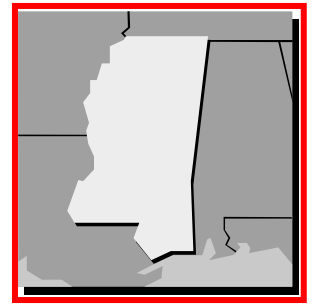


Success for Mississippi



Success for All Schools in Mississippi Gain on MCT-Reading

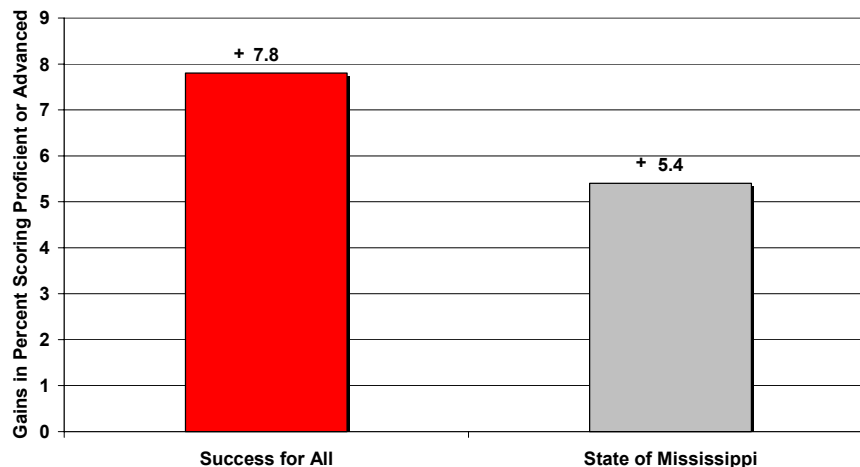
Mississippi elementary schools using the Success for All reading program have once again made outstanding gains on the Mississippi Curriculum Test (MCT) reading scale. **Students in grades 2-5 in Success for All schools gained 7.8 percentage points in students scoring at proficient or advanced from 2002 to 2004.** Mississippi students as a whole gained 5.4 points.

Schools making particularly outstanding gains include:

- Gloster Elementary in Amite Co.: 25.8%
- Witherspoon Elementary in Meridian: 20.6%
- Charlotte Hyatt Elementary in Moss Point: 18.1%
- Otken Elementary in McComb: 14.9%
- Harris Upper Elementary in Meridian: 11.5%
- West Hills Elementary in Meridian: 11.5%
- South Side Elementary in West Point: 11.5%
- East Park Elementary in Moss Point: 11.4%
- Kennedy Elementary in McComb: 10.2%
- Liberty Elementary in Amite Co.: 10.0%

The 2004 results reflect previous Mississippi findings as well as outcomes in states throughout the U.S., affirming that students in Success for All schools gain more than other students on state accountability measures.
