant agricultural worker or a migrant fisher or has a parent, spouse, or guardian who is a migrant agricultural worker or a migrant fisher; and 3) performs, or has a parent, spouse, or guardian who performs, qualifying agricultural or fishing employment as a principal means of livelihood; and 4) has moved within the preceding 36 months to obtain or to accompany or join a parent, spouse, or guardian to obtain, temporary or seasonal employment in agricultural or fishing work; and 5) has moved from one school district to another; or in a state that is comprised of a single school district, has moved from one administrative area to another within such district; or resides in a school district of more than 15,000 square miles, and migrates a distance of 20 miles or more to a temporary residence to engage in a fishing activity. (Provision 5 currently applies only to Alaska.)

Other staff—Includes support staff for local education agencies, schools, student support services and other areas such as data processing, health, transportation, etc.

Per pupil expenditure—Current expenditure for public elementary and secondary education in a state divided by the student membership. The numbers reported here, based on membership, can be expected to be smaller than per pupil expenditures based on average daily attendance, because the membership counts are generally larger than average daily attendance.

Public school—An institution that provides educational services and has the following characteristics:

- Has one or more grade groups (prekindergarten through grade 12) or is ungraded;
- Has one or more teachers to give instruction;
- Is located in one or more buildings or sites;
- Has an assigned administrator;



- Receives public funds as primary support;
- Is operated by an education agency.

Pupil/teacher ratio—The ratio of pupils to teachers in a school district, based on the total number of pupils (student membership) and the total full-time-equivalent (FTE) number of teachers reported in the schools associated with the school district. The pupil/teacher ratio is not a class size but rather a district level measure of pupils and teachers.

Pupils in membership—Count of all students whose names have been entered on the roll, minus those whose names have been withdrawn, on or before the closest school day to October 1. Membership counts at the district level may include students for whom the district is providing educational services through some other agency or institution.

Regular school—A public elementary/secondary school that does not focus primarily on vocational, special, or alternative education. It is possible for a regular school, just like a vocational, special, or alternative education school, to have no students in membership.

Regular school district—Agency responsible for providing free public education for school-age children residing within their jurisdiction. This category excludes local supervisory unions that provide management services for a group of associated school districts; regional education service agencies that typically provide school districts with research, testing, and data processing services; state and federally operated school districts; and other agencies that do not fall into these groupings.

Revenues—Additions to assets which do not incur an obligation that must be met at some future date, do not represent exchanges of fixed assets, and are available for expenditure by the local education agencies in the state. Revenues include funds from local, intermediate, state, and federal sources.

School administrators—Staff members whose activities are concerned with directing and managing the operation of a particular school.

Schools having membership—Schools at which students are counted for administrative purposes, even though the students may attend one or more other schools for all or part of their school day.

Special Education School—A public elementary/secondary school that: 1) focuses primarily on special education, including instruction for any of the following: hard of hearing, deaf, speech-impaired, health-impaired, orthopedically impaired, mentally retarded, seriously emotionally disturbed, multi-handicapped, visually handicapped, deaf and blind; and 2) adapts curriculum, materials or instruction for students served.

State revenues—State revenues include both direct funds from state governments and funds in lieu of taxation. Revenues in lieu of taxes are paid to compensate a school district for nontaxable state institutions or facilities within the district's boundary.

Teachers—The total number of classroom teachers for ungraded and all PK-12 graded classes in a school or district, state in full-time-equivalencies (FTE).

Title I school—A new CCD data item in the 1998-1999 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. A school designated under

appropriate state and federal regulations as being high poverty and eligible for participation in programs authorized by Title I of Public Law 103-382.

Title I school-wide—A new CCD data item in the 1998-1999 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. A program in which all the students in a school are designated under appropriate state and federal regulations as being high poverty and eligible for participation in programs authorized by Title I of Public Law 103-382.

Vocational Education School—A public elementary/secondary school that focuses primarily on vocational education, and provides education and training in one or more semi-skilled or technical operations.




