ABSTRACT

A survey was conducted to gather information on the salaries of nursing school deans and related information such as title, rank, degree level, tenure status, gender, and race/ethnicity. Findings, presented in several data tables, provide a benchmarking resource for comparing salary data on a calendar year basis by numerous characteristics of deans including title, highest earned degree, academic rank, tenure status, and years in current deanship. Salaries are also presented by geographic region, institutional control, parent institution (university or college), academic health center affiliation, types of nursing programs offered, Carnegie classification, and number of full-time faculty. INTRODUCTION

The American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) was established in 1969 to answer the need for a national organization dedicated exclusively to furthering nursing education in America's universities and colleges. Representing nursing education programs at 570 public and private universities and colleges, AACN serves the public interest by assisting deans and directors to improve and advance nursing education, research, and practice.

The Research and Data Center is the nucleus of the Association's authoritative national databank. Annually, the Research Center reports the most current statistics available on student enrollment, graduations, and faculty and deans' salaries.

The 2002–2003 Salaries of Deans in Baccalaureate and Graduate Programs in Nursing, the 25th such report, is designed to provide the most comprehensive and up-to-date salary data available for deans. This benchmarking resource presents salary data on a calendar year basis by numerous characteristics of deans including title, highest earned degree, academic rank, tenure status, and years in current deanship. Salaries also are presented by geographic region, institutional control, parent institution (university or college), academic health center affiliation, types of nursing programs offered, Carnegie classification, and number of full-time faculty.

SURVEY METHODOLOGY

The definition of terms used in the questionnaire can be found on page vi. Please note that the term "dean" is used throughout this report to refer to the chief executive officer of a school of nursing. It also encompasses those individuals with institutionally determined titles such as director, chair, head, and coordinator.

The deans' survey instrument was designed to gather information on salaries and related information such as title, rank, degree level, tenure status, gender, and race/ethnicity, and length of time in the deanship. Instructions for accessing the survey Web site were mailed to 682 baccalaureate and higher degree programs in nursing on September 10, 2002. Partial or complete responses were received from 573 institutions by February 3, 2003.

To ensure the privacy of data collected by AACN, any information that would divulge any monetary figures related to individual salaries or identify individual deans is classified as restricted. To further protect the confidentiality of salary data, salaries are not reported in tables where there were less than five cases in a cell. The mean and standard deviation were reported in cells with five cases; and the mean, standard deviation, and 25th, 50th, and 75th percentiles were reported in cells with six to nine cases.

RESPONSE RATE

Of the 682 deans' survey forms mailed, 573 questionnaires (517 member and 56 nonmember) were returned, yielding an overall response rate of 84.0 percent. The response rate for member schools was 90.9 percent; for nonmember schools the rate was 49.6 percent. Of the 573 respondents, 55 schools (49 member and 6 nonmember) reported acting or interim deans. These individuals were excluded from the analysis of deans' salaries and related information. The salaries analysis was limited to 493 institutions reporting salary and salary basis data.

CARNEGIE CLASSIFICATION DEFINITIONS

MASTER'S COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES I: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. They award 40 or more master's degrees per year across three or more disciplines.

MASTER'S COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES II: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. They award 20 or more master's degrees per year.

DOCTORAL/RESEARCH UNIVERSITIES-EXTENSIVE: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. They award 50 or more doctoral degrees per year across at least 15 disciplines.

DOCTORAL/RESEARCH UNIVERSITIES-INTENSIVE: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. They award at least 10 doctoral degrees per year across three or more disciplines, or at least 20 doctoral degree per year overall.

BACCALAUREATE COLLEGES-GENERAL: These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. They award less than half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.

BACCALAUREATE COLLEGES-LIBERAL ARTS: These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. They award at least half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.

BACCALAUREATE/ASSOCIATE'S COLLEGES: These institutions are undergraduate colleges where the majority of conferrals are at the subbaccalaureate level (associate's degrees and certificates), but bachelor's degrees account for at least 10 percent of undergraduate awards.

ASSOCIATE'S COLLEGES: These institutions offer associate's degree programs and certificate programs, but, with few exceptions, award no baccalaureate degrees.

SPECIALIZED INSTITUTIONS: These institutions offer degrees ranging from the bachelor's to the doctorate and a majority of the degrees awarded are in a single field.

MEDICAL SCHOOLS AND MEDICAL CENTERS: These institutions award most of their professional degrees in medicine. In some instances, their programs include other health professions programs, such as dentistry, pharmacy, or nursing.

OTHER SEPARATE HEALTH PROFESSION SCHOOLS: These institutions award most of their professional degrees in such fields as chiropractic, nursing, pharmacy, or podiatry.

OTHER SPECIALIZED INSTITUTIONS: Institutions in this category include graduate centers, maritime academies, military institutes, and institutions that do not fit any other classification category.

DEFINITION OF TERMS AND GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

Dean: The term "dean" is used throughout this report to refer to the chief executive officer of a school of nursing. It also encompasses those individuals with institutionally determined titles such as director, chair, head, and coordinator.

Salary: Current fiscal-year, gross salary rounded to the nearest dollar.

Salary Basis: Academic (9- or 10-month contract) or calendar (11- or 12-month contract).

Conversion of Salaries: All deans' salaries are reported on a calendar year basis. Salaries reported on an academic basis are multiplied by eleven-ninths (11/9). This conversion permits the salaries of all deans to appear in all tables.

Minimum and Maximum: The lowest and highest salary values, respectively, in a distribution of ordered data.

Mean: The average salary. It is affected by extreme (either high or low) values, particularly when there are small numbers of individuals represented in a particular faculty classification.

Standard Deviation: Describes how the salary data vary around the mean salary.

Median or 50th Percentile: The value midway between the lowest and highest salary value. The median is useful as it minimizes the effect of extreme values.

Percentiles: Values that divide a distribution of ordered data into 100 equal parts, or into four equal parts (quartiles). For example, a salary value at the 75th percentile is the value that 75 percent of the salaries are less than or equal to. Salaries ranges within a quartile can be constructed in relation to other quartiles. For example, if the 50th percentile salary is \$98,000 and the 75th percentile salary is \$100,000, the third quartile salaries range from \$98,001 through and including \$100,000.

HIGHLIGHTS

- ♦ The mean calendar year salary for 2002–2003 was \$100,985 for member deans (N=446) and \$71,378 for nonmember deans (N=47). These salaries represent a 1.0 percent increase for member deans and a 2.7 percent increase for nonmember deans above the 2001–2002 mean salaries.
- The mean and median number of years in current deanship was 6.3 and 5.0 years, respectively. Three hundred ninety deans (75.3 percent) were in their first deanship, while 128 (24.7 percent) reported holding previous deanships.
