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## ABSTRACT

This handbook presents statistics about the public and private schools of Maryland. In 2000-2001, there were 852,920 public school students in Maryland and 187,100 nonpublic school students, representing a 5.9% increase in the public school enrollment over 5 years and a 12.3% increase in the nonpublic school enrollment over 5 years. There were 1,380 public schools in the state and 1,157 nonpublic schools. Of the state's 100,531 public school staff, 68,485 were in instructional positions. The majority of the state's public school students were White (53.4%) and 37.1% were African American and 4.8% were Hispanic American. Most teachers were white (76.7%). Statewide, the average dropout rate was 3.90%, although in Baltimore City, the dropout rate was 10.44%. Most of the state's 47,740 high school graduates planned to go to college. Information is also provided about achievement test results for the Scholastic Aptitude Test and the Maryland School Performance Assessment, as well as information about teacher salaries, financial resources, special programs, correctional education, and vocational and adult education. 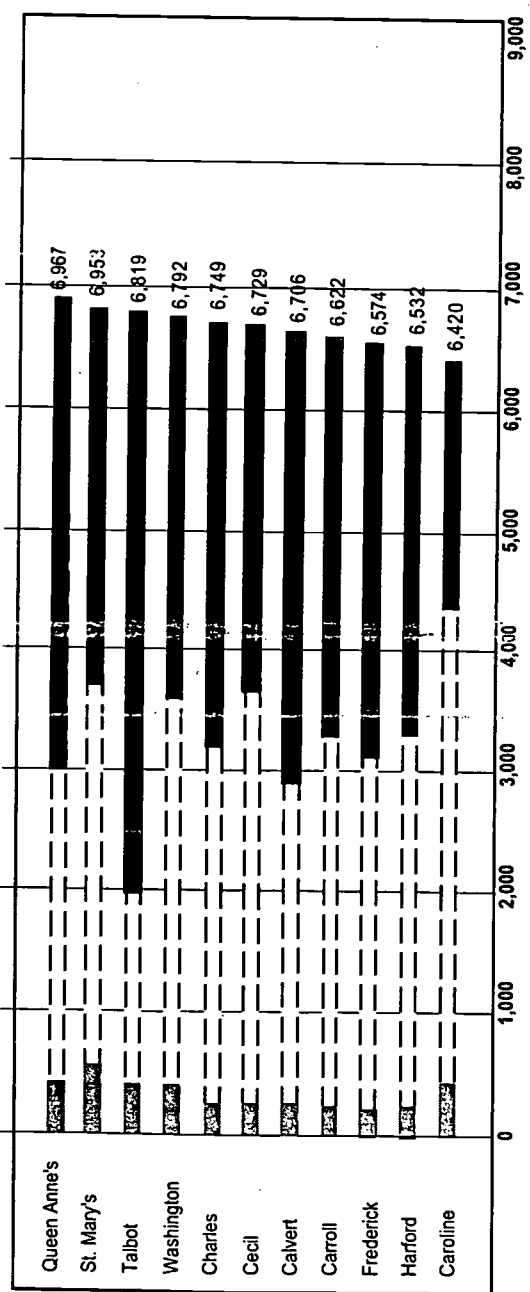

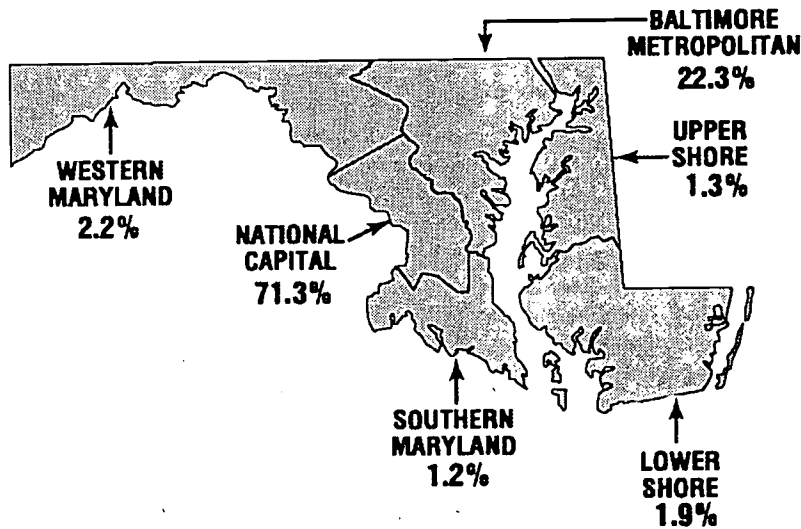

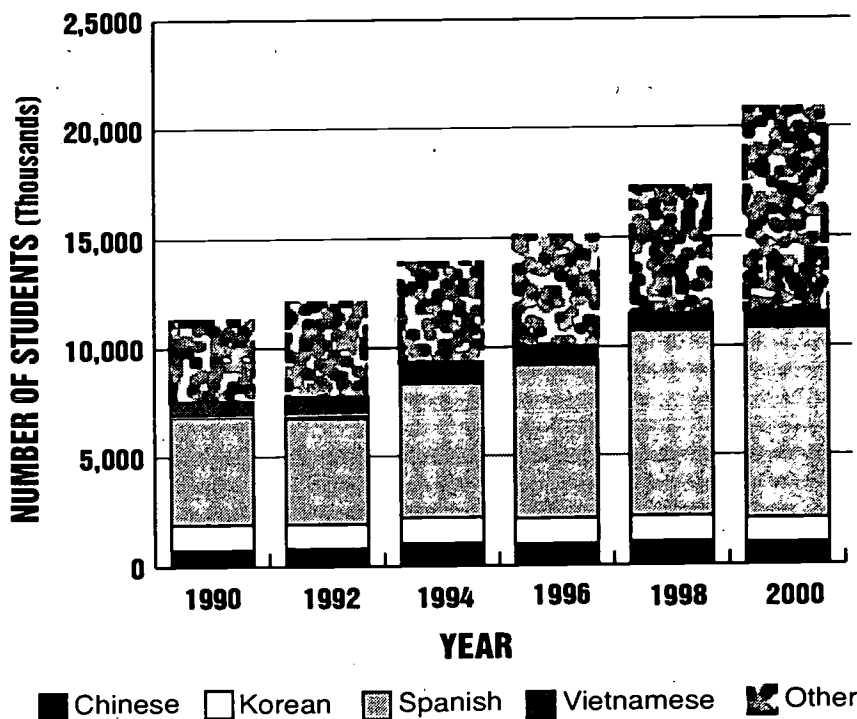

# Did You Know . . .

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- Maryland received an “A” rating in Education Week’s 2001 Quality Counts report for the state’s work in Academic Standards, Assessments and Accountability. Maryland’s score of 98 placed it first among all states for its comprehensive standards and accountability program.
- Maryland is one of the top four states in the nation with an exceptionally high percentage of public high schools offering Advanced Placement courses for students.
- Maryland was awarded the National Education Goals Panel 1999 Gold Star for having the nation’s highest graduation rate.
- Maryland was the first state to make completion of service-learning activities a condition of high school graduation. Since 1997, Maryland students have contributed more than six million hours of service to their communities.
- Maryland was the first state to sign on to the U.S. Department of Education’s Partnership for Family Involvement, and is the only state represented on the steering committee for national family involvement program planning.
- The U.S. Department of Education granted full approval of Maryland’s state assessments as effective measures of Title I Programs. Only 11 states received full approval.
- The state established the nation’s most challenging passing scores for the elementary education teacher certification test.
- Maryland ranked 4th in the nation for its 2001 cumulative SAT score among those states with a participation rate of 65% or higher.
- According to a report from RAND (a non-profit think tank), Maryland math scores are rising about twice as fast as the national average based on the National Assessment of Education Progress (NAEP) tests.
- Since the Maryland School Performance Assessment Program began testing students in 1993, the overall state composite has increased from 31.7% of students performing satisfactory in 1993 to 45.3 in 2000—an increase of 13.6 percentage points.

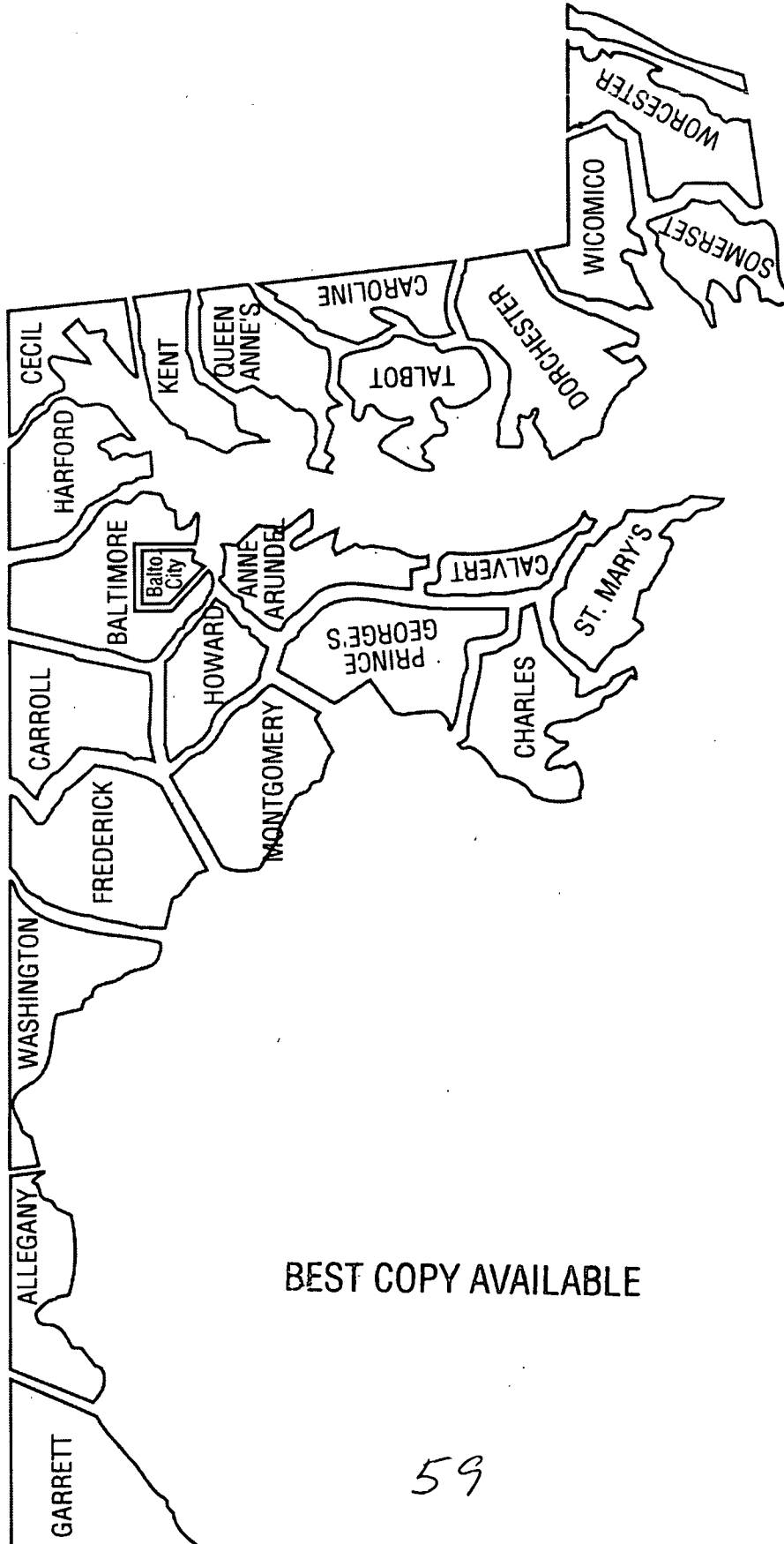
