ABSTRACT

This document compares unrestricted funding revenue at City University of New York (CUNY) with other select universities, colleges, and community colleges from the 1990 fiscal year to the 1999 fiscal year. Unrestricted funding revenue is limited to public support and tuition. Revenue from private gifts, grants, contracts, endowments, educational services, and other auxiliaries are not included. The selected colleges and universities were chosen based on their Carnegie classification, urban mission, and student demographics. The report shows that: (1) unrestricted funding revenue at CUNY senior four-year colleges declined 15% (\$154 million) between 1990 and 1999, even though enrollments and tuition both increased during the same time period; (2) unrestricted current fund revenue at the national senior college peer group rose 16% between 1990 and 1999; (3) enrollment-based state aid, maintenance of effort legislation and increased funds for facility improvements at Hostos, LaGuardia, and Kingsborough community colleges during the 1990s left the CUNY community college system with smaller funding losses than those experienced at the senior colleges; and (4) total unrestricted current fund revenue rose 4% at the community college peer institutions. Executive Summary

The following analysis examines Unrestricted Current Fund revenue at the City University of New York and select peer institutions between Fiscal Years 1990 and 1999.¹ Unrestricted Current Fund revenue in this analysis is limited to tuition and public support and therefore excludes private gifts, grants and contracts, endowment income, sales of educational services, auxiliary enterprises, and other sources. The senior and community college peer groups employed were originally developed by PriceWaterhouseCoopers for the Schmidt Commission. Criteria for peer selection included Carnegie classification, urban mission, and student demography. For purposes of the current analysis, Nassau Community College replaces Community College of Central Seattle to provide representation of SUNY in the community college peer group. The Community College of Denver was excluded from the peer group due to incomplete data reported for FY 1999. 1990 finance data have been adjusted for inflation using the Higher Education Price Index so that they reflect 1999 dollars.

What the Data Show

CUNY Senior Colleges:

Unrestricted Current Fund revenue at CUNY senior colleges declined 15.2% (\$154 million) after inflation between 1990 and 1999. Senior college enrollments increased more than 4% during that same period resulting in an even greater decline in revenue of 18.8% (\$2,141) per full-time equivalent student (Chart 1, Tables 1 and 2). This decline in funding occurred despite the fact that there were significant cost increases at a number of our senior colleges associated with new facilities: Baruch College (Site A), the consolidated campus at the College of Staten Island, the Queens College music building, the Lehman College physical education facility, as well as the conversion of Medgar Evers College to a senior college.

During this same period, revenue from tuition at CUNY senior colleges rose 79.4% (\$184 million) as a result of tuition increases in fiscal years 1991, 1992, 1993, and 1996. This increased revenue, however, was more than offset by a 43.4% (\$338 million) reduction in public support after inflation—leaving the senior colleges with the net Unrestricted Current Fund revenue loss of 15.2% (Chart 2, Tables 3 and 4). As a consequence of tuition hikes and cuts to public support, the portion of total Unrestricted Current Funds comprised of tuition revenue exceeded 40% at ten of eleven CUNY senior colleges in 1999 (and exceeded 50% at five colleges). A decade earlier, tuition comprised less than 30% of Unrestricted Current Funds at all CUNY senior colleges and less than 25% of revenue at eight of eleven senior colleges (Table 5).

¹ This study is based on IPEDS finance data. The most recent year available is 1999.

Senior College Peer Group:

Compared to diminished funding at CUNY senior colleges, Unrestricted Current Fund revenue at the national senior college peer group rose 15.6% (\$167 million) between 1990 and 1999. After accounting for a 13% increase in enrollment at these schools over the same time period, revenue increased 2.0% (\$216) per full-time equivalent student (Chart 1, Tables 1 and 2). This funding growth was due to 71% (\$175 million) in increased tuition revenue offset by a decline of 0.9% (\$8 million) in public support after inflation (Chart 2, Tables 3 and 4). As a consequence of relatively stable levels of public funding, tuition revenue remained less than 40% of Unrestricted Current Funds at eight of eleven peer institutions (Table 5). In sum, resources at the senior college peer group exceeded the cost of inflation in the 1990s and provided a majority of these institutions with increased resources to pursue and expand their educational missions.

CUNY Community Colleges:

Enrollment-based State aid, Maintenance of Effort legislation and increased funds for facility improvements at Hostos, LaGuardia, and Kingsborough community colleges during the 1990s left the CUNY community college system with somewhat smaller funding losses than those experienced at the senior colleges. Notwithstanding, total Unrestricted Current Fund revenue declined 4.2% (\$14 million) between 1990 and 1999. Coupled with a 13% increase in enrollment, Unrestricted Current Fund revenue per full-time equivalent student declined 15.4% (\$1,301) (Chart 3, Tables 6 and 7).

Tuition revenue rose 79.7% (\$64 million) during this period, but was offset by a 30.1% (\$79 million) reduction in public support, resulting in the total 4.2% net revenue decline across the community college system (Chart 4, Tables 8 and 9). As occurred at the senior colleges, increased tuition and reductions in public support drove the portion of total funding comprised of tuition revenue above 40% at four of six CUNY community colleges in 1999. Ten years earlier, tuition comprised 25% or less at five out of six of these schools (Table 10).

Community College Peer Group:

In comparison, total Unrestricted Current Fund revenue rose 4.2% (\$26 million) at the community college peer group institutions. Increased enrollment of 5% during this period left the peer group with a only slight decline of 0.8% (\$58) per full-time equivalent student (Chart 3, Table 6 and 7).

Funding at these institutions maintained approximate pace with inflation even after increased enrollments due to the fact that tuition revenue rose 29.1% (\$45 million) over the course of the decade and public support was reduced only by 4.3% (\$20 million) (Charts 4, Tables 8 and 9). Similar to the senior college peer group, relatively stable public support kept tuition as a portion of total Unrestricted Current Fund revenue below 40% at all but one community college peer institution (Table 10).

(1990 Dollars Inflation Adjusted to Reflect 1999 Dollars)





- Between 1990 and 1999 tuition revenue rose 79.4% (\$184 million) at CUNY senior colleges and 71.2% (\$175 million) at senior college peer group institutions after inflation. However, a 43.4% (\$338 million) reduction in Public Support for CUNY senior colleges left them with a net revenue loss of 15.2% (\$154 million). In contrast, Public Support declined 0.9% (\$8 million) among the peer group, providing them with a net revenue gain of 15.6% (\$167 million).



- When enrollment changes between 1990 and 1999 are accounted for, CUNY community colleges lost 15.4% (\$1,301) per fte while the community college peer group lost 0.8% (\$58) per fte.



Methodology Notes


For purposes of this study, Unrestricted Current Fund revenue includes funds from tuition and State and Local support that have no limitations or stipulations placed on them. It excludes private gifts, grants and contracts, endowment income, sales of educational services, auxiliary enterprises, and other sources.

The senior and community college peer groups employed in this study were developed by PriceWaterhouseCoopers for the Schmidt Commission. For purposes of the current analysis, Nassau Community College replaces the Community College of Central Seattle to provide representation for SUNY in the community college peer group. The Community College of Denver was excluded from the peer group due to incomplete data reported for FY 1999. It should be noted that the community college peer group, as selected by PriceWatterhouseCoopers, is larger than the CUNY community college system. Gross dollar comparisons should therefore be avoided in favor of comparisons of percentage change, percentage difference, and per fte dollars.

1990 data have been adjusted for inflation using the Higher Education Price Index so that they reflect 1999 dollars.

PEDS student FTEs are estimated from national headcount data. Total FTEs are equal to total full-time student headcount plus one-third of total part-time student headcount.


