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ABSTRACT

The availability of timely, reliable, and valid measures of the work performed by the administration at the University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA) enables the university to manage its enrollment and preserve the quality of academic programs and support services. The information in this fact book constitutes the empirical foundation of the university's self-study. Highlights for the six campuses, including Price William Sound Community College, for fall 1997 include: (1) student headcount was 20,936, with the average class size being 17; (2) there were 3,475 females and 2,448 males attending in the system full time; (3) 14,022 students were white, 860 Alaskan Native, 781 African American, and 690 Asian; (4) the largest age group was 20-24, with 3,842 students; smallest was 60 and over, with 335; (5) 600 graduate students were enrolled; (6) 24% were enrolled for a four-year degree, 18% for a two-year degree; (7) there were 1,592 full-time faculty and 1,313 adjunct faculty members teaching courses; and (8) revenues total for fiscal year ending June 30, 1997 were \$100,500,282 while expenditures were \$101,936,339. Five-year trends are provided for all categories. (NB)

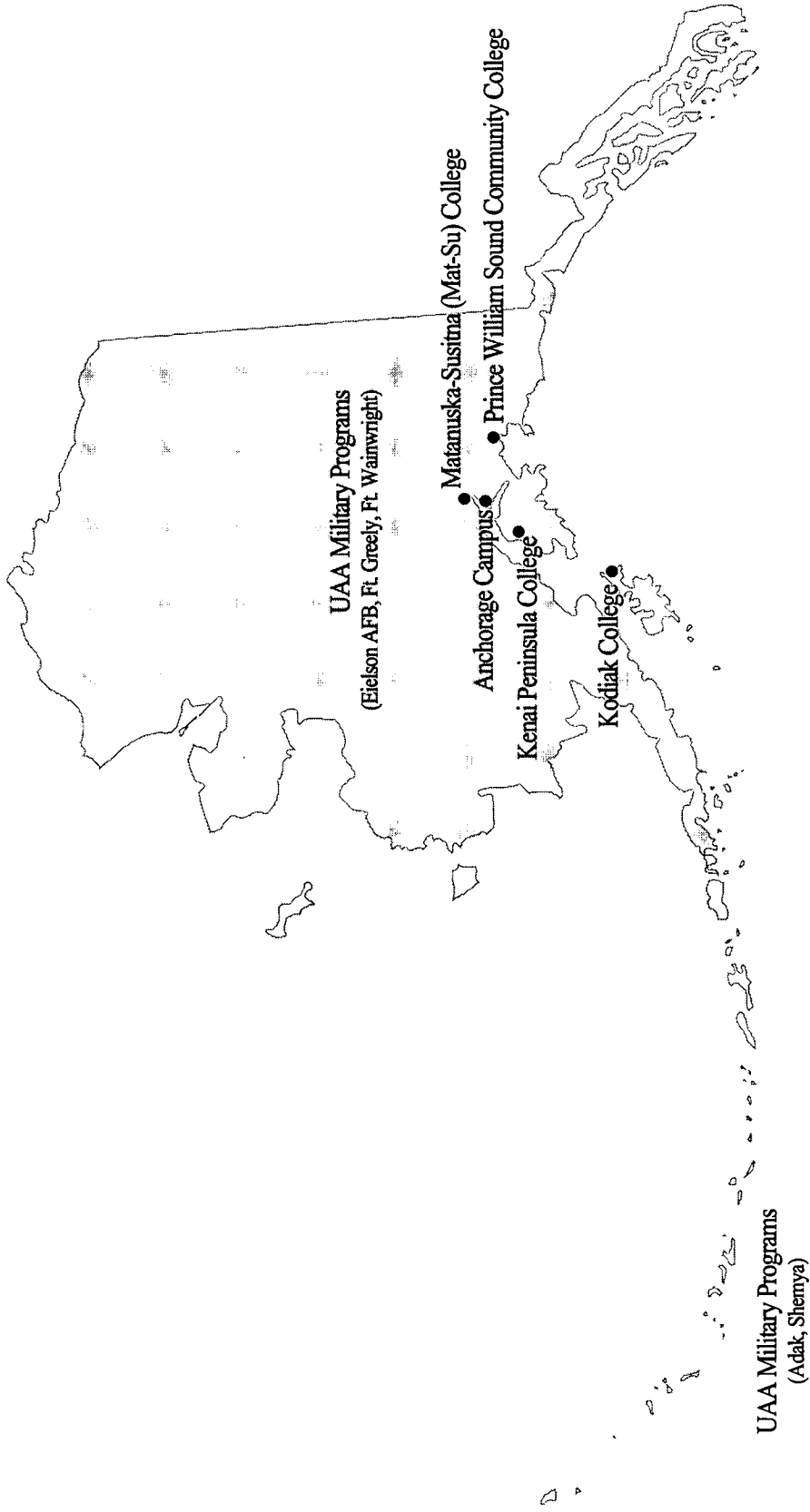

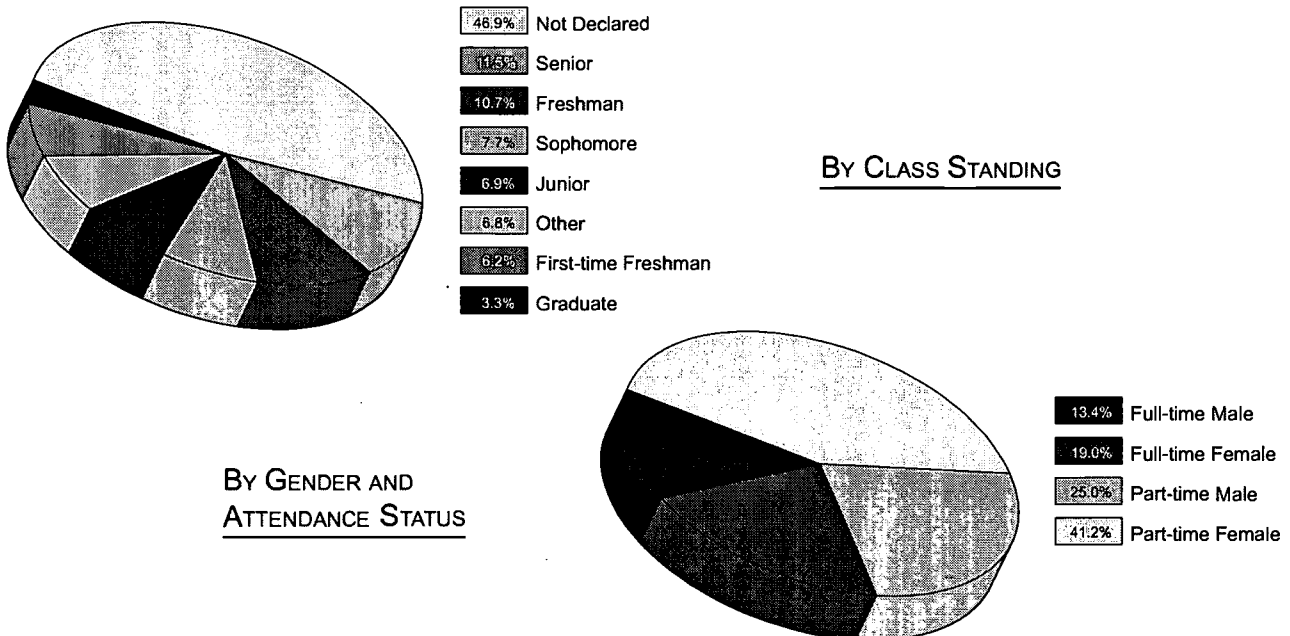

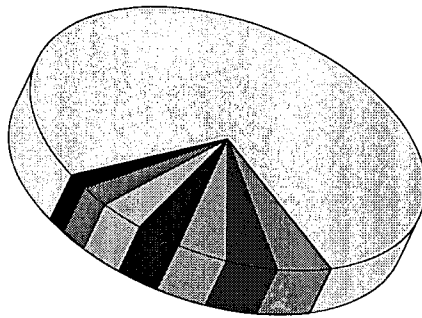

STUDENT CHARACTERISTICS AS A PERCENT OF TOTAL UAA STUDENT HEADCOUNT



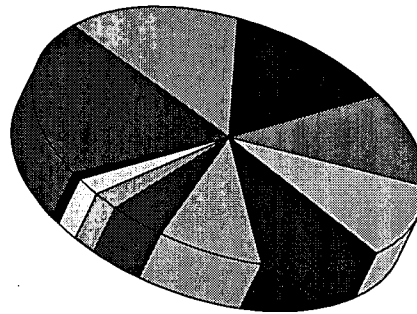
STUDENT CHARACTERISTICS AS A PERCENT OF TOTAL UAA STUDENT HEADCOUNT



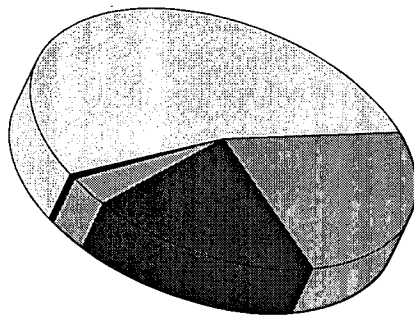

BY AGE GROUP



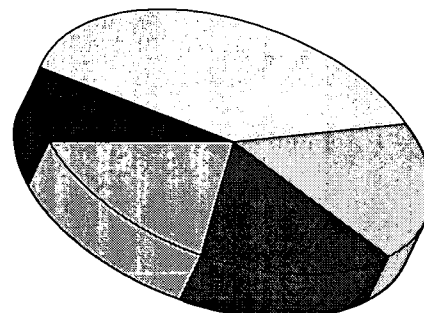

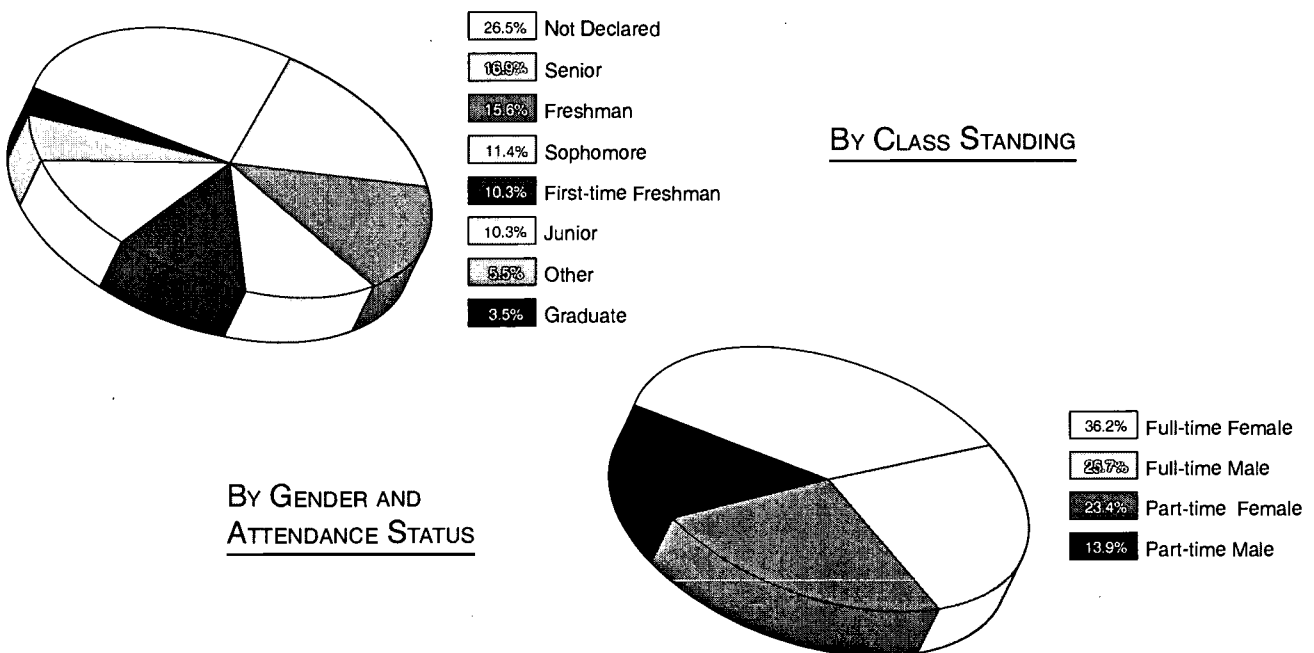

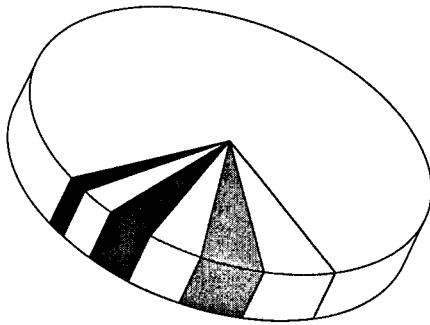

STUDENT CHARACTERISTICS AS A PERCENT OF TOTAL UAA STUDENT CREDIT HOURS



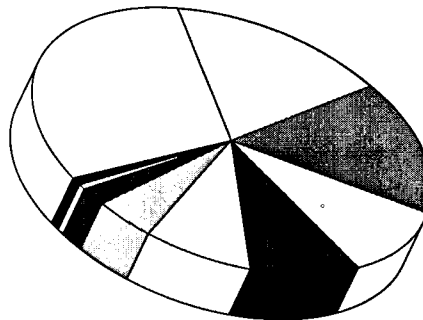
STUDENT CHARACTERISTICS AS A PERCENT OF TOTAL UAA STUDENT CREDIT HOURS



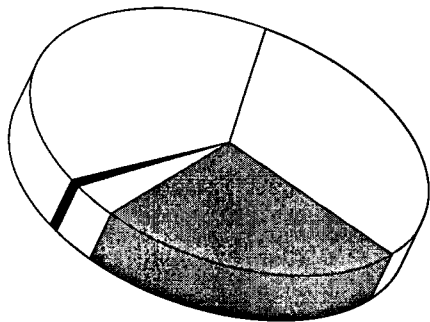

By AGE GROUP



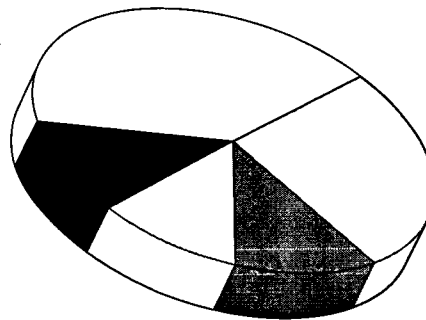

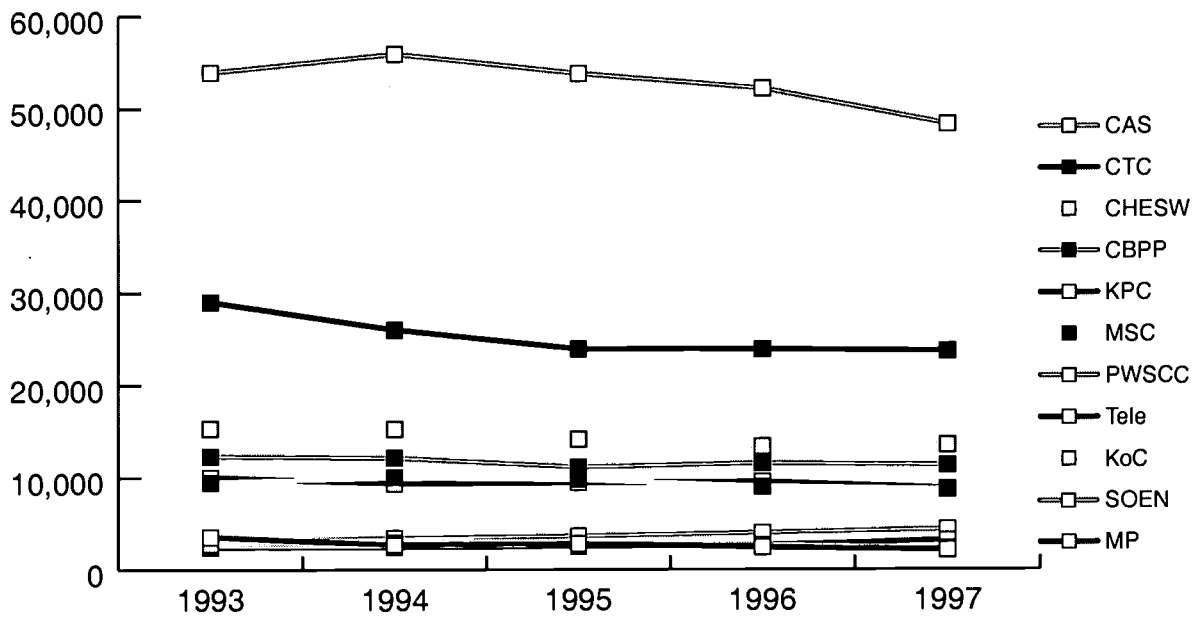

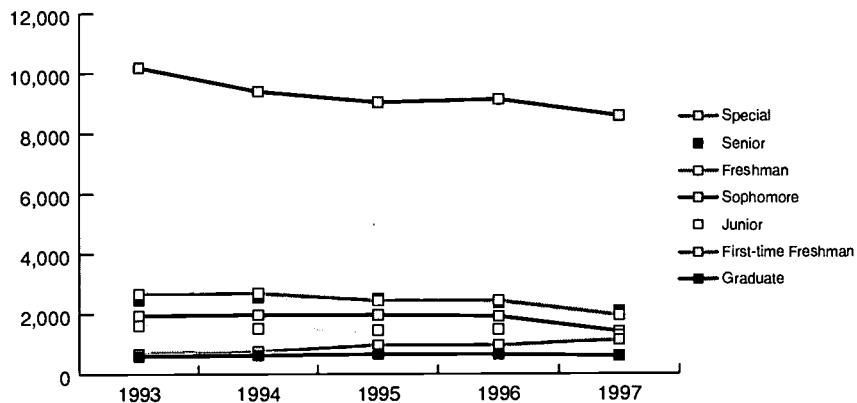

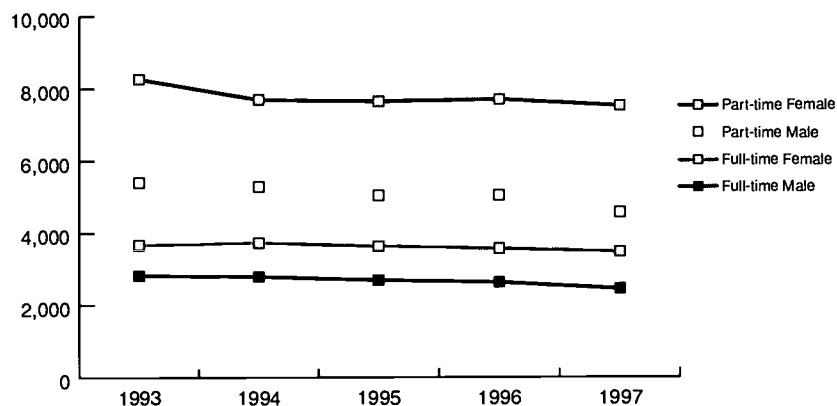

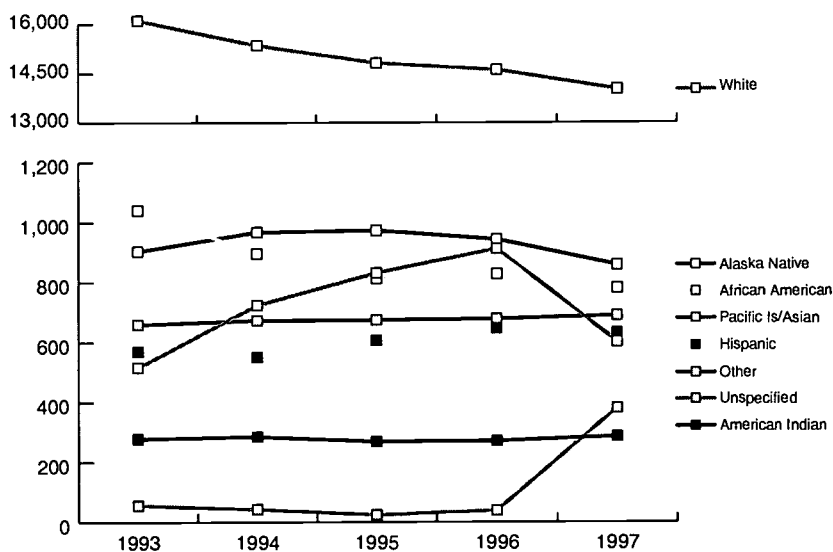
HEADCOUNT TREND BY CLASS STANDING



HEADCOUNT TREND BY GENDER AND ATTENDANCE STATUS

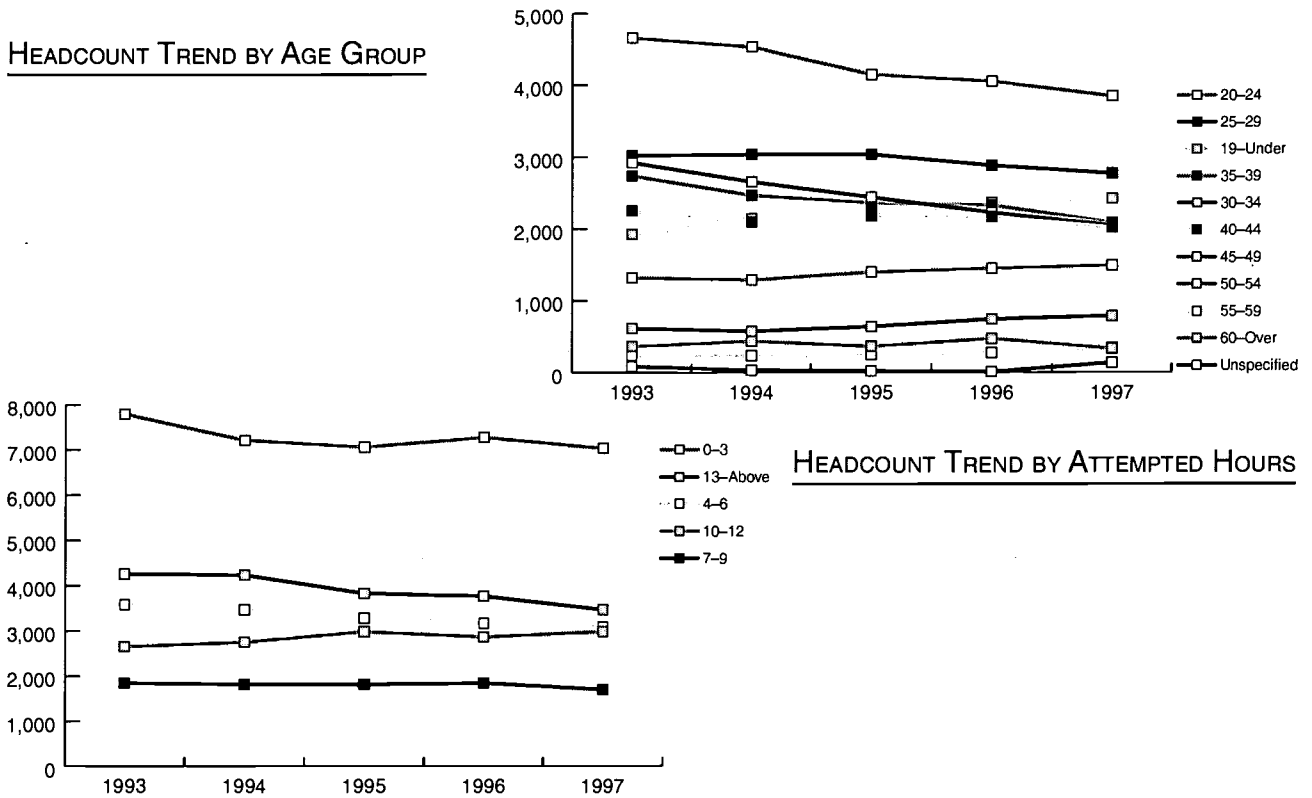


HEADCOUNT TREND BY ETHNICITY

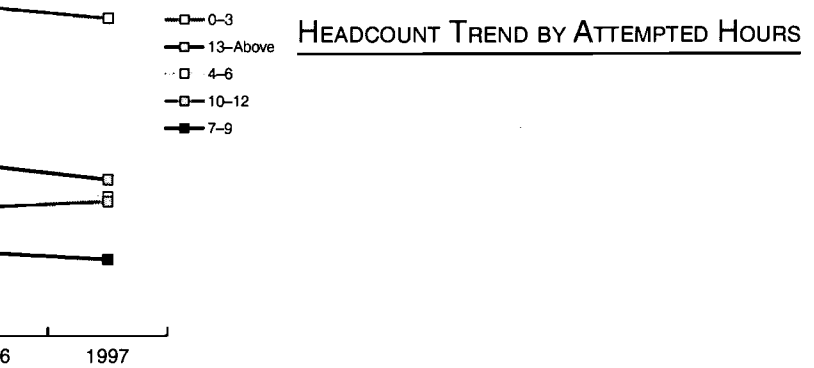


UAA STUDENT HEADCOUNT TRENDS, FALL CLOSING 1993-1997

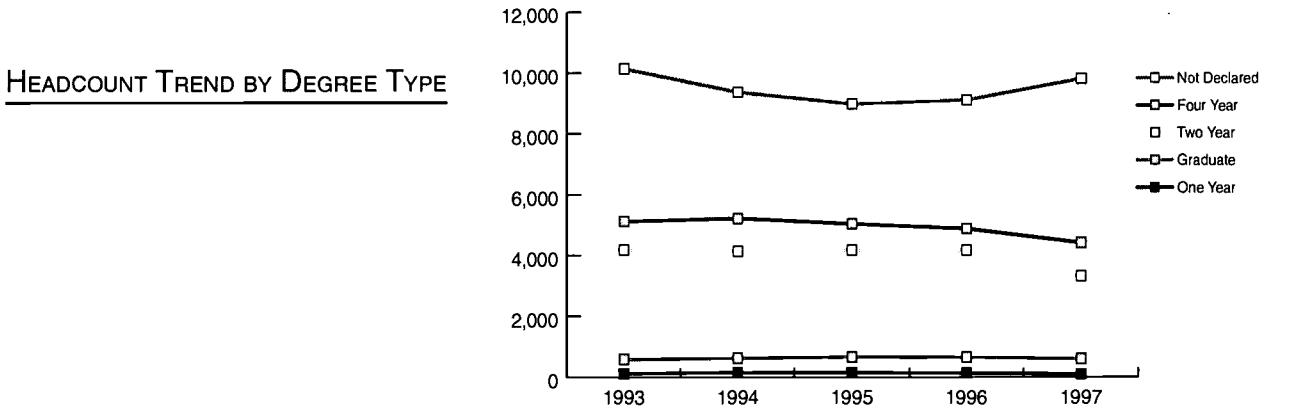
HEADCOUNT TREND BY AGE GROUP



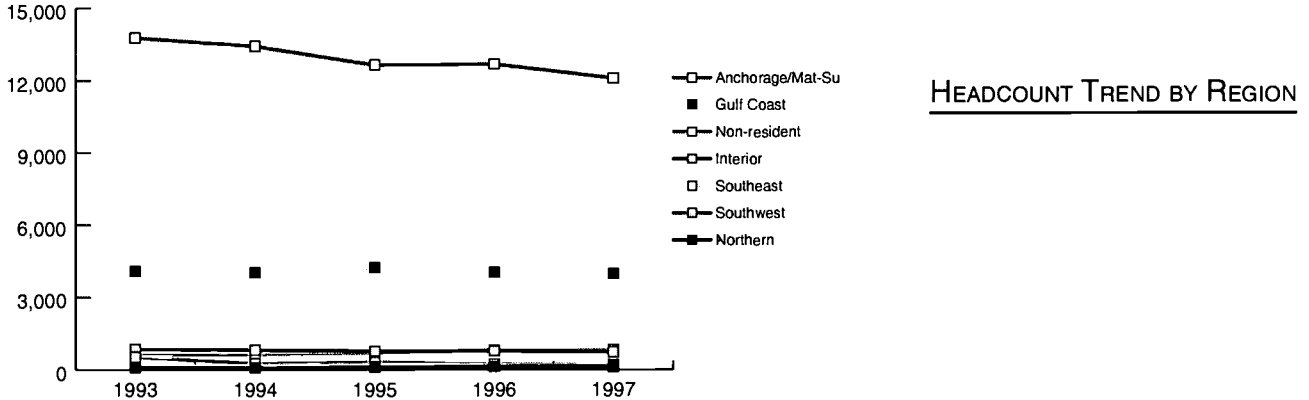
HEADCOUNT TREND BY ATTEMPTED HOURS

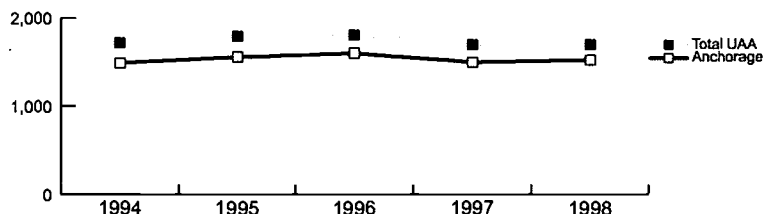

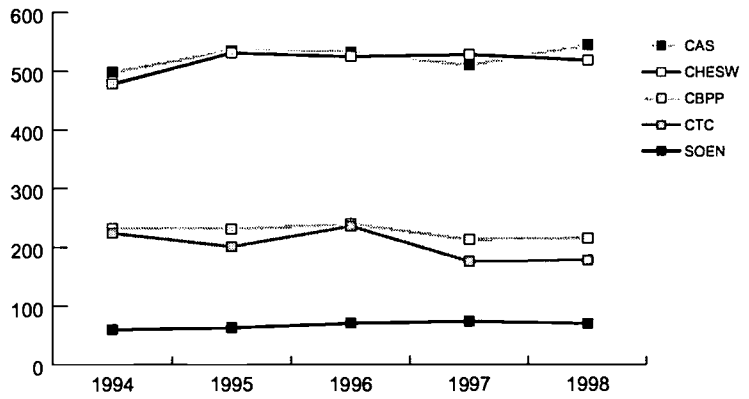
UAA DEGREE AWARD TREND, ACADEMIC YEARS 1994-1998

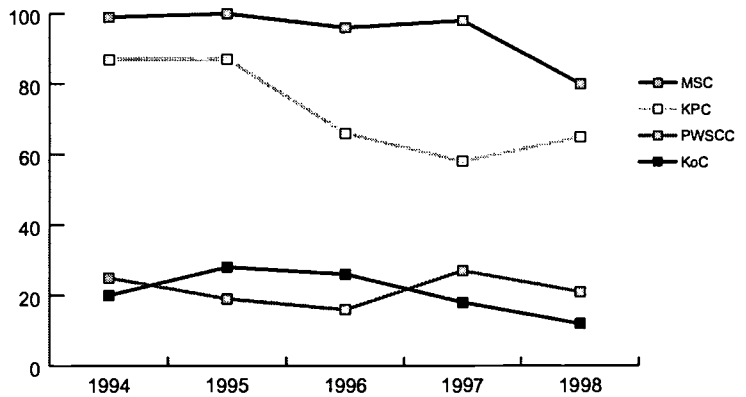

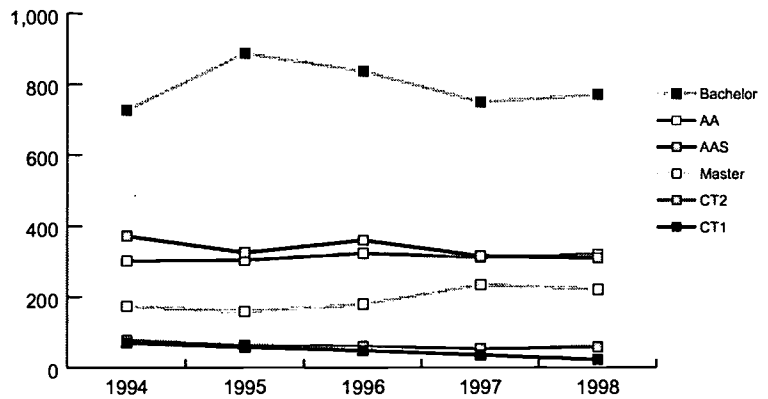

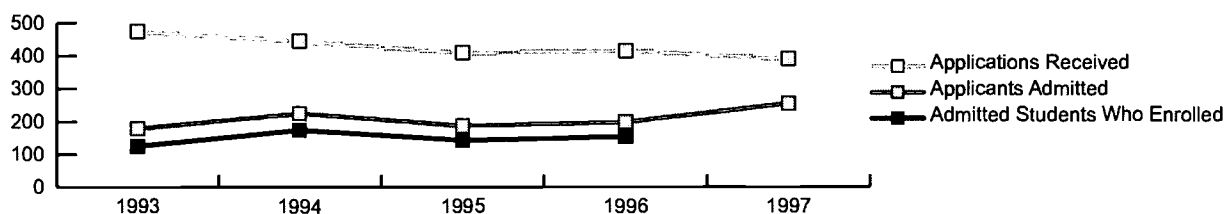

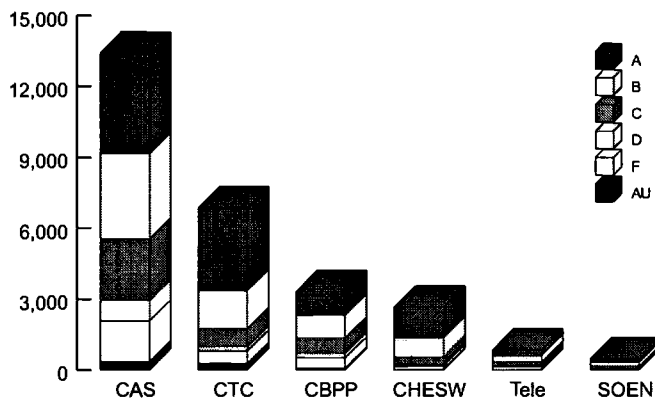

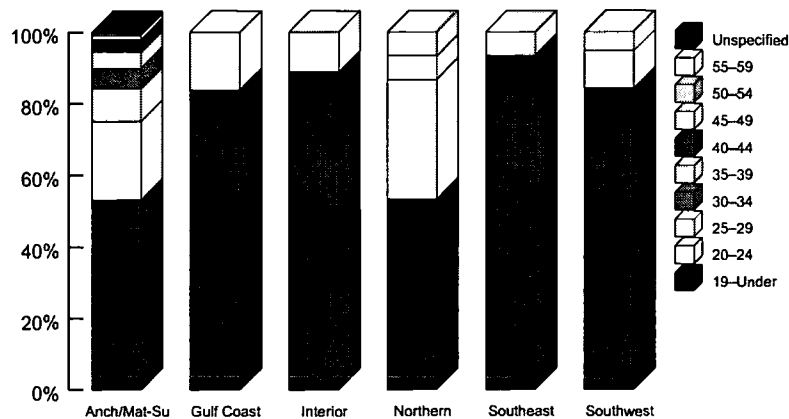

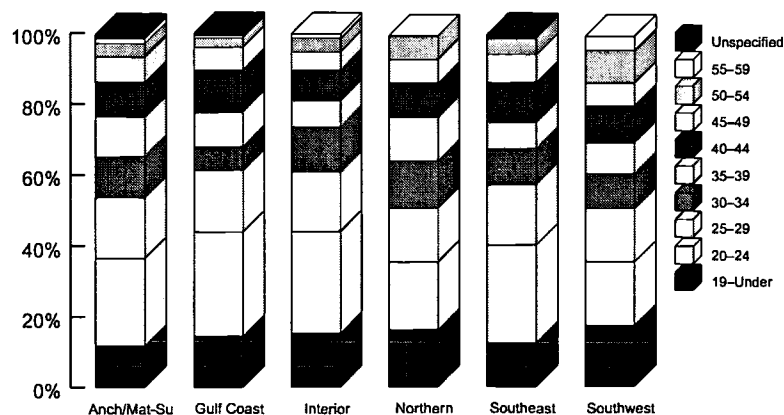

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AGE GROUP COMPOSITION OF ALL ANCHORAGE STUDENTS BY REGION OF ORIGIN, FALL 1997

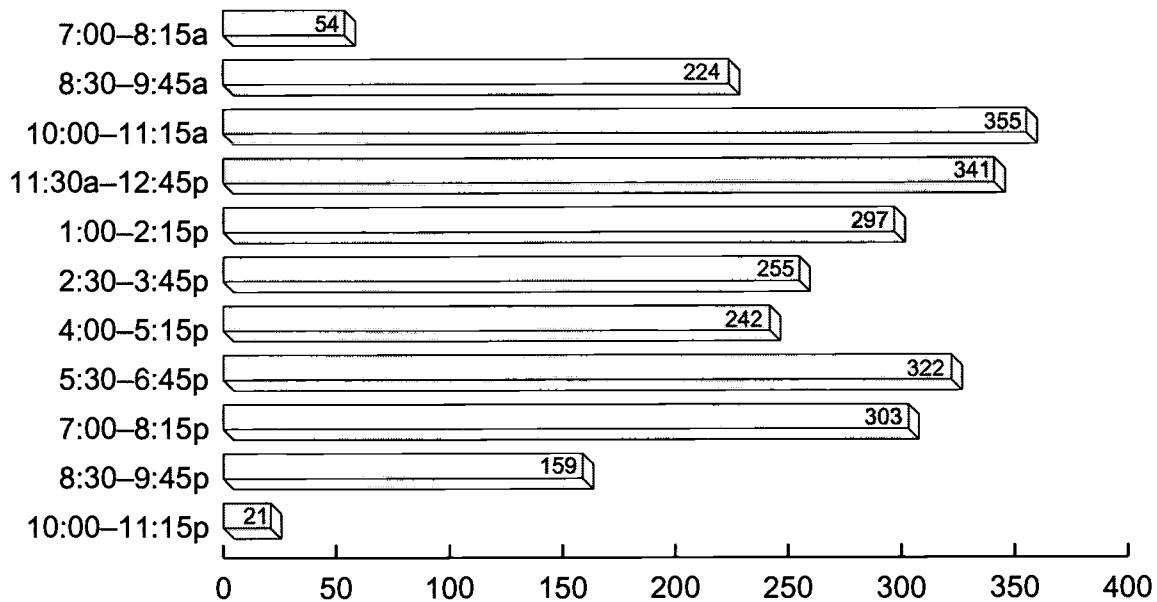

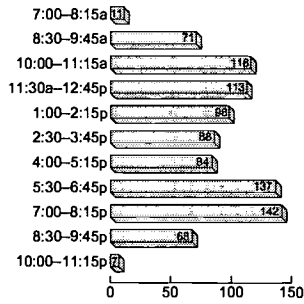

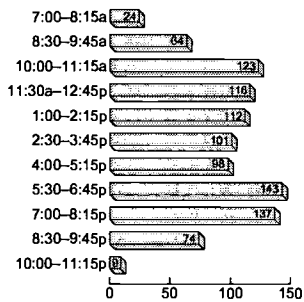
COMBINED DAYS TIME BLOCK USAGE



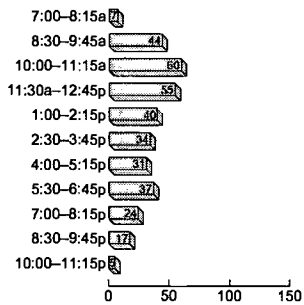
MONDAY/WEDNESDAY TIME BLOCK USAGE



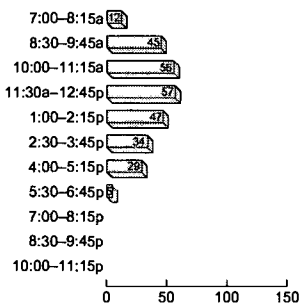
TUESDAY/THURSDAY TIME BLOCK USAGE

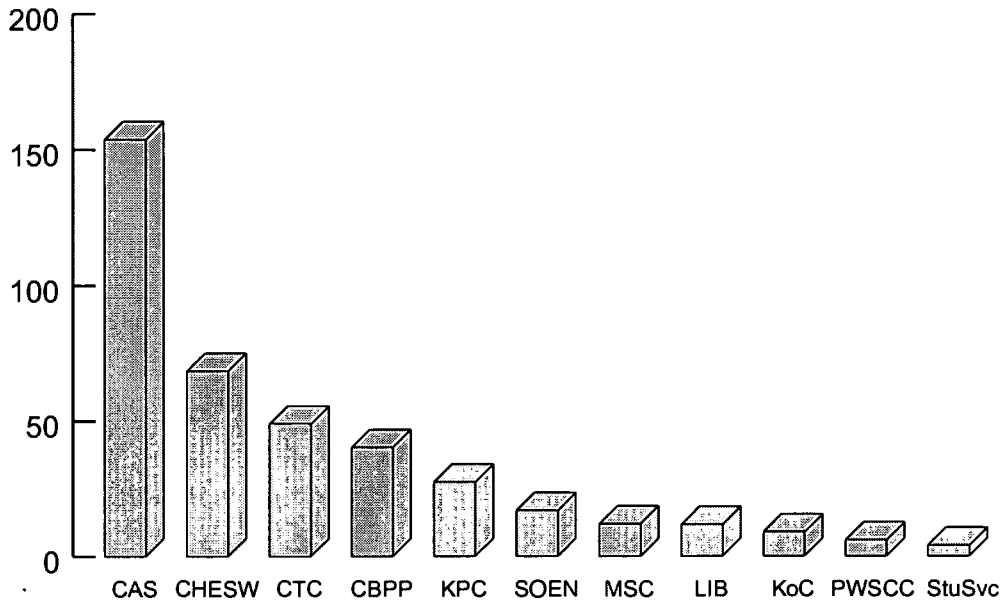

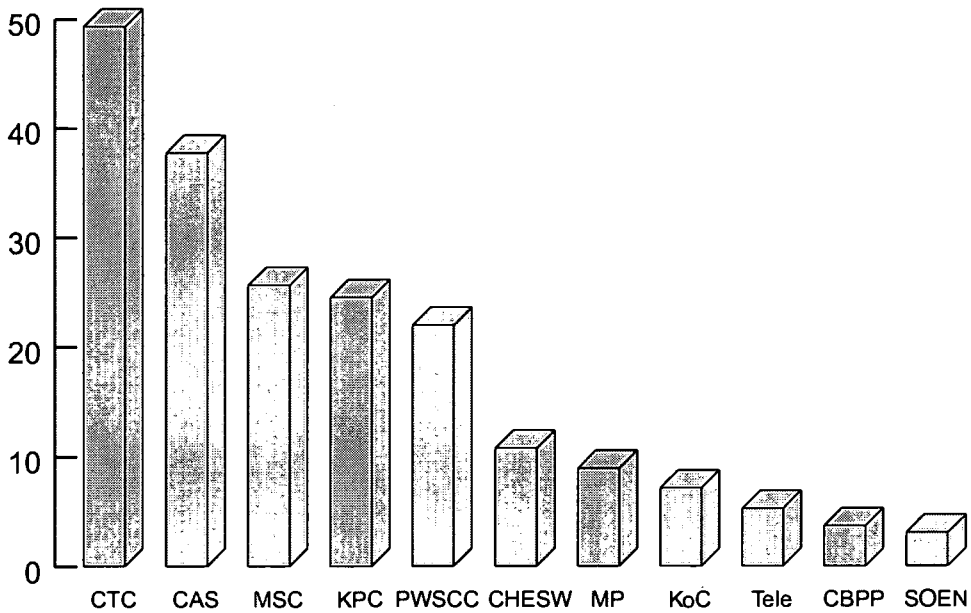

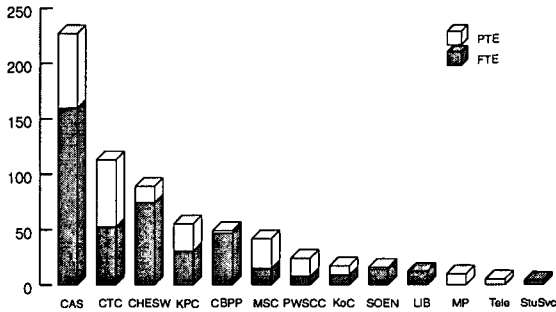

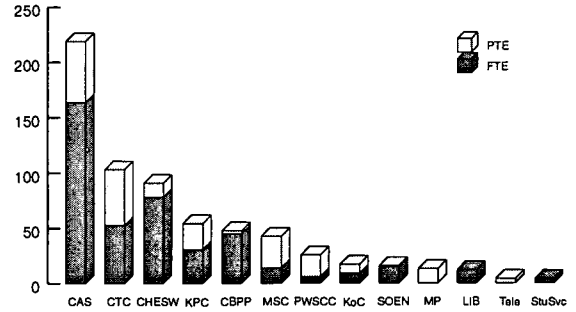

FALL SEMESTERS 1994-1997

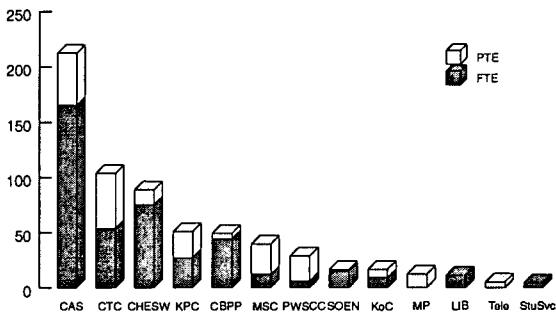

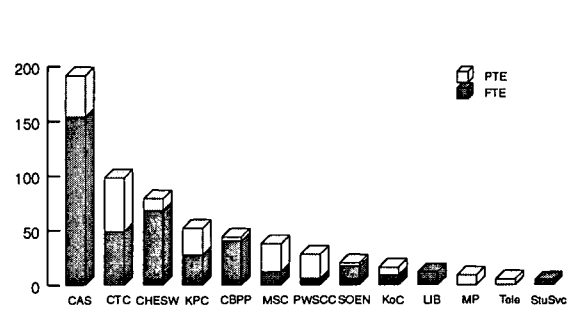

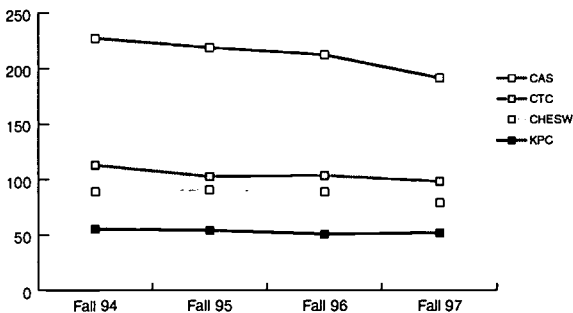

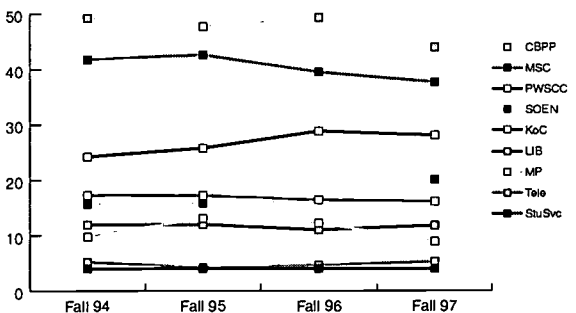


FOUR-YEAR TREND OF TOTAL FACULTY FTE, BY SCHOOL COLLEGE, FALL 1994-1997

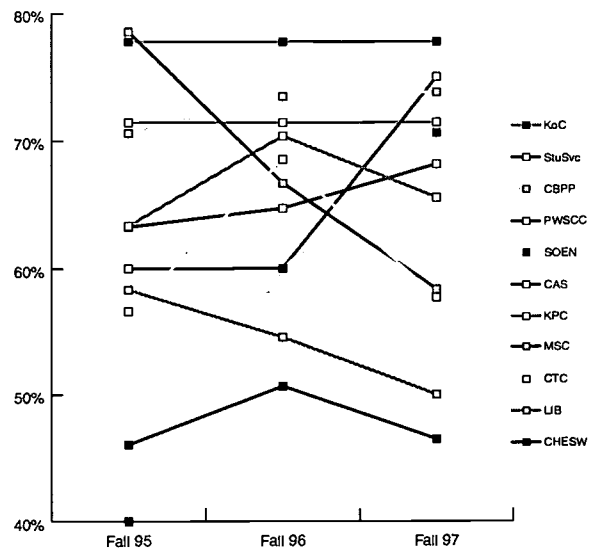

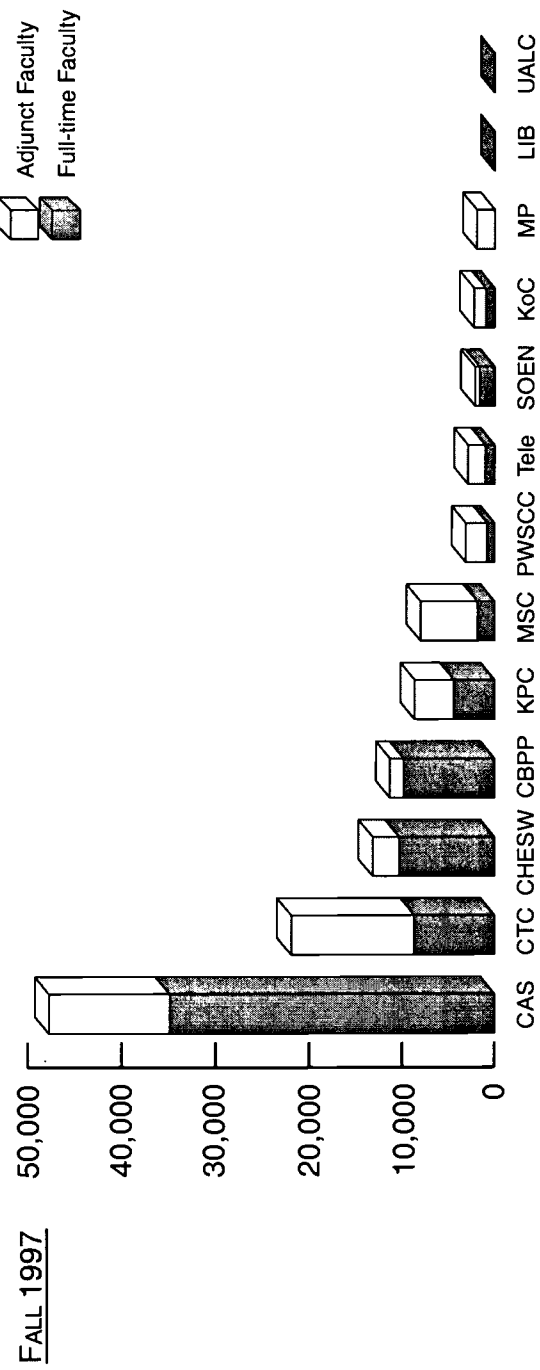
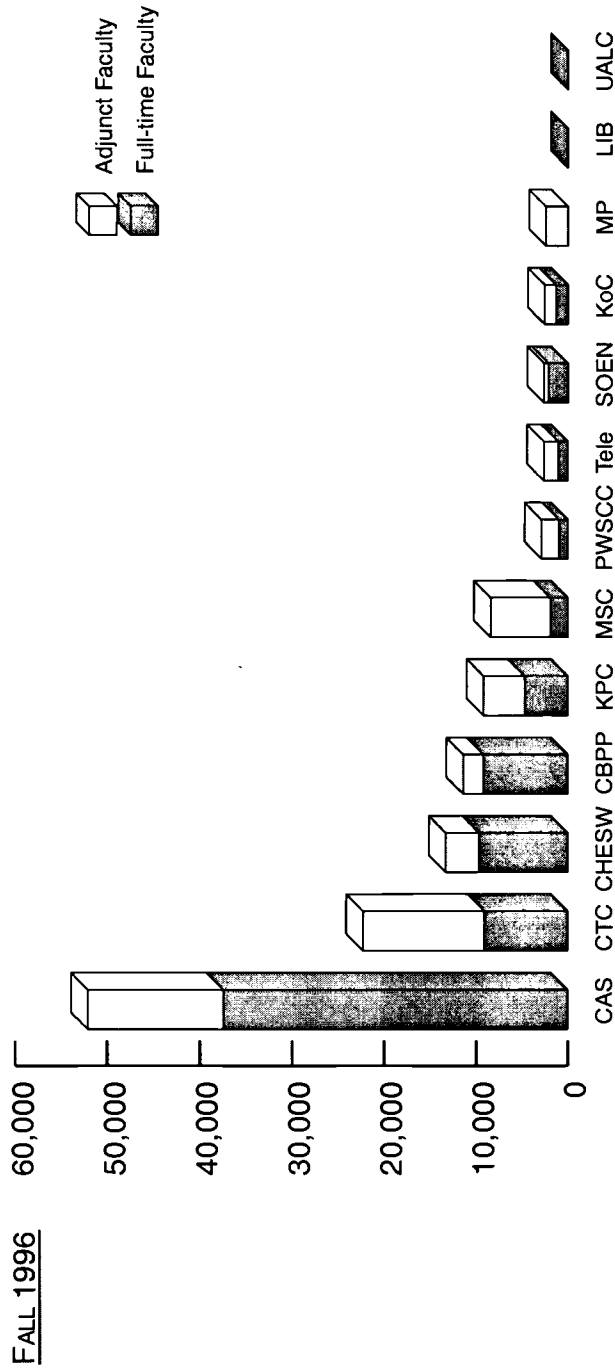

STUDENT/FACULTY FTE RATIO, BY SCHOOL/COLLEGE, FALL 1997

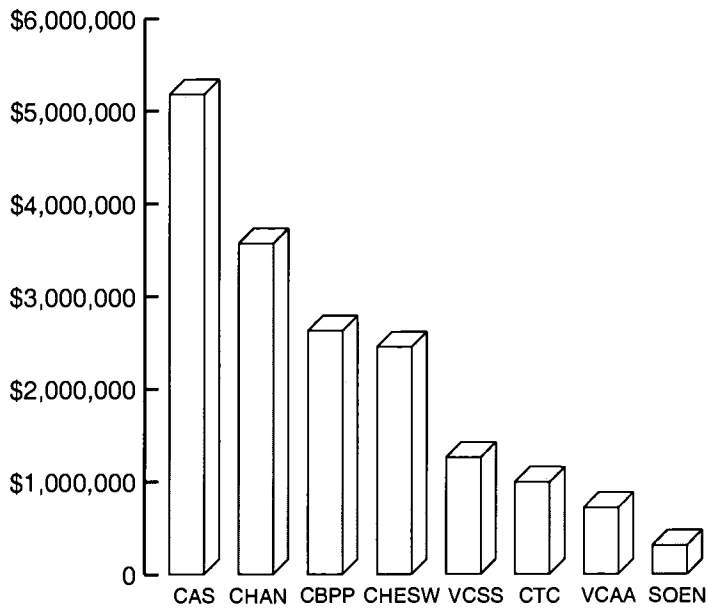

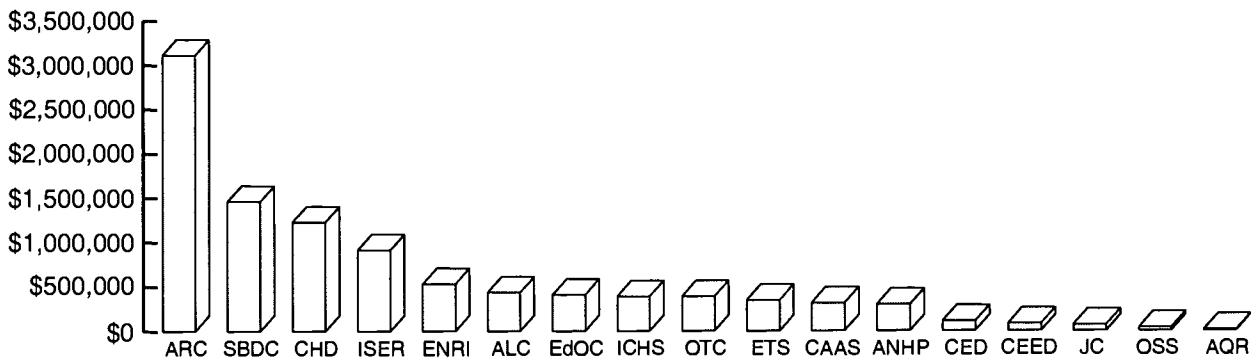

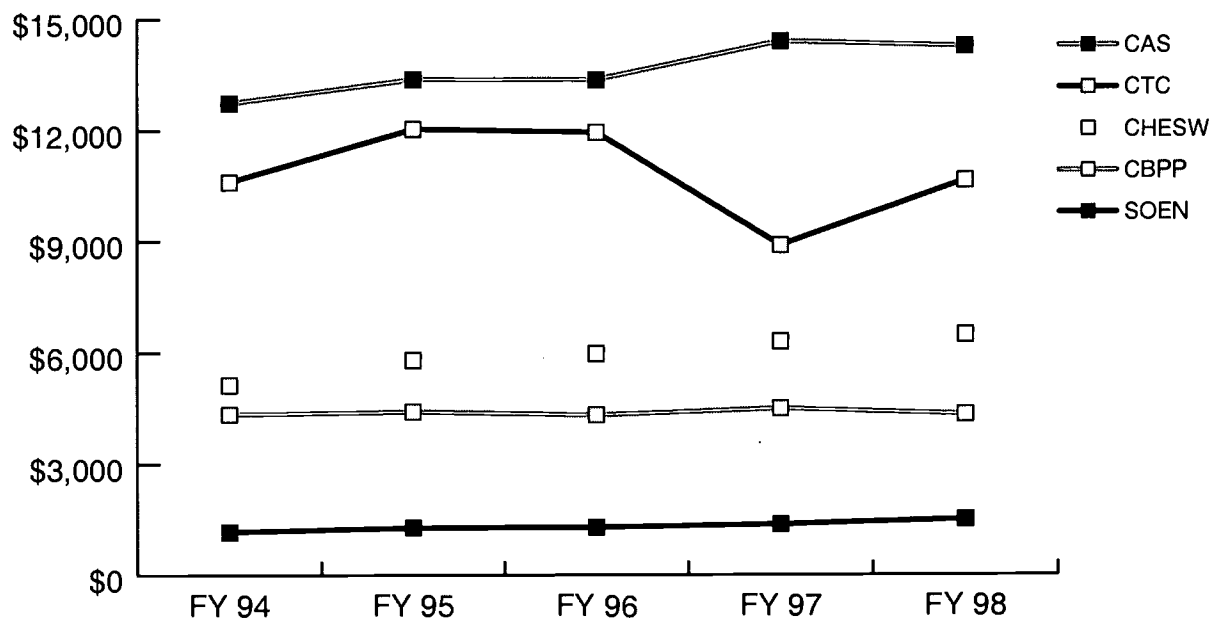

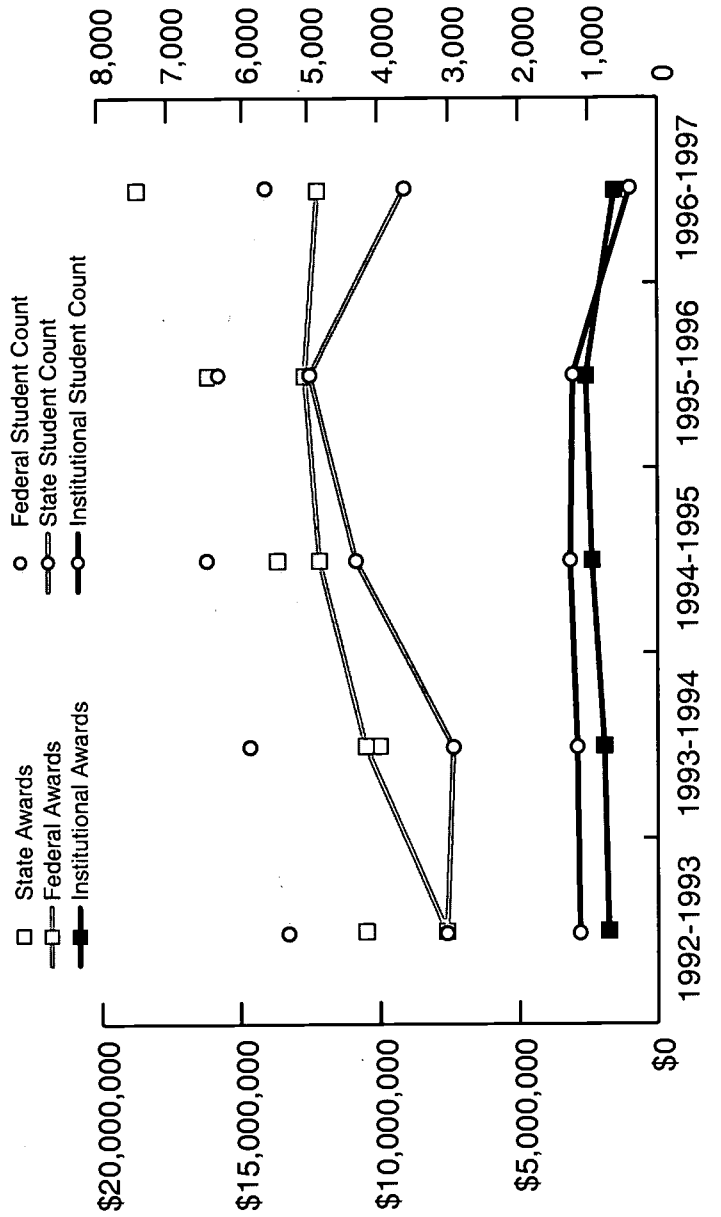

DEFINITION OF TERMS

ACADEMIC YEAR (AY)

A three-semester year which begins with Summer and ends with Spring.

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION (ABE)

Not-for-credit curriculum which enables students to obtain a high school diploma or prepare them for the GED examination.

AUDIT

A grade type for students enrolled in credit courses for auditing purposes, such students are referred to as auditors. Auditors do not receive grades or course credit.

AVERAGE CLASS SIZE

Refers to credit lecture and lecture/lab seatcount divided by credit lecture and lecture/lab sections. It does not include canceled sections.

CLASS STANDING

Undergraduate student status based on cumulative credit hours:

Freshman	=	0-29 cumulative hours
Sophomore	=	30-59 cumulative hours
Junior	=	60-89 cumulative hours
Senior	=	90+ cumulative hours
Special	=	not declared

CONTINUING EDUCATION UNIT (CEU)

Community or professional education course offerings which are not for credit, nor applicable to any degree. One Continuing Education Unit (CEU) may be granted for satisfactory completion of 10 contact hours of classroom instruction or for 20 hours of laboratory or clinical instruction.

COURSE CREDIT HOUR (CCH)

A unit of measure that represents the length of a course and its required class contact hours.

COURSE LEVEL

Developmental (Devel)	=	courses numbered 050-099
Lower Division (Lower)	=	courses numbered 100-299
Upper Division (Upper)	=	courses numbered 300-499
Professional (Prof)	=	courses numbered 500-599
Graduate (Grad)	=	courses numbered 600-699

CREDIT HEADCOUNT

An unduplicated headcount of students enrolled in credit courses at the 050 level and above, with auditors; duplication may occur between campuses.

ETHNICITY

The data represents self-reporting by students or employees according to the ethnicity with which they identify. In the student information, African American also includes students who identified themselves as Black, and may have originated outside the US.

FACULTY

ADJUNCT FACULTY

Faculty with temporary assignments.

BUDGETED FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE)

Faculty paid through unrestricted/general funds (not grants). Budgeted FTE equals 1 for faculty budgeted at 100% in unrestricted funds.

FACULTY PART-TIME EQUIVALENT (PTE)

This unit of measurement is computed by dividing the sum of course credits taught by 15, or by awarding 0.2 FTE for each 3 credit course taught.

DEFINITION OF TERMS (CONTINUED)**FISCAL YEAR (FY)**

A twelve-month period of time starting each July 1 and concluding on June 30. The fiscal year is named for the year in which it ends.

NON-CREDIT

Community interest and personal enrichment course offerings which are not applicable to any degree.

NOT DECLARED

Students not enrolled in a school or college and who have not declared degree-seeking intentions.

Referred to as special undergraduate students. They are not formally enrolled in any degree or certificate program, and are not undeclared majors.

PRIMARY MAJOR

The first degree or certificate program in which a student is formally admitted.

REGION OF ORIGIN

Refers to the Alaskan community of origin of each student based on residence at the time of admission.

REMEDIAL COURSEWORK

Any course numbered 050-099.

RESTRICTED FUNDING

Funding accepted by the university on the condition that it be used for donor-specified operations.

STUDENT**ALL STUDENTS**

An unduplicated headcount of students between, and irrespective of, course type (ABE, CEU, Non-credit, or Credit); duplication may occur between campuses.

FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN

Students enrolled in an undergraduate degree or certificate program who are attending an institution of higher education for the first time.

FIRST-TIME GRADUATES

Students enrolled in a graduate degree program for the first time.

FULL-TIME STUDENT

Undergraduates attempting 12 or more credit hours, and graduates attempting 9 or more credit hours.

GRADUATE STUDENTS

Students enrolled in graduate degree programs.

STUDENT FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE)

On the premise that undergraduate baccalaureate program completion requires four (4) years, and graduate program completion requires three (3) years, full-time equivalent (FTE) is computed by dividing undergraduate credit hours by 15, and graduate credit hours by 12.

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

Students enrolled in undergraduate degree or certificate programs, also includes special undergraduate, or not declared students.

STUDENT CREDIT HOURS (SCH)

Determined by multiplying the number of students enrolled in each course by its course credits, and aggregating for the school, college, or campus. In the event of variable credit courses, the number of credits pursued by each student is summed to obtain the course credit hour productivity.

TENURE STATUS

Faculty may be tenured, not tenured but eligible, and not eligible.

TENURED FACULTY

Faculty who have been awarded tenure by their campus. Deans, directors, or other administrators who have tenure are not counted in this group.

DEFINITION OF TERMS (CONTINUED)

NON-TENURED FACULTY

Faculty who are eligible, but do not have tenure.

NON-TENURE TRACK FACULTY

Faculty not eligible for tenure, includes some instructors and visiting appointments.

TEAM TAUGHT COURSES (COURSES TAUGHT BY MORE THAN ONE INSTRUCTOR)

In team taught courses, course credit hours and student credit hours are split equally among instructors.

UNDECLARED MAJORS

Students enrolled in a school or college, with degree-seeking intentions, but have not declared a major.

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
