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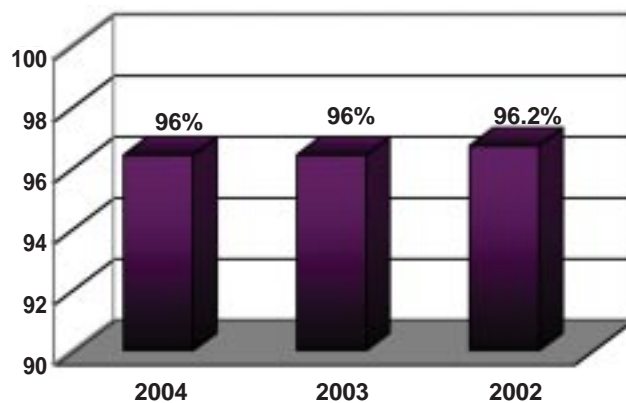

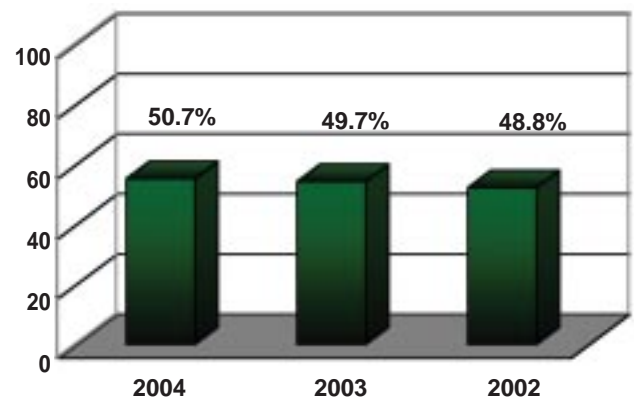
Average Daily Attendance

This chart shows the percent of students that attend school each day.



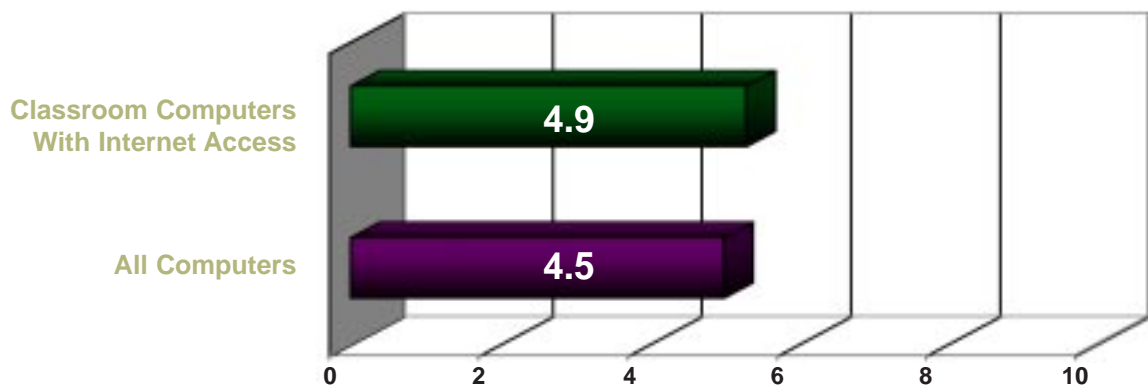
Free- or Reduced-Priced Meals

The following chart shows the type of discipline problems that have occurred in public schools in the state and what actions were taken in 2003-2004. An incident may involve one or more students.

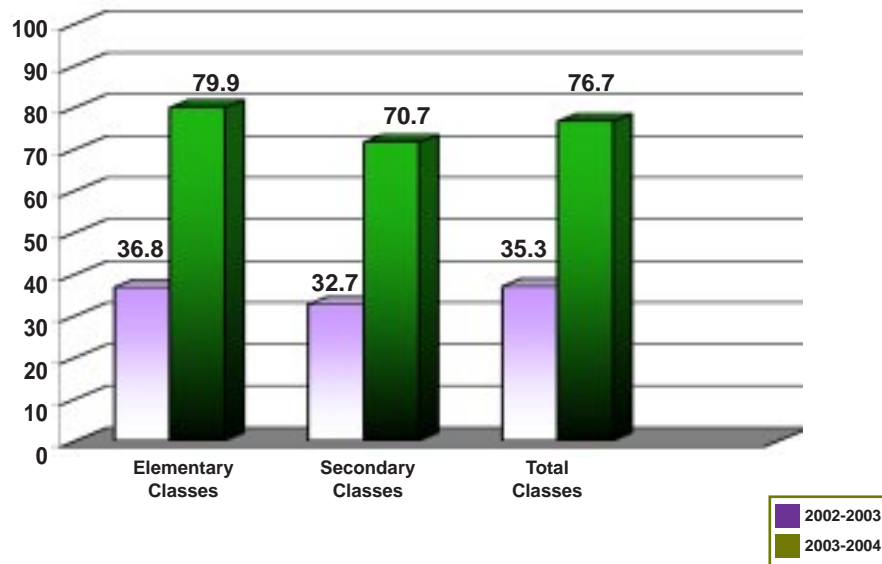

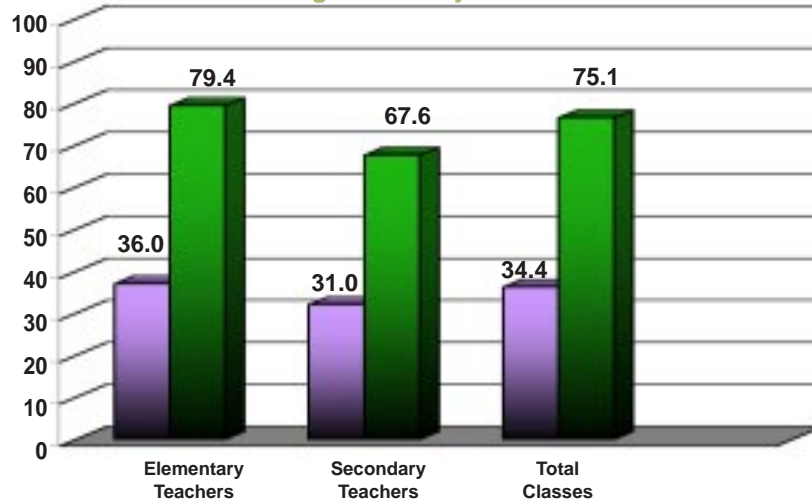
Highly Qualified Teachers

Percent of Classes Taught by Highly Qualified Teachers

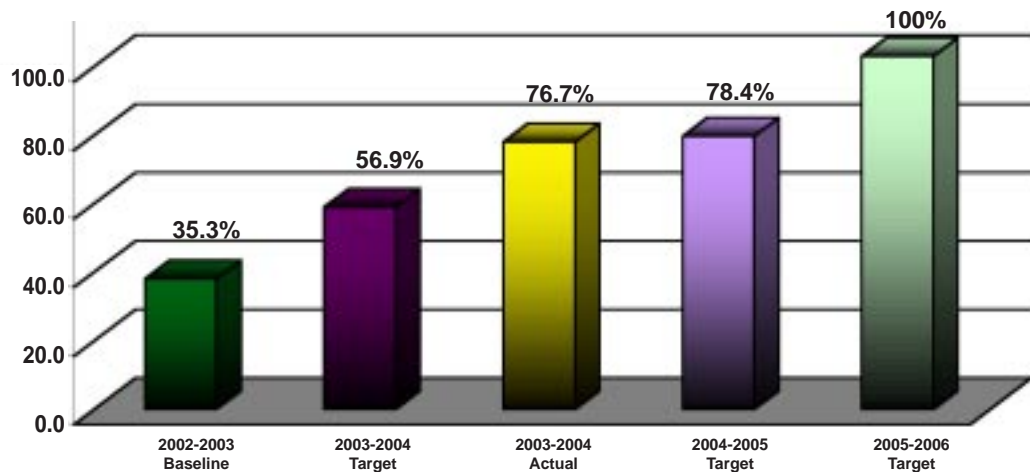


Percent of Highly Qualified Teachers Teaching Core Subjects

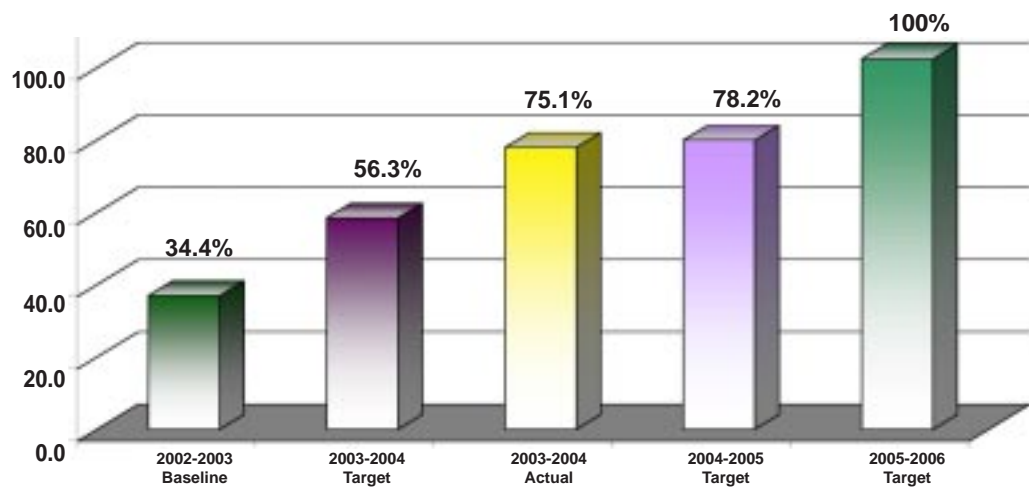

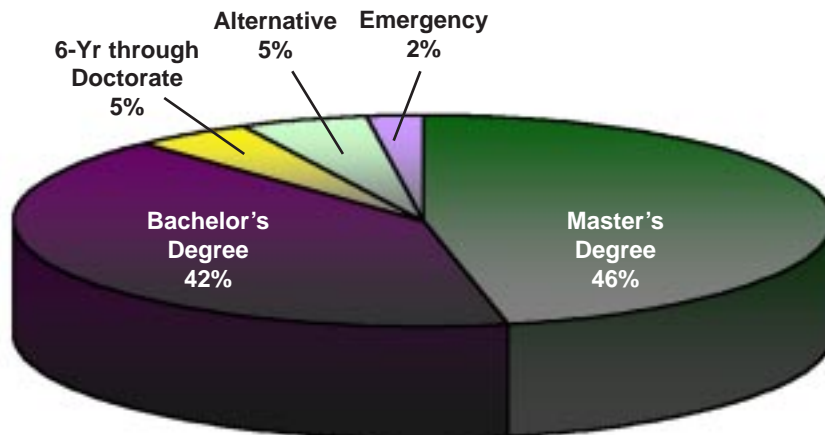

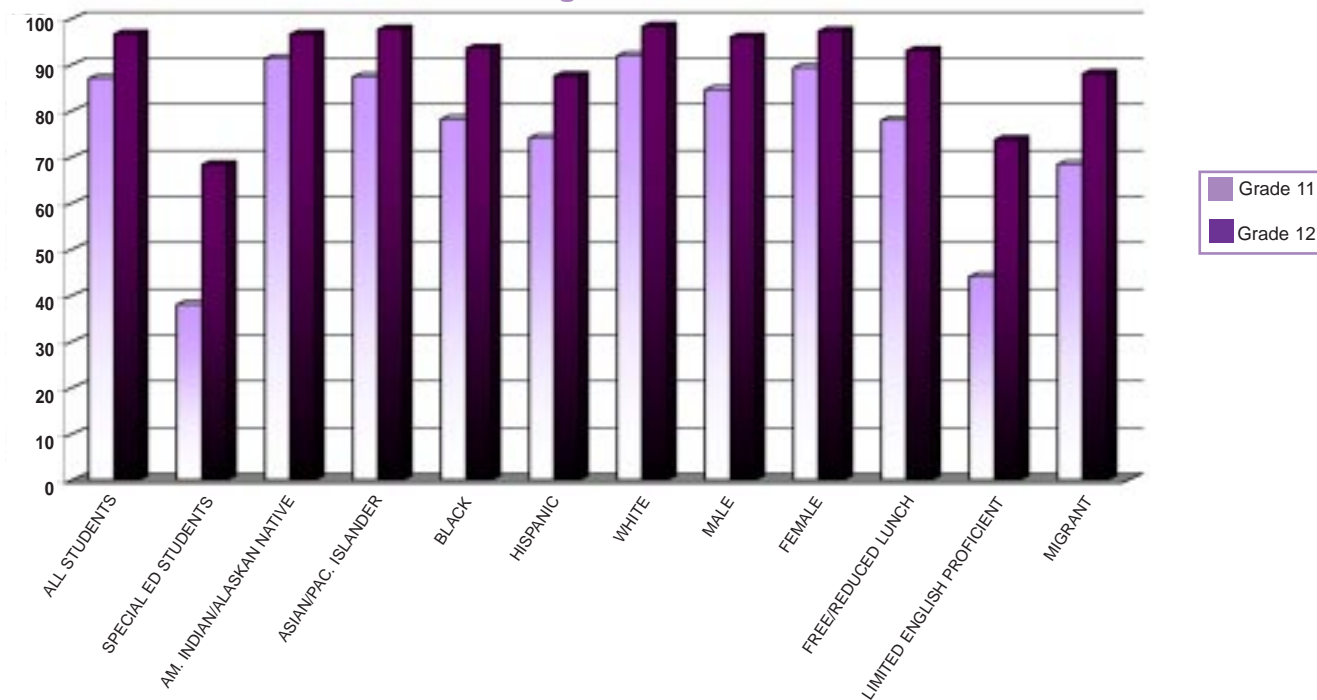

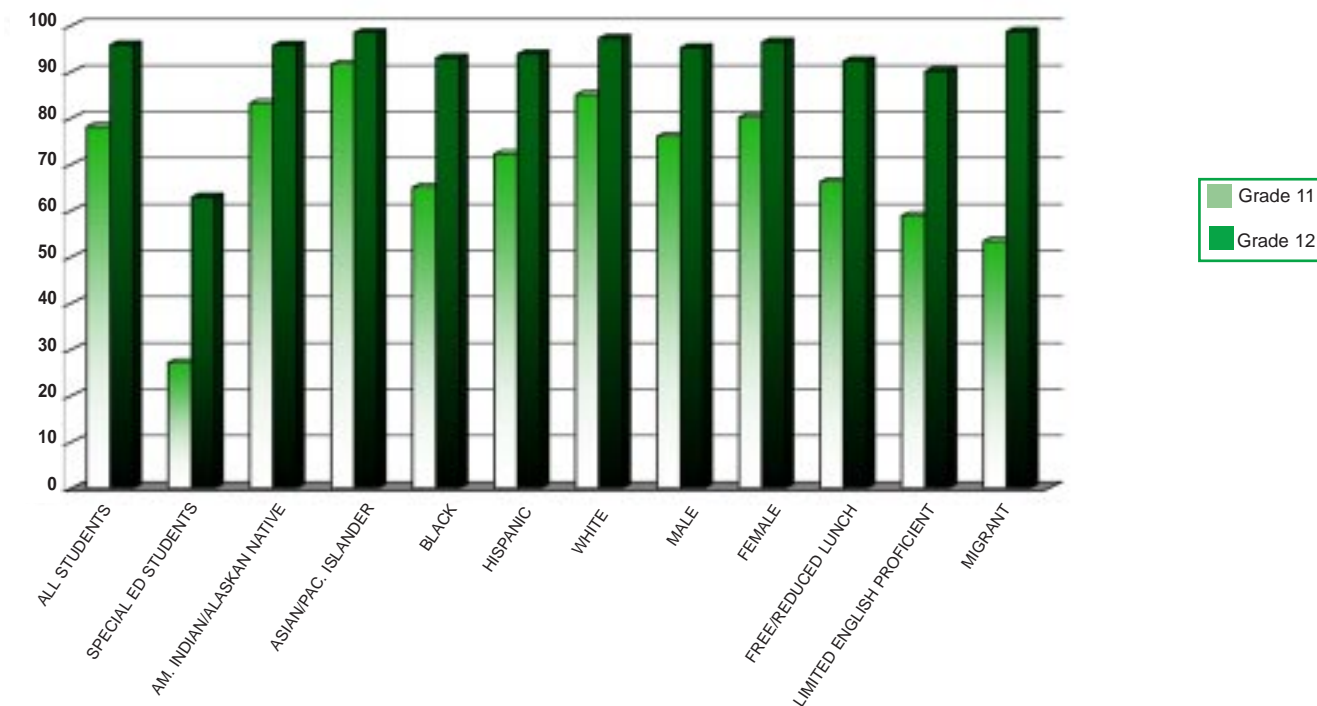

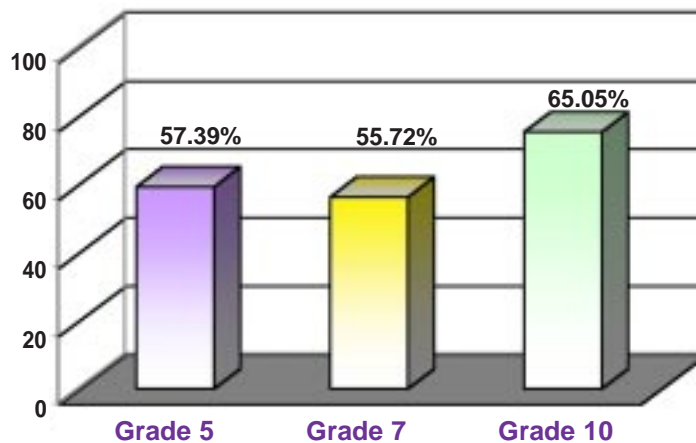

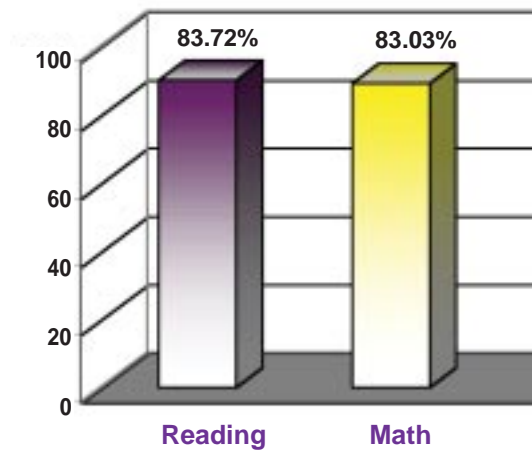

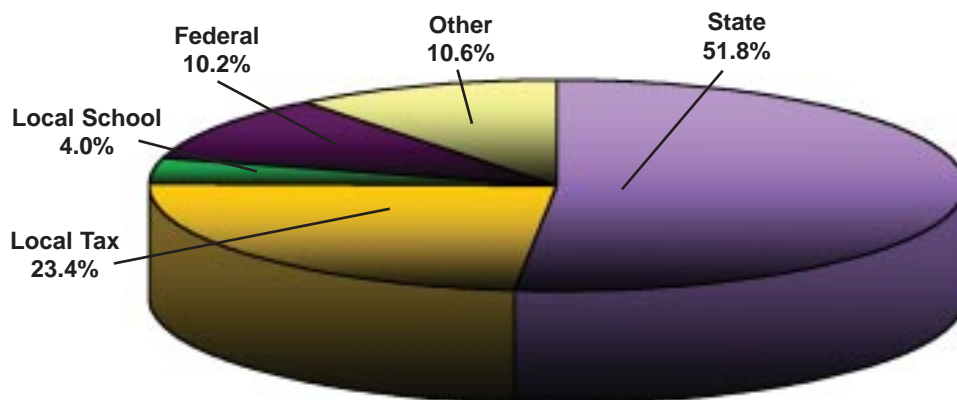
Percent of Students Meeting or Exceeding Standards



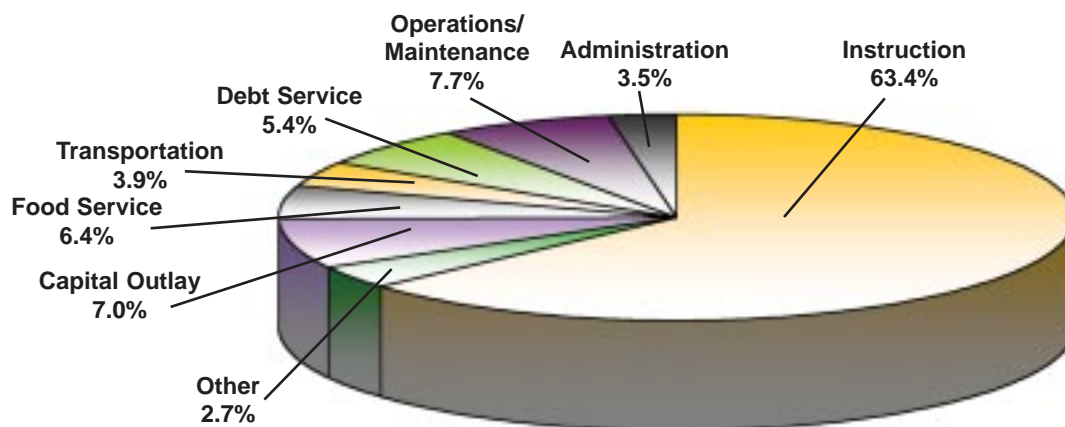

$$(.96)*(.875)*(.983)*(.9) = .743$$

(c) **Subtract from 1.000:** $1.000-.743 = .257$
