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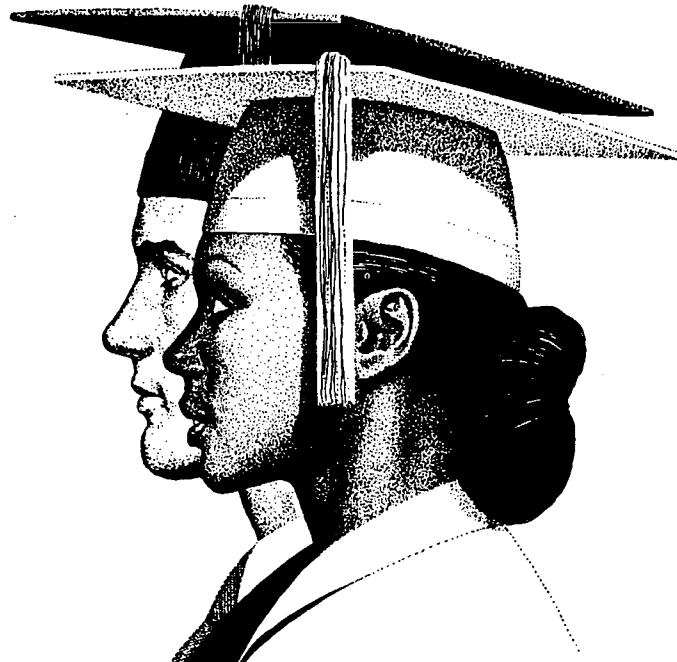

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The state superintendent of public instruction is required under subsection 115.28(7) of Chapter 115 of the Wisconsin Statutes to establish rules and standards of attainment governing the preparation and licensing of those who will serve in the public elementary and secondary schools of Wisconsin. In fulfilling this responsibility, the state superintendent has adopted Wisconsin Administrative Code-Rules of the Department of Public Instruction which pertain to the licensing of public school personnel. The rules establish that Wisconsin will follow the program approval plan for the licensing of professional school personnel.

Under the program approval approach to teacher licensing, graduates of Wisconsin colleges and universities are granted a license by the Department of Public Instruction on the recommendation of the certifying officer of the institution at which they have successfully completed an approved program.

Footnotes

1. UW-Milwaukee's and UW-Oshkosh's bilingual-bicultural minors lead to licensing to teach in bilingual classrooms at the elementary or secondary level. Most bilingual certification students at UW-Milwaukee are in Spanish, Hmong, or Lao programs but the certification is available in other languages, including German, Hebrew, and Russian. Bilingual-bicultural licenses at UW-Oshkosh are in Hmong and Spanish.
2. UW-Green Bay, UW-Milwaukee, UW-Oshkosh, and Cardinal Stritch College offer foreign language programs leading to licensing to teach in grades 6-12 or PK-12.
3. Schools offering Indian or other foreign languages teacher licensing programs include: UW-Green Bay—Oneida; UW-Madison—Chinese, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Polish, Portuguese; UW-Milwaukee—Hebrew; Beloit College—Japanese; Lawrence University—Chinese.
4. UW-Milwaukee offers an approved program in school counseling and bilingual school counseling.
5. St. Norbert College offers minors in Menominee history and culture and Oneida history and culture.
6. UW-Milwaukee's teaching majors in anthropology, economics, geography, history, political science, psychology, and sociology are available only as part of the Broad Field Social Studies Program.
7. UW-Stevens Point offers an American Studies teaching major.
8. The 1-9 elementary program permits teaching elementary subjects in grades 1-8 and in one's minor field in grade 9. Effective 7-1-92, the elementary range will include prekindergarten through grade 3, grades 1-6, and grades 1-9.
9. The following schools offer the school counselor internship program: UW-Madison, UW-Milwaukee, UW-Oshkosh, UW-Platteville, UW-River Falls, UW-Stout, UW-Superior, UW-Whitewater, and Marquette University.
10. UW-Madison offers an innovative/experimental undergraduate cross-categorical special education program. UW-Milwaukee offers an innovative/experimental program in special education at the post-baccalaureate or graduate level. Cardinal Stritch University offers a joint certification program in cognitive disabilities, learning disabilities, and emotional disturbance.
11. An experimental, accelerated elementary education program for those who are under-represented on elementary school faculties—minorities and males—and who already have their bachelor's degrees.
