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ABSTRACT

The purpose of this study was to examine the proportion of students in the cohort class of 2000 who completed Arizona high school graduation requirements within 4 years. The cohort class of 2000 comprises students who entered 9th grade in fall of the 1996-1997 school year, and were expected to graduate from 12th grade by the end of the 1999-2000 school year. The report also provide information about the number and proportion of students who obtained a General Educational Development (GED) certificate, dropped out, or remained enrolled for a fifth year of high school. Rates are summarized at the state level, by gender and ethnicity, by county, and by district and school. The cohort class of 2000 had a membership of 57,585 students. Of these, 71% graduated in 4 years, and 6.9% enrolled in a fifth year of high school. A GED was received by 0.3%. More than 75% of the females received high school diplomas, and 67% of the males graduated. Males were more likely to enroll for a fifth year of high school (8.3%) than were females (5.5%). There was a wide gap in the graduation rates of different ethnic groups, with Hispanic and Native Americans graduating at low rates (nearly 59% and 56% respectively), while White and Asian rates were nearly 79% and 84 % respectively. 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Executive Summary

High school graduation rates are a vital indicator of the success of various school improvement programs and of education reform efforts in general. The purpose of this study is to examine the proportion of students within the cohort class of 2000 who completed Arizona high school graduation requirements within four years. The cohort class of 2000 is comprised of students who entered ninth grade in the fall of the 1996-1997 school year and were, therefore, expected to graduate from twelfth grade by the end of the 1999-2000 school year.

This report also provides information about the number and proportion of students who fell into one of the following categories: obtained a General Educational Development certificate (GED)¹, dropped out² or remained enrolled for a fifth year of high school. Herein, these rates are summarized at the state level, by gender and ethnicity, by county, and by district and school.

This report is based on a longitudinal study for which student enrollment and transfer activity are tracked over a four year period to determine the number of students entering high school in the 1996-1997 school year who graduate four years later, in 2000. This method provides information about a particular cohort of students as it progresses through high school.

A brief overview of the cohort class of 2000 shows that

- It had a membership of 57,585 students
- 71.0% graduated in four years
- 6.9% enrolled in a 5th year of high school
- 0.3% received a GED (high school equivalency certificate)

Data presented in this report show a wide gender gap in the four year graduation rates for this cohort: more than 75% of the females received high school diplomas, while 67% of the males graduated. An additional 8.3% of the males remained enrolled for a fifth year of high school, compared to 5.5% of the females in this cohort.

In addition to gender differences found in this study, there is a wide gap in the graduation rates of different ethnic groups. Hispanic and Native American students showed consistently low graduation rates, nearly 59% and 56%, respectively, while White and Asian rates were much higher at nearly 79% and 84%, respectively.

² The dropout rates discussed within this report are four year dropout rates specific to the cohort class of 2000. They are not comparable to the annual dropout rates calculated in the Annual Dropout Rate Study.

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Further analysis of graduation rates shows that differences found in gender and ethnic groups compound to reveal even larger gender gaps within certain groups. White females graduated at a rate that was nearly 7% above that of White males. Hispanic and African American females graduated at rates that were 10.5% above the male graduation rates, respectively. The largest gender gap was found in the Native American student population: females graduated at a rate that was 11.3% above that of the males in this cohort.

The Arizona Department of Education (ADE) is committed to continued improvement of educational indicators by making the most accurate data available to policy makers and the public. As the state moves to a standards based educational system and away from a “seat time” approach to graduation, beginning with the cohort class of 2001, the ADE will also publish five year graduation rates.

Introduction

The calculation of four year graduation rates results from cooperative efforts among public school districts and charter schools, the ADE and the Arizona State Legislature. Presently, state school accountability efforts require greater attention to performance measures, such as the graduation rate, which serve as key indicators of a school's success in educating its student population. AZ LEARNS, Arizona's school accountability system, includes a school classification system based on a set of performance measures, including the graduation rate. School classifications will begin in the fall of 2002.³

Reporting Period

This report includes four year graduation rate calculations for the cohort class of 2000. Members of this class entered their ninth grade year in the fall of 1996 and were expected to graduate within four years: from the first day of the 1996-1997 school year to the last day of summer recess in the 1999-2000 school year. Summer graduates after the four year Spring commencement (in May or June of 2000) are counted as four year graduates for the class of 2000.⁴

Definitions

The following terms are used within this report and are meant to convey these associated meanings:

Cohort class is defined as the group of students that entered ninth grade for the first time in the Fall of 1996, independent of the state or district where they first enrolled. These students were expected to advance through high school as a group and become part of the same *graduating class* four years after the start of their ninth grade year (in the Spring of 2000). Students who began their ninth grade year at one school and transferred to another school before their fourth year Spring commencement are still a part of the same cohort class.

Class membership represents the total student count within the cohort class and is defined according to the following:

Class Membership

A class membership for any given school may change from year to year as students transfer in and out of schools. The accuracy of a school's class membership count is dependent on the school's ability to track student activity over the course of four years. (For more information, see *Limitations to Current Research*, p. 4)

Graduation rate is expressed as a percentage of the class membership and reflects the proportion of members of the cohort class of 2000 that received a high school diploma by the end of summer recess of their fourth year.

Still enrolled rate is expressed as a percentage of the class membership and reflects the proportion of members of the cohort class of 2000 that did not receive a high school diploma by the end of summer recess of the fourth year but remained enrolled to attend a fifth year.

GED rate is expressed as a percentage of the class membership and reflects the proportion of members of the cohort class of 2000 that did not receive a high school diploma but earned a GED by the end of summer recess of the fourth year. To qualify for this outcome, the former student must have received a GED certificate, not merely enrolled in preparatory classes.

Dropout/Status unknown rate is expressed as a percentage of the class membership and reflects the proportion of members of the cohort class of 2000 that left school before receiving a high school diploma and did not return, transfer, receive a GED or die. For the current study, a student who has left school and whose status is unknown is included in the dropout rate.

Transfer Documentation

A student is not counted as a dropout if there is documented evidence of a transfer to another school that offers coursework to fulfill the requirements for a high school diploma. School records must indicate the withdrawal status of each student who leaves the school. Documentation of a student transfer to another school consists of either (1) a request from another school for a transfer of the student's records or (2) information from a responsible adult that the student is enrolled in another educational facility from which (s)he may receive a high school diploma.

Methodology

After students entered ninth grade for the first time in the Fall of 1996, they were identified as members of the cohort class of 2000. Over the next four years, each public school in Arizona tracked the enrollment and transfer activities of those attending their schools. Four years later, after the last day of summer recess in the year 2000, each school attributed one of the following outcomes to every student who was a member of the cohort class of 2000: *graduated, still enrolled, dropped out/status unknown, or GED recipient*. Four year data on members of this cohort class were entered into a Graduation Rate Study online computer application and were uploaded to the ADE. The ADE distributed forms and instructions for data collection to high schools via regional training centers and by mail. High schools required to submit data were defined as those having had student membership in *one or more* of the following grades over the course of four years *and* offered a high school diploma:

Membership in ninth grade in the 1996-1997 school year, *or*
Membership in tenth grade in the 1997-1998 school year, *or*
Membership in eleventh grade in the 1998-1999 school year, *or*
Membership in twelfth grade in the 1999-2000 school year
-And-
Offered a high school diploma

Schools that met these criteria were determined to have served members of the cohort class of 2000 at some point during the students' high school years and were required to submit data even if none of those students received a diploma from that school. Therefore, if all members of the cohort transferred to other educational facilities, it is possible for a school to have a class membership of zero with a corresponding zero graduation rate.

As of 14 June, 2002, data were received from 342 public schools that satisfied one or more of the membership criteria stated above. In order to validate the data, the ADE conducted checks and contacted schools and districts to resolve discrepancies and clarify questions about inconsistent numbers. Membership counts and the associated four year cohort rates were verified with districts that served more than 50% of the state's cohort membership.

Limitations to Current Research

This longitudinal study requires the use of four years of student records. The validity of this report is dependent upon a school's ability to track students who enter or leave an educational facility over time. Many students who are classified as *status unknown*, and are therefore included in the dropout count, may have transferred to another educational facility in the state. A school's inability to track these students may artificially inflate the four year cohort class dropout rate and result in the under reporting of the class's graduation rate. However, schools have made improvements in their record keeping, and

the ADE anticipates improvements will continue to occur, due to emphases placed on school accountability and stronger reporting requirements.

Various School Types. The state of Arizona houses a wide range of campus types including traditional, charter, alternative and schools in correctional facilities. The reader should note that, in general, different types of schools serve inherently different groups of students. Therefore, the dropout and graduation rates for different types of facilities should be interpreted using different groups of assumptions. For example, some schools target at risk students, a population in which a large percentage has already dropped out of school. Thus, the graduation rates of these schools, many of which are relatively low, tend to represent the proportion of students receiving high school diplomas *after* dropping out. In the end, graduation and corresponding dropout rates for different types of schools may be reflective of the state's dropout population, not the overall student population, that either receives a diploma or that drops out for a second time.

GED recipients. To qualify for a fourth or eventual fifth year GED outcome, a student must have received a GED prior to the end of the reporting period. In the past, the state provided a list of GED recipients. Because this is no longer a standard practice, a school must use any resource necessary to determine the status of a GED candidate, relying on interpersonal correspondence and communication. As a result, GED recipients are currently difficult for schools to track and may cause a drastic under-reporting of former students who fit into this category. As student tracking becomes more accurate in the future (see *Future Graduation Rate Studies*), the reporting of GED recipients will become increasingly more precise.

Future Graduation Rate Studies

Beginning with the cohort class of 2001, the reporting period for graduation rate data will change. For the current study, the reporting period spanned from the first day of classes in the fall until the last day of summer recess four years later, which includes summer graduates after the four year Spring commencement as four year graduates. The reporting period for the class of 2001 will encompass the months from the first day of summer recess through the Spring commencement four years later. With this change, those who graduate in the summer after the four year Spring commencement will be counted as five year graduates, not four year graduates.

Beginning with the cohort class of 2001, the ADE will also produce a five year graduation rate study, which will include the four year rates for each cohort class as a subset of the five year rates. A five year graduation rate will reflect the proportion of students in a cohort class who receive high school diplomas by the Spring commencement of their fifth year. Students who graduate after their fourth year Spring commencement will not be reflected in the four year rate subset, but included in the total fifth year rate. According to the new reporting period, those students who graduate after the fifth year Spring commencement will not be counted as graduates for the purposes of this report. The reason for the move to a five year graduation rate analysis is the

increased emphasis on student proficiency with the Arizona Academic Standards as the basis for graduation and less emphasis on “seat time” (requirements). A standards based system recognizes that some students will require more than four years to demonstrate the level of proficiency necessary to meet Arizona’s academic standards.

Changes in data collection. As schools and districts push to overcome student tracking and reporting difficulties, the ADE is working diligently to implement an online computer tracking system, termed the Student Accountability Information System (SAIS). Once operational, future graduation rate data will be collected using SAIS which will produce a more efficient and accurate student tracking system. Schools and districts will be required to submit student enrollment and transfer activities at several junctions during the school year, allowing for SAIS to improve the accuracy of data significantly.

Results and Analysis

The dropout, GED, still enrolled and graduation rates for the cohort class of 2000 were computed and are presented in the following tables. Percentages in each category were calculated using the proportion of students to the total class membership count. The four year dropout rates presented in the following results are specific to the cohort class of 2000 and cannot be compared to the annual dropout rates calculated in the Annual Dropout Rate Study.

Statewide Dropout, GED, Still Enrolled and Graduation Rates

The class of 2000 had a membership count of 57,585. Of those, 71%, or 40,911, received high school diplomas in four years. Likewise, 6.9% were still enrolled at the end of four years and 0.3% had obtained a GED. (See Table 1)

Graduation Rate by Gender

A gender gap can be seen in the graduation rates for the cohort class of 2000. These data support a large body of literature dedicated to gender differences in graduation rates in that females are graduating at a higher rate than their male counterparts. As seen here, of the 28,601 female members of the class of 2000, more than 75% obtained high school diplomas, 5.5% or 1563 were still enrolled and 66 (0.2%) obtained a GED. The graduation rate for males of this cohort class is lower at 67%. (See Table 2)

Graduation Rate by Race/Ethnicity

Data for the cohort class of 2000 also show pronounced differences in the graduation rates by ethnicity. These data show Asian students have the highest graduation rate at 84%, followed by White students at nearly 79%. Native American students in this class show the lowest graduation rate at 55.9%. Also seen here, over four years, White students in this cohort class have the highest rate of GED recipients at 0.3. (See Table 3)

Graduation Rate by Gender and Race/Ethnicity

When ethnicity results are broken down by gender, as seen in **Table 4**, the differences found in each of these ethnic categories compound and the gender gaps become more evident. As seen in Table 3 above, Hispanic, Native American and African American graduation rates are lower than White and Asian rates, but the gender rates within each show wider gaps still. As these data show, Native American males have the lowest graduation rate at 50.1%. Asian female students in this class have the highest graduation rate at more than 86%. The largest gender difference within a racial category is seen in the Native American population: 61.4% graduation rate for females and a 50.1% for males, a difference of 11.3%. Hispanic and Native American males in this class show graduation rates at slightly above 50%, which are markedly lower than any other group of students presented here. Likewise, the still enrolled rates for these students are the highest of any other gender and ethnic group combination.

Graduation Rate by County

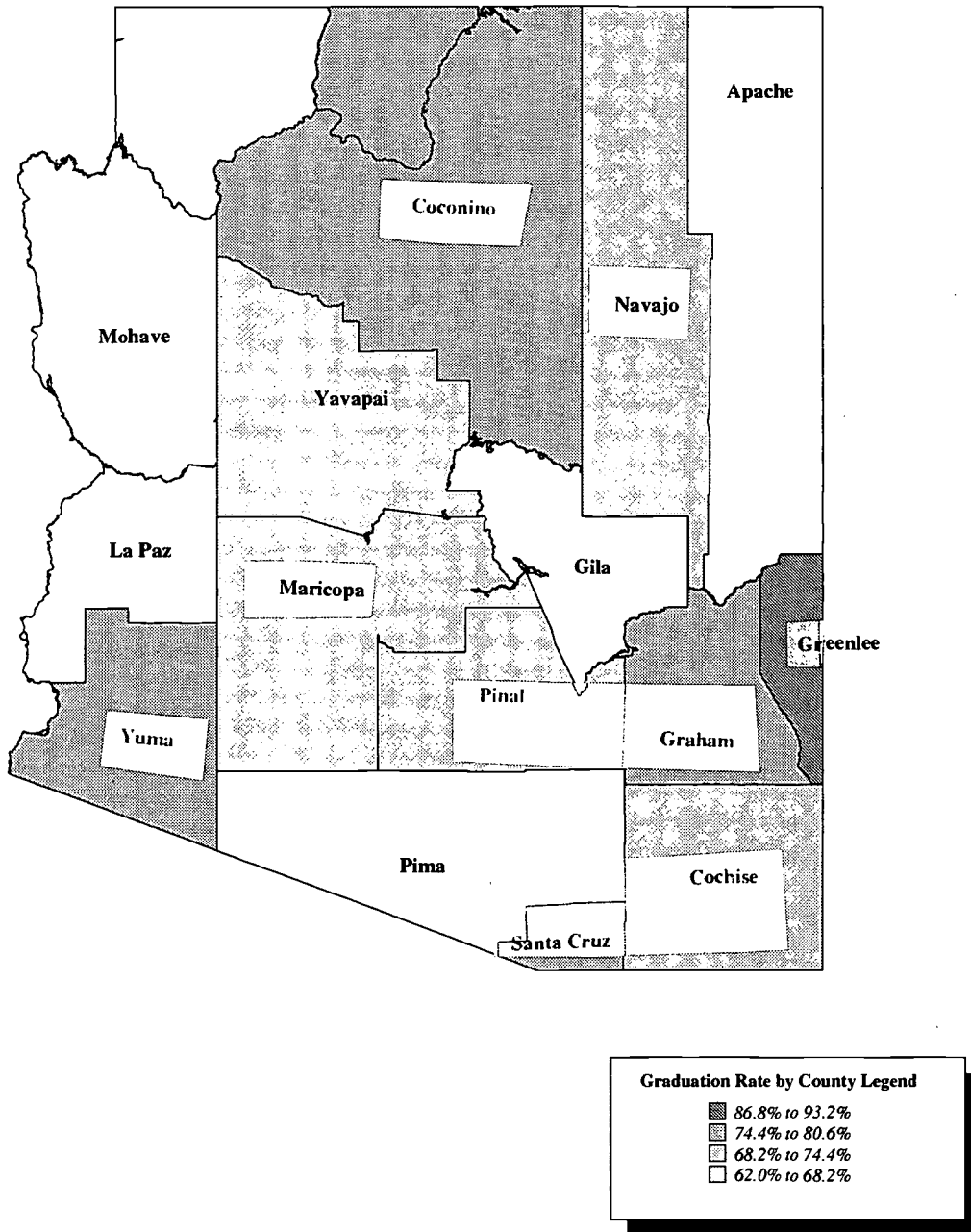
Greenlee County, while serving the fewest number of students in the cohort at 145, graduated the highest percentage in four years at just over 93%. Maricopa, serving the greatest number of students, graduated 23,874 of the 33,103 students served (72.1%). Note: in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, data pertaining to five or fewer students have been replaced with an asterisk (*) to protect student privacy. (see Table 5)
