ABSTRACT

The booklet is the first issue of a series that will highlight a variety of successes realized by the National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research (NIDRR) grantees in their dissemination and utilization efforts. This issue focuses upon the status of World Wide Web (WWW) usage among NIDRR grantees. Information is provided on the profile of overall NIDRR grantee use of the Internet, grantees with Web sites by project category or type, grantees with Web sites by research priority or activity, and Web site accessibility by research area priority, by related activity, and in other project categories. Charts are included that indicate grantee Web site characteristics for: (1) employment outcomes research projects, (2) health and function research projects, (3) technology for access and function research projects, (4) independent living and community integration research projects, (5) associated disability research areas, (6) knowledge dissemination and utilization activities, (7) capacity building for rehabilitation research training activities, (8) ADA technical assistance projects, (9) state technology assistance projects, (10) rehabilitation research and training centers, and (11) rehabilitation engineering research centers. The booklet closes with examples of grantee success stories in meeting dissemination and utilization challenges. (CR)



Success Stories 2000 Overview

This issue, Success Stories 2000, focuses upon the status of World Wide Web (WWW) usage among NIDRR grantees. The WWW plays an integral part in a growing number of grantees' strategies to reach wide-ranging audiences with information related to NIDRR grant activities and outcomes.

NCDDR staff reviewed those Web sites that were identified from NARIC's online resource "NIDRR Project Information on the Internet" (as of September 22, 2000 — http://www.naric.com/nidrrurl.html). Results are reported by the categories used in NIDRR's Long Range Plan. These categories include research areas of:

- Employment Outcomes Research
- Health and Function Research
- Technology for Access and Function Research
- Independent Living and Community Integration Research
- · Associated Disability Research

Other categories of projects featured in this issue include:

- Knowledge Dissemination and Utilization Activities
- Capacity Building for Rehabilitation Research Training
- Americans with Disabilities Act Technical Assistance Projects
- State Technology Assistance Projects
- Rehabilitation Research and Training Centers (RRTCs)
- Rehabilitation Engineering Research Centers (RERCs)

Web Site Characteristics Defined

Major characteristics of grantee Web sites that were analyzed and are reported in this issue include:

- percentage of projects with Web sites broken down by category and area
- accessibility at the Priority 1 level as defined by the W3C Web Content Accessibility Guidelines 1.0 and analyzed using the Bobby (Version 3.2) software program
- · availability of links to related sites
- use of email alerts to highlight changes in Web sites or new information related to that grantee's research focus
- presence of an online publications list of grantee's resources
 - presence of an online newsletter
 - use of discussion list or Bulletin Board as an interactive Web site feature
 - online marketing and purchasing features for grantee products
 - availability of site map as a navigational aide
 - privacy statement regarding Web user information
 - presence of text-only Web site version
 - incorporation of one or more site components in a language other than English
 - presence of a link to the NIDRR home page
 - presence of statement acknowledging NIDRR funding
 - frequency of Web site updates


Success Stories 2000 Grantee Highlights




Profile of Overall NIDRR Grantee Use of the Internet

The number of NIDRR grantees using Web sites as a dissemination vehicle has risen from about 88 in 1996 to 242 in 2000. Today, 67% of NIDRR grantees have a Web presence.




Of those with Web sites, 133 grantees (55%) have Web pages that specifically adress their NIDRR projects.



Of the grantees with Web sites,

139 (57%) meet Bobby's V3.2 Priority Level 1 requirements for accessibility.

Of these, only 73 (52%) display the "Bobby Approved" icon.



Looking at the world beyond themselves, 76% of NIDRR grantees' Web sites include a collection of links to additional sites and resources.

At the time of the Web site review, 6% of NIDRR grantees offered Web site components in a language other therefore.

Success Stories 2000 Highlights

Grantee Success Stories have been chosen for the highlights section based on their demonstration of activities that address specific dissemination and utilization challenges, such as:

- · overcoming an identified dissemination "barrier"
- reaching new target audiences with needed information
- addressing linguistic, cultural, and cognitive diversity among audiences
- applying Social Marketing techniques that work
- achieving a unique impact through a specific dissemination activity
- obtaining individual benefits through utilization of disseminated information

Additional information on grantee Success Stories is available through the NCDDR.

Highlights

- An Employment Outcomes Research area grantee reported success in a new strategy for reaching businesses and employers.
 The strategy used targeted faxing of information sheets to their audience. The fact sheets explained ADA information and tax benefits of hiring people with disabilities.
- Another grantee in the Employment Outcomes Research area collaborated with a Knowledge Dissemination and Utilization grantee to publish the *Guide to Substance Abuse & Disability Resources*. The Guide includes products from across the NIDRR community addressing the issues related to substance abuse in the disability community.
- One grantee in the Health and Function Research area devised and implemented a new strategy to improve its outreach by using a new dissemination vehicle. The grantee created an illustrated comic book addressing psychiatric disabilities.
 The grantee has found the comic book a successful dissemination vehicle.



- Another grantee in the Health and Function Research area collaborated with the U.S. Department of Agriculture to address the needs of farming families with disabilities. The grantee reports that its public information campaign — waged through farming community groups and farming periodicals — has raised the awareness of resources and services available to farmers with chronic health conditions.
- A grantee in the Technology for Access and Function Research Area paired engineering students with people with disabilities to conceptualize and build effective, consumerdriven rehabilitation products. The grantee reports success both in viable rehabilitation products and in recruiting new rehabilitation engineers from minority communities.
- A grantee in the Associated Disability Research area had staff attend a number of meetings of minority parents of children with disabilities. As a result, the staff member established a good working relationship with the group. Ultimately the relationship led to programmatic collaborations, which facilitated utilization of project information.
- One grantee, a State Technology Assistance project, wanted to raise state legislators' awareness of the importance of assistive technology availability to the disability community. The grantee assisted the legislators in realizing that they had a constituent base of people who could benefit from assistive technology. The grantee created a primer on assistive technology that included pictures of and stories about constituents and how assistive technology affected their lives. Accompanying the publication was a sample piece of assistive technology. This information campaign met with positive feedback from legislators. During that session, the legislature passed an assistive technology bill favorable to the disability community.
