## ABSTRACT

This memorandum contains facts about degrees conferred by institutions in the University of Wisconsin (UW) System in 2001-2002. Overall, the system conferred 28,894 degrees, of which 1,164 were associate degrees and 21,304 were bachelor's degrees. Institutions in the system conferred 5,083 master's degrees, 736 doctoral degrees, and 607 professional degrees. The top discipline sub-area in terms of bachelor's and master's degrees conferred was business administration, but the greatest number of doctoral degrees were granted in Chemistry. Women earned 57.1% of all degrees in the university system, and students of color received 6.6% of the total degrees, exceeding the 4.4% conferred on international students. 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**DEGREES CONFERRED BY INSTITUTION AND LEVEL**

In 2001-02, UW System institutions conferred 28,894 degrees (Table 1). Of these degrees, 1,164 were Associate degrees, 21,304 were Bachelors degrees, 5,083 were Masters degrees, and 736 were Doctoral degrees. Professional degrees awarded to UW-Madison students in law, medicine, veterinary medicine, and pharmacy accounted for the remaining 607 degrees.

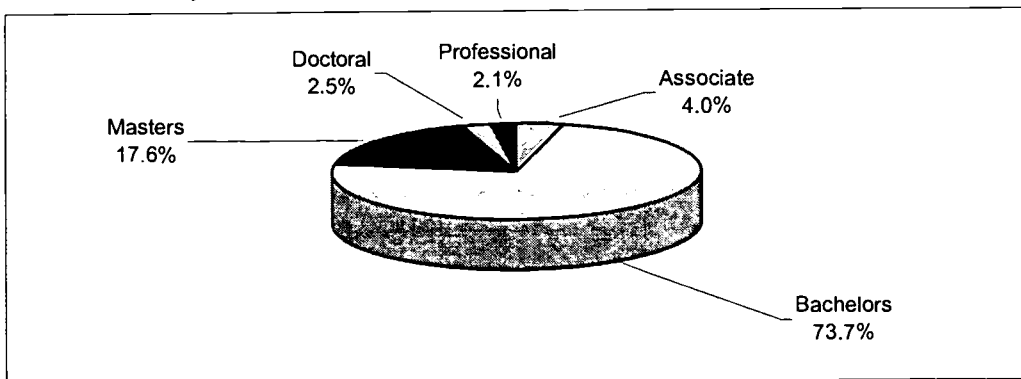

**PROPORTION OF DEGREES CONFERRED BY LEVEL**

Almost three-quarters (73.7%) of all degrees conferred by UW System institutions in 2001-02 were Bachelors degrees (Figure 1). Masters degrees accounted for 17.6% of all degrees conferred while Associate degrees made up 4.0% and Doctoral degrees made up 2.5% of degrees conferred. Professional degrees awarded to UW-Madison students were 2.1% of all UW System degrees conferred.

**DEGREES CONFERRED BY DISCIPLINE AREA AND LEVEL**

Table 2 shows the CIP<sup>1</sup> discipline areas and the 2001-02 degrees associated with these disciplines. Degrees in the Business Administration (CIP 52) discipline accounted for 18.5% of all degrees and degrees in Education (CIP 13) made up 12.8% of all degrees conferred. Other discipline areas in which one thousand or more degrees were conferred included Social Sciences and History (2,722), Allied Health and Health Sciences (1,982), Communications (1,724), Biological Sciences (1,445), Engineering (1,386), Visual and Performing Arts (1,239), Multidisciplinary Studies (1,205), and Psychology (1,201).

<sup>1</sup> The discipline areas are categorized according to the Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP), the U.S. Department of Education's standard educational program classification system. Each academic major program in the UW System has been assigned a CIP code for reporting purposes. A CIP code has six digits. The first two digits represent broad discipline areas such as those in Table 2. The middle two digits represent areas within the broader discipline and the whole CIP code represents a unique identifier for degree programs.

**TRENDS IN DEGREES CONFERRED BY DISCIPLINE AREA**

Tables 3, 4, and 5 show the number of degrees conferred by UW System institutions by CIP sub-area, a more specific categorizing mechanism than the CIP area shown in Table 2. The specific degree programs shown represent programs in which 2.5% or more of the total degrees for that level and year are conferred. With the exception of Biology and Fine Arts, all discipline sub-areas in which at least 2.5% of all Bachelors degrees were conferred in 2001-02 were also represented in 1996-97 (five years ago) and in 1991-92 (ten years ago) (Table 3). Biology was a common sub-area in 2001-02 and five years ago, but not ten years ago. Accounting and Journalism were common discipline sub-areas both five and ten years ago but are not represented in 2001-02. Fine Arts has emerged as a more common bachelors-level discipline in recent years.

Of the discipline sub-areas in which at least 2.5% of Masters degrees were conferred in 2001-02, three are in areas that were not represented either five or ten years ago (Table 4). These areas are Education, Educational Psychology and Special Education. Business Administration, Elementary Education, Curriculum and Instruction, Social Work, Counseling, Secondary Education, and Library Science are all areas that were represented in 2001-02 and were also represented both five and ten years ago. Communicative Disorders is an area that was represented in 2001-02 and 1996-97 but not ten years ago.

Chemistry, Curriculum and Instruction, Biological Sciences, Zoology, Economics, and Physics are all discipline sub-areas in which at least 2.5% of all Doctoral degrees have been conferred for 2001-02, 1996-97, and 1991-92. The fields of Education and Psychology were common areas in 2001-02 but were not either five or ten years ago. English and History were common areas in both 2001-02 and ten years ago but not five years ago. Molecular Biology was a common area in 2001-02 and five years ago but not ten years ago.

**DEGREES CONFERRED BY GENDER**

Women earned 57.1% of all degrees conferred in the UW System in 2001-02 (Table 6). This is a 1.3 percentage point increase from the proportion of degrees conferred to women in 1997-98. At the Associate level, 61.3% of degrees conferred in 2001-02 were to women. At the Bachelors level, 56.7% of degrees conferred were earned by women and 60.1% of Masters degrees conferred were earned by women. The Doctoral level continues to be the only level where women do not comprise the majority of degree recipients. In 2001-02, 56.9% of Doctoral degrees were earned by men and 43.1% were earned by women. At the Professional level, 53.7% of degrees conferred were earned by women.

**DEGREES CONFERRED BY RACE/ETHNICITY**

Students of color earned 6.6% of all degrees conferred in 2001-02 (Table 7). White students earned 89.0% of all degrees conferred during the same time period. The remaining 4.4% of degrees conferred were earned by international students. Compared to 1997-98, the number of degrees conferred to students of color in 2001-02 increased by 120 but the proportion of degrees conferred to students of color decreased slightly between these two years. The proportion of degrees at each degree level earned by students of color ranged from 4.2% at the Associate level to 16.0% at the Professional level. The proportion of degrees at each level earned by international students ranged from 0.7% at the Associate level to 32.2% at the Doctoral level.

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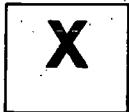


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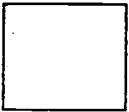


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
