ABSTRACT

This document reports on the salaries paid in faculty and selected administrative positions in the Oklahoma state system of higher education. The average salary for all full-time faculty equated to a 9-10 month basis in Oklahoma state-supported colleges and universities is \$46,145 for the year 1998-99. This is an increase of \$956 or 2.1% above 1997-98. Average salaries increased \$4,231 at the universities, \$2,388 at the four-year universities, and \$2,325 at the two-year colleges. These salaries represent increases of 8.4%, 5.9%, and 6.5%, respectively, over 1997-98. Among the three categories of institutions, the rank of professor at the comprehensive universities showed the greatest dollar increase over 1997-98. Full-time salaries on a 9-10 month basis in the 25 institutions in 1998-99 range from a minimum of \$12,400, an increase of 15.9% from 1997-98, to a maximum of \$164,999, an increase of \$20,799 or 14.4% over the previous year. On an 11-12 month basis, full-time salaries range from a minimum of \$13,599, an increase of 13.3% from 1997-98, to a maximum of \$148,795, a decrease of 1.4%. The average fringe benefits paid for faculty on a 9-10 month contract basis for 1998-99 are \$12,408, an increase over 1997-98 of \$1,453, or 13.3%; for faculty on an 11-12 month contract basis, average benefits total \$15,337, an increase of \$1,408 or 10.1%. Comprehensive universities average salary is 88% of the national average, compared with 83% in 1987-88. (VWC)

HIGHLIGHTS

For the purposes of this report, the term “**comprehensive universities**” includes OU and OSU; the term “**four-year universities**” includes the eleven regional universities (UCO, ECU, NSU, SEOSU, SWOSU, Cameron, Langston, NWOSU, Panhandle, RSU and USAO). “**Constituent agencies**” refer to the OU Health Sciences Center, the OU Law Center, the OSU Agriculture Experiment Station, the OSU Cooperative Extension Service, the OSU College of Veterinary Medicine, the OSU College of Osteopathic Medicine, and the OSU Technical Branches at Oklahoma City and Okmulgee.

Average Salary: The average salary for all full-time faculty equated to a 9-10 month basis in Oklahoma state supported colleges and universities, excluding the constituent agencies, is \$46,145 for the year 1998-99 (Table 1). This is an increase of \$956 or 2.1 percent above 1997-98.

Increase by Type of Institution: Average salaries increased \$4,231 at the universities, \$2,388 at the four-year universities, and \$2,325 at the two-year colleges. These salaries represent increases of 8.4 percent, 5.9 percent, and 6.5 percent, respectively, over 1997-98.

Increase by Rank: Among the three categories of institutions, the rank of professor at the comprehensive universities showed the greatest dollar increase over 1997-98--\$7,087 or 11.0 percent. All other percent changes in salaries range from an increase of \$499 or 2.1 percent for instructors at the comprehensive universities, to an increase of \$4,110 or 8.8 percent for associate professors at the comprehensive universities (see figure 3).

Total Faculty: Total full-time faculty in 1998-99 is 4,194, an increase of 61 or 1.5 percent over 1997-98 (Figure 1).

Salary Range: Full-time salaries on a 9-10 month basis in the 25 institutions in 1998-99 range from a minimum of \$12,400, an increase of 15.9 percent from 1997-98, to a maximum of \$164,999, an increase of \$20,799 or 14.4 percent over the previous year (Table 9). On an 11-12 month basis, full-time salaries range from a minimum of \$13,599, an increase of 13.3 percent from 1997-98, to a maximum of \$148,795, a decrease of 1.4 percent. These data exclude salaries for deans and other administrative personnel.

Increase in Benefits: The average fringe benefits paid for faculty on a 9-10 month contract basis for 1998-99 are \$12,408, an increase over 1997-98 of \$1,453, or 13.3 percent (Table 5); for faculty on an 11-12 month contract basis, average benefits total \$15,337, an increase of \$1,408 or 10.1 percent (Table 7).

Oklahoma Average Salaries Compared to National: Comprehensive universities average salary is 88 percent of the national average, compared to 83 percent in 1987-88. A slight decline in relative averages continues at the other two tiers of institutions.

NOTE: The changes in average salaries are only partially related to salary increase action by governing boards. Other factors, such as resignations and retirements, can have an impact as well, particularly if new junior faculty are hired at lower salaries to replace departing senior faculty.

TABLE 1

Table 1 presents the 1998-99 average salaries paid all full-time faculty by rank and by all 25 colleges and universities in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. These data include salaries of full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract basis and full-time faculty employed on an 11-12 month contract basis with salaries equated to 9-10 months. Table 1 also includes the number of full-time faculty by rank and by institution.

The average salary equated to a 9-10 month basis paid in the 25 institutions in 1998-99 is \$46,145. This represents an increase over 1997-98 of \$956 or 2.1 percent. The average for comprehensive universities is \$54,764, for four-year universities, \$42,775, and for two-year colleges, \$38,212. These salaries represent increases over 1997-98 of 2.1 percent, 1.8 percent, and 2.6 percent, respectively. The 1998-99 median of all institutions' average salaries is \$38,166.

Average salaries for instructors are highest at the two-year colleges, and lowest at the comprehensive universities.

Faculty distribution by rank may influence the salary averages of the various faculty ranks within an institution. Table 1 shows a smaller proportion of faculty in the upper two ranks (professor and associate professor) at four-year universities than at the comprehensive universities. The comprehensive universities' average salary for all ranks is 28.0 percent higher than the average salary of all ranks for four-year universities. By rank, the comprehensive universities' average salary exceeds the four-year universities' average salary in the rank of professor by 35.9 percent, associate professor by 11.0 percent, and assistant professor by 5.4 percent. However, in the rank of instructor, the four-year universities' average salary exceeds the comprehensive universities' average salary by 36.4 percent.

The total number of full-time faculty reported in the 25 institutions in 1998-99 is 4,194—1,537 at comprehensive universities, 1,716 at four-year universities, and 941 at two-year colleges.



1997-98 to 1998-99**



Table 2 presents the 9-10 month average salaries of all full-time faculty members for the three years, 1996-97 through 1998-99, from which salary trends by institution and by rank may be analyzed.

Certain factors may influence salary averages so that they do not accurately indicate long-term salary trends. For example: a senior full professor receiving a top salary could retire and at the same time an associate professor be promoted to full professor at the bottom of the salary scale for full professors. The net result, with respect to individual faculty still employed, would be that at least one person would be receiving more salary than in the previous year. Yet, the effect upon the average salary for full professors at the institution would show a decline. The average salary for an entire institution could be affected in the same manner. Another factor causing the same effect could occur as a result of hiring new faculty to meet the demands of expanding enrollment; new faculty members would normally be hired at a salary level below the institution's salary average. Institutions showing a decline in salary due to the aforementioned factors are OU, OSU, UCO, ECU, Cameron, Langston, OPSU, and Connors.

Analyses of the data contained in Table 2 may be made in a variety of meaningful ways. No attempt is made here to provide an exhaustive analysis; however, certain observations are noted. The dollar increases in average salaries are not the same between different ranks in the same institution. For example, changes for 1996-97 to 1998-99 show the University of Oklahoma increased the average of all ranks \$4,042, while Oklahoma State University increased \$4,590. At Oklahoma State University, the salary increase for the rank of professor was \$6,109; the increase for associate professors was \$4,351; the increase for assistant professor was \$3,520; and the rank of instructor showed a decrease of \$881. At the University of Oklahoma, comparable figures were increases of \$7,914, \$3,901, \$2,792, and \$2,440 for professors, associate professors, assistant professors and instructors, respectively. Such differences may result from factors suggested above or could also result from salary administration policy and faculty qualifications. Although Table 2 does not provide specific reasons for observed salary averages and comparisons, the three-year trend of institutions' average salaries by rank may provide helpful data.

Table 3 presents the average salaries of all full-time faculty members equated to a 9-10 month basis for the three years, 1996-97 through 1998-99, classified by rank and by type of institution.

Dollar increases in average annual salaries of all ranks in 1998-99 over 1997-98 are greatest for the comprehensive universities, next for two-year colleges, and least for four-year universities. The increased averages of all ranks by type of institution in 1998-99 over 1997-98 were \$1,151, \$736, and \$957 for comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, respectively. The average salary at comprehensive universities was \$11,574 greater than the average at four-year universities in 1997-98, and \$11,988 greater in 1998-99. The average salary at four-year universities was \$4,784 greater than the average at two-year colleges in 1997-98, and \$4,563 greater in 1998-99.

Averages by rank show that comprehensive universities' faculty receive higher salaries than four-year universities' faculty in the ranks of professor, associate professor and assistant professor in 1998-99. Instructors at two-year colleges receive higher average salaries than instructors at both comprehensive universities and four-year universities.

Over the three-year period, the percentage increase in average salaries for all ranks was largest for comprehensive university faculty, while faculty at four-year universities showed the smallest percentage increase.

The annual increases in average salaries for 1997-98 and 1998-99 for comprehensive universities have been 6.1 percent and 2.1 percent with an average of 4.1 percent. The four-year universities experienced increases of 4.1 percent in 1997-98 and 1.8 percent in 1998-99, with an average of 2.9 percent. The two-year colleges experienced a 3.8 percent increase in 1997-98 and a 2.6 percent increase in 1998-99, with an average increase of 3.2 percent.

Table 4 presents the average salaries and the number of full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month basis only. Faculty who are employed on an 11-12 month basis are not included in this table. Individual faculty members included in Table 4 may or may not be employed by separate contract for summer teaching. The criterion for inclusion in Table 4 is that the basic contract is for a regular 9-10 month academic year. Whereas many interpretations may be made from data in Table 4 alone, depth may be gained by comparing the data with those contained in Tables 1 and 6.

The average salary paid in the 25 institutions in 1998-99 to 9-10 month employed faculty is \$45,827. This represents an increase over 1997-98 of \$1,091 or 2.4%. As is true with other consolidated data in this report, the comprehensive universities exert heavy influence on this average, as they claim more than one-third of the faculty and their average is 24.5 percent higher than that of the four-year universities. Likewise, within the two-year tier, Tulsa Community College employs over one quarter of the total faculty and shows an average salary over 13 percent above the mean. This influence is indicated by observing that the average salary for the comprehensive universities is \$53,437, the average salary for four-year universities is \$42,914, and the average salary for two-year colleges is \$38,522. The 1998-99 median of all institutions' average salaries is \$38,152.

Table 4 reveals that the comprehensive universities report a lower average salary for the ranks of professor and associate professor employed on a 9-10 month contract when compared to the average shown in Table 1. The data for the comprehensive universities reflect a higher average monthly rate of pay for 11-12 month contract faculty than average monthly salary rates for 9-10 month contract faculty, with the exception of the rank of assistant professor. Unlike the comprehensive universities, the data for four-year universities and two-year colleges reflect a higher average monthly salary rate of pay for 11-12 month contract faculty than average monthly salary rates for 9-10 month contract faculty at all ranks.

The number of full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract in 1998-99 is 3,749. This number represents 89.4 percent of the total full-time faculty in the 25 institutions. In 1997-98, the number was 3,718 or 90.0 percent of the total. In 1998-99, four-year universities employ 92.4 percent of their full-time faculty on a 9-10 month basis. The two-year colleges employ 88.8 percent on a 9-10 month basis. The two comprehensive universities combined employ 86.3 percent of their full-time faculty on a 9-10 month basis.



1997-98 TO 1998-99



Table 5 presents the average fringe benefits on a 9-10 month basis paid to or on behalf of all 9-10 month full-time faculty by all 25 colleges and universities in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. The average fringe benefits paid for 1998-99 are \$12,408, an increase over 1997-98 of \$1,453 or 13.3 percent.

Fringe benefits as a percent of average salaries may be computed from the data in Tables 4 and 5. For all institutions, 1998-99 fringe benefits are 27.1 percent of the average salary; in 1997-98, the figure was 24.5 percent. For the comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, the fringe benefits for 1998-99 as a percent of average salaries are 28.1 percent, 26.8 percent, and 25.8 percent, respectively. Comparative percentages for 1997-98 were 23.7 percent, 25.5 percent, and 24.5 percent, respectively.

Retirement plan payments are the largest fringe benefit for all institutions combined. 1998-99 payments comprise 48.9 percent of the average total fringe benefits for the State System, an increase over 45.2 percent in 1997-98. For the comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, retirement plan payments are 56.4 percent, 46.4 percent, and 36.5 percent, respectively, of the total average fringe benefits. Comparable 1997-98 figures were 50.2 percent, 45.1 percent, and 35.6 percent, respectively.

Social security taxes are the second largest fringe benefit paid by institutions and are required by law, as are unemployment compensation and worker's compensation payments.

Medical and life insurance benefits are provided by all institutions and 21 institutions provide other fringe benefits not specifically identified.

1997-98 TO 1998-99**



Table 6 presents the average salaries and the number of full-time faculty employed in the 25 institutions on an 11-12 month basis only.

The average salary paid in the 25 institutions in 1998-99 to 11-12 month employed faculty is \$61,398, an increase over 1997-98 of \$1,201 or 2.0 percent. The average 11-12 month salary for comprehensive universities is \$77,179; the average for four-year universities is \$50,209; and the average for two-year colleges is \$43,690. The 1998-99 median of the average salaries for 24 institutions reporting 11-12 month full-time faculty is \$46,290.

The number of full-time faculty employed on an 11-12 month contract basis is 445 or 10.6 percent of the total full-time faculty in the 25 institutions. In 1997-98, the number was 415 or 10.0 percent. The percent of faculty employed on an 11-12 month basis is 13.7 percent at comprehensive universities; 7.6 percent at four-year universities, and 11.2 percent at two-year colleges. The number of full-time faculty employed on an 11-12 month basis varies by institution. For example, the University of Central Oklahoma employs no faculty on an 11-12 month basis, while more than one-third of Langston University's faculty (54 out of 140) are employed on an 11-12 month basis.



1997-98 TO 1998-99



Table 7 presents the 1998-99 average fringe benefits on an 11-12 month basis to or on behalf of all 11-12 month full-time faculty by all 25 institutions in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. The average fringe benefit paid for 1998-99 is \$15,337 and represents an increase of \$1,408 or 10.1 percent.

Fringe benefits as a percent of average salaries may be computed from the data in Tables 6 and 7. For all institutions, 1998-99 fringe benefits are 25.0 percent of the average salary, an increase from 23.1 percent in 1997-98. For the comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, the fringe benefits as a percent of average salaries are 25.5 percent, 25.5 percent, and 23.5 percent, respectively. Comparable 1997-98 figures were 22.3 percent, 27.0 percent, and 22.5 percent, respectively.

Retirement plan payments are the largest fringe benefit for all institutions combined. Such payments comprise 54.0 percent of the average total fringe benefits for the State System for 1998-99 as compared with 51.0 percent for 1997-98. For the comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, the payments are 61.4 percent, 49.0 percent, and 34.4 percent, respectively, of the total average fringe benefits. Comparable figures for 1997-98 were 55.8 percent, 50.8 percent, and 35.4 percent respectively.

Social security taxes are the second largest fringe benefit paid by institutions and are required by law, as are unemployment compensation and worker's compensation payments.

Medical and life insurance benefits are provided by all 24 institutions reporting 11-12 month full-time faculty. Eighteen institutions provide other fringe benefits not specifically identified.

1997-98 TO 1998-99**




TABLE 8

Table 8 presents the 1998-99 average total compensation paid to those full-time faculty on both 9-10 month and 11-12 month contracts by all 25 institutions in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.

Average total compensation for 9-10 month faculty in 1998-99 is \$58,235, compared with \$55,691 in 1997-98, and represents an increase of \$2,544 or 4.6 percent. The 1998-99 average for comprehensive universities is \$68,459, for four-year universities, \$54,436, and for two-year colleges, \$48,455. The median of the average total compensation for all 25 institutions reporting is \$49,591.

Average total compensation for 11-12 month faculty in 1998-99 is \$76,735 compared with \$74,127 in 1997-98, and represents an increase of \$2,608 or 3.5 percent. The 1998-99 average for comprehensive universities is \$96,825, for four-year universities, \$63,007, and for two-year colleges, \$53,963. The median of the average total compensation for the 24 institutions reporting 11-12 month faculty is \$57,441.



TABLE 9

Table 9 presents the highest and lowest salaries paid academic deans and full-time faculty classified both by contract period and by type of institution. The number of individuals and the number of institutions in each classification are also presented.

The average (mean) salaries for academic deans employed on an 11-12 month contract basis in 1998-99 for the three classifications of institutions are: comprehensive universities, \$138,055; four-year universities, \$72,974; and two-year colleges, \$58,451. For 1997-98 the average salaries were \$122,385, \$69,264, and \$56,663, respectively. Average salaries for academic deans increased over 1997-98 by 12.8 percent at comprehensive universities, by 5.4 percent at four-year universities, and by 3.2 percent at the two-year colleges.

The highest salary paid academic deans in the 25 institutions on an 11-12 month contract basis in 1998-99 is \$198,499 for comprehensive universities, \$118,440 for four-year universities, and \$66,800 for two-year colleges. The highest salary for these categories in 1997-98 was \$182,760, \$112,800, and \$65,000 for the comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, respectively. The 1998-99 lowest salary for academic deans is \$89,000 for comprehensive universities, \$49,350 for four-year universities, and \$44,290 for two-year colleges. The lowest salary for these categories in 1997-98 was \$57,500, \$49,350, and \$43,000, respectively.

For full-time faculty on 9-10 month contracts in the state system, the highest salary paid in 1998-99 is \$164,999, up from \$144,200 in 1997-98. The lowest salary is \$12,400, up from \$4,784 in 1997-98.

For 1998-99, the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$67,300, an increase from \$63,496 in 1997-98. The lowest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a four-year university in 1998-99 is \$24,000, unchanged from 1997-98. For two-year colleges, the 1998-99 high is \$64,902, compared to \$62,107 for 1997-98. Finally, the 1998-99 low two-year college salary is \$15,000, compared to \$24,250 in 1997-98.

The highest salary paid an 11-12 month contract full-time faculty member in the 25 institutions in 1998-99 is \$158,795, compared to \$150,840 in 1997-98. The lowest salary in 1998-99 is \$13,599, compared to \$12,000 in 1997-98. For 1998-99, the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a comprehensive university is \$148,795, compared to \$150,840 in 1997-98; the lowest salary in 1998-99 is \$13,599, compared to \$23,472 in 1997-98. For 1998-99, the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$84,120, compared to \$81,360 in 1997-98; the lowest salary in 1998-99 is \$24,000, compared to \$12,000 in 1997-98. For 1998-99, the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a two-year college is \$65,175, compared to \$66,892 in 1997-98; the lowest salary is \$26,780, an increase from \$23,235 in 1997-98. These data exclude academic deans.

TABLE 10

Table 10 presents income earned by full-time faculty members from activities that are specifically authorized by the institution in addition to primary employment duties. Income from summer-term employment for faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract basis is excluded from Table 10. These data are presented as "actual" for the completed year of 1997-98 and "estimated" for the current year, 1998-99.

The "estimated" average mean income in the 25 institutions from extra teaching assignments and approved noninstitutional employment for 1998-99 is \$2,463 for those faculty members earning such income. The "actual" figure for 1997-98 was \$2,575. In 1998-99, the median of the "estimated" averages is \$2,043; in 1997-98, the median of the "actual" averages was \$2,495. In 1998-99, the highest "estimated" average income from extra assignments is \$3,909; in 1997-98, the highest "actual" average was \$5,129.

 1997-98 - 1998-99




TABLE 11

Table 11 presents 1998-99 salary data for selected administrative positions on an 11-12 month employment period by type of institution. The positions selected for inclusion are those most commonly staffed at higher education institutions. The average amount of fringe benefits is also included in the table. In some institutions, one individual may hold two or more administrative titles. In these instances, the salary has been reported under that heading most commonly associated with the highest salary.

Comprehensive university presidents salaries average \$193,100 in 1998-99, compared to \$184,500 in 1997-98. Fringe benefits for the two presidents average \$40,388.

Four-year university presidents receive an average salary of \$119,016 in 1998-99, an increase of 5.4 percent over the 1997-98 average salary of \$125,745. The highest salary for a four-year university president in 1998-99 is \$138,000, compared to \$158,000 in 1997-98. Fringe benefits average \$28,175 or 23.7 percent of the average salary.

Two-year college presidents receive an average salary of \$98,585 in 1998-99, an increase of 3.4 percent over the 1997-98 average salary of \$95,361. The highest salary for a two-year college president in 1998-99 is \$137,500, compared to \$118,627 in 1997-98. Fringe benefits average \$21,919 or 22.2 percent of the average salary.

College and university vice presidents' salary information includes those positions surveyed in the Administrative Compensation Survey from the College and University Personnel Association (CUPA). These positions surveyed at the Vice President level are: Chief Academic Officer, Chief Business Officer, Chief Development Officer, and Chief Student Affairs Officer.

TABLES 12, 13, and 14

Tables 12, 13, and 14 present average salaries and fringe benefits of eight constituent agencies in the state higher education system. Each of the constituent agencies is unique with respect to average salary rates or professional classification. Consequently, salary data for each of the eight agencies are presented separately.

The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center average salaries are presented on an 11-12 month contract basis. **The College of Medicine** 1998-99 average salary is \$72,989, an increase of 10.0 percent from 1997-98. **The College of Dentistry** 1998-99 average salary is \$65,291, an increase of 8.5 percent from 1997-98. **The College of Nursing** 1998-99 average salary is \$41,060, an increase of 2.9 percent over 1997-98. **The College of Public Health** 1998-99 average salary is \$65,809, an increase of 5.2 percent over 1997-98. **The College of Allied Health** 1998-99 average salary is \$49,815, a decrease of 0.9 percent from 1997-98. **The Graduate College** 1998-99 average salary is \$35,242. **The College of Pharmacy** 1998-99 average salary is \$66,618, an increase of 4.5 percent over 1997-98. **The Tulsa Branch Medical School** 1998-99 average salary is \$85,862, a decrease of 0.1 percent from 1997-98.

The University of Oklahoma Law Center full-time faculty average salary on a 9-10 month equivalent contract basis for 1998-99 is \$90,595, an 11.0 percent increase over 1997-98.

The Oklahoma State University College of Veterinary Medicine full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1998-99 of \$75,722 is an increase of 3.0 percent over 1997-98.

The Oklahoma State University Agricultural Experiment Station full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1998-99 of \$70,723 is an increase of 2.2 percent over 1997-98.

The Oklahoma State University Cooperative Extension Service full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1998-99 of \$67,179 is an increase of 2.3 percent over 1997-98.

The Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1998-99 of \$100,333 is an increase of 8.3 percent over 1997-98.

The Oklahoma State University Technical Branch, Okmulgee full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1998-99 of \$41,812 is an increase of 3.5 percent from 1997-98.

The Oklahoma State University Technical Branch, Oklahoma City full-time faculty average salary on a 9-10 month contract basis for 1998-99 of \$36,212 is an increase of 4.5 percent over 1997-98.

TABLES 15 and 16

Tables 15 and 16 illustrate the number and average salaries of new full-time faculty hired in 1998-99, as well as the number and average salaries of full-time faculty terminations in 1997-98. A total of 266 faculty retired, resigned, or were terminated, while an additional 350 faculty were hired, a net gain of 84 new faculty. "Terminated Faculty" on Table 16 includes faculty who departed for any of the noted reasons (retired or resigned).

When comparing average salaries of new faculty hires to faculty terminations, new faculty salaries were 5.5 percent higher at the comprehensive universities, 9.7 percent lower at four-year universities, and 15.3 percent higher at two-year colleges. The system average is 3.1 percent less for new hires compared to terminated faculty. The average salaries of new hires are lower primarily because most new faculty are hired at a lower academic rank (i.e., assistant professor or instructor).

It is significant that the average salary of new hires is higher at all ranks of both comprehensive universities than the average salary of each rank as a whole (Table 15 vs. Table 1). At OU, for example, at the professor level, new hires average salary is \$102,804, compared to \$72,721 average salary of currently employed professors. At the regional universities, newcomers' average salaries are lower than the average salaries for the ranks of assistant professor and instructor, as a whole, but are higher for associate professors.

Table 17 illustrates average salaries by rank and by tier of Oklahoma institutions compared to national averages.

Oklahoma has made significant strides in bringing faculty salaries up to the national average. With the exception of Oklahoma's instructor salaries, which already exceed the national average, salaries of all other ranks are now no more than 11 percentage points below the national average. Oklahoma professors salaries are at 89.6 percent of the national average (\$63,866 compared to \$71,257), associate professors are 90.9 percent of the national average (\$48,497 compared to \$53,356), and assistant professors are 92.8 percent of the national average (\$40,884 compared to \$44,075). Oklahoma instructors salaries exceed the national average, \$35,978 compared to \$33,323.

Professors at Oklahoma's comprehensive universities have seen the largest 11-year growth in average salary, 66.5 percent, when compared to other ranks and other tiers. Nationally, professor salaries at comprehensive universities grew only 55.2 percent, by comparison. Not surprisingly, Oklahoma instructors at comprehensive universities have seen the smallest 11-year increase, 29.8 percent, and are 71.9 percent of the national average (\$24,325 compared to \$33,854).

Overall, average salaries of all ranks have increased 49.7 percent over the 11-year period compared to 50.3 percent nationally, bringing Oklahoma average faculty salaries to 82.7 percent of the national average.

Figure 11 shows the annual percentage increases in average faculty salaries in Oklahoma and the nation over a 10-year period for each tier of institutions. Comprehensive universities and two-year colleges have made the most progress, with percentage increases surpassing the national average in 6 out of the 10 years. Overall, Oklahoma's average annual increase matched the national average of 3.5 percent.

Figure 12 shows annual percentage increases in faculty salaries in Oklahoma and the nation over a 10-year period by faculty rank. Professors received the largest average annual increase, 4.2 percent, compared to 3.6 percent nationally. Average annual increases for associate professors, assistant professors, and instructors were 3.2 percent, 3.1 percent, and 3.0 percent, respectively.





**ANNUAL PERCENTAGE INCREASES IN FACULTY SALARIES, BY TIER
