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## ABSTRACT

This report provides information about the 26,697 degrees and certificates granted by Connecticut colleges and universities between July 1, 1998 and June 30, 1999. Data are included on the gender and race or ethnicity of the recipients, and data are broken into academic disciplines following the Classification of Instructional Programs. The 29,697 degrees and certificates in 1998-1999 represent an increase of 3.9% over the previous year. This increase represents both an increase in reporting and an actual increase in recipients. This is particularly true for certificate programs, up 74.2%; degrees have not changed greatly, although master's degrees increased by 6.0%. Decreases occurred in first professional degrees, doctorates, and greater-than-1-year certificates. Minorities in Connecticut earned more degrees in 1998-1999 than in any previous recording period. The 5 most popular disciplines in which degrees and certificates were awarded were: (1) Business Management and Administrative Services (5,677); (2) Health Professions and Related Sciences (3,209); (3) Education (3,170); (4) Social Sciences and History (2,712); and (5) Liberal Arts and Sciences, General Studies, and Humanities (2,247). 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## Degrees and Certificates Conferred by Connecticut Institutions of Higher Education 1998-99

### Highlights

- Connecticut colleges and universities awarded a total of 29,697 degrees and certificates in 1998-99, up 3.9% over the previous year. This growth reflects both an increase in reporting, particularly of certificates, and an actual increase in recipients, as well as the first-time inclusion of data from Gibbs College. Excluding the latter, the annual increase is 2.7% to 29,276 degrees and certificates.
- Significant increases occurred in master's (up 6.0%), bachelor's (up 2.4%), associate's (up 3.4%) and less-than-one-year certificates (up 74.2%). The increase in less-than-one-year certificates reflects a change in reporting from Gibbs College and an actual increase in the number of recipients (without Gibbs College's data, total less-than-one-year certificates rose 6.7% over last year).
- Decreases occurred in first-professional degrees (down 4.4%), doctorates (down 8.3%), and greater-than-one-year certificates (down 44.9%). Certificates in this category have typically been less than one percent of total degrees and certificates granted in any given year.
- Minorities, again, earned more degrees (4,288) in 1998-99 than in any previous recording period. This is an increase of 11.6% over last year, with most growth in degrees occurring at the Master's level.
- Public colleges and universities granted 14,819 degrees and certificates, up 1.1% from a year ago. Independent institutions granted 14,878 degrees and certificates, up 7.4% from the previous year. This includes the addition of degree and certificate data from Gibbs College to the count (421 degrees and certificates). Not including the data from Gibbs, the total for independent colleges and universities increased 4.4%.
- The five most popular disciplines in which degrees and certificates were awarded were: Business Management and Administrative Services (5,677), Health Professions and Related Sciences (3,209), Education (3,170), Social Sciences and History (2,712), and Liberal Arts and Sciences, General Studies and Humanities (2,427).

## Introduction

This report provides information about the 26,697 degrees and certificates granted between July 1, 1998 and June 30, 1999 by Connecticut colleges and universities, as well as the gender and race or ethnicity of the recipients. The data also break into academic disciplines following the Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP). The data for this report were provided to the Department by each college and university, and aggregated and analyzed by the Department. ## Overview

Connecticut colleges and universities awarded 29,697\* degrees and certificates in 1998-99, an increase of 1,118 (3.9%) over the previous year. This increase represents both an increase in reporting and an actual increase in recipients. This is particularly true in the case of certificate programs; degrees such as associate's, bachelor's, master's, and doctorates have not changed greatly. In one year, for example, total less-than-one year certificates increased from 565 to nearly 1,000, an increase of 74% in one year. This, however, is largely driven by the addition of one college, Gibbs, to the report. Without Gibbs' certificates, the total increased 6.7%. Bachelor's degrees, the largest single degree level, increased 2%, from 14,102 to 14,447.

Table 1 provides the breakdown of degrees and certificates conferred by public and independent institutions. In 1998-99 public colleges and universities awarded 49.9% of all degrees and certificates. The proportion of degrees and certificates granted by the public institutions has been dropping since 1993-94, reflecting state enrollment patterns.

As a proportion of total degrees and certificates granted, bachelor's represent slightly less than half, 48.6%. This is down from a year ago, when bachelor's degrees represented 49.5% of all degrees and certificates granted. Master's degrees, as a proportion of total conferrals, are at a peak, representing 27% of all degrees and certificates. Associate's degrees represent 15.7%, continuing the general downward trend of the last six years. Table 2 depicts these percentages for selected years.

### Degrees Awarded to Minorities

Each year minority individuals earn more and more degrees and certificates in Connecticut; 1998-99 was no exception. Minorities earned 4,288 degrees or certificates in 1998-99, up 11.6% from 1997-98, as shown in Table 3. In addition, degrees conferred to minority students made up a higher proportion (14.4%) of the total than in years past. Since the 1980s progress has been real and continuous, both in terms of increasing the total number of degrees awarded to minorities and in the percentage of total degrees earned by minority students. Connecticut institutions continue to improve in recruiting minority students, retaining those minority students from semester to semester, and in preparing them for completion of their academic programs.

Comparing 1998-99 to the previous year, each ethnic group changed. Degrees conferred to Blacks were up 9.2%, to Hispanics up 13.3%, to Asians up 13.7% and to American Indians up 8.3%. Of the total degrees and certificates awarded in 1998-99, Blacks received 5.7%, Hispanics 4.1%, Asians 4.2%, and American Indians 0.3%.

This year slightly more degrees were awarded to minority students by independent institutions (50.1%) than by the publics (49.9%). Table 4 provides the break out of degrees by gender, race or ethnicity, and type of institution.

For more than a decade, minority students have made significant progress by earning more and more higher-level degrees. This year the pattern changed slightly, with a small increase at the lowest levels and in master's degrees. The percentage of degrees and certificates at the bachelor's level remained essentially the same for minorities, while the percentage of doctorates and first-professional degrees decreased a bit (see Table 5). Minorities continue to trail whites in proportions of Master's and Doctoral degrees.

Non-resident aliens or foreign students earned 1,802 degrees and certificates in 1998-99. Most such degrees were awarded by independent colleges and universities.

### Degrees Earned by Women

Women received 57.7% of all degrees awarded in 1998-99, almost the same as the year before. Women continue to be especially underrepresented among doctoral and first-professional degree recipients though there has been a small upturn in the proportion of women recipients of first professional degrees (see Table 6).

## Trends in Disciplines

Business Management and Administrative Services was the most popular field for the 17<sup>th</sup> consecutive year. Following this discipline, in descending order were 2) Health Professions and Related Sciences, 3) Education, 4) Social Sciences and History, and 5) Liberal Arts and Sciences, General Studies and Humanities. Health Professions and Related Sciences is again in the second spot, having fallen behind Education last year; for the seven years prior to that Health Professions and Related Sciences was second highest. Of these five disciplines, changes are as follows: 1) Business is up by 383, 2) Health is down by 127, 3) Education is up by 179, 4) Social Sciences is down by two, and 5) Liberal Arts is up by 226.

The number of degrees and certificates awarded in scientific and technical disciplines included several that increased. An outstanding increase occurred in computer and information sciences, largely because of the addition of 118 one-year certificates, 105 of which were granted by Gibbs College. Other levels increased as well in this discipline. Health and Biological Science disciplines increased also, including several increases at the graduate level. Mathematics remains a small proportion of total degrees, but it increased slightly this past year, mostly because of increases at the master's level. Decreases occurred again in Engineering and related fields, a drop of 3.1% from last year. Finally, Physical Sciences and related fields decreased to the same level as ten years ago. The change occurred mainly at the bachelor's level. Table 7 provides totals and trend data for these disciplines, and Appendix 2 provides further detail regarding degree levels.

## Summary

This year degrees and certificates increased in number and in the diversity of recipients. Recipient diversity is part of a continuing trend, with more minority individuals receiving degrees in 1997-98 than in previous years. There is still under-representation of women and minorities among degree recipients at the highest levels. The overall increase in number of awards is partly because of reporting of certificates that were not previously reported to the Department. Degrees at other levels remained about the same as last year.

Specific disciplines that were of interest include several with strong linkages to careers in high demand. Among those are computer science, where awards jumped significantly this year largely because of the addition of 118 one-year certificates, of which 105 were from a single college which was newly added to degrees and certificates reporting. Several other large disciplines with strong linkages to careers, including engineering and related technologies (two disciplines were presented in summary form) continued to drop. The largest discipline was business, continuing a lengthy trend.
