## ABSTRACT

This memorandum provides information about students granted financial aid in the University of Wisconsin (UW) system in 2001-2002 and earlier years. The total financial aid provided to UW students was \$550.0 million, up \$52.2 million from 2000-2001. Total loan dollars for UW students totaled \$371.2 million, up \$30.9 million from 2000-2001. UW students received \$166.7 million in 2002-2002, an increase of \$20.4 million from 2000-2001. Of the financial aid, 81% came from federal sources, and 7% from state sources. Institutional sources provided 6% of financial aid. In all, 88,594 students received financial aid, an increase of 4,377 students. The percentage of undergraduate students receiving financial aid, 58%, was up 2 percentage points from 2000-2001. Thirty-nine percent of graduate students received financial aid in the 2001-2002 academic year, an increase of 3 percentage points from the previous year. As in the previous year, 66% of students receiving financial aid were dependent students; 26% were independent. The average loan debt of a Wisconsin resident who received a Bachelor's degree in 2001-2002 was \$16,046. Six appendixes contain supplemental data. (Contains 17 tables.) (SLD)

**OVERVIEW OF STUDENT FINANCIAL AID TRENDS**

Overall, 88,594 UW students, 56 percent of total enrollment, received \$550.0 million in financial aid in 2001-02 (Table 1). Compared to 2000-01, the number of financial aid recipients increased by 4,377 and dollars increased by 52.2 million. Almost 3 of every 5 undergraduate students (58%) received some financial aid (including non-need based aid) in 2001-02.

**SOURCES OF AID FOR UW STUDENTS**

Almost five of every six financial aid dollars (81%) to UW students were provided or underwritten through a federal program (Table 2). Aid from state sources represented less than one-tenth (7%) of all aid. Institutional aid accounted for 6 percent of the aid received by UW students. Institutional aid is made up primarily of scholarships funded through sources such as private donations to UW institutions.

**LOANS**

Loan aid continues to make up the largest component of financial aid to UW students. Loan dollars make up 67 percent of total financial aid dollars and 79 percent of financial aid recipients received some kind of loan (Table 3). Forty-four percent of enrolled UW students received a loan in 2001-02.

**GRANTS**

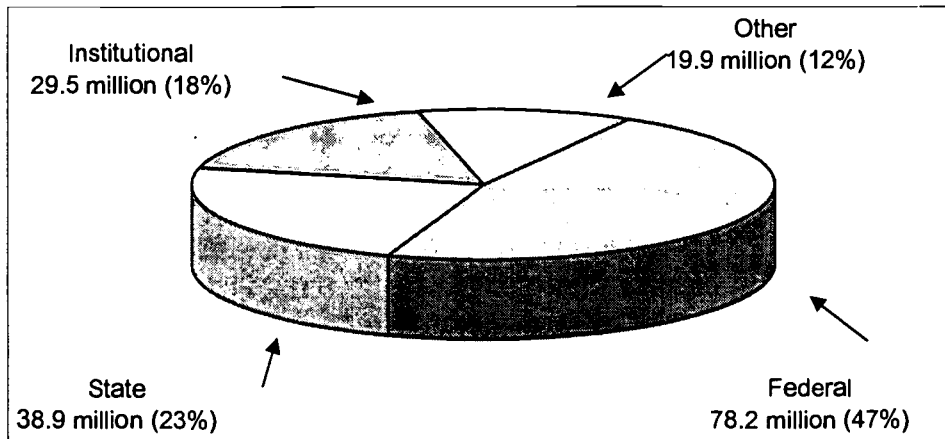
Grant aid made up 30 percent of financial aid dollars and 55 percent of financial aid recipients received a grant of some kind in 2001-02 (Table 4). The proportion of grant dollars to total aid increased slightly from the previous year and the percentage of financial aid recipients who received grants increased two percentage points from 2000-01. However, the proportion of grant dollars to total aid remains well below that of the late 1980s and early 1990s.

In 2001-02, federal grants comprised the largest portion of grants (47%) received by UW students followed by state grants at 23 percent (Figure 1). Grants in the "other" category are provided by other states to non-resident students.

The largest need based state grant program available to Wisconsin residents attending a UW institution is the Wisconsin Higher Education Grant (WHEG). One out of every six resident undergraduate students (17%) received a WHEG award in 2001-02 (Table 5). Other state grant programs are described in Appendix D.

**FEDERAL WORK STUDY**

In 2001-02, \$12.1 million dollars were provided through the Federal Work Study (FWS) program, a work program that includes both federal and state contributions. In 2001-02, 9,115 students participated in this program which accounted for 2 percent of all financial aid dollars (Table 6).

**CHARACTERISTICS OF FINANCIAL AID RECIPIENTS**

Twenty-six percent of all aid recipients, 20percent of undergraduate students and 86 percent of graduate students, were independent students (Table 7). A higher percentage of non-resident undergraduate students are dependent (76%) compared to resident undergraduate students (71%).

Sixty-four percent of all enrolled UW students of color received some form of financial aid in 2001-02 (Table 8). Eighty-three percent of these students had demonstrated financial need as defined by the Federal Needs Analysis Methodology.

**STUDENT INDEBTEDNESS**

UW resident undergraduate students who received loans (both need and non need-based) during their academic careers, had an average debt of \$16,046 at graduation in 2001-02 (Table 9). This represents a 3 percent increase from 2000-01. The proportion of resident undergraduate debt coming from non-need based loan programs increased by two percentage points. Sixty-two percent (62%) of resident undergraduate students who graduated in 2001-02 had loan debt at graduation. Table 10 shows cumulative student loan debt by UW institution.

Although the percentage of students graduating with loan debt has increased in the past few years, the student loan default rate for UW students (2.7%) remains low (Table 11). The student loan default rate for UW graduates is significantly lower than the student loan default rate of all borrowers nationally showing that the great majority of student loan borrowers are able and committed to making their loan payments.

## TECHNICAL NOTES

This Informational Memorandum presents annual data on the amount of financial assistance provided to UW System students. Unless otherwise noted, figures are based on student financial aid data provided to UW System Administration by the UW institutions via the Financial Aid Central Data Request (CDR). The total number of aid recipient figures represent the total number of students (undergraduate, graduate, residents, non-residents) receiving any type of financial aid (with exceptions noted below). Students often received more than one type of aid so the cumulative total for students aided through grant, work, and loan programs will not equal the grand total. Other important caveats include:

- Details in the text and tables may not add due to rounding.
- The data reported in this Informational Memorandum do not include graduate assistantships or fellowships and tuition remission grants.
- Work study includes only dollars provided through the Federal Work Study program and ROTC. It does not capture other on-campus and off-campus employment.
- Loan data do not include private non-federally-guaranteed borrowing activity.
- Residency for fee-purposes is determined by the Office of the Registrar at each institution. Non-residents are defined as all students with residency other than "resident" including Minnesota and Michigan reciprocity agreement students. Students with missing residency information have been included with Wisconsin residents.
- Graduate enrollment includes enrollment in professional programs.
- Financial need is defined by Federal Needs Analysis methodology.
- Dependency status is defined by Federal Needs Analysis methodology and specifications.
