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ABSTRACT

This 1999-2000 statistical report contains numerous data tables and figures on institutions of higher education in Pennsylvania. The data were compiled from annual surveys of the state's colleges and universities and are presented in the categories of basic student charges, fall enrollments, residence of students, degrees conferred, faculty and staff, and finance. Pennsylvania data are compared with national data drawn from the results of surveys conducted by the U.S. Department of Education, National Center for Education Statistics (NCES). Major findings include: (1) the increase in undergraduate basic charges was greater than the Consumer Price Index; (2) female enrollments have outpaced male enrollments; (3) over 78 percent of total enrollees were Pennsylvania residents; (4) the largest growth in degrees conferred occurred at the first-professional and graduate levels; (5) Pennsylvania had the ninth-highest average salary for full-time instructional faculty on nine-month contracts among public four-year institutions in the nation in 1997-98; and (6) total current-funds revenues for public institutions rose to \$5.6 billion in 1998-99, an increase of 6.5 percent; expenditures rose similarly. 

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INTRODUCTION

The 1999-00 Education Digest includes data on basic student charges, fall enrollments, residence of students, degrees conferred, faculty and staff, and finance. Data is compiled from annual surveys of Pennsylvania colleges and universities.

In 1999-00, Pennsylvania had 146 colleges and universities consisting of 34 public and 112 private institutions. In addition, there are private licensed schools in Pennsylvania authorized to grant specialized associate degrees in business or technology (ASB or AST degrees). In 1997-98, the latest year for which data was available, there were 92 schools with this degree-granting authority.

Pennsylvania data is compared with national data drawn from the results of surveys conducted by the U.S. Department of Education, National Center for Education Statistics (NCES).

BASIC STUDENT CHARGES

The increase in undergraduate basic student charges (tuition, required fees, and room and board) from 1998-99 to 1999-00 was greater than the increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for state universities, state-related commonwealth universities, community colleges (tuition and required fees only), private colleges and universities, and private two-year colleges. The average annual increase in undergraduate basic student charges for each institutional category was also higher than the average increase in the CPI for the past 10 years.

For an analysis conducted by NCES, tuition and fees were weighted by the number of full-time equivalent undergraduates in 1997, but were not adjusted to reflect student residency. Also, room and board charges were based on full-time students. This analysis showed that Pennsylvania had the sixth highest undergraduate basic student charges among public four-year institutions in the nation in 1998-99. In Pennsylvania these institutions charged on the average \$10,074 against the national average of \$8,018. The five states with charges higher than Pennsylvania were located in the northeastern United States. Vermont institutions had the highest average (\$12,209). The average for Pennsylvania private four-year colleges and universities was the ninth highest. These institutions charged on the average

\$22,774 compared to the national average of \$19,970. Massachusetts had the highest average (\$26,747) among this category of institutions.

FALL ENROLLMENTS

Total enrollments reached 589,838 in 1999. In addition, 57,452 students pursuing ASB or AST degrees were enrolled in private licensed schools in 1997-98, the latest year for which data was available. This figure, if combined with college and university students, would place the number of people pursuing a postsecondary degree at approximately 647,000.

Between 1990 and 1992, college and university total enrollments increased an average of 1.9% each year, peaking in 1992 at 587,977. A period of decline beginning in 1993, averaging 0.9% each year, brought the total to 568,222 in 1996. Much of this decline was in part-time enrollments. Total enrollments then began a period of growth averaging 1.3% each year, with all the increase concentrated in full-time enrollments.

The number of full-time female enrollments has been increasing consistently for more than 10 years, reaching 215,478 in 1999. Male full-time enrollments peaked in 1992 at 185,278, declined every year through 1996 to 178,621 and increased to 188,558 in 1999.

Since 1990, the percentage increase in female enrollments at each level far exceeded that of their male counterparts. Specifically, female undergraduate enrollments increased 3.2%; graduate, 18.8%; and first-professional, 49.1%. Comparatively, male undergraduate enrollments increased 2.2%; and first-professional, 11.1%. Male graduate enrollments actually decreased by 0.7%.

Postsecondary enrollments nationally and in Pennsylvania followed a similar pattern over the past decade. Current NCES projected data indicates that in the near future enrollments at the national level will increase similar to the period between 1996 and 1999. Pennsylvania secondary enrollments continue to increase, and therefore, it is expected Pennsylvania postsecondary enrollments will follow the national pattern.

RESIDENCE OF STUDENTS

Over 78% of the total enrollees (undergraduate, first-professional and graduate) were Pennsylvania residents in Fall 1999. Pennsylvania residents represented 80.8% of all enrollees at the undergraduate level, 69.5% at the graduate level and 58.7% at the first-professional level. Of the total enrollment, minority students from Pennsylvania comprised 10.6%, while minority students from out-of-state comprised 3.8%.

The Fall 1998 survey collected data on first-time students only but provided more detail about their residence. This data showed percentages similar to Fall 1999 when aggregated into the categories: in-state, out-of-state and foreign.

DEGREES CONFERRED

The total number of degrees conferred was 105,425 in 1998-99. In addition, private licensed schools conferred 9,053 ASB or AST degrees in 1997-98, the latest year for which data was available. This figure, if added to the number of degrees from colleges and universities, would bring the total number of postsecondary degrees conferred to 114,478.

In 1998-99, the largest numbers of associate degrees were conferred in the fields of business (3,406) and health (3,112). At the bachelor's degree level, the largest fields of study were business (12,766), education (6,964), social sciences (5,994) and health (5,257). The largest fields at the master's degree level were business (5,317) and education (5,039). At the doctor's degree level, the largest fields were education (381) and engineering (320). The largest numbers of first-professional degrees were conferred in health (2,244) and law (1,530).

Growth in colleges and universities at the national and state level showed similar trends. The largest growth over the past decade was at the first-professional and graduate levels. Between 1989-90 and 1998-99, first-professional enrollments and graduates in Pennsylvania increased 22.8% and 17.9%, respectively. During this same period, graduate enrollments increased 12.1%. Master's and doctor's degrees increased 41.1% and 8.1%, respectively.

Increases in the number of minorities and females receiving degrees were reflective of the enrollment picture. Since 1988-89, minority enrollments and graduates increased 64.9% and 86.5%,

respectively. Much of this increase was due to the rising number of Asian/Pacific Islander and Hispanic students. By comparison, white enrollments decreased 0.1% while white graduates increased 7.6%. Between 1989-90 and 1998-99, the number of female enrollees and graduates increased 6.5% and 21.5%, respectively, while males increased 1.2% and 2.3%, respectively.

FACULTY AND STAFF

The total number of staff employed in 1999-00 was 142,986. Of that number, 92,194 were full-time and 50,792 were part-time. Of the total, 46.1% were instructional, 6.7% managerial, 16.4% other non-teaching professionals and 30.8% nonprofessional staff. The percentage of minority full-time employees was 14.4%, while whites comprised 83.7% and nonresident aliens 1.9%.

A separate annual survey was conducted on the salaries, tenure and fringe benefits of full-time instructional staff. In 1999-00, there was a total of 22,782 full-time instructional faculty with 9- or 12-month contracts. The average salary of full-time instructional faculty on 9-month contracts for selected ranks (professor, associate professor, assistant professor and instructor), among private four-year institutions, was highest (\$83,218) for private state-aided institutions. Among public institutions, the highest (\$63,117) was for state-related commonwealth universities.

Pennsylvania had the ninth highest average salary for full-time instructional faculty on 9-month contracts among public four-year institutions in the nation in 1997-98 (the latest data available), \$58,310 against the national average of \$54,114. Of the states with an average salary higher than Pennsylvania, four were not located in the northeastern United States. California had the highest average salary in the nation (\$65,009), followed by Connecticut (\$64,812) and New Jersey (\$64,640). The average salary for Pennsylvania private four-year institutions was the tenth highest. These institutions paid on the average \$56,150, against the national average of \$54,379. Massachusetts paid the highest average salary in the nation (\$66,058) among this category of institutions, followed by Connecticut (\$64,819) and New Jersey (\$63,562).

FINANCE

This section includes data for public institutions only. Private institutions are excluded because national accounting procedures for private institutions changed from a current-funds to an entity-wide model in 1996-97 while public institutions remained unchanged. Furthermore, a crosswalk being developed at the national level has not been completed.

Total current-funds revenues for public institutions rose to \$5.6 billion in 1998-99, an increase of 6.5% from 1997-98. The rise in revenues was a result of increases in most line items, particularly tuition and fees, followed by hospitals and government grants. Of the total, tuition and fees comprised the largest source of revenue at 29.8%. Similar to revenue, total current-funds expenditures rose to \$5.6 billion, an increase of 7.3% from the previous year. Hospital and research expenditures were a major source of increase. Instruction accounted for 27.9% of the total expenditures.

The latest national data for public institutions remains 1995-96. National data showed current-funds revenues changed by 30.0% from 1990-91 to 1995-96. In contrast, the change for Pennsylvania was 35.9%, which was higher than any of the states contiguous to Pennsylvania. Among these states, current-funds expenditures in Delaware showed the highest percent of change (33.9%), with Pennsylvania and New Jersey tying for second with 32.7%. During the same period, Ohio registered the smallest percent of change in revenues (18.9%) and expenditures (17.8%) among the contiguous states.

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OVERVIEW

For 1999-00, average undergraduate basic student charges (tuition, required fees, and room and board) at four-year colleges were \$23,064 for students attending private state-aided institutions, \$21,303 for private colleges and universities, \$11,677 for state-related commonwealth universities, \$8,655 for state universities and \$7,839 for theological seminaries. The average for private two-year colleges and the college of technology was \$14,933 and \$8,996, respectively. For community colleges, the average tuition and required fees were \$2,105.

The average increase in undergraduate basic student charges from 1998-99 to 1999-00 was highest for private two-year colleges (5.4%). Increases for other categories of institutions were: state universities, 4.4%; state-related commonwealth universities, 4.3%; private colleges and universities, 3.4%; community colleges, 3.1%; theological seminaries, 1.9%; and college of technology, 1.5%. The average for private state-aided institutions decreased by 3.0% as a result of the addition of Johnson Technical Institute. This two-year institution had tuition equal to half of the previous year category average.

The average annual increase in the CPI (1982-84 = 100) for the period July 1990 through June 2000 was 2.9%. However, over the past ten years, the average annual increase in undergraduate basic student charges ranged from 4.3% for theological seminaries to 5.9% for state universities as well as for private colleges and universities.






AVERAGE ANNUAL INCREASE IN UNDERGRADUATE IN-STATE TUITION

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OVERVIEW

Total enrollments in 1999 reached 589,838, an increase of 10,362 (1.8%) from the previous year.

With the exception of community colleges and the college of technology, enrollments in all institutional categories showed increases. The decrease in community colleges occurred mostly in part-time enrollments. The growth in the national economy, resulting in better job opportunities, may have caused many part-time students to move to full-time employment.

Total enrollments increased by 4.2% since 1990. The analysis by level of enrollment showed undergraduate enrollments peaked in 1992 at 491,453, declined to 471,484 by 1996 and increased to 488,962 in 1999. Graduate enrollments peaked in 1994 at 82,505, declined to 80,582 by 1996 and increased to 83,211 in 1999. Enrollments in first-professional programs increased every year, with the exception of 1997, and registered a ten-year high of 17,665 in 1999.

Females had the largest percentage of enrollments in all age groups in 1999. This was most pronounced in the 50-64 age group where females outnumbered males approximately 2 to 1.

Male enrollments increased by 4,811 and female enrollments increased by 5,551 in 1999 when compared with the previous year. However, female enrollments grew at a faster rate than male enrollments since 1991. When reviewed by enrollment status, the percentage of females enrolled full-time grew from 60.6% in 1991 to 66.2% in 1999, an increase of 5.6 percentage points, while full-time male enrollees increased from 69.7% to 71.3%, an increase of 1.6 percentage points.

Minority enrollments made significant progress, increasing from 82,476 in 1998 to 85,350 in 1999, an increase of 2,874 students. Minority enrollments have also been increasing faster than nonminority enrollments during the past decade. Since 1990, the proportion of minority enrollments increased from 10.0% to 14.5% in 1999. Specifically, the proportion of black enrollments jumped from 6.2% to 8.4% during the same period. On the other hand, the nonminority proportion decreased from 87.5% to 82.3%. Nonresident alien enrollments increased from 2.5% in 1990 to 3.2% in 1999. Since 1990, more than 50% of nonresident aliens were enrolled at the graduate level.

1990 AND 1999




R E S I D E N C E O F S T U D E N T S

OVERVIEW

Data on the legal residence of all students is collected biennially in odd numbered years. The data is classified into three categories: in-state; out-of-state; and foreign. Data on first-time students is collected biennially in even numbered years which provides more detail about residence (by state, state unknown, individual U.S. territory and foreign). This data can also be aggregated easily into the categories as established for the survey on residence of all students.

Based on the 1999 total enrollments in Pennsylvania colleges and universities (589,838), 78.5% were Pennsylvania residents, 18.3% were out-of-state residents and 3.2% were residents of foreign countries. Enrollments in public institutions had a significantly larger percentage of Pennsylvania residents than private institutions. Specifically, of the total enrollments in public institutions, 89.3% were Pennsylvania residents, 8.5% were out-of-state residents, and 2.2% were residents of foreign countries. Data for private institutions showed that 63.0% were Pennsylvania residents, 32.4% were out-of-state residents and 4.6% were residents of foreign countries. Private state-aided institutions had the largest percentage of out-of-state students at the undergraduate and first-professional levels.

Excluding foreign students, minorities comprised 13.6% of the in-state students and 20.9% of the out-of-state students in 1999. Most of the difference was attributed to the Asian/Pacific Islander and Hispanic categories at all enrollment levels. Overall, Asian/Pacific Islander comprised 3.0% of in-state students and 7.6% of those from out-of-state, while the Hispanic percentages were 1.7 and 3.9, respectively.

The total first-time freshmen enrollments increased from 104,210 in Fall 1998 to 108,611 in Fall 1999. The number of Pennsylvania residents in this category changed from 80,905 to 84,286, an increase of 4.2%. During the same time period, the number of Pennsylvania residents enrolled as first-time first-professional, as well as first-time graduate students, decreased. Specifically, first-time first-professional decreased from 2,822 to 2,509, a decrease of 11.1% and first-time graduate students decreased from 12,587 to 12,378, a decrease of 1.7%.

D E G R E E S C O N F E R R E D

OVERVIEW

Degrees conferred totaled 105,425 in 1998-99, a 0.5% increase over 1997-98. The largest growth was at the first-professional level, which increased 3.9%. Bachelor's and master's degrees increased 0.8% and 0.7%, respectively. Associate degrees dropped for the fourth consecutive year, decreasing 0.6% from 1997-98. Most of this decrease was at the community colleges, where enrollments dropped steadily between 1992 and 1997. Degrees conferred at the doctor's level decreased 8.5%.

Since 1989-90, the total number of degrees conferred increased 12.3%. The largest percentage increase was at the master's level (41.1%), followed by first-professional (17.9%), associate (9.1%), doctor's (8.1%), and bachelor's (5.7%).

Between 1989-90 and 1998-99, an average of 61.9% of all degrees were conferred at the bachelor's level. The four largest fields of study were business, education, health and social sciences. Degrees conferred in these four areas represented 52.1% of the bachelor's degrees in 1989-90 compared to 48.4% in 1998-99. The most significant change was a decrease of 4.3 percentage points in business. Social sciences decreased 1.0 percentage point, while education and health increased 0.6 and 1.2 percentage points, respectively.

The percentage of white graduates dropped from 89.4% to 83.3% since 1989-90, while minorities grew from 7.5% to 12.2% and nonresident aliens increased from 3.1% to 4.5%. Increases in the minority percentages over the past decade were: Asian/Pacific Islander, 1.9 percentage points; black, 1.9 percentage points; Hispanic, 0.9 percentage point; and American Indian/Alaskan Native, 0.1 percentage point.

Females earned 52.2% of the degrees conferred in 1989-90, compared to 56.5% in 1998-99. The percentages of degrees awarded to females in 1998-99 were: associate, 64.3% (up from 62.3% in 1989-90); bachelor's, 56.1% (up from 52.5%); first-professional, 43.9% (up from 35.7%); master's, 56.1% (up from 48.8%); and doctor's, 43.9% (up from 34.8%).

1989-90 AND 1998-99




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OVERVIEW

In 1999-00, there was a total of 20,570 full-time instructional faculty on 9-month contracts making an average salary of \$60,024. In addition, 2,212 full-time instructional faculty on 12-month contracts made an average salary of \$61,399.

When only selected ranks are used (professor, associate professor, assistant professor and instructor), the percentage of full-time instructional faculty with tenure on 9-month contracts increased from 63.1% in 1990-91 to 65.0% in 1999-00, but decreased for faculty on 12-month contracts from 49.2% to 35.0%. The percent of males with tenure on 9-month contracts increased by 1.2 percentage points, while the percent of females with tenure increased by 7.4 percentage points.

Over the past decade, the average salary for selected ranks of full-time instructional faculty on 9-month contracts rose at a faster rate than the CPI (2.9%). The average yearly salary increases since 1990-91 for the selected ranks were between 4.2% and 4.8%. Since 1990-91, the average yearly salary increases for full-time instructional faculty at public and private institutions were higher than the average increase in the CPI by 1.2 and 0.7 percentage points, respectively.

In 1999-00, a total of 92,194 full-time employees were working in all occupational categories. These were comprised of 83.7% whites, 14.4% minorities and 1.9% nonresident aliens.





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OVERVIEW

Beginning with 1996-97, the finance survey was changed from current-funds to an entity-wide model for private institutions while it remained unchanged for public institutions. Due to this major change, finance data for 1995-96 continues to be the latest available for private institutions. Data for 34 public institutions is presented for 1998-99.

Current-funds revenues for public institutions in 1998-99 totaled \$5.6 billion. Of the total, revenues from tuition and fees (29.8%) was the largest source, followed by government appropriations (23.4%). Revenues from all government sources accounted for 38.5%. Total current-funds expenditures were also reported as \$5.6 billion. Of that total, educational and general expenditures represented 77.8%, of which 27.9% was for instruction. Hospital expenditures accounted for the second largest expenditure function (13.5%).

Tuition and fees comprised 27.9% of all revenues for public institutions in 1994-95 and 29.8% in 1998-99, an increase of 1.9 percentage points. During the same period, hospital revenues dropped from 14.2% to 13.0% of the total, a decline of 1.2 percentage points. Separation of The Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine from a teaching hospital in 1997-98 contributed to the decline in hospital revenues in 1997-98. However, hospital revenues showed an increase of 16.1% in 1998-99.

Expenditures for instruction comprised 29.4% of all expenditures for public institutions in 1994-95 and 27.9% in 1998-99, a decrease of 1.5 percentage points. During the same period, expenditures for academic support accounted for an increase of 0.9 percentage point, from 7.6% to 8.5%. Both scholarships and fellowships, and research expenditures rose 0.8 percentage point, 6.2% to 7.0 % and 9.5 % to 10.3%, respectively.

APPENDIX A

GLOSSARY

ACADEMIC SUPPORT - A category of college expenditures for support services that is an integral part of the institution's primary mission of instruction, research and public service. Includes expenditures for libraries, galleries, audio/visual services, academic computing support, ancillary support, academic administration, personnel development and course and curriculum development. Includes expenditures for veterinary and dental clinics if their primary purpose is to support the institutional program.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE - A degree based on at least two but less than four years of full-time equivalent college work.

AUXILIARY ENTERPRISES - A revenue and expenditure category including essentially self-supporting operations that exist to furnish a service to students, faculty or staff and which charge a flat fee that is directly related to, although not necessarily equal to, the cost of the service.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE - A degree based on at least four but not more than five years of full-time equivalent college work.

BASIC STUDENT CHARGES - Includes tuition, required fees and room and board charges for a full-time undergraduate, graduate or first-professional educational program.

BOARD CHARGES - Charges for a 7-day meal plan. Where a 7-day meal plan is not available, 6-day or 5-day meal plans are used in calculating the averages. The averages do not include board charges at branch campuses.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI) - A measure in the average change of prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services which covers all urban consumers (CPI-U) consisting of approximately 80% of the total population. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups such as professional, managerial and technical workers; the self-employed; short-term workers; the unemployed; retirees and others not in the labor force.

CONTRACT STATE - A state having a contract with a Pennsylvania college for which students are charged a reduced tuition for certain programs. The contract state for the University of Pennsylvania is New Jersey. For the Pennsylvania College of Optometry, the contract states are Delaware, Nebraska, North Carolina, Virginia and West Virginia.

CURRENT-FUNDS EXPENDITURES - The costs incurred for goods and services used in the conduct of the institution's current operations. Current-funds expenditures include both restricted and unrestricted expenditures.

CURRENT-FUNDS REVENUES - All funds, both restricted and unrestricted, available for financing the operations of the institution. These revenues do not include restricted current funds received but not expended because these revenues have not been earned.

DOCTOR'S DEGREE - A degree normally based on at least three years of graduate work beyond the bachelor's degree, usually granted as a Ph.D. in any field or Doctor of Education, Doctor of Juridical Science, Doctor of Public Health, etc.

EDUCATION AND GENERAL EXPENDITURES - The sum of current-funds expenditures on instruction, research, public service, academic support, student services, institutional support, operation and maintenance of plant, scholarships and fellowships and educational and general transfers.

ENDOWMENT FUNDS - Funds whose principal is nonexpendable and that are intended to be invested to provide earning for institutional use (includes term endowment and quasi-endowment funds).

EXECUTIVE, ADMINISTRATIVE AND MANAGERIAL - Employees who exercise responsibility for the management of the institution or of a customarily recognized department or subdivision thereof.

FIRST-PROFESSIONAL DEGREE - A degree based on at least six years of college work, usually granted in Dentistry, Law, Medicine, Theology, etc. It signifies completion of the academic requirements to begin practice in the profession.

FIRST-PROFESSIONAL STUDENT - A student enrolled in a professional school or program which requires at least two academic years of college work for entrance and a total of at least six years for a degree.

FIRST-TIME FRESHMAN - A student who has not previously attended any college. Also included are those students who entered with advanced standing (college credits earned before graduation from high school) at the freshmen level and those who attended college for the first time during the preceding summer.

FIRST-TIME STUDENT - A student enrolled at an institution for the first time at any of the following levels: undergraduate; graduate; or first-professional.

FOREIGN STUDENT - A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. The term is synonymous to nonresident alien.

FRESHMAN - A first year undergraduate student.

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT - A comparative figure derived by converting part-time student academic work load into a normal full-time load. Institutions were requested to use 15 credit hours per semester for undergraduate students and 12 credit hours per semester for graduate and first-professional students as the normal load. Total full-time equivalent enrollments are the sum of full-time headcount and the full-time equivalency of part-time students.

GOVERNMENT APPROPRIATIONS - An amount (other than a grant or contract) received from or made available to an institution through an act of a legislative body.

GOVERNMENT GRANT OR CONTRACT - Revenues from a government agency for a specific research project or other program.

GRADUATE STUDENT - A student who holds a bachelor's or first-professional degree or equivalent and is taking courses at the postbaccalaureate level. The student may or may not be enrolled in a graduate program.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE - A student who has completed the 12th grade and received a high school diploma.

INDEPENDENT OPERATIONS - A group of self-supporting activities under control of a college or university. This category is composed principally of federally funded research and development centers (FFR & DC).

INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT - A category of higher education expenditures that includes day-to-day operational support for colleges, excluding expenditures for physical plant operations. Examples of institutional support include general administrative services, executive direction and planning, legal and fiscal operations and community relations.

INSTRUCTION - That category of expenditures of colleges, schools, departments and other instructional divisions of higher education institutions and expenditures for departmental research and public service that are not separately budgeted. Includes expenditures for credit and noncredit activities. Does not include expenditures for academic administration where the primary function is administration (for example, academic deans).

INSTRUCTIONAL FACULTY - Instruction/research staff whose major regular assignment is instruction, including those with release time for research. The term does not include data relating to instructional faculty who teach preclinical or clinical medicine, who are members of a religious order or who teach in the Reserve Officer Training Program (ROTC).

LENGTH OF CONTRACT (9-MONTH AND 12-MONTH) - Salaries of faculty are reported on either a 9-month or a 12-month basis. Faculty are reported as having 9-month or 12-month salaries on the basis of their contract period, not on the basis of the number of installments in which salaries are paid. The term "9-month contract" applies to faculty who teach for two semesters, three quarters, two trimesters, two four-month sessions or the equivalent. The term "12-month contract" applies to faculty employed for the entire year. These faculty are generally employed for 11 months of teaching with one month vacation. The term "salary" may be substituted for "contract" within the context of this definition.

MASTER'S DEGREE - A degree based on at least one but not more than two full-time academic years of work beyond the bachelor's degree.

MINORITY - For this publication, a person identified as belonging to any of the following classifications: American Indian/Alaskan Native; Asian/Pacific Islander; Black (Non-Hispanic); or Hispanic.

NONPROFESSIONAL - Individuals employed for the primary purpose of clerical and secretarial occupations, skilled crafts and service/maintenance.

OTHER PROFESSIONAL - Individuals employed for the primary purpose of performing academic support, student service and institutional support activities, whose assignments would require either college graduation or experience of such kind and amount as to provide a comparable background.

OTHER SOURCES - Revenues not covered elsewhere. Examples are interest income and gains (net of losses) from investments of unrestricted current funds, miscellaneous rentals and sales, expired term endowments and terminated annuity of life income agreements. This source also includes revenues resulting from the sales and services of internal service departments to persons or agencies external to the institution (for example, the sale of computer time).

PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS - Institutions listed in the following categories: private state-aided institutions, private colleges and universities, theological seminaries and private two-year colleges.

PROGRAM - A combination of courses and related activities organized for the attainment of broad educational objectives described by the institution.

PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS - Institutions listed in the following categories: state universities, state-related commonwealth universities, community colleges and college of technology.

RACIAL/ETHNIC AND OTHER DESCRIPTIVE CATEGORIES OF PERSONS

RACIAL/ETHNIC CATEGORIES - Categories used to describe groups to which individuals belong, identify with or belong in the eyes of the community. These categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. However, no person may be counted in more than one racial/ethnic category. Racial/ethnic designations are requested only for United States citizens, resident aliens and other eligible (for financial aid purposes) non-citizens who are not citizens or nationals of the United States but who have been admitted as legal immigrants for the purpose of obtaining permanent resident alien status (and who hold either an alien registration card (Form I-551 or I-151), a Temporary Resident Card (Form I-688) or an Arrival-Departure Record (Form I-94) with a notation that conveys legal immigrant status such as Section 207 Refugee, Section 208 Asylee, Conditional Entrant Parolee or Cuban-Haitian).

AMERICAN INDIAN/ALASKAN NATIVE - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

ASIAN/PACIFIC ISLANDER - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent or the Pacific Islands. This includes people from China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, Samoa, India and Vietnam.

BLACK (NON-HISPANIC) - A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa (except those of Hispanic origin).

HISPANIC - A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

WHITE (NON-HISPANIC) - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa or the Middle East (except those of Hispanic origin).

OTHER DESCRIPTIVE CATEGORY

NONRESIDENT ALIEN - A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. Nonresident aliens are reported separately rather than in any of the five racial/ethnic categories described above.

REQUIRED FEES - Fees required of all students or by such a large portion of students that someone not paying the particular fee is an exception.

ROOM CHARGES - Charges based on double occupancy for a full academic year. The averages do not include room charges at branch campuses.

SALES AND SERVICES OF EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES (REVENUES) - Revenues from the sales of goods or services that are incidental to the conduct of instruction, research or public service. Examples include film rentals, sales of scientific and literary publications, testing services, university presses, dairy products, machine shop products, data processing services, cosmetology services and sales of handcrafts prepared in classes.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FELLOWSHIPS - A category of college expenditures that applies only to money given in the form of outright federal Pell Grants, grants and trainee stipends to individuals enrolled in formal course work either for credit or not. Aid to students in the form of tuition fee remissions is included.

STATE OF RESIDENCE (IN-STATE, OUT-OF-STATE) - A person's permanent address as determined by such evidence as a driver's license or voter registration. For entering freshmen, residence may be the legal residence of a parent or guardian.

TENURE - Status of a personnel position, or a person occupying a position or occupation, with respect to permanence of position.

TUITION - The typical nine-month charge for a full-time student. Calculated averages include full-time in-state students (from sponsoring districts for community colleges) attending day school at the main campus. An exception to the main campus rule is the inclusion of the first-professional medical program at the Pennsylvania State University, College of Medicine. As an additional note, community college charges for in-state students in non-sponsoring districts are approximately twice the listed amount for in-state students in sponsoring districts. Excluded from calculated averages are those charges listed on a credit hour or per course basis.

UNDERGRADUATE - A student enrolled in a four- or five-year bachelor's degree program, in an associate degree program, a certificate program or in a vocational-technical program below the baccalaureate level.
