ABSTRACT

The primary mission of the Community College of Rhode Island (CCRI) is to help students succeed in reaching their educational goals by preparing them to enter the workforce or transfer to a four-year college or university. Each year, CCRI surveys the previous year's graduates as a way of measuring success. A total of 1,379 members of the class of 2001 were asked to provide information about place of employment, job title, salary, and status of continuing education. More than 81% (1,126) responded to the survey. Results indicate that 517 (45.9%) graduates were employed full-time; 126 (11.2%) were employed full-time and going to school part-time; 106 (9.4%) were employed part-time, 20 (1.8%) were unavailable for employment; 55 (4.9%) were unemployed and searching; 112 (9.9%) were in school full-time; and 190 (16.9%) were in school full-time and working part-time. More than 93% of respondents were employed, continuing their education, or both. The report breaks down employment and transfer status into 26 different programs and departments, ranging from Business Administration to Liberal Arts and Technical Studies. Average salaries reported are based on a 40-hour week and are reported only for education-related employment. Research instrument appended. (NB)

With an enrollment of 16,000 students each semester, CCRI touches the lives of most Rhode Island families.

Each year, between 1,200 and 1,700 Rhode Islanders graduate from CCRI and thousands more come to the college to take a course or two as part of their lifelong learning endeavors. Currently, our graduates total more than 45,000, most of them living and working in this state. It could be said that they are the backbone of the Rhode Island economy – the company CEOs and lawyers, educators, health care professionals, technicians, manufacturers and service workers that keep the Ocean State afloat.

Many of our graduates also choose to continue their education by transferring to another school. This class was no exception. Of those responding to the survey, 27% indicated they were attending school full time and another 11% part time. Whether students transfer before completing a degree at CCRI or upon completion as highlighted in this report, the transfer function is performing very effectively in meeting the needs of our students. As indicated on the following page, graduates of the class of 2001 are continuing their studies at a variety of colleges across the country.

Established in 1964 to give all Rhode Islanders an opportunity to achieve their educational goals, CCRI remains committed to helping every student succeed. The college serves recent high school graduates, older adults looking for a new career, recent immigrants and businesses looking to give their employees the training they need to remain competitive in a global economy.

Meeting Expectations

CCRI's primary mission is to help students succeed in reaching their educational goals by preparing them to enter the workforce or transfer to a four-year college or university. Each year the college attempts to measure its success in this regard by surveying the previous year's graduates.

This year 1,379 members of the class of 2001 were asked to provide information about place of employment, job title, salary and status of continuing education. Of those, 1,126, or 81.7% responded to the survey. The results indicate that, overwhelmingly, CCRI graduates succeeded in reaching their educational goals. In fact, more than 93% are employed, continuing their education or a combination of both.

A total of 643 graduates reported that they are working full time, with another 296 employed on a part-time basis (190 of those working part time are also continuing their education). Also, 302 graduates are attending school full time; 41.7 percent of these are attending Rhode Island College and 18.2 percent are studying at the University of Rhode Island. Members of the class of 2001 transferred to more than 38 colleges and universities.

About this report ...

Since the Career Placement and Graduate Transfer Report is based on a self-report survey, some caution in interpretation is suggested. In looking at the data, please be advised that average salaries, based on a 40-hour week, are reported only for educational-related employment and may show an unexpectedly broad range due to data collected from both graduates in entry-level positions and professionally employed graduates who attended CCRI for further professional development.

The overall results from this year's survey again validates, as have all reports since 1985, CCRI's success in preparing graduates for further education as well as for jobs in the Rhode Island economy.





Business Administration

The Business Administration program focuses on providing students with a solid academic background in business as well as specialized training in a variety of areas. Students receive a solid foundation in management, marketing, accounting, retail management, finance/banking, entrepreneurship and real estate. They also learn critical thinking, problem solving and decision-making skills. A cooperative education option offers students an opportunity to gain work experience while in school.



Cardio-Respiratory Care

A respiratory care worker is an allied health specialist employed under medical supervision in the treatment, management, control, diagnostic evaluation and care of patients with deficiencies and abnormalities associated with the cardiopulmonary systems of the body. CCRI's two-year, six-semester program incorporates college classes with clinical practice. Graduates must pass a national entry-level examination. Respiratory therapy personnel are employed in hospitals, nursing facilities, clinics, doctors' offices, home care companies, rehabilitation centers and municipal organizations.



Computer Studies

CCRI offers two Associate in Science degree programs in the computer area. The Computer Programming degree program prepares the student to enter a modern programming environment. It stresses problem definition and solution design using different programming languages in the development of applications. The Microcomputing degree program prepares the student to enter a workplace that emphasizes the use of the personal computer as a stand-alone device or in a networked computer environment. This program prepares an individual to be employed in computer user support services. The college also offers one-year certificate options, which emphasize technical work only, for students who already hold a Bachelor's Degree or have experience in a computer-oriented profession. The career paths of graduates have been changing in recent years; instead of working in programming positions which typically lead to systems analysts positions at banks or insurance companies, students are going to work for major companies to staff the "help desk."



Computer & Networking Maintenance

Opportunities for individuals skilled in the installation, support and troubleshooting of computers and computer networks continue to increase. This certificate provides a balanced coverage of technology fundamentals, computer hardware, computer software, and networking technology. An emphasis is placed on operating principles of hardware and software, networking models, operating systems, internetworking components, industry standards and hands-on laboratory activities for developing practical problem-solving skills. Students will develop the ability to configure and troubleshoot basic PCs, local area networks (LANs) and internetworks using routers and switches. Integrated into the program are courses that prepare the student to sit for both the Cisco CCNA examination and the CompTIA A+ certification for computer maintenance. Most of the courses in this certificate program transfer towards an associate degree in Computer and Networking Technology and to a lesser extent, an associate degree in Telecommunications Technology. This program prepares students for employment as computer technicians, computer personnel, and network administrators and network installers.

Engineering Technology

CCRI has three Engineering Technology programs. The Electronic Engineering Technology program educates students as technicians in the design, development and testing of engineering models and systems. Graduates of this program pursue careers as engineering associates, engineering aides in research and development, field engineers, sales engineers, engineering technicians, technical writers and assistant production managers in the electronics industry. Due to the increasing complexity of electrical and electronic equipment, many students decide to expand their knowledge by pursuing a four-year degree in engineering technology.

The Mechanical Engineering Technology program trains students to convert engineering theory into working plans in order to solve real world problems. The students study traditional engineering subjects such as physics, math, statics, materials and mechanisms as well as taking courses in the areas of robotics, tool design, quality control, CAD, production planning and cost estimating. Graduates are qualified to seek employment in the design as well as the manufacturing or industrial engineering areas.

The Computer Engineering Technology program offers students a chance to acquire a heavier concentration in computer education. Computer engineering technicians are needed to assist engineers in the design, development and testing of new devices, and they are needed to install, operate and maintain computer equipment. In industry they may be found in design, in sales, in research and development, or in the field providing technical information and service to the users of computer engineering technology.
