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ABSTRACT

This report presents the results of the Houston Community College System's (HCCS's) (Texas) year 2000 Student Survey. Highlights include: (1) 63% of students surveyed were female, and more than 67% of students surveyed lived in households of 2 to 4 individuals; (2) the ethnic/racial makeup of the sampled students is almost evenly divided among the 3 major ethnic groups/racial groups in the geographic area--Caucasians 27%, Hispanics 26%, and African Americans 25%; (3) the mean age of students surveyed was 28 years, and the median age was 24 years; (4) almost 70% of students reported that they were employed off campus, in either full- or part-time positions; (5) approximately 37% of students reported an annual household income equal to or exceeding \$33,460, while almost 15% reported a yearly household income of \$8,050 or less; (6) approximately 51% of students indicated that they were first-generation college attendees; and (7) slightly more than 50% of students indicated a desire to transfer either to the University of Houston-Downtown or the University of Houston-University Park. Results of the survey were presented as System totals as well as being broken down into the five System campuses: Central, Northeast, Northwest, Southeast, and Southwest. (NB)

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Houston Community College System Student Survey2000 Profile of Sampled Students

- Females represent 63.3% of the students sampled.
- The ethnic/racial make-up of the sampled students is almost evenly divided among the three major ethnic/racial groups in this geographic area; Caucasians = 27%, Hispanics = 26.2%, and African Americans = 24.8%.
- The mean age of students surveyed is 27.5 years and the median is 24 years.
- More than 67% of surveyed students live in households of two to four individuals.
- More than three-fourths of the students report that they do not have children living with them and only 6.5% of the students report eligibility for AFDC payments.
- Approximately 37% of students report a household income equal to or exceeding \$33,460 per annum; however, almost 15% of students report a yearly household income of \$8,050 or less.
- Almost 70% of students' report that they are employed off-campus, either in full-time or part-time positions.
- Approximately 51% of students indicate they are first-generation college attendees; that is, neither parent has attended college.
- Students are almost equally divided between those who have taken classes at other institutions and those who have not.
- The vast majority of students are enrolled in day classes, while 50.7% of the students report their educational goal is to transfer to a 4year institution.
- Slightly more than 50% of the survey students report a desire to transfer to either the University of Houston-Downtown or the University of Houston-University Park.

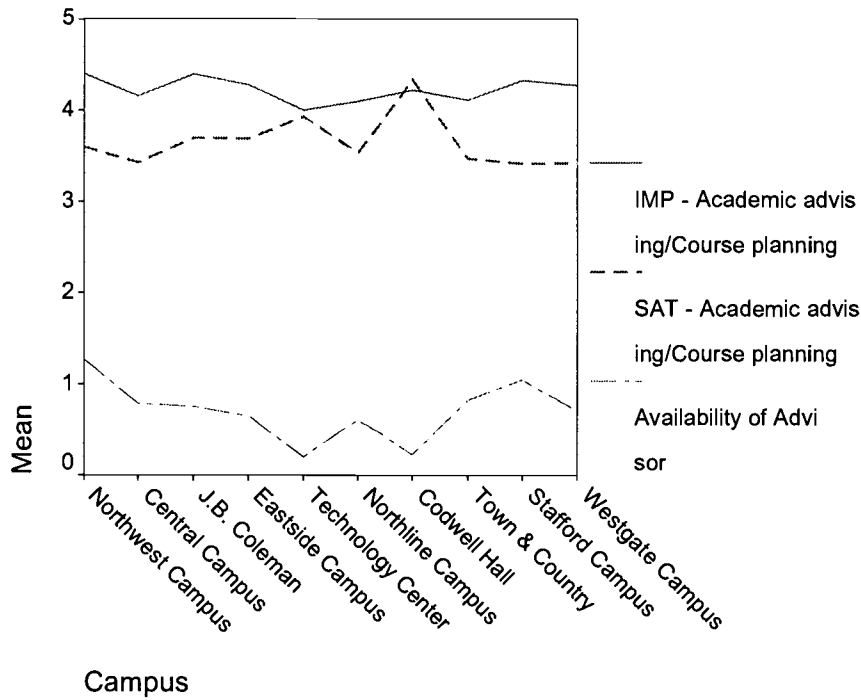

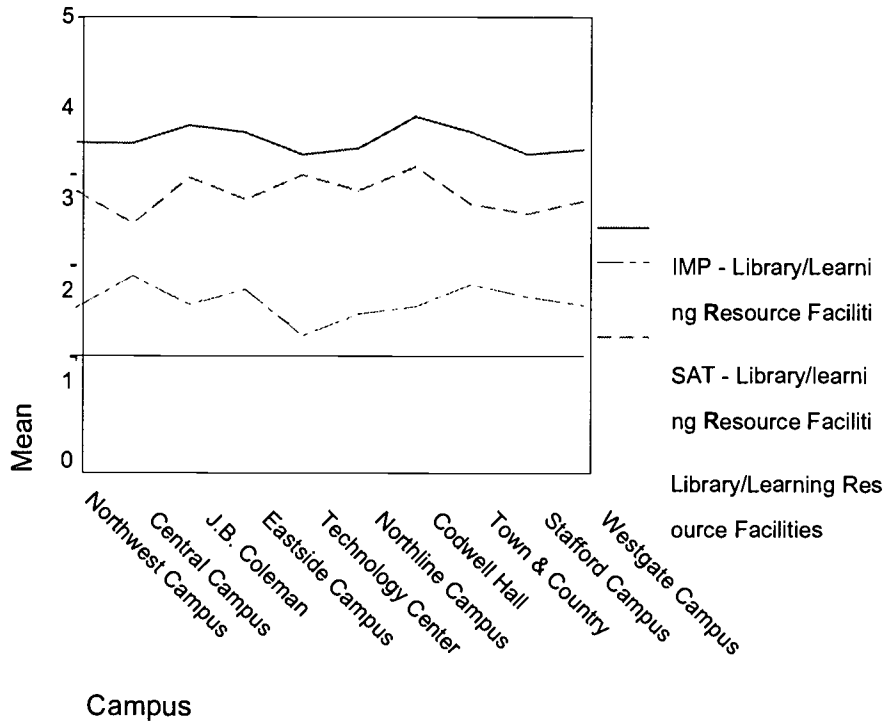

Means Plot: 'Importance,' 'Satisfaction,' and 'Availability' of Library/Learning Resource



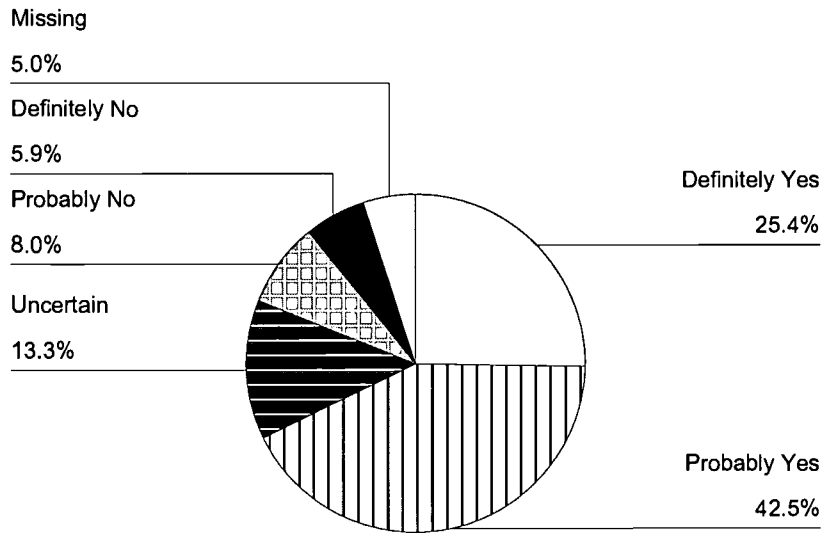

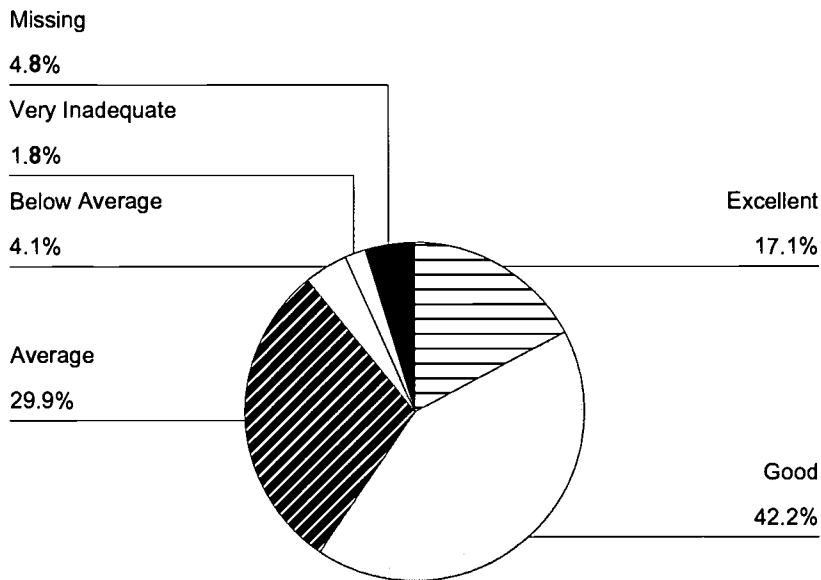

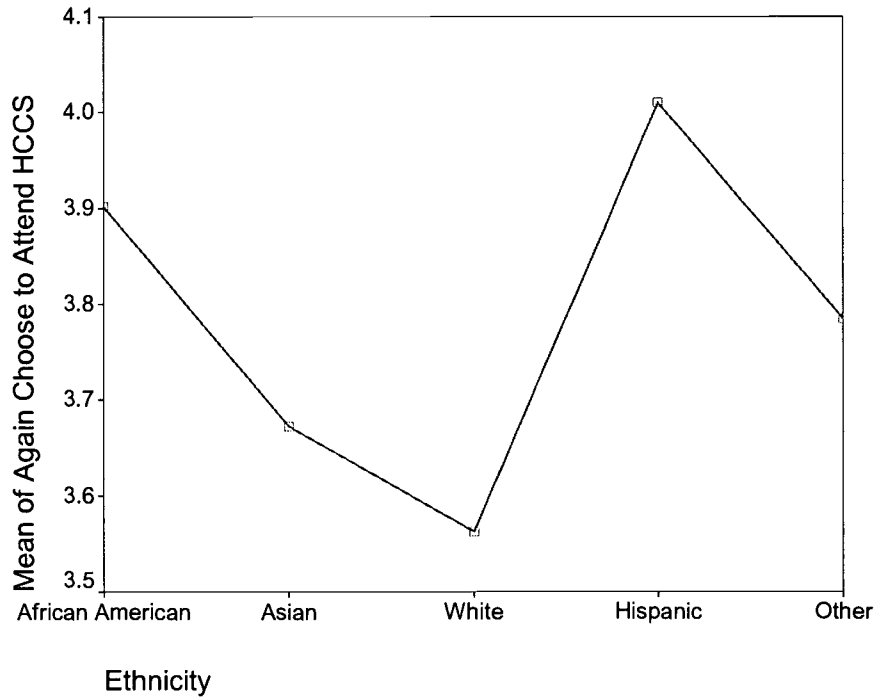

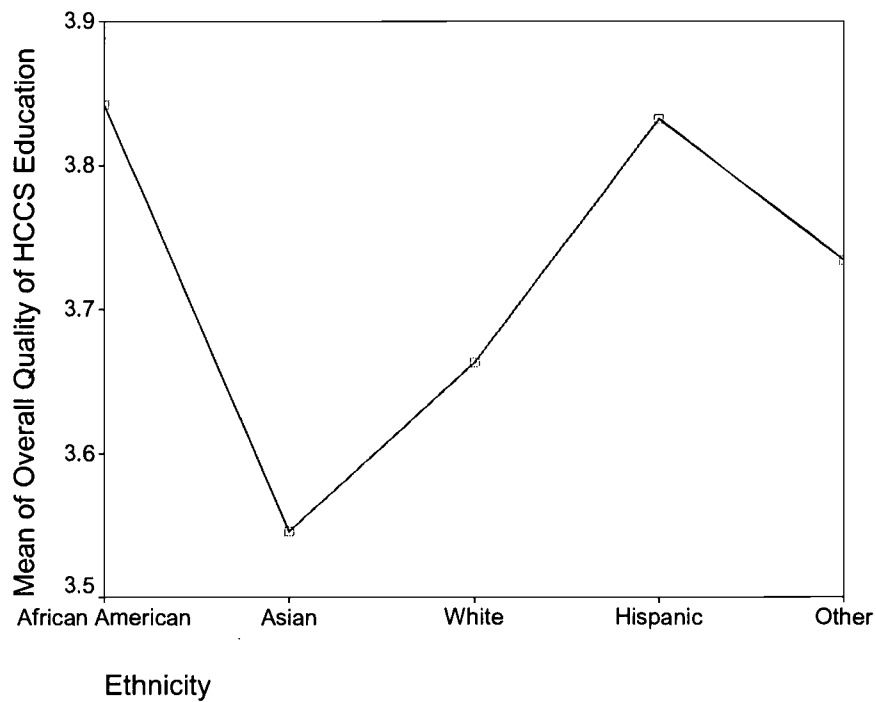

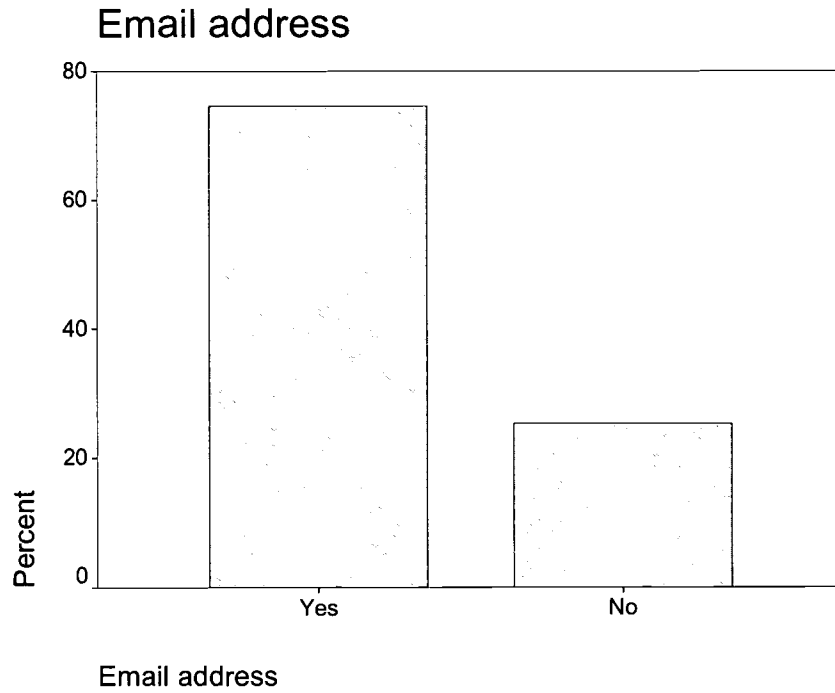
Preferred Registration Method

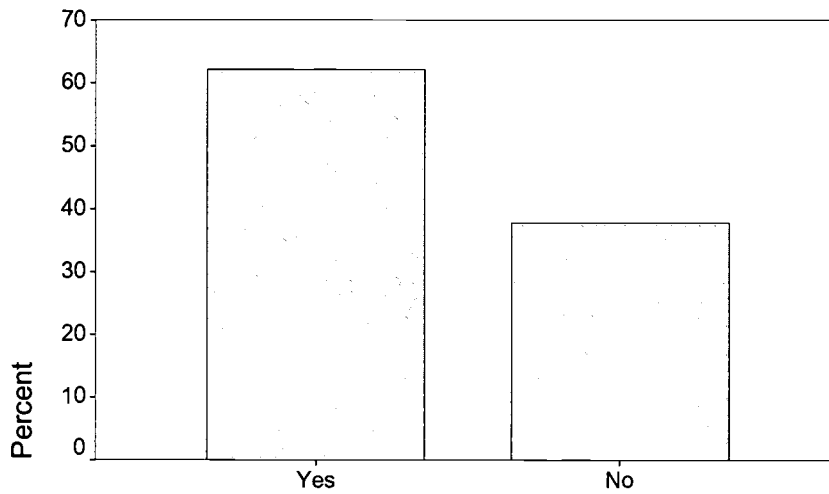

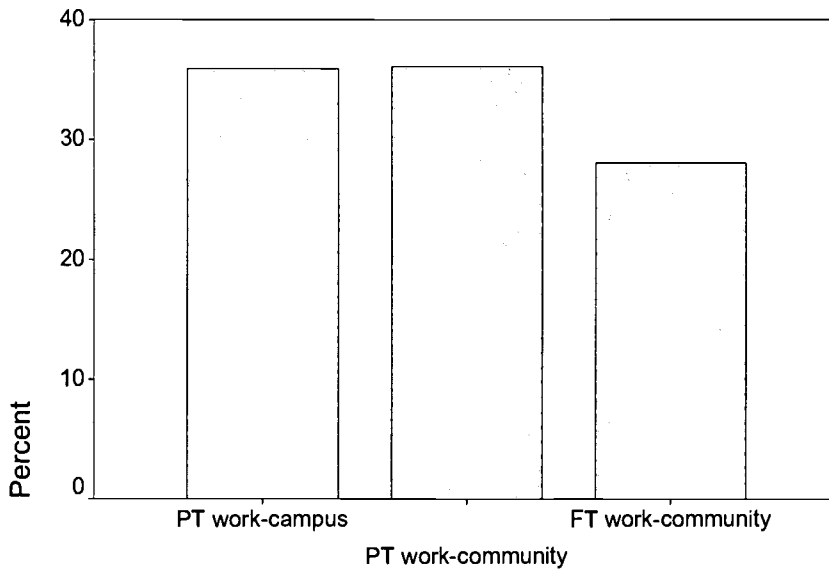
Condition of HCCS Classrooms/Equipment

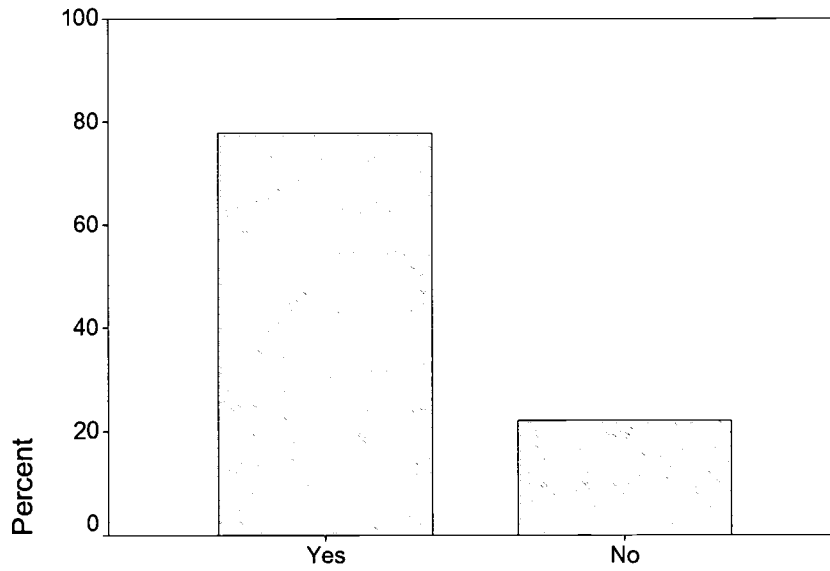

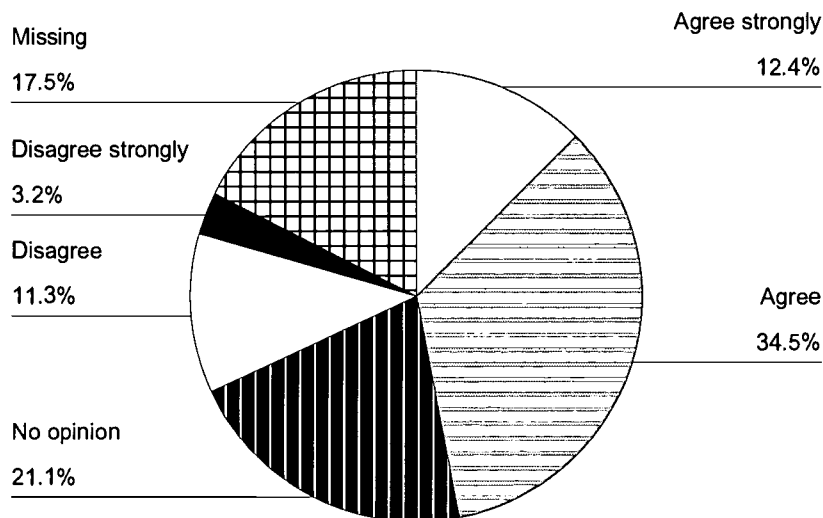
