Success for All Schools in Nevada Gain on Nevada Criterion-Referenced Assessment

Nevada elementary schools implementing the Success for All reading program made outstanding gains on the 2004 Nevada Criterion-Referenced Assessment in reading. Averaging the gains of third and fifth graders from 2002 to 2004, students in the 21 Nevada Success for All schools statewide gained an average of 2.8 percentage points in percent passing. Over that same time period, Nevada students in general declined by 5.9% in percent passing.


Schools making particularly outstanding gains include:

- Natchez Elementary in Washoe County: 35.9%
- Sierra Vista Elementary in Washoe County: 17.7%
- Alice Maxwell Elementary in Washoe County: 16.7%
- Anderson Elementary in Washoe County: 12.3%

- Kermit R. Booker Elementary in Clark County: 7.8%
- Kit Carson Elementary in Clark County: 6.8%
- Empire Elementary in Carson City: 5.2%
- McDermitt Elementary in Humboldt County: 4.8%

The 2004 results reflect findings in states throughout the U. S., affirming that Success for All schools gain more than other schools on state accountability measures.
