ABSTRACT

This report tracks 335 Title-IV participating degree-granting institutions that met the criterion of enrolling at least 25% Hispanic students in 1999 (Hispanic Serving Institutions, or HSIs). The HSIs on this list include public, private not-for-profit, and private for-profit institutions in the United States and Puerto Rico. This report provides a statistical overview of the growth in HSI enrollment and degrees during the 1990s. It also presents an overview of HSI staff in 1999 and describes salary changes from the middle to the end of the decade. This report does not contain an official list of HSIs, but instead attempts to provide a policyrelevant picture of current trends in college education for Hispanics. The broader definition of HSI in this report brings into focus a group of institutions that served 45% of all Hispanic college students in the United States in 1999. Enrollment data are from the 1999 survey of the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System fall enrollment compliance report. Data show that enrollment in the HSIs grew rapidly between 1990 and 1999. The number of students enrolled increased by 14%, so that the proportion of all U.S. college students enrolled in HSIs grew to 10%. In addition, the number of degrees awarded by HSIs grew by 36% between the 1991-1992 academic year and the 1999-2000 academic year. Data are also presented about faculty and students at HSIs. An appendix contains guides to the tables and sources and a list of definitions. (Contains 4 figures and 38 tables.) (SLD)

INTRODUCTION

Economic realities today place considerable pressure on American youth to pursue postsecondary education. A high school diploma no longer guarantees high-paying employment, and the labor market is such that an individual's chances for economic success can be improved by obtaining postsecondary degrees.1 As a result, demand for postsecondary education has grown in the past decade, as is evidenced by the fact that Americans are enrolling in colleges and universities in greater numbers than ever before. This is especially true for the Hispanic population, which is experiencing rapid growth. Hispanic Americans' enrollment in colleges and universities increased by 68 percent in just 9 years—from about 782,000 in 1990 to 1,317,000 in 1999 (table 5).2

As Hispanic enrollment grows, Hispanic serving institutions (HSIs) play an increasingly important role in providing Hispanic Americans with access to college education. Hispanic serving institutions, for the purposes of this report, are degree-granting institutions where at least 25 percent of full-time-equivalent undergraduates who are U.S. citizens or resident aliens are Hispanic. This report, the first from the U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) to focus exclusively on HSIs, tracks 335 Title IV-participating³ degree-granting institutions that met the 25 percent Hispanic enrollment criterion in 1999. The HSIs on this list include public, private not-for-profit, and private for-profit institutions in the United States and Puerto Rico. This report provides a statistical overview of the growth in

HSI enrollment and degrees during the 1990s. It also presents an overview of HSI staff in 1999 and salary changes from the middle to the end of the decade.

It is important to note that the institutions tracked in this report do not comprise an official list of institutions eligible for federal funding under the Title V Developing Hispanic-Serving Institutions Program. To be eligible for this program, an institution must meet additional criteria found in Title V of the Higher Education Act (HEA) of 1965, as amended. In particular, institutions must assure that at least 50 percent of their Hispanic students are low-income individuals. Furthermore, institutions must be not-for-profit. Other qualification criteria for the program exist as well, and eligibility is contingent on the submission of an application.

The purpose of this report, therefore, is not to describe an official list of Hispanic serving institutions, but instead to provide a policy-relevant picture of current trends in college education for Hispanics. The broader definition of HSIs used in this report brings into focus a set of institutions that enrolled 45 percent of all Hispanic college students in the United States in 1999 (table 6).

The enrollment data used to identify this report's set of HSIs are from the fall 1999 survey of the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) Fall Enrollment Compliance Report. In the IPEDS survey system, data on race/ethnicity are collected for U.S. citizens and resident aliens only. Nonresident aliens, regardless of race, are reported as a separate group. For this report, institutions were selected as HSIs based on the percentage of students who were Hispanic after nonresident aliens were excluded from the total number of enrolled students in each institution. However, to provide a complete picture of the proportion of the entire student body

that was Hispanic, the percentages presented in this report include the nonresident aliens in the total number of students. (Data on the percent of U.S. citizens and resident aliens enrolled in HSIs who were Hispanic can be found in table A1 in the appendix.)

This report tracks the same set of 335 institutions (276 in the United States and 59 in Puerto Rico) between 1990–91 and 1999–2000. It does not identify the varying number of institutions that met the definition of HSIs in each year. If the 25 percent enrollment criterion were applied in a different year, a different number of institutions may have qualified. For instance, if the criterion were applied in 1990, 111 institutions in the United States and 53 institutions in Puerto Rico would have been designated as Hispanic serving institutions.⁶

By tracking a single set of 335 institutions from 1990-91 to 1999-2000, this report presents a tabular illustration of the role of HSIs in America's postsecondary education system. Included are summary tables with data on enrollments, degrees conferred, and staff for the 335 HSIs, as well as institution-level tables with data for each individual institution. The tables provide a context for the development of HSIs by comparing their experiences with those of all institutions in the United States. In tables 1-3, the data are presented separately for HSIs in the United States and for HSIs in Puerto Rico. Furthermore, tables 4-7 present data by race/ethnicity, and data for Puerto Rico have been excluded from the calculations in these tables. This was done because Hispanic students inherently comprise the majority of students in these institutions in Puerto Rico, unlike in their counterparts in the United States. In tables with detailed institution-level data, information for all HSIs in both the United States and Puerto Rico is included.

The data presented in this report provide a statistical overview of the work of HSIs with students of Hispanic origin as well as with students from diverse racial and ethnic backgrounds. In addition, the institution- and state-level statistics in this report can assist HSIs in comparing their own experiences with those of other HSIs throughout the country and within their own states. A trend table on enrollment at the institution level examines some important developments at specific institutions.

Enrollment

Enrollment in HSIs in the United States grew rapidly between 1990 and 1999. During this period, the number of students enrolled increased by 14 percent, exceeding the 7 percent growth for all institutions (table 1). As a result, the proportion of all U.S. college and university students who were enrolled in HSIs grew during the decade, from 9 percent in 1990 to 10 percent in 1999 (table 6). In Puerto Rico, the number of students enrolled at HSIs grew as well, increasing by 11 percent from 1990 to 1999.

The number of women enrolled in HSIs in the United States grew 18 percent between 1990 and 1999, compared with a 9 percent growth among men (table 1). At all institutions in the United States, the number of women grew at a faster rate than the number of men as well (10 percent vs. 3 percent growth between 1990 and 1999). In 1999, women accounted for 58 percent of students at HSIs in the United States and 56 percent of students at all institutions in the United States.

The growth in enrollment at HSIs in the United States also varied by race/ethnicity. In fact, the growth was almost entirely a product of a surge in enrollment of minority students. Between 1990 and 1999, the number of minority students enrolled in HSIs increased by 49 percent—a rate comparable to the 48 percent increase for all institutions (tables 4 and 5). Over the same period, White enrollment in HSIs declined by 20 percent, compared with only a 4 percent decline in all institutions. As a result of these differences in growth trends, by 1999, minorities out-numbered Whites in HSIs (64 percent vs. 34 percent) (table 4). In 1990, by contrast, White and minority students were represented in almost equal proportions. Nonresident aliens accounted for 3 percent of students at HSIs in 1990 and 2 percent of students at HSIs in 1999.

Among minorities, the number of Hispanic students enrolled in HSIs in the United States grew faster than students of any other race or ethnicity (figure 1). From 1990 to 1999, the number of Hispanic students grew from 359,000 to 588,000 (table 4). This growth raised the proportion of Hispanic students to 42 percent and made them the largest racial or ethnic group at these institutions. The number of students who were Blacks, Asians or Pacific Islanders, or American Indians or Alaska Natives also grew during the decade, but these increases were smaller.

Despite the 64 percent growth in Hispanic enrollment in HSIs from 1990 to 1999 (table 4), the percentage of all Hispanic students enrolled in HSIs

actually declined slightly, from 46 percent to 45 percent (table 6). This small decline can be attributed to the fact that Hispanic enrollment in non-HSIs grew even faster than Hispanic enrollment in HSIs.

A relatively large proportion of the growth in enrollment between 1990 and 1999 at HSIs in the United States occurred at private institutions (table 2). Although the total number of students enrolled in private HSIs in 1999 was far smaller than the number enrolled in their public counterparts (153,000 in private HSIs vs. 1,246,000 in public HSIs), enrollment in private HSIs rose considerably over the decade and substantially exceeded the growth in public institutions (table 2). In both 2-year and 4-year private HSIs, Hispanic enrollment more than doubled between 1990 and 1999 (table 4).

Changes in the racial and ethnic representations in enrollment at HSIs occurred at the undergraduate, graduate, and first-professional levels, to varying degrees. At all three levels, the shift was an increase in minority enrollment, particularly Hispanic enrollment (figure 2).

Overall enrollment in HSIs at the graduate level grew faster than both undergraduate and first-professional enrollment, increasing 24 percent, from 76,000 in 1990 to 95,000 in 1999 (table 7). This increase in the number

of graduate students was due primarily to increasing minority enrollment in HSIs, particularly that of Hispanic students, which more than doubled from 1990 to 1999. The increase can also be partially attributed to a 56 percent increase in the number of non-resident aliens.


Undergraduate enrollment in HSIs in the United States fluctuated more throughout the decade than did graduate enrollment (table 7). By 1999, however, the number of undergraduate students had increased substantially, rising from 1,143,000 in 1990 to 1,297,000 in 1999. The slower pace of undergraduate growth compared with graduate growth is in part due to a substantial drop in White undergraduate enrollment in HSIs, which declined 22 percent from 1990 to 1999 (whereas White graduate student enrollment dropped only 5 percent during the same period).

Degrees

The number of degrees awarded by HSIs in the United States grew by 36 percent between 1991–92 and 1999–2000 (table 23). In contrast, the number of degrees conferred by all institutions in the United States grew by 13 percent between 1991–92 and 1999–2000 (tables 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16). The increase in degree recipients at HSIs resulted in an increase in the

share of all degrees in the United States that were conferred at HSIs from 5 percent in 1991–92 to 6 percent in 1999–2000. The number of degrees awarded by HSIs in Puerto Rico also increased, by 31 percent between 1991-92 and 1999-2000.

At each degree level, the number of minorities receiving degrees at HSIs in the United States grew more than the number of Whites. Consequently, the total number of degree recipients at HSIs who were minorities grew by 87 percent between 1991–92 and 1999–2000, while the number of White degree recipients declined by 4 percent. The number of Hispanic degree recipients grew by 95 percent, more than the increase in the number of recipients from any other racial or ethnic group (table 23).

Associate's degrees

Associate's degrees accounted for 46 percent of the 149,028 degrees awarded by HSIs in the United States in 1999–2000 (table 23). The number of associate's degrees awarded by HSIs in the United States between 1991–92 and 1999–2000 rose 43 percent, compared with a growth in the number awarded by all U.S.

degree-granting institutions of only 12 percent (table 12). In Puerto Rico, the number of associate's degrees awarded by HSIs grew 29 percent.

Among Hispanics who were awarded associate's degrees in the United States in 1999-2000, 53 percent earned them at HSIs. By 1999–2000, 40 percent of all associate's degrees conferred by HSIs in the United States were earned by Hispanics, making them the most represented racial or ethnic recipient group (figure 3). Between 1991-92 and 1999-2000, the number of associate's degrees awarded by HSIs to Hispanics increased 97 percent, whereas the number awarded to Whites decreased 2 percent (table 12). This pattern was similar to that for all institutions: the number of associate's degrees awarded to Whites remained rather stable, while the number for Hispanics increased by 89 percent. The number of associate's degrees awarded by HSIs to non-Hispanic minorities grew substantially as well: degrees awarded to Blacks, Asians or Pacific Islanders, and American Indians or Alaska Natives grew by 59 percent, 109 percent, and 99 percent, respectively, between 1991-92 and 1999-2000.

Bachelor's degrees

Bachelor's degrees accounted for 39 percent of all degrees awarded by HSIs in the United States in 1999–2000 (table 23). The number of bachelor's degrees awarded by HSIs rose 26 percent between 1991–92 and 1999–2000, while the number of bachelor's degrees conferred by all institutions in the United States rose 9 percent (table 13). In Puerto Rico, the number of bachelor's degrees conferred by HSIs rose 23 percent.

In 1991–92, Whites receiving a bachelor's degree at HSIs outnumbered Hispanics receiving a bachelor's degree at HSIs by more than 2 to 1. By 1999–2000, however, Whites and Hispanics earned bachelor's degrees at HSIs in almost equal proportions (figure 3). The number of Hispanics earning a bachelor's degree at HSIs grew by 87 percent between 1991–92 and 1999–2000 (table 13). While this growth was the highest of any racial or ethnic group, non-Hispanic minority groups also showed an increase in the number of bachelor's degrees received. However, the number of Whites receiving bachelor's degrees at HSIs declined 12 percent, compared to only a 1 percent decline at all institutions.

Master's degrees

Master's degrees accounted for 13 percent of all degrees awarded by HSIs in the United States in 1999–2000 (table 23). The number of master's degrees conferred by HSIs in the United States rose 46 percent between 1991–92 and 1999–2000, compared with the national increase of 30 percent (table 14). In Puerto Rico, there was a 129 percent increase in master's degrees conferred by HSIs.

The master's degrees conferred by HSIs in the United States as a proportion of those conferred by all U.S. degree-granting institutions remained rather constant during this period, at 4 percent. Among Hispanics who received master's degrees in the United States in 1999–2000, 25 percent earned them at HSIs. In comparison, only 3 percent of Whites and 5 percent of non-Hispanic minorities who received their master's degrees in 1999–2000 received them from HSIs.

The number of Hispanic students earning master's degrees at HSIs grew 136 percent between 1991–92 and 1999–2000 (table 14). This rate of growth was more than that experienced by any other racial or

ethnic group at HSIs and exceeded the national Hispanic rate of growth of 102 percent. As a result of this growth, the proportion of master's degree recipients at HSIs who were Hispanic rose from 15 percent in 1991–92 to 24 percent in 1999–2000 (figure 3).

Doctor's degrees

Doctor's degrees accounted for less than 1 percent of all degrees awarded by HSIs in the United States in 1999–2000 (table 23). The number of doctor's degrees awarded by HSIs rose 74 percent between 1991–92 and 1999–2000, while the number of doctor's degrees awarded by all institutions rose 10 percent (table 15). In Puerto Rico, the increase in doctor's degrees conferred by HSIs was 111 percent.


Despite the increase in doctor's degrees conferred by HSIs, in 1999–2000, only 2 percent of all doctor's degrees awarded in the United States were awarded by HSIs. Among the 731 recipients of doctor's degrees at HSIs in the United States in 1999–2000, the most popular fields of study were education and psychology, which accounted for 33 percent and 16 percent, respectively, of doctor's degrees conferred (table 20).

The number of Hispanics receiving their doctor's degrees from HSIs grew 85 percent between 1991–92 and 1999–2000 (table 15). The percentage increase in the number of Whites receiving doctor's degrees from HSIs was also substantial (75 percent), while for Blacks and Asians or Pacific Islanders, the percentage increases were more than that for Hispanics. The proportion of recipients at HSIs who were Hispanic increased slightly (from 14 percent in 1991-92 to 15 percent in 1999-2000). The proportion who were White increased slightly as well (59 percent in 1991-92 to 60 percent in 1999-2000) (figure 3).

First-professional degrees7

First-professional degrees accounted for 1 percent of all degrees awarded by HSIs in 1999–2000 (table 23). The number of first-professional degrees awarded by HSIs in the United States rose 7 percent, slightly less than the 8 percent increase in first-professional degrees awarded by all institutions (table 16). In HSIs in Puerto Rico, the increase was 3 percent.

The number of Hispanics receiving first-professional degrees at HSIs in the United States grew 47 percent during this period, compared to a 35 percent increase at all U.S. institutions (table 16). As a result, the proportion of all Hispanic first-professional degree recipients who earned their degree at an HSI grew from 9 percent in 1991–92 to 10 percent in 1999–2000. However, the number of Hispanic recipients of first-professional degrees at HSIs actually grew at a slower rate than the number of recipients from any other minority group between 1991–92 and 1999–2000. Despite this trend, Hispanics remained the second most represented group at HSIs (after Whites), accounting for 22 percent of all first-professional degree recipients (figure 3).


Faculty and Staff

In 1999, Hispanic serving institutions employed 163,000 people, or 6 percent of all employees of U.S. degree-granting institutions (tables 28 and 29). Instructional and research faculty accounted for 46 percent of HSI staff, while nonprofessional staff accounted for 34 percent (table 28). Nonfaculty professionals; executive, administrative, and managerial professionals; and instruction and research assistants accounted for 12 percent, 5 percent, and 4 percent, respectively, of HSI staff.

Among Hispanics who were employed by degreegranting institutions in 1999, 30 percent were employed by HSIs (table 30). (Among Hispanics employed by 2-year institutions, this proportion was even higher, with over half working at HSIs.) Hispanics accounted for 25 percent of all employees at HSIs, making them the second largest racial or ethnic group after Whites (table 28). At 2-year HSIs, Hispanics were slightly less represented, particularly at 2-year private schools, where 17 percent of employees were Hispanic. However, to put these percentages in context, only 5 percent of employees in all U.S. degree-granting institutions in 1999 were Hispanic. Non-Hispanic minorities made up similar proportions of employees at HSIs and at all institutions: 16 percent and 15 percent, respectively (tables 28 and 29).

Nonprofessional staff employed at HSIs were more likely to be Hispanic than to be any other race or ethnicity (figure 4). In contrast, Whites accounted for

the largest proportions of faculty; instruction and research assistants; nonfaculty professionals; and executive, administrative, and managerial staff at HSIs.

Salaries

In 1995–96, full-time instructional faculty members employed by HSIs earned an average of \$53,929 per year (after adjustments for inflation), which was virtually the same as the national average (table A). Between 1995–96 and 1999–2000, average faculty salaries at all degree-granting institutions increased by 3 percent, slightly more than the 1 percent increase

experienced at HSIs. As a result, by 1999–2000, HSI salaries for full-time instructional faculty members had fallen \$1,236 below the national average.

HSIs in Puerto Rico experienced a larger increase in salaries during this period than did HSIs in the United States. Between 1995-96 and 1999-2000, salaries increased 25 percent (after adjustments for inflation), to \$41.675 in 1999-2000.

In both 1995–96 and 1999–2000, salaries at private HSIs in the United States were lower than at public HSIs (table 31). The national trend was the opposite: salaries at private institutions tended to be higher than salaries at their public counterparts. However, it is important to note that the private HSIs include a relatively high proportion of private 2-year colleges, where salaries tend to be lower. In contrast, these lower salaries had little effect on the average salaries at all private degreegranting institutions, because private 2-year institutions comprise a very small proportion of the general body of degree-granting institutions.

Differences between salaries at HSIs in the United States and at all institutions varied by academic rank.



Full professors at HSIs, who are paid more than any other academic rank, made 93 percent of the national average salary for full professors in 1999–2000. Associate professors and lecturers at HSIs made less than the averages at all institutions as well (97 percent and 96 percent, respectively, of the national averages). Assistant professors, instructors, and those with no academic rank, however, earned higher salaries at HSIs.

Summary

This report presents a tabular illustration of changes among the 1999–2000 set of 335 HSIs in the United States and Puerto Rico and compares these changes to the national average for all institutions. The set of institutions used in this report was identified by NCES based on the enrollment selection criterion described above, using data from the fall 1999 release of the IPEDS Fall Enrollment Compliance Report preliminary file.

The data presented in this report show that the 1990s were a period of growth for HSIs. Overall enrollment grew 14 percent between 1990 and 1999, while Hispanic students enrolled at HSIs grew to 42 percent of all HSI-enrolled students by 1999. The number of degrees conferred by HSIs rose 36 percent between 1991–92 and 1999–2000, while the number of degrees awarded to Hispanics grew 95 percent. Given that overall enrollment in degree-granting institutions and the nation's Hispanic population are both projected to rise between 1999 and 2011,8 HSIs are likely to continue to play an important role in providing Hispanic Americans with access to postsecondary education.



Guide to Tabular Presentation

This section is intended to assist the reader in following the basic structure of the HSI tables and to provide a legend for some of the common symbols and indexes used throughout the book. Unless otherwise noted, all data are for the 50 states and the District of Columbia.

Table Components

Title Describes the table content concisely.

Unit Indicator Informs the reader of the measurement united in the table – "In thousands," "In millions of dollars," etc. Noted below the title unless several units are used, in which case the unit indicators are generally given in the spanner or individual column heads.

Spanner Describes a group of two or more columns.

Column head Describes specific column.

Stub Describes a row or a group of rows. Each stub is followed by a number of dots (leaders) or by a semicolon if no data appears in the data fields.

Field The area of the table which contains the data elements.

Rules in the field

Single horizontal rules indicate

- that the data below the line add to the figure immediately above the line, or
- in the case of derived figures (e.g., percents, medians) that the datum above the line represents a cumulative figure.

Double horizontal rules demarcate groups of related rows.

Single vertical rules delineate columns.

Double vertical rules divide the table into sections with unique stubs.

Footnote Describes a unique circumstance relating to a specific item within the table. Usually listed below the bottom rule of the table.

Note Furnishes general information that relates to the entire table.

Source The document or reference from which the data are drawn.

Descriptive Terms

Average A number that is used to represent the "typical value" of a group of numbers. It is regarded as a measure of "location" or "central tendency" of a group of numbers. Arithmetic mean is the most commonly used average. It is derived by summing the individual item values of a particular group and dividing that sum by the number of items. This value is often referred to simply as the "mean" or "average."

Index number A value that provides a means of measuring, summarizing, and communicating the nature of changes that occur from time to time or from place to place. An index is used to express changes in prices over periods of time but may also be used to express differences between related subjects at a single point in time.

The *HSI* report uses the Consumer Price Index to compare purchasing power over time. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) represents changes in the prices of all goods and services purchased for consumption by urban households.

To compute a price index, a base year or period is selected. The base year price is then designated as the base or reference price to which the prices for other years or periods are related.

A method of expressing the price relation is:

Index number =

Price of a set of one or more items for related year
Price of the same set of items for base year

When 100 is subtracted from the index number, the result equals the percent change in price from the base year.



Current and constant dollars are used in tables 31 and 32 to express salary data. Unless otherwise noted, all figures are in current dollars, not adjusted for inflation. Constant dollars provide a measure of the impact of inflation on the current dollars.

- Current dollar figures reflect actual prices or costs prevailing during the specified year(s).
- Constant dollar figures attempt to remove the effects of price changes (inflation) from statistical series reported in dollar terms.

The constant dollar value for an item is derived by dividing the base year price index (for example, the Consumer Price Index for 1995) by the price index for the year of data to be adjusted and multiplying by the item to be adjusted. The result is an adjusted dollar value as it would presumably exist if prices were the same as the base year - in other words, as if the dollar had constant purchasing power. Any changes in the constant dollar amounts would reflect only changes in the real values.



Guide to Sources

Sources and Comparability of Data

The Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) surveys approximately 10,000 postsecondary institutions, including universities and colleges, as well as institutions offering technical and vocational education beyond the high school level. This survey, which began in 1986, replaced the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS).

Prior to 2000, IPEDS consisted of eight integrated components. These components were designed to obtain information on who provides postsecondary education (institutions), who participates in it and completes it (students), what programs are offered and what programs are completed, and both the human and financial resources involved in the provision of institutionally based postsecondary education. Specifically, these components include: institutional characteristics, including instructional activity; fall enrollment, including age and residence; enrollment in occupationally specific programs; completions; finance; staff; salaries of fulltime instructional faculty; and academic libraries.

The degree-granting institutions portion of this survey is a census of colleges awarding associate's or higher degrees that were eligible to participate in Title IV financial aid programs. Prior to 1993, data from the technical and vocational institutions were collected through a sample survey. Beginning in 1993, all data were gathered in a census of all postsecondary institutions. The tabulations from IPEDS developed for *Hispanic Serving Institutions* are based on lists of all institutions and are not subject to sampling errors.

The definition of institutions generally thought of as offering college and university education has been changed in recent years. The old standard for higher education institutions included those institutions that had courses that led to an associate's degree or higher, or were accepted for credit towards those degrees. The higher education institutions were accredited by an agency or association that was recognized by the U.S. Department of Education or recognized directly by the Secretary of Education. The current standard for

degree-granting institutions includes institutions that award associate's or higher level degrees that are eligible to participate in Title IV federal financial aid programs. The degree-granting classification is very similar to the earlier classification, except that it includes some additional institutions, primarily 2-year colleges, and excludes a few institutions that did not award associate's or higher degrees. Time-series tables may contain data from both series, and they are labeled accordingly. The impact of this change has generally not been large. For example, tables on faculty salaries and benefits were only affected to a very small extent. Also, degrees awarded at the bachelor's level or higher were not heavily affected. The largest impact has been on private 2-year college enrollment. In contrast, most of the data on public 4-year colleges has been affected only to a minimal extent. The impact on enrollment in public 2-year colleges was noticeable in certain states, but relatively small at the national level. Overall, enrollment for all institutions was about one-half a percent higher for degree-granting institutions compared to the total for higher education institutions.

Institutional Characteristics

This survey provides the basis for the universe of institutions presented in the *Directory* of *Postsecondary Institutions*. The survey collects basic information necessary to classify the institutions including control, level, and kinds of programs; and information on tuition, fees, and room and board charges. Beginning in 2000, the survey collected institutional pricing data from institutions with first-time, full-time, degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students. Unduplicated full-year enrollment counts and instructional activity are

now collected on the fall enrollment survey. The overall response rate was 95.5 percent for 2001.

This survey has been part of the IPEDS series since 1986. The enrollment survey response rate is relatively high. The 1999 overall response rate was 96.9 percent for degree-granting institutions. The imputation method differed for 1999 compared to earlier surveys. For all institutions that did not report in 1999, data from the previous year were used as 1999 estimates.

Beginning in fall 1986, the survey allowed (in alternating years) for the collection of age and residence data. In 2000, the Enrollment survey collected the instructional activity and unduplicated headcount data, which are needed to compute a standardized, full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment statistic for the entire academic year. Starting in 2001, unduplicated headcount by level of student, and by race/ethnicity and gender of student were also requested, as was total number of students in the entering class.

Salaries, Tenure, and Fringe Benefits of Full-Time **Instructional Faculty**

This institutional survey has been conducted annually since 1989-90. Although the survey form changed a number of times during those years, only comparable data are presented in this report.

Beginning with the surveys for 1987-88, the IPEDS data tabulation procedures included imputations for survey nonrespondents. The response rate for the 1999-2000 survey was 95.4 percent for degreegranting institutions. Because of the higher response rate for public colleges, it is probable that the public colleges' salary data are more accurate than the data for private colleges. Although data from these surveys are not subject to sampling error, sources of nonsampling error may include computational errors and misclassification in reporting and processing. NCES reviews individual colleges' data for internal and longitudinal consistency and contacts the colleges to check inconsistent data. More information on response rates for degree-granting institutions in 1999-2000 can be found in table A2.

Salary data in Hispanic Serving Institutions are presented in both current and constant (inflation-free) dollars. Data are collected in current dollars and converted to constant dollars using the Consumer Price Index (CPI). Further information on how the CPI is used to convert monetary figures into inflation-free dollars can be found in the Guide to Tabular Presentation. The CPI figures for each school year from 1991-92 to 1999-2000 can be found in table A4.

Completions

Collection of degree data has been maintained through the IPEDS system. The nonresponse rate did not appear to be a significant source of nonsampling error for this survey. The return rate over the years has been high, with the degree-granting institutions response rate for the 1999-2000 survey at 96.7 percent. The overall response rate for the non-degree granting institutions was 84.4 percent in 1999-2000. Because of the high return rate for the degree-granting institutions, nonsampling error caused by imputation is also minimal.

The major sources of nonsampling error for this survey were differences between the NCES program taxonomy and taxonomies used by the colleges, classification of double majors, operational problems, and survey timing.

Staff

The fall staff data presented in this publication were collected by NCES, through the IPEDS system, which collected data from postsecondary institutions, including all 2- and 4-year degree-granting education institutions. The NCES collects staff data biennially in odd numbered years from institutions of postsecondary education.

The "Fall Staff" questionnaires were mailed out by NCES in August; the respondents reported the employment statistics in their institution that cover the payroll period in the fall of the survey year. The "Fall Staff, 1999" survey had an overall response rate of 94.8 percent for degree-granting institutions. Imputations for 1999 differed from earlier methods. For all institutions that did not respond to the survey, data from the 1997 survey were used as estimates for fall 1999.

Definitions

Agriculture Courses designed to improve competencies in agricultural occupations. Included is the study of agricultural production, supplies, mechanization and products, agricultural science, forestry, and related services

Associate's degree A degree granted for the successful completion of a sub-baccalaureate program of studies, usually requiring at least 2 years (or equivalent) of full-time college-level study. This includes degrees granted in a cooperative or work-study program.

Bachelor's degree A degree granted for the successful completion of a baccalaureate program of studies, usually requiring at least 4 years (or equivalent) of full-time college-level study. This includes degrees granted in a cooperative or work-study program.

Business Program of instruction that prepares individuals for a variety of activities in planning, organizing, directing, and controlling business office systems and procedures.

College A postsecondary school which offers general or liberal arts education, usually leading to an associate's, bachelor's, master's, doctor's, or first-professional degree. Junior colleges and community colleges are included under this terminology.

Computer science A group of instructional programs that describes computer and information sciences, including computer programming, data processing, and information systems.

Constant dollars Dollar amounts that have been adjusted by means of price and cost indexes to eliminate inflationary factors and allow direct comparison across years.

Consumer Price Index (CPI) This price index measures the average change in the cost of a fixed market basket of goods and services purchased by consumers.

Control of institutions A classification of institutions of postsecondary education by whether the institution is operated by publicly elected or appointed officials (public control) or by privately elected or appointed

officials and derives its major source of funds from private sources (private control).

Current dollars Dollar amounts that have not been adjusted to compensate for inflation.

Degree-granting institutions Postsecondary institutions that are eligible for Title IV federal financial aid programs and that grant associate's, bachelor's, master's, doctor's, and/or first-professional degrees that are recognized or authorized by a state agency. For an institution to be eligible to participate in Title IV financial aid programs it must offer a program of at least 300 clock hours in length, have accreditation recognized by the U.S. Department of Education, have been in business for at least 2 years, and have signed a participation agreement with the Department.

4-year institution An institution legally authorized to offer and offering at least a 4-year program of college-level studies wholly or principally creditable toward a baccalaureate degree.

2-year institution An institution legally authorized to offer and offering at least a 2-year program of college-level studies which terminates in an associate's degree or is principally creditable toward a baccalaureate degree.

Doctor's degree An earned degree carrying the title of Doctor. The Doctor of Philosophy degree (Ph.D.) is the highest academic degree and requires mastery within a field of knowledge and demonstrated ability to perform scholarly research. Other doctorates are awarded for fulfilling specialized requirements in professional fields, such as education (Ed.D.), musical arts (D.M.A.), business administration (D.B.A.), and engineering (D.Eng. or D.E.S.). Many doctor's degrees in academic and professional fields require an earned master's degree as a prerequisite. First-professional degrees, such as doctorates in medicine (M.D.) and doctorates in dental surgery (D.D.S.), are not included under this heading.

Engineering Instructional programs that describe the mathematical and natural science knowledge gained

English A group of instructional programs that describes the English language arts, including composition, creative writing, and the study of literature.

Enrollment The total number of students registered in a given school unit at a given time, generally in the fall of a year.

Executive/administrative/managerial staff Employees of postsecondary institutions who hold responsibility for management of the institution or a customarily recognized department or subdivision thereof. This category includes all officers holding titles such as president, vice president, dean, director, or the equivalent, as well as officers subordinate to any of these administrators with such titles as associate dean, assistant dean, executive officer of academic departments (department heads, or the equivalent) if their principal activity is administrative.

Faculty (instruction and research) Employees of postsecondary institutions whose specific assignments customarily are made for the purpose of conducting instruction, research, or public service as a principal activity, and who hold academic rank titles of professor, instructor, lecturer, or the equivalent of any of these academic ranks.

First-professional degree A degree that signifies both completion of the academic requirements for beginning practice in a given profession and a level of professional skill beyond that normally required for a bachelor's degree. This degree usually is based on a program requiring at least 2 academic years of work prior to entrance and a total of at least 6 academic years of work to complete the degree program, including both prior-required college work and the professional program itself. By NCES definition, first-professional degrees are awarded in the fields of dentistry (D.D.S. or D.M.D.), medicine (M.D.), optometry (O.D.), osteopathic medicine (D.O.), pharmacy (D.Phar.), podiatric medicine (D.P.M.), veterinary medicine (D.V.M.), chiropractic (D.C. or D.C.M.), law (J.D.), and theological professions (M.Div. or M.H.L.).

First-professional enrollment The number of students enrolled in a professional school or program which requires at least 2 years of academic college work for entrance and a total of at least 6 years for a degree. By NCES definition, first-professional enrollment includes only students in certain programs. (See First-professional degree for a list of programs.)

Foreign languages A group of instructional programs that describes the structure and use of language that is common or indigenous to people of the same community or nation, the same geographical area, or the same cultural traditions. Programs cover such features as sound, literature, syntax, phonology, semantics, sentences, prose, and verse, as well as the development of skills and attitudes used in communicating and evaluating thoughts and feelings through oral and written language.

Full-time enrollment The number of students enrolled in courses with total credit load equal to at least 75 percent of the normal full-time course load.

Full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollment For degreegranting institutions, enrollment of full-time students, plus the full-time-equivalent of part-time students. The full-time-equivalent of the part-time students is estimated using different factors depending on the type and control of institution and level of student.

Full-time instructional faculty Those members of the instruction/research staff who are employed full time as defined by the institution, including faculty with released time for research and faculty on sabbatical leave. Full time counts exclude faculty who are employed to teach less than two semesters, three quarters, two trimesters, or two 4-month sessions; replacements for faculty on sabbatical leave or those on leave without pay; faculty for preclinical and clinical medicine; faculty who are donating their services; faculty who are members of military organizations and paid on a different pay scale from civilian employees; academic officers, whose primary duties are administrative; and graduate students who assist in the instruction of courses.

Full-time worker For postsecondary education, a member of an educational institution's staff who is employed full time.

Graduate An individual who has received formal recognition for the successful completion of a prescribed program of studies.



Graduation Formal recognition given an individual for the successful completion of a prescribed program of studies.

Graduate enrollment The number of students who hold the bachelor's or first-professional degree, or the equivalent, and who are working towards a master's or doctor's degree. First-professional students are counted separately. These enrollment data measure those students who are registered at a particular time during the fall. At some institutions, graduate enrollment also includes students who are in postbaccalaureate classes but not in degree programs.

Higher education institutions See Degree-granting institutions

Hispanic serving institutions For the purposes of this report, degree-granting institutions with full-timeequivalent undergraduate enrollment of Hispanic students at 25 percent or more of total enrollment of U.S. citizens and resident aliens.

Instruction and research assistants Students employed by postsecondary institutions on a part-time basis for the primary purpose of assisting in classroom or laboratory instruction or in the conduct of research. These positions are typically held by graduate students having titles such as teaching assistant, teaching associate, teaching fellow, or research assistant. Excludes students in the College Work-Study Program.

Master's degree A degree awarded for successful completion of a program generally requiring 1 or 2 years of full-time college-level study beyond the bachelor's degree. One type of master's degree, including the Master of Arts degree, or M.A., and the Master of Science degree, or M.S., is awarded in the liberal arts and sciences for advanced scholarship in a subject field or discipline and demonstrated ability to perform scholarly research. A second type of master's degree is awarded for the completion of a professionally oriented program, for example, an M.Ed. in education, an M.B.A. in business administration, an M.F.A. in fine arts, an M.M. in music, an M.S.W. in social work, and an M.P.A. in public administration. A third type of master's degree is awarded in professional fields for study beyond the first-professional degree, for example, the Master of Laws (L.L.M.) and Master of Science in various medical specializations.

Mathematics A group of instructional programs that describes the science of numbers and their operations, interrelations, combinations, generalizations, and abstractions and of space configurations and their structure, measurement, transformations, and generalizations.

Not-for-profit institution A private institution in which the individual(s) or agency in control receives no compensation other than wages, rent, or other expenses for the assumption of risk. Not-for-profit institutions may be either independent not-for-profit (i.e., having no religious affiliation) or religiously affiliated.

Nonresident alien A person who is not a citizen of the United States and who is in this country on a temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely.

Other professionals Employees of postsecondary institutions whose primary purpose is to perform academic support, student service, and institutional support activities, and whose assignments would require either college graduation or experience of such kind and amount as to provide a comparable background. This category includes librarians, accountants, systems analysts, computer programmers, and coaches.

Part-time enrollment The number of students enrolled in courses with a total credit load less than 75 percent of the normal full-time credit load.

Postsecondary education The provision of formal instructional programs with a curriculum designed primarily for students who have completed the requirements for a high school diploma or equivalent. This includes programs of an academic, vocational, and continuing professional education purpose, and excludes avocational and adult basic education programs.

Private school or institution A school or institution which is controlled by an individual or agency other than a state, a subdivision of a state, or the federal government, which is usually not supported primarily by public funds, and is not operated by publicly elected or appointed officials. Private schools and institutions include both not-for-profit and proprietary (for-profit) institutions.

Proprietary (for-profit) institution A private institution in which the individual(s) or agency in control receives compensation other than wages, rent, or other expenses for the assumption of risk.



Public school or institution A school or institution controlled and operated by publicly elected or appointed officials and deriving its primary support from public funds.

Racial/ethnic group Postsecondary institutions reported race/ethnicity of students according to the extent that administrative data was available at the institution level. The data were submitted to NCES as part of the IPEDS survey system. Race/ethnicity details were reported for U.S. citizens and permanent residents only. Nonresident alien students were reported as a separate category. Institutions also reported some U.S. students as "race/ethnicity unknown". For purposes of analysis in the fall enrollment survey, these were prorated among reported racial/ethnic groups. The proration procedure was also employed for summary degree data. However, institution-level degree data were not prorated and include the race/ethnicity unknown category. Staff data were not prorated and include the race/ethnicity unknown category.

These categories are in accordance with the Office of Management and Budget standard classification scheme presented below:

White A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East. Excludes persons of Hispanic origin.

Black A person having origins in any of the black racial groups in Africa. Excludes persons of Hispanic origin.

Hispanic A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

Asian or Pacific Islander A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands. This area includes, for example, China, India, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, and Samoa.

American Indian or Alaska Native A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and maintaining cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

Salary The total amount regularly paid or stipulated to be paid to an individual, before deductions, for personal services rendered while on the payroll of a business or organization.

Student An individual for whom instruction is provided in a postsecondary education program.

Undergraduate students Students registered at a college or university who are working in a program leading to a baccalaureate degree or other formal award below the baccalaureate, such as an associate's degree.

University An institution of postsecondary education consisting of a liberal arts college, a diverse graduate program, and usually two or more professional schools or faculties and empowered to confer degrees in various fields of study.

Visual and performing arts A group of instructional programs that generally describes the historic development, aesthetic qualities, and creative processes of the visual and performing arts.

Vocational education Organized educational programs, services, and activities which are directly related to the preparation of individuals for paid or unpaid employment, or for additional preparation for a career, requiring other than a baccalaureate or advanced degree.
