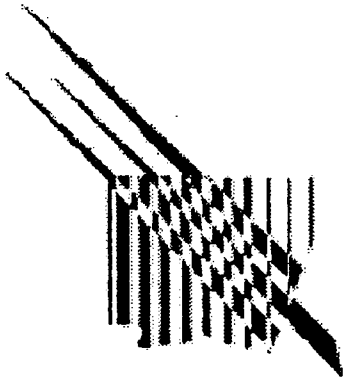

ABSTRACT

This document provides supplemental statistical information to the State Board of Directors for Community Colleges of Arizona annual report. The statistical report contains student enrollment data, financial information, teacher certification and faculty information, and information on federal vocational education funding. Enrollment data include the annual audited full-time equivalent student report, unduplicated headcount, and headcount by full-time and part-time enrollment, gender, ethnic or race group, age cohort, and residency status. Additionally, the report includes data tables for non-credit classes, and non-credit enrollment, college continuation status, Arizona high school graduation status, degrees and certificates awarded, and off-campus programs. Financial information data reveal sources of funds, analysis of state aid, general fund income, plant fund income, assessed valuation and tax levy, expenditure capacity, and expenditure. The data provided and found in the Enrollment Analysis Reports were submitted by the ten community college districts of Arizona. Report highlights include: (1) total headcount by full- and part-time enrollment was 170,686 for fall 1999; (2) females accounted for 94,787 of the total headcount, and males 71,667; (3) whites made up 107,358 of the total headcount, Hispanics 31,936, blacks 6,051, American Indian 6,382, and Asian 4,903; and (4) the total number of degrees and certificates issued was 8,639. ARIZONA COMMUNITY COLLEGE TEACHER CERTIFICATION

The State Board of Directors for Community Colleges of Arizona recognizes that superior teaching is the primary objective of community college faculty. Accordingly, it has established statewide certification standards, pursuant to A.R.S. §15-1425.4.

During FY 1999-2000 there were a total of 4,360 teaching certificates issued by the State Board.

In 1995, the Certification department implemented a program of Continuous Quality Improvement. The findings from a customer service survey, conducted FY 1999-2000, revealed that the average overall quality of service was 4.42 on a scale of 1 (Very Poor) to 5 (Excellent). The survey revealed that 95% of those surveyed thought the certification application and the guidelines were clear. The survey also reflected that 98% of the customers felt that the certification staff was knowledgeable, courteous and helpful. Out of those surveyed, 88% thought they received their certificate in a timely manner.
