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## ABSTRACT

This report presents findings reported in the follow-up survey of Piedmont Virginia Community College (PVCC) (Virginia) graduates of the class of 1998-99. Graduates were surveyed during the spring of 2000 to determine what jobs they had obtained, which schools they were attending, how much they earned, how satisfied they were with their employment or schooling, and what impact PVCC had upon their careers and education. Highlights include: (1) graduates were very satisfied with the quality of college services--an overwhelming majority of survey respondents were either very much or somewhat satisfied with the quality of services (97%) and academic programs (98%) provided by PVCC; (2) nearly one-half believed that their PVCC education had contributed "very much" to their ability to reason logically (50%), research a topic (54%), solve problems (50%), speak clearly and effectively (49%), understand and use computers (57%), understand and use math (49%), and write clearly and effectively (57%); (3) wage earnings were a primary source of financial support for 1998-99 graduates--nearly nine out of ten respondents (89%) were employed while attending PVCC; (4) four of every ten respondents (41%) were enrolled in postsecondary institutions at the time of the survey; and (5) three-quarters of the survey respondents (75%) were employed at the time of the survey. # Follow-Up Survey of PVCC Graduates Of the Class of 1998-99

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## Introduction

Piedmont Virginia Community College (PVCC) has conducted graduate surveys since 1974, when college officials asked members of the first graduating class to report on what happened to them after graduation. Throughout the years, the surveys have asked questions concerning jobs, career satisfaction, salaries, study at other colleges and universities, and the impact the college has had upon the lives of PVCC graduates. Information from graduation surveys is used to improve academic programs and college services.

This study represents the results of the 24th graduate survey. The survey was conducted for graduates of the class of 1998-99, which includes students graduating from PVCC during Summer Term 1998, Fall Semester 1998, and Spring Semester 1999. The survey instrument was the same used for the graduating classes of 1995-96, 1996-97, and 1997-98 and is included in this study as Appendix A. In terms of format and content, this study is similar to previous graduate studies.

Please note that presentation of survey results in the "Results" section of the study, which follows both the "Findings" and "Conclusion" sections, differs for each question depending upon the type of data obtained. Categorical listings, frequencies, and percentages are provided for nominal data; response frequencies, adjusted percentages, and histograms are provided for ordinal level data; and descriptive statistics, such as the mean, median, and mode, are provided for continuous data.

At the end of the survey, graduates were invited to offer comments or suggestions concerning any aspect of their PVCC experience. Graduates were particularly asked to comment on ways that the college could improve its curriculum and services. These comments are contained in Appendix B.

## Methodology

During the spring of 2000, the Office of Institutional Research mailed surveys and cover letters to the 259 graduates of the class of 1998-99. Surveys were mailed approximately seven months after graduation to allow time for the graduates to secure jobs or to enroll in colleges or universities. Those not responding to the initial mailing of the follow-up survey were contacted two additional times.

Of the 259 graduates, 147 returned completed surveys for a response rate of 56.7%. This is considerably better than the response rate of 45.2% for graduate respondents of the class of 1997-98, and the highest response rate of any graduating class since the class of 1987-88.

As can be seen in Tables 1 through 3, survey respondents of the class of 1998-99 were in most respects similar demographically to all 1998-99 graduates. Although a larger percentage of respondents were female than all graduates, the difference between the two groups was less than 7%. The percentage of minority respondents (11.6%) was identical to the percentage of all

minority graduates. In terms of age, survey respondents were on average only

one-half a year older. These similarities in demographic characteristics, as well as the high response rate, suggest that survey responses are representative of all graduates of the class of 1998-99.

## Findings

- Graduates were very satisfied with the quality of college services. An overwhelming majority of survey respondents (97%) were either very much or somewhat satisfied with the quality of services provided by PVCC.
- An overwhelming majority of respondents (97.8%) indicated that they were either very much or somewhat satisfied with the quality of their academic program at PVCC.
- Graduates were pleased with the skills they developed while attending PVCC. Nearly one-half believed that their PVCC education had contributed “very much” to their ability to reason logically (49.7%), research a topic (54.2%), solve problems (50%), speak clearly and effectively (48.6%), understand and use computers (57.3%), understand and use math (49%), and write clearly and effectively (56.6%). Only a few of the remaining respondents believed that their PVCC education did not contribute at all to their ability to reason logically (1.4%), research a topic (1.4%), solve problems (1.8%), speak clearly and effectively (2.4%), understand and use computers (3.5%), understand and use math (3.5%), and write clearly and effectively (2.8%).

- Wage earnings were a primary source of financial support for 1998-99 graduates. Nearly nine out of ten respondents (89.4%) were employed while attending PVCC. Two out of ten respondents (21%) borrowed money to finance their PVCC education. A large number of respondents worked between 10 and 30 hours per week (48.9%), and 21.7% worked 40 or more hours.
- Four of every ten respondents (40.8%) were enrolled in postsecondary institutions at the time of the survey. Most attended public (87.2%), four-year (79.4%) institutions located within the Commonwealth of Virginia (91.3%). In fact, nearly one-half of those attending postsecondary institutions chose to continue their education at The University of Virginia (n=14), James Madison University (n=7), or Old Dominion University (n=7). Nine respondents indicated that they were continuing their education at PVCC.
- Eight out of ten respondents (80%) felt that their bachelor's program was very much or somewhat related to their PVCC degree program. The most popular fields of study were in the areas of business, finance, and accounting.
- Academically, 1998-99 graduates performed quite well at the postsecondary institutions to which they transferred. Enrolled respondents earned a mean grade point average of 3.24 at their respective colleges. The average number of credit hours earned was 29.
- For the most part, graduates were pleased with the level of academic preparation they received at PVCC. Most respondents (95.6%) believed that they were either better prepared, or about as well prepared, as students who enrolled at transfer institutions as freshmen. Nine out of ten respondents (91.9%) felt that the level of academic preparation they received at PVCC was either excellent or good.

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- Graduates were satisfied with the transfer process. Nearly nine out of ten enrolled respondents (89.6%) indicated that the credits they earned at PVCC transferred as expected. Most respondents (88%) indicated that the institution to which they transferred was their first choice. Most (88.7%) who transferred to public four-year colleges in Virginia were either very much or somewhat satisfied with the transfer process.
- For the most part, graduates were pleased with the quality of transfer assistance received at PVCC. Slightly over one-half of all enrolled respondents (51%) received assistance from PVCC in transferring to their current college. Of those who received assistance, approximately eight out of ten rated the quality of assistance they received from academic advisors (77.8%), their academic programs (81.5%), and faculty (81.5%) as either excellent or good.
- Three-quarters of the survey respondents (74.8%) were employed at the time of the survey, and of these, nearly three-quarters (73.2%) worked full time. Nearly three-quarters (72.5%) also indicated that their current jobs were related to their fields of study at PVCC.
- Graduates were employed in a wide range of occupations. Four of ten graduate respondents (38.8%) indicated they were employed in professional specialty occupations; nearly one-quarter (24.3%) were employed in administrative support jobs; and over ten percent (12.6%) were employed as technicians. Nearly nine out of ten survey respondents (88.9%) were either very satisfied or satisfied with their current jobs, and six out of ten (56.9%) planned to pursue their current jobs as long-range careers.
- For the most part, 1998-99 graduates felt that PVCC provided them with the tools necessary to be effective in the workplace. Almost all respondents (99.1%) felt that they were either better prepared, or about as well prepared, as others beginning careers in their job field. Nine

out of ten respondents (88.7%) indicated that the academic preparation they received at PVCC was either excellent or good.

- Attending PVCC had a positive impact on the job prospects and earnings of many 1997-98 graduates. Over one-half of all respondents (52.4%) felt that their degree from PVCC helped them to obtain their current job, and one-third (33.3%) believed that their degree helped them to obtain a promotion in their current job. The average annual salary earned by employed respondents was \$32,284. On average, respondents estimated that their salaries would have been \$9,987 lower if they had not attended PVCC.

## Conclusions

Information provided by 1998-99 graduate survey respondents was in most respects similar to that provided by graduates from previous classes. Typically, most graduates are employed in jobs related to their study at PVCC or enrolled in four-year colleges or universities. While survey respondents each year offer many helpful suggestions to improve academic programs and college services, most are pleased with the education they receive at PVCC. Respondents from the graduating class of 1998-99 were no exception. The two following comments from 1998-99 graduate survey respondents illustrate graduate satisfaction with PVCC.

PVCC was a wonderful school. The teachers would meet with you, get to know you, and work with you until you understood. I feel that the education I received at PVCC was much higher quality than now at UVa.

I am not very objective when it comes to PVCC. In fact, I am rather biased. It is an outstanding school with many excellent teachers. I have attended PVCC over a number of years and the outstanding quality has remained constant.

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## Appendix B: Graduate Comments

I really enjoyed my experience at Piedmont. I met my husband there!

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PVCC has the best computing equipment but its use is so limited. There should be more hours scheduled. Students should be more exposed to use today's technology for academics. Library hours should improve.

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The Financial Analysis Degree Program was wonderful and has made me so much more prepared for my current job than others who start in the same position. I wouldn't be where I am now without Piedmont. Thanks.

---

I was very pleased with my experience at PVCC. The faculty was great. Maybe some day I'll take more classes for fun this time.

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The only aspect I would improve is not using inexperienced staff, i.e. grad students, to teach summer school – they were not prepared but the regular Piedmont teachers were very good!!

---

I felt I had a great education from PVCC. I was a stay-at-home mom while attending PVCC and I worked part time. I plan to pursue my bachelor's degree this fall.

---

More hours of courses (availability of courses should be improved). Some courses are only offered during the day while some are only offered at night.

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I was very happy to be a graduate of PVCC. There was an excellent program of study, a dedicated and caring staff, and a warm, friendly environment.

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I was somewhat disappointed to find that the math courses taken as part of an AS at PVCC wouldn't transfer to ODU (not listed in the transfer credits in the Virginia Community College System course book). Other than that PVCC was very good.

---

The Nursing Program was excellent. Only areas that I would improve on would be to create a more realistic approach to what nursing is on the outside. Example: In your last semester, have the student take and manage five patients instead of one or two.

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The faculty who instructed me was extremely helpful, supportive, interested, and inspired me to perform well in school and become a different person. In particular Physics Instructor [name of instructor], English instructor [name of instructor], computer course instructor [name of instructor], just to name a few. Excellent teachers with a good level of personal commitment to students' success.

---

The only bad experience at PVCC was in my first Humanities in the early 1990s. {Name of professor} was course professor (s/he was great!), but [name of professor] taught in that class – paintings and sculpture. S/he ignored me the first time I asked a question, the second time I asked, s/he humiliated me in class for my question. I had asked for a specific, verbal definition of "classicism." S/he refused to answer me, stating, "If there were a developmental class in humanities, I should take it." I was totally embarrassed. There were about 50 people in the class.

{Name of professor} had taken our class on a field trip to the Bayley Art Museum and showed us paintings depicting "classicism." I was there and looked at the paintings, but still didn't quite get what was meant by "classicism.") So the next class night, I raised my hand and asked. S/he was very angry with me for asking that question. S/he ignored me the first time I asked.

So I raised my hand again and asked again. S/he was very nasty and angry and that's why s/he told me, I guess, "to take a developmental class in humanities." [Name of professor] was completely out of line for saying that. S/he definitely was not professional or mature.

---

Job listed above (waiter) does not related to my degree from Piedmont. I did not receive job based on my degree.

---

The work that I did at PVCC has prepared me for the work that I am not doing in 4-year college. The PVCC program gave me confidence, and the instructors were very knowledgeable and encouraging. Perhaps some improvements might be longer computer lab and library access hours. One other suggestion might be the organization of intramural sport leagues or other activities to bring students together.

---

I took the Computer Repair Course and think that the electrical part of the requirement was the hardest, most irrelevant course I've ever taken. The teacher was smart but not prepared for basic training of pupils. I felt I learned nothing and hope future students can forego this unnecessary course.

---

PVCC was a wonderful school. The teachers would meet with you, get to know you, and work with you until you understood. I feel that the education I received at PVCC was much higher quality than now at UVa.

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- The nursing instructors play favorites in the clinical setting.
  - The nursing program needs to have the same grading scale as the college.
  - All clinical settings should provide each student with at least three patients.
  - Nursing program should offer public health practicum.

Piedmont was a great place for me. After awhile there, it helped me grow and mature. Most of my teachers went out of the way to help me. There were some though who couldn't care less what you did or if you were there. [Name of instructor] was the worst I had. My recently retired counselor was a lifesaver to me. The computer lab was pretty good and the outdoor veranda and indoor video games provided much needed stress relief and relaxation. The only thing I would ask is for more computer class options, both in variety and number of spots available.

---

I would like to say that [name of professor] and [name of professor] are, hands down, the best instructors I have ever had in any school. They both show an interest in the student and teach in a way that the student can learn and not made to feel out of place if something wasn't understood in class. Please relay these remarks to the instructors and Dean of PVCC. I have also recently moved to the state of Michigan and am not currently employed by a company that uses the training I received from PVCC.

---

My overall satisfaction with PVCC is excellent. Every instructor I had (except one) was very knowledgeable about the subject matter and was willing to give each student as much extra attention and assistance as necessary. The affordability of PVCC is also a big plus.

---

PVCC is an excellent school. I particularly enjoy the convenient hours you offer for your classes. You offer a number of classes at night which enables the students to work in the day. Also, I am pleased that you offer a large number of courses in the summer.

---

I was very pleased with my experience at PVCC.

---

After attending Piedmont I transferred to Virginia Tech and completed my B.S. and then finished my M.S. Attending Piedmont was a great experience.

---

The art department needed more up to date computer graphics instruction; i.e., Adobe, Quark, Photo Express. The most beneficial classes for me at PVCC (in terms of relating to my Longwood courses) were Biology, Sociology, History 122, and American Literature. The requirements of those courses (lots of writing practice, research, etc.) prepared me for the mounds of writing assignments at Longwood. The transfer process was top-notch! It was a smooth transition to Longwood.

---

You have helped me with two careers. For 15 years, I worked in medical statistics/health planning and was promoted twice as a direct result of PVCC coursework. My final salary was \$28,000 annually. I also obtained an associate in biology and took most of the horticulture classes which enabled me to garden for a living—which I prefer. All of my coursework was at PVCC.

---

I had a good time – good learning experience. [Name of counselor] was wonderful in trying to help with transferring to UVa. I was attending PVCC on and off for five years before anyone told me that I should be in a degree program – what it was and why. Five years! I would rate that as very unsatisfying. Other than that I had a good experience at PVCC and it has provided a base to build upon at UVa.

---

I took several accounting classes when I worked as a Finance Manager.

If possible, a Microsoft SQL Server 7.0 Information Technology class would be a great class to add.

---

[Name of IST instructor] and [name of IST instructor] were two of my teachers, and they did an outstanding job.

It would be excellent if your academic computing lab were open on Sundays.

---

There were several teachers at PVCC (names of five professors) that impacted me greater than any other teachers in my life. They encouraged questions and fostered understanding. PVCC's faculty is their strong point (among others) and I will always be grateful for the education and incredible faculty I had while I was there.

---

I am not very objective when it comes to PVCC. In fact, I am rather biased. It is an outstanding school with many excellent teachers. I have attended PVCC over a number of years and the outstanding quality has remained constant.

---

I am a 17-year government employee. While attending PVCC I moved from a non-professional job series to a professional job series. I am now on the road to a full-performance GS-12. My PVCC degree was not the determining factor but it certainly did help in my securing my current position.

In my opinion, if a public speaking course were required for the completion of the General Studies curriculum then the General Studies program would be stronger and more challenging.

Provision for better students to receive credit for work completed.

Better coordination with 4-year colleges.

---

I am very pleased that I selected PVCC to prepare for the university. All of my instructors at PVCC were terrific! [Name of counselor] was most helpful with the transfer process and helping me plan my courses needed for the commerce school. The competitive environment at UVa is much stronger but I do feel prepared and my first semester grades would reflect this. Thanks PVCC!!

---

I actually had a four year degree first from James Madison University and went back to school to change my career. I finished at PVCC and had fulfilled the requirements to sit for the CPA exam in November 1999. I passed all four parts on the first try. I am very satisfied with my education received from PVCC.

---

This last question (#23) [on the survey form] is ridiculous. Change it to: "What would you be doing (working) if you hadn't attended PVCC?" The salary part [on the survey form] is a bad idea. I only work to make grocery and bill money. I have side jobs, not anything I'm going to pursue—many other people are in the same boat. Also, explain "course materials" [on the survey form]. Do you mean textbooks or what? Most people aren't going to say they're satisfied with those.

---

Your institution and the faculty provided me with excellent training and refresher skills enhancement. Because I have not been able to obtain a satisfying career position reflects in no way on PVCC. The right opportunity just hasn't come along for my skills, activities and growth.

---

I'm sure I'm the exception to the rule, but I experienced man "snafus" with paperwork at PVCC. Two examples among the many were the registrar's office losing my request o mail transcript to VA Board of Nursing and correspondence from the nursing program office that was never received. By the end of my program at PVCC, I actually started to feel jinxed because no one else seemed to experience such problems with such regularity.

---

I have attended Piedmont in order to fulfill the requirements to take the CPA exam. I will take the test this coming May. Piedmont is a very good community college, though some classes were not offered in the evenings and I could not take them during the day. Secondly, one class that I wanted to take was always listed but cancelled because of lack of participants. I'll keep trying though. Thanks.

---

The only big difference is the aspect of group work. At UVa, there is a lot of group work that I was not prepared for. Also the workload is a lot more at UVa that I somewhat expected but wish I would have been used to from PVCC. However, PVCC was a great place to learn and I am glad I attended here my first two years of college.

---

Overall, everything worked out well in my degree of study so I say the nursing program is excellent and keep up the good work.

---

PVCC is a great place. The buildings are starting to need some maintenance/paint. The maintenance pickup trucks should not be parked in front of the building on the grass. They should be in the third lot and hidden.

---

PVCC is a great institution. However, to be most effective in the sciences more money and space is needed to effectively teach chemistry and biology. The chemistry department is due a *significant* infusion of funding, since they have been allowed to run down from lack of financial backing.

---

There was a lot of transition while I was enrolled in the nursing program at PVCC. Some classes and instructors were very organized and informative and some were very disappointing. The general education classes were excellent and the staff was very competent and friendly. Overall, I was very satisfied with my educational experience at PVCC.

---

Provide advising for new students. New students need to know about courses they need in order to pursue further education after the 2 years at Piedmont. Packets from other institutions could be provided for students to see what courses are required.

---

Overall, education and teachers were good but the advisors and counselors need to learn to help students rather than blow them off.

---

Even though I am not now working in the field that I studied at PVCC I still found the entire course of study personally rewarding and fulfilling.

---

Advisement counselors need more time to deal with helping students. I ended up taking things that would not transfer, so it took me longer and cost more. The counselors do not seem to be familiar with the classes and often didn't seem to care what I *needed*. They just listened to what I *wanted* and signed the card. Overall, PVCC is an excellent school!!!

---

I received no assistance from my staff advisor and was very dissatisfied with having to track her down for assistance and then she wasn't very willing to help.

---

Orientation and physical education should not be requirements for graduation. For me, the orientation class was more of a hindrance than help.

PVCC should continue providing cultural activities to the students (concerts, plays, art exhibits).

---

I had several new teachers during my last semester who were terrible. They did not know how to teach and the grades in comparison to my past grades (as well as other students in class) reflect these concerns [English instructor and Bio lab instructor]. The woman in registration window is very rude! The library books need to be updated. Lunch room prices are too high.

---

I loved all of my professors at PVCC. The only complaint that I have has to do with transfer credits. MBC-ADP didn't accept most of my credits that I took at PVCC. I think that there should be more help from counselors to make sure that students take classes that will transfer.

---

I loved my time at PVCC. Small classes and great teachers.

---

Overall, PVCC was an excellent experience for me and I received a quality education. However, I feel the computer lab often made it difficult to find an available computer. Often a large number of computers were blocked from general use, where only a few were made available for those who needed one. Also, I feel more emphasis should be put on how to operate a computer, i.e., student/teacher e-mail use, etc.

Excellent nursing program! Competent and caring nurse faculty.

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Section I, # 6 [survey form]: I did not take any classes that required research and I did not have any math courses.

Good job PVCC!!!

PVCC has a great staff!! [Science and Technology professor] is a great instructor and he works hard to help his students get co-op equivalent, but shouldn't [professor] be doing that?

Co-op program should be reevaluated quickly. Improvement can be made in the Co-op program. The person that handles that program needs to organize it better. Paperwork and information on how the program works would be a benefit. Money and time could be saved. I received about five copies of the same paperwork after I turned everything in.

Tutoring hours for upper level subjects should be available in the late evening, especially since the average student age is 32.

I found the majority of the faculty to be very helpful and willing to work with students. I was impressed with their understanding and tolerance with the facts that sometimes jobs and families make it necessary to allow some flexibility in class. I did find at times, however, the Administrative/Business Office to be a little unorganized and confusing.

---

I had a very good experience at Piedmont. I would recommend it to anyone. The instructors were great.

---

Registration for courses needs to run smoother. Classes need to be made more accessible to working adults. Certain teachers need to realize adult students are working full time, plus raising families, and they need to be a little more flexible.

---

I would, and have, recommended PVCC to anyone seeking quality education in a mature and student friendly environment. I found the faculty to be skilled and compassionate. The student age range was wide and I appreciate the cultural diversity.

---

My suggestions:

--Add a full-time person to the Electronics Department, [name of professor] is stretched too thin.

--Find a good Physics instructor and pay them enough to keep them.

The Electronics classes I took were outstanding; the electives were fair.

---

I think that the Learning Center could use more "PR" and courses offered in the fall should also be offered in the spring.

---

First, I never received the initial letter to respond to the survey.

Took the automotive tech curriculum as an extracurricular activity, primarily to support a previous job as an internal sales representative for a sports car catalog company. I enjoyed my experience at PVCC and would encourage you and your staff to extend additional support and funding to the automotive program.

---

Offer continuing education to senior citizens.

---

I was satisfied with both courses and staff.

---

An Associate in Marketing is useless. Potential employers don't seem to think very highly of it. If a student expresses interest in the marketing field advise them to attend another school. Don't waste their time.

---

I wish that more emphasis were on actual transferability of classes. Also, I would like the counselors to ask the students why they want to take particular classes (possibly saving them money and time). I also did not know about some optional programs that were available.

---

This is the third graduate survey I have received this year. The reason I have not taken the time to fill the others out is because I'm still attending PVCC. Now, maybe, you won't send me anymore of these until I graduate.

I had a wonderful experience at PVCC. This is mainly due to the excellent faculty who kept the material interesting. I feel very lucky to have benefited from their enthusiasm. The financial aide and guidance faculty were very helpful and friendly. The building and grounds add to the pleasant environment.
