ABSTRACT

This report summarizes fall 1995 student enrollment in credit classes on the official census date (45th day of classes) at Pima Community College (PCC) in Arizona. The number of students (head count) and full-time student equivalents (FTSE) are categorized by campus and the time of day students attend classes. Comparisons with head count and FTSE data from the previous four years are displayed in tables and graphs. Time of day of attendance is compared to fall 1994 data. Figures indicate that PCC fall enrollments increased between 1991 and 1992, but have steadily declined thereafter, with district enrollment decreasing by 2,309 students between fall 1992 and fall 1995. The five-year pattern varied from campus to campus. An enrollment management plan at one campus that increased class size, reduced the number of class offerings, and changed some classes from credit to non-credit status is cited as a possible contributing factor for the decline. A noteworthy trend is the relatively greater decline in extended day enrollment (enrollment in any class taught after 5:00 p.m. or with a whole starting day of Friday, Saturday, or Sunday) throughout the district as compared to day enrollment. 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This report summarizes Fall 1995 student enrollment in credit classes. The data reflect enrollments on the official census date (45th day of classes). The number of students (head count) and full-time student equivalents (FTSE) are categorized by campus and time of day attended. Comparisons with head count and FTSE data from the previous four years are displayed in tables and graphs. The time of day attended is compared to Fall 1994.

District Enrollment

Graph 1 and Table 1 depict the most recent five-year fall enrollment by both head count and FTSE. The unduplicated total district head count for Fall 1995 semester was 27,866, a decrease of 94 (<-1%) from the previous fall semester and the lowest head count enrollment in five years. The district FTSE was 13,978 in Fall 1995, also the lowest level in five years.

Graph 1. Head Count and FTSE of PCC Students in Fall Semesters

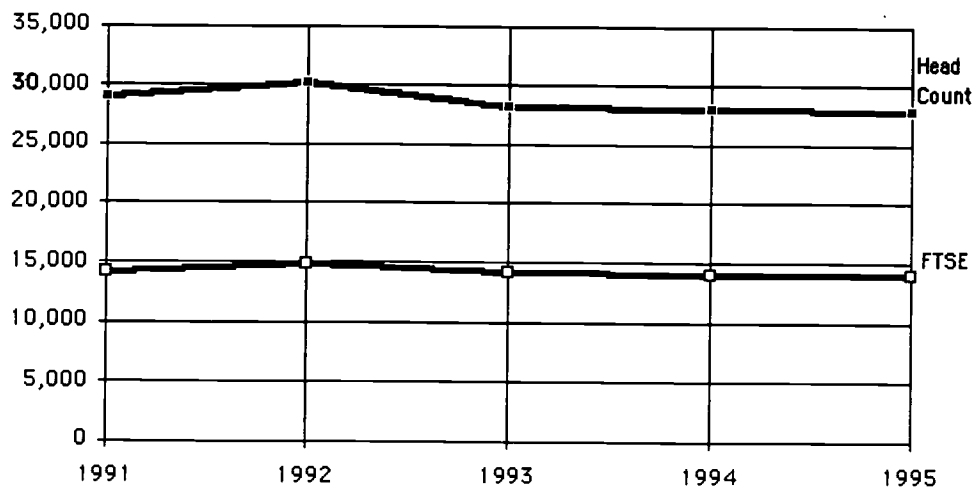

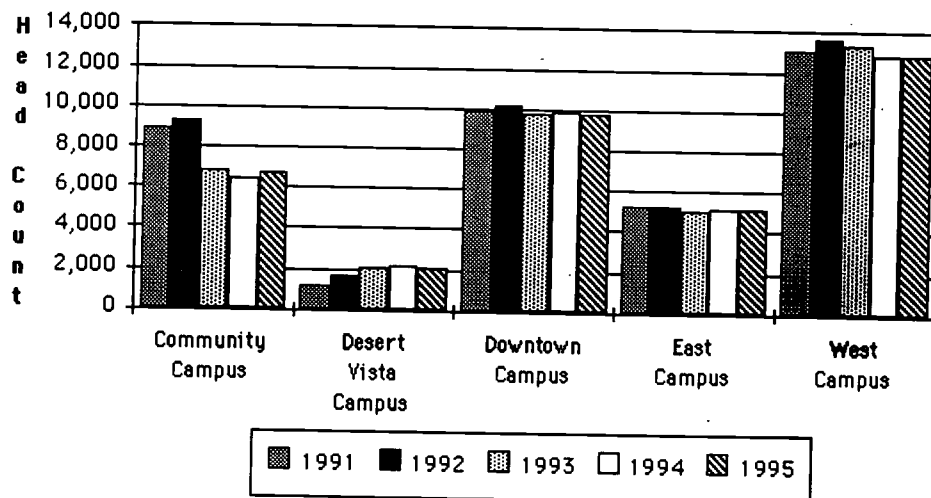
Campus Head Count

Table 1 and Graph 2 depict the five-year head count enrollment by campus. The enrollment at both the Downtown and East Campus has remained fairly stable over the past five years. The recent growth at Desert Vista Campus tapered off in fall 1995. Desert Vista's headcount enrollment grew by 78% from 1991 to 1994 before declining 3%. In 1995, a two-year decline in

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Community Campus head count enrollment was reversed. Community Campus' head count enrollment increased by 255 (3%) students from Fall 1994 to Fall 1995. Still, in 1995 the Community Campus accounted for 5% less of the College head count than it did in 1992. The West Campus head count has declined slightly every year since 1992, but still accounts for 35% of total district head count enrollment.

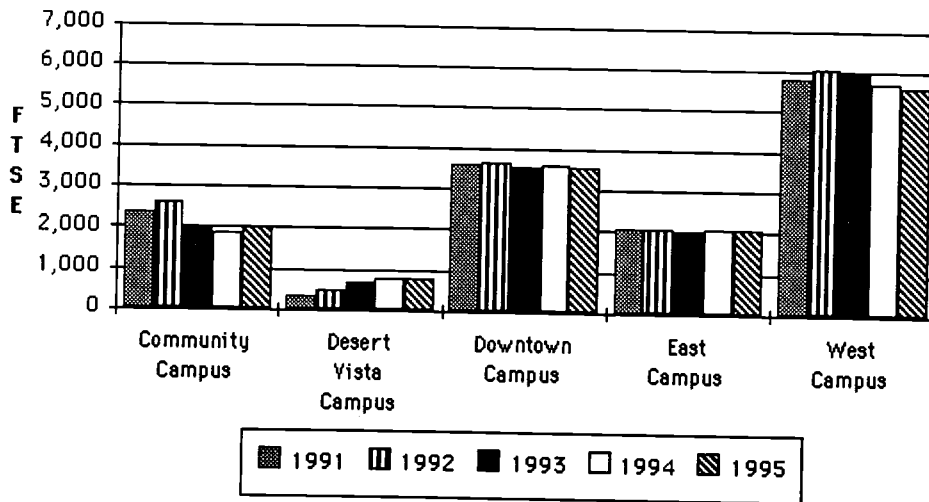
Graph 2. Head Count Enrollment for Fall Semesters by Campus and Year



Campus FTSE

Table 1 and Graph 3 show FTSE data. Campus semester FTSE is calculated by dividing the total credit hours by 15. Desert Vista, Downtown, and West Campuses each experienced a 2% decrease in FTSE in 1995. The Community Campus gained 139 FTSE for a 7% increase while the increase of 16 FTSE at the East Campus equals a 1% gain.

As shown in Table 1, the enrollment at the West Campus generated over 40% of the district FTSE between 1991 and 1994. During this period, the percentage of FTSE produced by Desert Vista Campus increased from 3% to 6%. The percentage of District FTSE at the Downtown Campus and the East Campus remained stable during this five-year period. The Community Campus accounted for 18% of the College's FTSE in Fall 1992, but only 13% of the FTSE in Fall 1994. The enrollment increase in the fall 1995 semester at the Community Campus produced more FTSE so that the campus now accounts for 14% of the College's FTSE.

Time of Day Attended by Campus

Table 2 compares enrollment information from 1994 with 1995 by time of day attended. When examining these data, the reader should be aware that the *district head count does not equal the sum of the campus head counts*. A student is counted once at each campus attended and once in the district total. For example, a student may simultaneously enroll in a day course at the Downtown Campus and an extended day course at the Community Campus. This student would be categorized once as a day student at the Downtown Campus and once as an extended day student at the Community Campus. The district total, however, would count this student in the category, "both day and extended day enrollment."

There are differences among the campuses. The four brick-and-mortar campuses serve primarily day students. At these campuses, day students accounted for from just under one-half (Desert Vista) to more than two-thirds (West) of the enrollment. The Community Campus serves more extended day than day students, accounting for 34% of the District's extended day enrollment. However, in 1995 Community Campus served 25% more day students and 7% fewer extended day students than it did in 1994.

Table 3 displays the comparative enrollment for FTSE by campus for Fall 1994 and 1995. Day head count enrollment generated a higher proportion of FTSE than the extended day enrollment. Extended day enrollment (enrollment in any class taught after 5:00pm or whole starting day is Friday, Saturday or Sunday) has decreased for the District and for all campuses except the East Campus.

Trends and Implications

PCC fall enrollments have steadily declined since Fall of 1992. During this time period, the District enrollment has decreased by 2,309 students.

Several factors appear to account for this change in District enrollment patterns. During this time, the Community Campus instituted an enrollment management plan that increased the minimum class size, reduced the number of class offerings, and converted some credit classes to community education non credit classes. The result has been a 31% decrease in the number of students taking credit courses at the Community Campus between 1992 and 1994. Despite a 3% growth in the head count at Community Campus in 1995, overall District enrollment continued to decline. The Desert Vista Campus which officially opened in Fall 1993 had its first enrollment decline (73 students, 3%) in five years. Enrollment changed by less than 1% at the other three campuses. Overall, the College enrolled 94 fewer students in 1995 than in the previous fall semester.

A major issue is whether the declines will continue or whether the decrease in enrollment is a temporary enrollment adjustment and will give way to more growth in the future. The positive economic outlook (more jobs) usually means a decrease in enrollment at the community college level. Since Tucson and Pima County are in an expanding economy, the College should expect a slow or no growth enrollment pattern. However, the enrollment pattern will differ by campus. The Community Campus will be expanding in enrollment as a balance to the earlier decreases.

A noteworthy trend is the decline in the extended day enrollment throughout the district. Safety concerns, availability of part-time evening employment for those seeking supplemental income, and cancellation of classes not meeting the minimum enrollment required may affect the extended day enrollment more significantly than the day enrollment. This trend of declining extended day enrollment impacts campuses differently. Overall, this trend and its impact on total enrollment needs to be addressed.

Summary

The Fall 1995 District head count and FTSE enrollment were slightly less (<-1%) than the previous Fall's figures. The enrollment pattern for the last five Fall semesters shows District enrollment increased between 1991 and 1992 but decreased thereafter. The five-year pattern varied from campus to campus.
