## ABSTRACT

The Office of Institutional Development and Technology at College of the Canyons, California, conducted a study of the characteristics of the students who submitted an application to the College but did not enroll, compared with students who submitted an application and subsequently enrolled. Student characteristics included high school, ethnicity, and gender. The results are intended to assist Student Services in their outreach to feeder high schools. Applicant and demographic data were obtained from the College's Management Information Systems department. Enrollment data were obtained from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. Three sets of analyses were conducted, one each for fall 1999, fall 2000, and fall 2001. Of all applicants, Latinos showed the largest discrepancy between those who enrolled and those who did not for all 3 years: -5% in 1999, -9% in 2000, and -2% in 2001. In addition, overall, females were more likely than males to apply and not enroll for all 3 years: -4% in 1999, -17% in 2000, and -10% in 2001. For each term, results were disaggregated for each high school with 10 or more applicants. The report stipulates that caution should be used in interpreting the results, as students may apply to multiple colleges, and since there is no application fee, there is no financial consequence for not enrolling. # **APPLICANTS WHO DO NOT ENROLL FOR FALL 1999, FALL 2000, AND FALL 2001**

**Spring 2002**

## ***Executive Summary***

The *Office of Institutional Development and Technology* conducted a study of the characteristics of students who submitted an application to College of the Canyons but did not enroll, compared with students who submitted an application and subsequently enrolled. Student characteristics included high school, ethnicity, and gender.

These analyses will help identify high schools more likely to show a discrepancy between those who apply and enroll, compared with those who apply but fail to enroll. Student Services can use this as a tool to focus outreach efforts on those feeder high schools with discrepancies in ethnicity and/or gender.

Latinos showed the largest discrepancy in all three semesters, although the size dropped substantially in 2001. Females consistently showed a higher percentage of no-shows.

### **Fall 1999**

Analyses revealed that of all applicants Latinos showed the largest discrepancy between those who enrolled and those who did not (-5%). Eighteen percent of all enrollees were Latino, compared to 23 percent of all no-shows. Of local feeder high schools, Hart showed the highest difference for Latinos (-10 %). Refer to appendix for detailed tables.

Overall, females showed a -4 percent difference between enrollees and no-shows (Table 2). Of the local feeder high schools, Valencia showed the highest difference for females (-14 %).

### **Fall 2000**

Analyses revealed that of all applicants Latinos showed the largest discrepancy between those who enrolled and those who did not (-9%). Twenty-one percent of all enrollees were Latino, compared to 30 percent of all no-shows. Of local feeder high schools, Hart showed the highest difference for Latinos (-10 %). Refer to appendix for detailed tables.

Overall, females showed a -4 percent difference between enrollees and no-shows (Table 4). Of the local feeder high schools, Valencia showed the highest difference for females (-17 %).

## Fall 2001

In Fall 2001, the discrepancy narrowed for all ethnicities, including Latinos. In examining Table 5, of all applicants Latinos showed the largest discrepancy between those who enrolled and those who did not (-2%). Twenty-one percent of all enrollees were Latino, compared to 23 percent of all no-shows. Of local feeder high schools, Hart showed the highest difference for Latinos (-9 %). Refer to appendix for detailed tables.

Overall, females showed a -5 percent difference between enrollees and no-shows (Table 6). Of the local feeder high schools, Saugus showed the highest difference for females (-10 %).

## *Recommendations*

Caution should be used when interpreting this information. Students may apply at multiple colleges. In addition, since COC does not charge an application fee, there is no financial consequence for not enrolling. In addition, we do not know the reasons for non-enrollment. We recommend the following: subsequent qualitative research to supply us with this type of important information on students who apply to COC but do not enroll; as well as analyses of subsequent semesters will reveal if the trends cited above will continue.

## ***Introduction***

The Office of Institutional Development and Technology conducted a study of the characteristics of students who submitted an application to College of the Canyons but did not enroll, compared with students who submitted an application and subsequently enrolled. Student characteristics included high school, ethnicity, and gender. These results are intended to assist Student Services in their outreach efforts to feeder high schools.

## ***Methods***

Applicant and demographic data were obtained from the College of the Canyons MIS department. Enrollment data were obtained from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office referential files, namely USX files for Fall 1999, Fall 2000, and Fall 2001. Three sets of analyses were conducted, one for each of the Fall semesters examined. For each term, results were disaggregated for each high school with 10 or more applicants. Statistics include:

- The number of students, percent ethnicity by high school and by enrollment category: enrolled or not enrolled.
- The number of students, percent male/female by high school and by enrollment category: enrolled or not enrolled.
- The difference in number and percent for ethnicity by high school and by enrollment category: enrolled or not enrolled.
- The difference in number and percent male/female by high school and by enrollment category: enrolled or not enrolled.
- The total number, percent, and differences for each ethnicity and gender for all high schools combined.

## **Results**

### **Fall 1999**

In examining Table 1, of all applicants Latinos showed the largest discrepancy between those who enrolled and those who did not (-5%). Eighteen percent of all enrollees were Latino, compared to 23 percent of all no-shows. Of local feeder high schools, Hart showed the highest difference for Latinos (-10 %). Refer to appendix for detailed tables.

Overall, females showed a -4 percent difference between enrollees and no-shows (Table 2). Of the local feeder high schools, Valencia showed the highest difference for females (-14 %).

### **Fall 2000**

In examining Table 3, of all applicants Latinos showed the largest discrepancy between those who enrolled and those who did not (-9%). Twenty-one percent of all enrollees were Latino, compared to 30 percent of all no-shows. Of local feeder high schools, Hart showed the highest difference for Latinos (-10 %). Refer to appendix for detailed tables.

Overall, females showed a -4 percent difference between enrollees and no-shows (Table 4). Of the local feeder high schools, Valencia showed the highest difference for females (-17 %).

### **Fall 2001**

In Fall 2001, the discrepancy narrowed for all ethnicities, including Latinos. In examining Table 5, of all applicants Latinos showed the largest discrepancy between those who enrolled and those who did not (-2%). Twenty-one percent of all enrollees were Latino, compared to 23 percent of all no-shows. Of local feeder high schools, Hart showed the highest difference for Latinos (-9 %). Refer to appendix for detailed tables.

Overall, females showed a -5 percent difference between enrollees and no-shows (Table 6). Of the local feeder high schools, Saugus showed the highest difference for females (-10 %).

## ***Conclusions***

These analyses will help identify high schools more likely to show a discrepancy between those who apply and enroll, compared with those who apply but fail to enroll. Student Services can use this as a tool to focus outreach efforts on those schools with discrepancies in ethnicity and/or gender.

Latinos showed the largest discrepancy in all three semesters, although the size dropped substantially in 2001. Females consistently showed a higher percentage of no-shows. Analyses of subsequent semesters will reveal if these trends will continue.

Caution should be used when interpreting this information. Students may apply at multiple colleges. In addition, since COC does not charge an application fee, there is no financial consequence for not enrolling. In addition, we do not know the reasons for non-enrollment. Subsequent qualitative research could supply us with important information on students who apply to COC but do not enroll.
