

## GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS AND TEACHERS

ou may wish to guide your child or students in using the *My*Galaxy journal. Encourage young writers to use their journals as a means to think, write, and be creative. They will learn about themselves and the important people and events in their lives. Here are some suggestions for completing the journal:

- Pages 9-11 offer a place for the writer to provide some basic information about himself or herself. These pages should be completed first.
- Pages 12-16 are for family and friends to share information about themselves and to write special messages to the child. These may be completed at any time. If loved ones are far away, they can mail their comments and the child can fill in the pages. If any page does not fit a particular family's circumstances, it may be left blank.
- Pages 18–19 are the diary pages for My Galaxy. Make as many copies of these pages as necessary and have the child fill them out at regular intervals. The length of the intervals will depend on your schedule and the age of the child. Younger children may prefer to have longer periods between writing, while older kids may have lots to say each week.
- Pages 20–29 offer special prompts for writing and other creative activities. These may be filled out whenever you choose.
- On pages 30-32, "Reflections and Resolutions," the writer is offered
  the opportunity to reflect on the experiences of the past year and
  possible directions for the year ahead. These pages are intended to
  be completed last.


# THE SKY \*\*\* IN MY GALAXY
