#### **ABSTRACT**

This document from the Miami-Dade Community College Office of Institutional Research (Florida) briefly reports student retention rates at the college for the year 2000. Retention rates for degree-seeking students in 2000 increased from 1998 for all major ethnic categories. The year 2000 total college retention rate was 72.5%. Retention rates by ethnicity were: white non-Hispanic 70.1% (an increase of 3.5 percentage points from 1998), black non-Hispanic 73.4%, and Hispanic 72.5%. When students who graduated in the fall term were taken into account, the retention rates were even greater: total college was 76.5%, white non-Hispanic 75.5%, black non-Hispanic 77.1%, and Hispanic 76.4%. Retention rates of new students also increased for all major ethnic categories: total college was 78.3%, white non-Hispanic 73.3%, black non-Hispanic 78.4% (an increase of 2.9 percentage points from 1998), and Hispanic 79.1%. In general, new students showed the highest retention rates among the different categories of enrollment (i.e. new, continuing, other). Includes eight tables reporting the 1996-2000 retention rates (with the exception of 1999 rates, which were excluded due to data anomalies). These retention rate tables are organized according to the students' enrollment category, ethnicity, and college campus. (KP)

### INFORMATION CAPSULE: RETENTION RATE BY ETHNICITY

### Fall-to-Spring Retention Rates Up for All Ethnic Groups

Retention rates for degree-seeking students in 2000 increased for all major ethnic categories. The Black non-Hispanic retention rate increased to 73.4% and was the highest among ethnic groups. The Hispanic retention rate rose a percentage point to 72.5%. Although White non-Hispanic students show a retention rate of only 70.1%, this rate represents a 3.5 percentage point gain over 1998.

### Fall-to-Spring Ethnic Retention + Graduation Rates Boosted

A more accurate measure of retention takes into account those who graduated in the Fall term, since these graduates would not be returning. For 2000, the retention plus graduation rate for Hispanics was 76.4%, and this was the highest rate among Hispanics for the years studied. Black non-Hispanic retention + graduation rate peaked at 77.1%. White non-Hispanic students had a rate of 75.5%. (Details are found in the attached Table 1).

### Retention of New Students by Ethnicity

Retention rates of new students also increased for all major ethnic categories. Black non-Hispanic new students had the largest gain, 2.9 percentage points - to 78.4% in 2000. The Hispanic new student retention of 79.1% exceeded the college-wide rates and is the highest rate shown. In general, new students have the highest retention rates among the categories of enrollments (new, continuing, other). Table 1 provides the details.

### INFORMATION CAPSULE: RETENTION RATE BY ETHNICITY

#### Campus Retention + Graduation Rates for Ethnic Groups

Tables 2-8 (attached) display ethnic group retention data as well as retention + graduation data for all campuses. Some notable findings for the combined retention + graduation rate are:

- Medical Campus rates far exceed those of other campuses across ethnic groups and ranged from 87% - 88% in 2000.
- North Campus rates were evenly distributed across ethnicities at 75%-76% in 2000.
- Wolfson Campus ethnic rates ranged narrowly between 76%-78% for 2000.
- Homestead Campus had the greatest retention + graduation rate increase (6.8 percentage points) across campuses for Hispanic students in 2000.
- ◆ InterAmerican Campus had a retention + graduation rate of 78.5% for Hispanic students, and this surpassed the college rate.
- ◆ In 2000, White non-Hispanic retention + graduation rates on North, Kendall, Wolfson, and Homestead campuses increased by more than 4 percentage points.

#### Notes on Method:

This report is an extension of Information Capsule IC 2001-10C that analyzed college-wide and campus retention rates for new, continuing, and other (former, transfer, dual, miscoded) degree-seeking students. This capsule captures the same population and presents an ethnic perspective. For retention data, campus is based on the campus where more than 50% of course credits were taken in the Fall term. Any Spring term enrollment is counted as retention. For graduation data, the graduate is counted on the campus posting the degree. Data for 1999 are not available due to data anomalies in the Odyssey conversion.
