## Highlights

This report describes the characteristics of the 100 largest public elementary and secondary school districts in the United States and its jurisdictions. These districts are defined as the 100 largest according to the size of their student population. The information in this report was provided by state education agency officials to the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) for inclusion in the Common Core of Data (CCD). The report uses data from the 2003–04 school year and includes student membership and staff in public schools and school districts in the 50 states, Puerto Rico, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Department of Defense, and the four outlying areas (American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Marianas, and the U.S. Virgin Islands).<sup>1</sup> This report also includes graduate counts for the 2002–03 school year and revenues and expenditures for fiscal year (FY) 2003.

Highlights of the report include the following:

- The 100 largest public school districts, representing less than 1 percent (0.6 percent) of all school districts in the United States and jurisdictions, were responsible for the education of 23 percent of all public school students (table 1).
- The 100 largest public school districts employed 22 percent of the United States and jurisdictions' public school teachers and contained 17 percent of all public schools and 20 percent of public high school completers (table 1).
- The 100 largest public school districts had larger average school enrollments compared to the average for all school districts (697 vs. 503). In addition to larger school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also had a slightly higher median pupil/teacher ratio than the average school district (15.8 vs. 15.2) (table 1).
- Three states—California, Florida, and Texas—accounted for 41 percent of the 100 largest public school districts (table D-3).
- The percentage of students in the 100 largest public school districts who were other than White, non-Hispanic was 70 percent, compared to 43 percent of students in all school districts (table 2).
- Among schools that reported free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, 47 percent of the students in the 100 largest public school districts were eligible for free and reduced-price lunch, compared to 37 percent of all students in reporting states and jurisdictions (table 2).
- In FY 2003, current expenditures per pupil in the 100 largest public school districts ranged from a low of \$4,413 in Alpine School District, Utah to a high of \$17,652 in Newark City, New Jersey (table A-14).

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### Introduction

The purpose of this publication is to provide basic descriptive information about the 100 largest school districts (ranked by student membership, that is, the number of students enrolled at the beginning of the school year) for the 2003–04 school year in the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Department of Defense, and the four outlying areas (American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Marianas, and the U.S. Virgin Islands). In this report, the term "United States and jurisdictions" refers to these entities. This is different from most National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) reports, which include only the 50 states and the District of Columbia in the totals.

Almost one in four public school students in the United States and jurisdictions is served by one of the 100 largest school districts (table 1). These districts are distinct from all school districts by characteristics other than just the size of their membership, such as average school size, median pupil/teacher ratio, and minority enrollment as a proportion of total enrollment (tables 1 and 2).

In this report, the terms "public school districts," "school districts," and "regular schools districts" are used interchangeably. These districts are a subset of local education agencies (LEAs), which include regular school districts; local supervisory unions that provide management services for a group of associated school districts; regional education service agencies that typically provide school districts with research, testing, and data processing services; state and federally operated agencies; and other agencies that do not fall into these groupings (e.g., charter schools reported as their own school districts). A "regular school district" is an agency responsible for providing free public education for school-age children residing within its jurisdiction. All of the 100 largest districts are regular school districts.

Information about the characteristics listed above is found in the tables that accompany this report. To establish a meaningful context for the information on the 100 largest districts, four tables in this section (tables 1–4) provide national data and data for the 100 largest school districts; tables 1 and 2 also include

data for the 500 largest districts. Appendix A presents basic data tables. Appendix D (tables D-1 to D-4) provides supplementary information about the 100 and 500 largest districts and the 100 largest school districts in 1993–94. Table D-1 lists the 500 largest school districts with some identifying information. Table D-2 is an alphabetic list of the 500 largest districts that includes their rank by membership size. Table D-3 provides a count of the number of 100 largest districts by state. Table D-4 provides selected data for the 100 largest school districts in the 1993–94 school year for comparison with the 2003–04 school year. In all tables, with the exception of tables D-2 and D-3, districts are presented in decreasing order of membership size.

### **Overview of the 100 Largest School Districts**


In the 2003–04 school year, there were 17,512 public school districts, 98,213 public schools, and over 49.3 million students in public schools in the United States and jurisdictions (table 1). Additionally, there were over 3.1 million full-time-equivalent (FTE) teachers in the 2003–04 school year and over 2.8 million high school completers in the 2002–03 school year.<sup>2</sup> The 100 largest school districts comprised less than 1 percent of all public school districts but served 23 percent of all public elementary and secondary students. These school districts contained 17 percent of all public schools and employed 22 percent of all FTE teachers. In comparison, the 500 largest school districts comprised 3 percent of all public school districts, comprised 32 percent of public schools, and served 43 percent (21.3 million) of all public elementary and secondary students in the United States and jurisdictions.

The 100 largest school districts ranged in size from 46,594 to 1,023,674 students in 2003–04 (table A-1). Twenty-seven of these districts served over 100,000 students. The largest public school district was New York City Public Schools, New York, with 1,023,674 students enrolled in 1,225 schools. The next largest was the Los Angeles Unified district, California, with 747,009 students in 693 schools. The enrollment of each of these two largest districts was greater than the enrollment of each of 28 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, each of the four outlying areas, the Bureau of Indian Affairs schools, and the Department of Defense schools.<sup>3</sup>

## Where Were the 100 Largest School Districts?

There were 32 states and jurisdictions that each had at least one of the 100 largest school districts in the 2003–04 school year (figure 1, table A-1, and table D-3). Texas had 15 districts among the 100 largest, and California and Florida had 13 each. Several other states had more than one district represented among the 100 largest: Georgia and Maryland each had 6; North Carolina had 5; Tennessee, Utah, and Virginia each had 4; Colorado and Louisiana each had 3; and Arizona, Nevada, and Ohio each had 2. Each of the following states had one school district among the 100 largest: Alabama, Alaska, the District of Columbia, Hawaii, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, Washington, and Wisconsin. (The District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico have only one school district each for their entire jurisdiction.)

About three-quarters of the 100 largest school districts were located in coastal and Gulf Coast states (see table D-3 for a count of the 100 largest districts by state). The school districts among the 100 largest also tended to be in cities and counties with large populations, with administrative offices typically located in large cities and their environs. Many of the districts were in states where the school districts have the same boundaries as counties. However, school district boundaries need not be the same as county, city, or town boundaries.

## How Did the 100 Largest School Districts Compare With All School Districts?

### **General Characteristics**

In the 2003–04 school year, each of the 100 largest school districts had at least 46,594 students, whereas 73 percent of all regular school districts had fewer than 2,500 students (tables 3 and A-1). However, these smaller districts served only 17 percent of all students; 83 percent of students were enrolled in districts of 2,500 or more students (table 3).

The average school district in the United States and jurisdictions had 5.6 schools; in comparison, the 100 largest school districts averaged 161.8 schools per district (derived from table 1). Two of the three largest districts—New York City Public Schools, New York, and the Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico—each had over 1,200 schools (table A-1).

#### **School Characteristics**

Average school size ranges from a low of 375 students (in Seattle, Washington) to a high of 1,373 (in Gwinnett County School District, Georgia) in the 100 largest school districts in the 2003–04 school year (table A-2). The largest school in the 100 largest districts, and also one of the two largest regular schools in the United States, was the 5,299-student Belmont Senior High, Los Angeles Unified District, California.<sup>4</sup>

The 100 largest school districts had more students per school than the average school district (697 vs. 503) (table 1). Ten of the 100 largest school districts had an average regular school<sup>5</sup> size of over 1,000 students (table A-2). In addition to larger school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also had a higher median pupil/teacher ratio than the average school district (15.8 to 1 vs. 15.2 to 1) (table 1). Among the 100 largest public school districts, Jordan School District, Utah, had the highest median pupil/teacher ratio (25 to 1) and Newark City, New Jersey, had the smallest (12.1 to 1) (table A-3). The pupil/teacher ratio for primary schools in the 100 largest districts was lower than that for high schools (16.4 to 1 vs. 17.8 to 1).

Of the 15,891 schools with membership in the 100 largest public school districts, 9,959 were primary schools, 2,471 were middle schools, 2,240 were high schools, and 1,221 were schools with other instructional levels (table A-4). The Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico—which had the most schools with membership in total—had the largest number of primary (833) and other instructional level (301) schools of the 100 largest public school districts, whereas New York City Public Schools, New York, had the largest number of middle (207) and high schools (195).

*School staff.* At the national level, 51 percent of staff were teachers (Hoffman and Sable 2006),<sup>6</sup> while in the 100 largest districts 53 percent of staff were teachers (table A-5). Sixty-six of the 100 largest districts reported that 50 percent or more of staff were teachers, and 7 districts reported that 60 percent or more of staff were teachers, tube, Chesterfield County Public Schools, Virginia; City of Chicago School District, Illinois; Clark County School District, Nevada; Greenville County School District, South Carolina; New York City Public Schools, New York; San Francisco Unified, California). Twenty of the 100 largest school districts had 1 percent or more of their staff assigned as LEA administrators.

*Title I participation*. Ninety-nine of the 100 largest school districts reported data for Title I eligible schools and programs for the 2003–04 school year (table A-6). The percentage of Title I eligible schools in these 99 districts ranged from 6 percent (in Jordan School District, Utah) to 99 percent (in the Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico). Within the districts that reported Title I data, 53 percent of students attended a Title I eligible school, compared to 50 percent of students nationally (Hoffman and Sable 2006). Also, the percentages of students in Title I eligible schools in the 100 largest school districts ranged from 4 percent (in Jordan School District, Utah) to 100 percent (in Aldine Independent School District, Texas).

*Charter schools and magnet schools.* There were 602 charter schools administered by the 100 largest school districts in the 2003–04 school year (table A-7). This number does not include charter schools that are independent of the school district.<sup>7</sup> Almost 2 percent of the students in these districts attended one of these charter schools. In the 50 states and the District of Columbia, there were 3,181 charter schools attended by 2 percent of students in 2003–04 (Hoffman and Sable 2006). The largest number of charter schools administered by a district (120) was in the Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico (table A-7). In 58 of the 100 largest districts reporting magnet school data, there were 1,017 magnet schools. The largest number of magnet schools was in the City of Chicago School District, with 312 magnet schools (or 49 percent of its schools and 55 percent of its students in magnet schools).

#### Student Body

Overall, the 100 largest school districts in 2003–04 had 23 percent of the United States and jurisdictions' public school students (table 1). The 100 largest school districts were not homogeneous, and certain student characteristics, such as race/ethnicity, poverty level, and disability status varied across the districts.

*Race/ethnicity.* American Indians/Alaska Natives, Asians/Pacific Islanders, Hispanics, non-Hispanic Blacks, and non-Hispanic Whites are the five racial/ethnic groups about which the CCD collects data. In 63 of the 100 largest districts, non-Hispanic Whites comprised less than 50 percent of student membership (table A-8). The 100 largest school districts served 40 percent of the 19.9 million public school students in the United States and jurisdictions who are other than White, non-Hispanic, compared to serving 12 percent of the 28.3 million students in the U.S. and jurisdictions who are White, non-Hispanic (derived from tables 1 and 2).<sup>8</sup> In more than one-third (36) of the 96 districts among the 100 largest districts for which racial/ethnic data were available, students who were other than White, non-Hispanic comprised more than 75 percent of the student membership (table A-8). Eight of the 10 largest school districts had other than White, non-Hispanic student memberships of at least this size.

Even with the relatively high other than White, non-Hispanic membership in the 100 largest school districts, 33 of the 96 districts with racial/ethnic data reported 50 percent or more of their students as White, non-Hispanic (table A-8). In 6 of these 33 districts, at least 75 percent of students were White, non-Hispanic. In 18 of the 96 districts, half or more of the membership was Black, non-Hispanic. Nineteen districts reported that the majority of students were Hispanic; 4 of these were among the 10 largest districts (table A-9). In Hawaii, a one-district state, and the San Francisco Unified District, California, the majority of students were Asian/Pacific Islander.

*Free and reduced-price lunch participation.* The 100 largest school districts had a disproportionate percentage of students eligible for the free and reduced-price lunch program relative to all public school districts. Among schools that reported free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, 47 percent of students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible, compared with 37 percent of students in all districts (table 2). Among the 94 of the 100 largest school districts that reported data on free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, 42 districts reported 50 percent or more of their students as eligible for the free and reduced-price lunch program (table A-9).

*Students with disabilities.* Approximately 1.3 million students in the 100 largest school districts had Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) (table A-10). Students with IEPs made up 12 percent of all students in these districts, slightly lower than the percentage for the United States and jurisdictions as a whole (14 percent) (Hoffman and Sable 2006). In the largest school district reporting IEP data, Los Angeles Unified, California, 11 percent (or 85,441 students) had IEPs. About 3 percent of the schools in the 100 largest school districts were special education schools (derived from table A-11).

*English language learner (ELL) and migrant students.* In the 92 largest school districts for which data were available, over 1.3 million ELL students were served in 2003–04, or about 12 percent of all students in these districts (table A-12). Data on the number of migrant students enrolled in the previous school year were available for 88 of the 100 largest public school districts; the number of migrant students ranged from 0 in some districts to 13,725 students in the Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico.

*High school completers*. The number of 2002–03 high school completers in the 100 largest school districts ranged from 1,617 (in Oakland Unified, California) to 39,539 (in New York City Public Schools, New York) (table A-13). The averaged freshman graduation rate<sup>9</sup> was 69 percent for the 100 largest school districts in 2002–03. This ranged from a low of 39 percent (in New York City Public Schools, New York) to a high of nearly 100 percent (in San Juan Unified, California).

### Revenues and Expenditures for Fiscal Year (FY) 2003

In the 2002–03 school year (FY 2003), the 100 largest school districts received over \$99 billion for public elementary and secondary education (table A-14). Of this \$99 billion, 30 percent (\$30 billion) went to the 5 largest school districts (New York City Public Schools, New York; Los Angeles Unified, California; Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico; City of Chicago School District, Illinois; and Dade County School District, Florida). Across the 100 largest districts, state sources accounted for 47 percent of revenues, local sources for 43 percent, and federal sources for 10 percent (table A-15). Revenues from the federal government received by the 100 largest school districts constituted between 3 percent (in the Plano Independent School District, Texas) and 31 percent (in the Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico) of all revenues to the district.

The two largest school districts, New York City Public Schools, New York, and Los Angeles Unified, California, spent a little more than 1 out of every 5 current expenditure dollars spent by the 100 largest school districts (table A-14). The percentage of total current expenditures spent on instruction ranged from 52 percent (in Jefferson County, Colorado) to 78 percent (in New York City Public Schools, New York) in the 100 largest school districts (table A-15).

Current expenditures per pupil in FY 2003 ranged from \$4,413 (in the Alpine School District, Utah) to \$17,652 (in Newark City, New Jersey) in the 100 largest school districts in FY 2003 (table A-14). (See appendix C for definitions of specific revenues and expenditures.)

*Expenditures for charter and private schools.* Payments by, or on behalf of, public school districts to independent charter schools and private schools are not included in the expenditures in this report. In some states these payments are made by some entity other than the public school district, and are therefore not reported on the School District Finance Survey. Information on expenditures for independent charter schools and private schools, for those school districts reporting these expenditures, can be found on the Build a Table application at <a href="http://nces.ed.gov/ccd/bat/">http://nces.ed.gov/ccd/bat/</a>.

## Changes in the 100 Largest School Districts Between 1993 and 2003

While there has been considerable change in rank by size within the 100 largest school districts over time, the lists of school districts in 1993–94 and 2003–04 are similar. Only 9 of the 100 largest school districts in 1993–94 were not among the 100 largest school districts in 2003–04 (see table D-4 for a list of the 100 largest school districts in 1993–94).<sup>10</sup>

Between 1993–94 and 2003–04, the number of students in the 100 largest school districts increased by 11 percent, the number of teachers increased by 43 percent, and the number of schools increased by 12 percent (table 4). However, while the numbers of students, teachers, and schools increased between these years, the proportion of the national total these numbers represent was essentially unchanged. For example, the 100 largest school districts included 23 percent of all students in both 1993–94 and 2003–04.

## Appendix A—Basic Tables

**Table A-1** presents basic data such as the number of students receiving educational services, full-timeequivalent (FTE) teachers, 2002–03 completers, and number of schools for each of the 100 largest school districts. Also shown is information to fully identify each school district by its city, state, and county, since the name of the district is not always sufficient for this purpose. In this and all of the other basic tables, the districts are shown in descending order of size (students in membership as of October 2003). Since the districts are displayed by the number of students, it is easy to note differences in the numbers of teachers, high school completers, and schools as they relate to districts of similar size. For example, the Fairfax County Public Schools, Virginia, though smaller in size, has more high school completers than the seven districts immediately preceding it.

Tables A-2, A-3, A-4, A-8, A-9, and A-12 include only schools with student membership (or regular schools with students, as specified in table A-2).

**Table A-2** provides information on school characteristics in the 100 largest school districts by displaying school size (students in membership) at different percentile levels, as well as mean school size for each district (computed using regular schools having membership). For example, in New York City Public Schools, New York, the table shows that the smallest 25 percent of schools have student memberships of 458 or less, while the largest 25 percent have student memberships of 1,020 or more. Dividing all the students in regular schools in the district by the number of such schools yields a mean, or average, size of 841.1 students. If all the regular schools in New York City Public Schools were listed by size, the school at the midpoint on the list (the median) would have 676 pupils in membership.

**Table A-3** presents median pupil/teacher ratios for the schools in the 100 largest school districts by instructional level. Since teacher counts by school were not available for Tennessee and the New York City Public Schools, New York, no pupil/teacher ratio could be calculated for these districts (Seminole County, Florida, was not computed because data were missing for more than 20 percent of schools).

**Table A-4** answers the question of how many "primary," "middle," and "high" schools there are in the 100 largest school districts. Since nearly every possible grade span is found among the schools in the 100 largest districts, grade spans are defined on the basis of the combination of the school's lowest and highest grade offered. The following four categories are used: *primary* (lowest grade of prekindergarten to 3; highest grade up to 8), *middle* (lowest grade 4 to 7; highest grade 4 to 9), *high* (lowest grade 7 to 12; highest grade 12), and *other* (all other configurations, including PK, K, or 1 to 12).

**Table A-5** presents the different types of staff in each district. Teachers represented the largest proportion of staff. "Other staff," which made up 29 percent of the total, is defined in the appendix C—Glossary.

**Table A-6** reports the number and percentage of Title I eligible schools, the percentage of students in Title I eligible schools, and the percentage of students in Title I school-wide programs. The 2003–04 school year was the sixth year the CCD collected this Title I information. Not all states were able to report this information. The percentage of schools that were Title I eligible (in districts that provided the information) varied widely, from 6 to 99 percent.

**Table A-7** reports data items that were added in the 1998–99 school year: magnet and charter schools. Among the 100 largest school districts, seventy-nine were in states that reported the number of magnet schools or reported that magnet schools did not exist in that state. All districts in states that had charter schools reported the number of charter schools administered by that district. Many charter schools

function as their own school districts, which is why a number of the districts in this report do not report any charter schools.

**Table A-8** gives the number of schools in each district in five ranges of percentage of other than White, non-Hispanic student membership, as well as the overall percentage of other than White, non-Hispanic student membership in each district. For example, in 8,346 schools, more than 80 percent of students were other than White, non-Hispanic. Across all of the 100 largest school districts, 70 percent of students were other than White, non-Hispanic.

Whereas table A-8 deals with the number of schools in each district that have at least one student whose race is other than White, non-Hispanic, **table A-9** presents the percentage of students in each district by specific racial/ethnic categories. This table illustrates that some school districts are made up of many other than White, non-Hispanic groups while others have high concentrations of one other than White, non-Hispanic group. For example, in Los Angeles Unified, California, 73 percent of students are Hispanic and 12 percent are Black, non-Hispanic, whereas in the New York Public Schools, New York, the other than White, non-Hispanic population is more evenly divided between Hispanic and Black, non-Hispanic students (38 and 34 percent, respectively), among other racial/ethnic groups.

Also shown in table A-9 is the percentage of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch. Responses in this data category were available for 94 of the 100 largest districts. Among these districts, the percentages of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch under the National School Lunch Program varied greatly.

**Table A-10** presents the numbers of students assigned to the schools in the 100 largest school districts. It should be noted that students attending a "non-regular" school (i.e., special education, vocational education, and other or alternative education school) are often counted at their regular home school rather than the school they attend part of the day. The number and percentage of students having Individualized Education Programs (IEPs), in accordance with the Individuals With Disabilities Education Act, Part B, is also shown in table A-10. Except for IEP data, the student counts presented in this table are aggregated from the school level and may differ from counts presented elsewhere in this report that are derived from the school district level. For example, student counts from the district level could include students enrolled in the district but not assigned to a school (e.g., hospitalized or homebound students).

**Table A-11** presents the number of schools in the 100 largest districts by type of school. All but three of the districts have specialized schools devoted to special, vocational, or alternative education. This table also includes schools that do not have students. Schools may not have students for a variety of reasons, the most common being that the school serves a student population that is counted at another school. For example, students with dual enrollment in a regular school and a vocational education school would be counted in only one of these schools.

**Table A-12** reports the number and percentage of migrant and summer migrant students, as well as the number and percentage of English language learners (ELL, formerly known as limited English proficient, or LEP). Eighty-eight of the 100 largest school districts reported the number of migrant students enrolled in the previous year.

**Table A-13** presents the number of high school completers (regular diploma recipients and other completers) in the 100 largest school districts in 2002–03. Note that high school completers are reported on the CCD agency file for the previous year (e.g., 2002–03 high school completers are reported on the 2003–04 agency file). This table also presents the averaged freshman graduation rate (using diploma recipients only) for each district for 2003–04 (see appendix B—Methodology for a discussion of the calculation of the averaged freshman graduation rate).

**Table A-14** deals with school district revenues and expenditures and is based on fiscal year 2003 (school year 2002–03) local government financial data collected by the Governments Division of the U.S. Census Bureau. It presents the amount of revenue received by source (local, state, and federal); current expenditures and those current expenditures for instruction; and current expenditures per pupil in membership for fiscal year 2003. Data for Puerto Rico were obtained from the CCD National Public Education Financial Survey (NPEFS).

Whereas table A-14 deals with the dollar amounts of revenues and expenditures, **table A-15** presents the percentages of revenues by source as well as the percentage of current expenditures spent on instruction. For example, the 100 largest school districts received 47 percent of their revenues from state sources and spent 63 percent of their current expenditures on instruction.

In **table A-16**, data are given on the number of students assigned to graded (three categories) and ungraded levels. In accounting for their students, 67 of the 100 largest districts assigned all of their students to numbered grades and 33 used the ungraded status for some students in some settings, such as special education, vocational education, and other specialized or alternative education programs. In this table, students assigned to all types of schools are counted in the grade for which they are reported. The student counts presented in this table are aggregated from the school level, and may differ from counts presented elsewhere in this report that are derived from the school district level. For example, student counts from the district level could include students enrolled in the district but not assigned to a school (e.g., hospitalized or homebound students).

### Appendix B—Methodology

The source of the data for this report is the 2003–04 Common Core of Data (CCD). Information was reported to NCES by state education agencies in the spring of 2004. There are three nonfiscal CCD surveys that collect basic descriptive data on public education in the nation: the school survey (Public School Universe Survey), local education agency survey (Local Education Agency Universe Survey), and state survey (State Nonfiscal Survey). Fiscal CCD data are gathered at the state level by NCES in the National Public Education Financial Survey (NPEFS) and at the local level in the Annual Survey of Local Government Finances (F-33 series of the Census of Local Governments) conducted by the Governments Division of the U.S. Census Bureau. The most recent fiscal year for which data are available is 2003. Puerto Rico fiscal data were taken from the fiscal year 2003 NPEFS.

CCD data are provided by a CCD Coordinator in each of the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Department of Defense, and four outlying areas (American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, and the U.S. Virgin Islands). Data for all of these states and jurisdictions are included in this report. If a data item is marked "data not available," it indicates the state or jurisdiction did not report the data item in its CCD submission.

Districts represented in this report have various sizes and geographic locations. The District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico are each administered as one school district. Some districts comprise a substantial portion of a state's total student membership, while others make up only a small fraction of membership.

#### Data Quality

CCD data are reported by state education agencies (SEAs) for individual schools and districts within the state, as well as for the state as a whole. Staff at NCES and its collection agent, the U.S. Census Bureau, work with the SEAs to clean and edit the data. State CCD coordinators correct or confirm any numbers that are challenged in the NCES edits. NCES accepts the states' responses to these edit questions; however, in a limited number of situations, if the SEA does not provide NCES with the explanation or new data for an item, NCES will suppress or edit the data.

NCES challenges SEA data under several circumstances. Some examples of edits include numbers appearing out of range when compared to national averages, the previous year's data, or internal state reports. If a response is logically impossible—for example, reporting "Title I School status" as "not applicable" when "yes" or "no" are the only possible answers—NCES will consult with the state and replace the response with a logically acceptable alternative. As another example of an edit, if a reported total is less than the sum of the detail comprising that total, the total will be changed to the sum of the detail. Missing data at the state level are imputed to support reporting national totals for the reporting year. Data may also be adjusted for confidentiality.

#### Item Nonresponse

Some items were not available at the school district level. The following items describe nonresponse in the CCD school and agency universe surveys that affected the information presented in this report:

- no teacher counts at the school level for Tennessee and New York City Public Schools, New York;
- no data on race/ethnicity or free and reduced-price lunch eligibility for Tennessee;

- no Individualized Education Program (IEP) data for New York City Public Schools, New York;
- no school-year or summer migrant data for Maryland, New York, Tennessee, and Washington, and no summer migrant data for Ohio and Texas; and
- no English language learner (ELL) data for Illinois, New York, Pennsylvania, Puerto Rico, or Tennessee.

#### High School Completers and Averaged Freshman Graduation Rate

This report presents counts of high school completers and an averaged freshman graduation rate. The term "high school completer" includes both diploma recipients and other high school completers, but not high school equivalency recipients. The averaged freshman graduation rate only includes diploma recipients; it does not include other high school completers or those receiving a GED-based equivalency credential.

#### Diploma Recipients

These are individuals who are awarded, in a given year, a high school diploma or a diploma that recognizes some equivalent level of academic achievement. They can be thought of as students who meet or exceed the coursework and performance standards for high school completion established by the state or other relevant authorities.

#### **Other High School Completers**

These individuals receive a certificate of attendance or some other credential in lieu of a diploma. Students awarded this credential typically meet requirements that differ from those for a high school diploma. Some states do not issue an "other high school completion" type of certificate, but award all students who complete school a diploma regardless of what academic requirements the students have met. In order to make data as comparable as possible across states, this report includes both regular and other diploma recipients in its total number of high school completers. High school equivalency recipients are not included.

#### Exclusion of High School Equivalency Recipients

High school equivalency recipients are awarded a credential certifying that they have met state or district requirements for high school completion by passing an examination or completing some other performance requirement. High school equivalency diplomas are considered valid completion credentials, but high school equivalency recipients are not included in the total number of completers, for two reasons. First, high school equivalency recipients are reported on the CCD only at the state level and cannot be disaggregated to the district level. Second, not all states report high school equivalency counts on the CCD, and the statistic is therefore not comparable across states.

### Averaged Freshman Graduation Rate (AFGR)

The averaged freshman graduation rate provides an estimate of the percentage of high school students who graduate on time (i.e., within 4 years of entering 9<sup>th</sup> grade for the first time). The rate uses aggregate student enrollment data (to estimate the size of an incoming freshman class) and aggregate counts of the number of diplomas awarded 4 years later. The incoming freshman class size is estimated by summing the enrollment in 8<sup>th</sup> grade in one year, 9<sup>th</sup> grade for the next year, and 10<sup>th</sup> grade for the year after and then dividing by three. The averaging is intended to account for higher grade retentions in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade

compared with 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grades. Ungraded students reported to the CCD were prorated into the individual grade enrollment counts.

Thus,

#### More Information on CCD Methodology

For more information on CCD school and agency universe surveys and response rates, see *Public Elementary and Secondary Students, Staff, Schools, and School Districts: School Year 2003–04* (Hoffman and Sable 2006). This report discusses missing data and data quality, and presents state totals for CCD data items from the school and agency surveys. It includes state-idiosyncratic treatment of charter and magnet schools as well as schools and districts with no student membership.

## Appendix C—Glossary

**alternative education school**—A public elementary/secondary school that (1) addresses needs of students that typically cannot be met in a regular school, (2) provides nontraditional education, (3) serves as an adjunct to a regular school, or (4) falls outside the categories of regular, special education, or vocational education.

American Indian/Alaska Native—A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

Asian/Pacific Islander—A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands. This includes, for example, China, India, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, and Samoa.

**averaged freshman graduation rate (AFGR)**—An estimate of the percentage of an entering high school class that graduates on time. See Appendix B—Methodology for more information.

Black—A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.

**Bureau of Indian Affairs schools and districts**—A school or district that is directly funded by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, U.S. Department of the Interior.

**charter school**—A school that provides free public elementary and/or secondary education to eligible students under a specific charter granted by the state legislature or other appropriate authority, and designated by such authority to be a charter school. Charter schools can be administered by regular school districts, state education agencies, or chartering organizations. They are reported on the CCD by the type of district that administers them.

**current expenditures**—Funds spent operating local public schools and local education agencies, including such expenses as salaries for school personnel, student transportation, school books and materials, and energy costs, but excluding capital outlay, interest on school debt, payments to private schools, and payments to public charter schools.

**English language learner (ELL)**—an individual who (1) was not born in the United States or whose native language is a language other than English; or (2) comes from environments where a language other than English is dominant; or (3) is an American Indian or Alaska Native and who comes from environments where a language other than English has had a significant impact on their level of English language proficiency; and (3) who, by reason thereof, has sufficient difficulty speaking, reading, writing, or understanding the English language to deny such individual the opportunity to learn successfully in classrooms where the language of instruction is English or to participate fully in the larger U.S. society.

**federal revenues**—Include direct grants-in-aid to schools or agencies, funds distributed through a state or intermediate agency, and revenues in lieu of taxes to compensate a school district for nontaxable federal institutions within a district's boundary.

**free and reduced-price lunch eligible**—Number of students who are eligible for the Free and Reduced-Price Lunch Program under the National School Lunch Act. In any school that reported 100 percent eligible students, the number is adjusted to prevent the identification of any individual student. Caution should be used when interpreting these data. Three states did not report free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, and others may not have included reduced price lunch students or may have reported participation instead of eligibility data. **guidance counselors**—Professional staff assigned specific duties and school time for counseling students and parents, addressing learning problems, evaluating student abilities, and assisting students in career and personal development.

**high school completers**—Students who completed the course of public elementary and secondary education offered by the school district and who received a high school diploma, or who met other requirements of completion as defined by state law or policy during the period October 2002 through September 2003. Does not include high school equivalency recipients.

**Hispanic**—A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

**Individualized Education Program (IEP)**—As used here, refers to a written instructional plan for students with disabilities designated as special education students under the Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA, Part B). Each plan includes a (1) statement of the child's present levels of educational performance, (2) statement of annual goals, including short-term instructional objectives, (3) statement of specific educational services to be provided and the extent to which the child will be able to participate in regular educational programs, (4) projected date for initiation and anticipated duration of services, and (5) appropriate objectives, criteria, and evaluation procedures and schedules for determining, on at least an annual basis, whether instructional objectives are being achieved.

**instructional expenditures**—Current expenditures for activities directly associated with the interaction between teachers and students, including teacher salaries and benefits, supplies (such as textbooks), and purchased instructional services.

instructional support staff—Includes instructional coordinators and supervisors and instructional aides.

**library/media staff**—Professional staff members who are assigned specific duties and school time for professional library and media service activities. Includes library/media specialists and support staff.

**local education agency (LEA)**—a government agency administratively responsible for providing public elementary and/or secondary instruction or educational support services.

**local education agency (LEA) (district) administrators**—Local education agency superintendents, deputy and assistant superintendents, and other persons with district-wide responsibilities such as business managers and administrative assistants.

**local revenues**—Include revenues from such sources as local property and nonproperty taxes, investments, and student activities such as textbook sales, transportation and tuition fees, and food service revenues.

**magnet school**—Regardless of the source of funding, a magnet school or program is a special school or program designed to attract students of different racial/ethnic backgrounds for the purpose of reducing, preventing, or eliminating racial isolation and/or to provide an academic or social focus on a particular theme.

migrant students—A migrant student as defined under 34 CFR 200.81:

A. is younger than 22 (and has not graduated from high school or does not hold a high school equivalency certificate); and

- B. is a migrant agricultural worker or a migrant fisher or has a parent, spouse, or guardian who is a migrant agricultural worker or a migrant fisher; and
- C. performs, or has a parent, spouse, or guardian who performs, qualifying agricultural or fishing employment as a principal means of livelihood; and
- D. has moved within the preceding 36 months to obtain or to accompany or join a parent, spouse, or guardian to obtain, temporary or seasonal employment in agricultural or fishing work; and
- E. has moved from one school district to another; or in a state that is composed of a single school district, has moved from one administrative area to another within such district; or resides in a school district of more than 15,000 square miles, and migrates a distance of 20 miles or more to a temporary residence to engage in a fishing activity. (Provision E currently applies only to Alaska.)

**other staff**—Includes support staff for local education agencies, schools, student support services and other areas, such as data processing, health, and transportation.

outlying areas—Include: American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Marianas, and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

**per-pupil expenditures**—Current expenditures for public elementary and secondary education in a state divided by the student membership. The numbers reported here, based on membership, can be expected to be smaller than per pupil expenditures based on average daily attendance because membership counts are generally larger than average daily attendance.

public school—An institution that provides educational services and has the following characteristics:

- has one or more grade groups (prekindergarten through grade 12) or is ungraded;
- has one or more teachers to give instruction;
- is located in one or more buildings or sites;
- has an assigned administrator;
- receives public funds as primary support; and
- is operated by an education agency.

**pupil/teacher ratio**—The ratio of pupils to teachers in a school district, based on the total number of pupils (student membership) and the total full-time-equivalent (FTE) number of teachers reported in the schools associated with the school district. The pupil/teacher ratio does not represent class size, but rather is a district-level measure of pupils and teachers.

**pupils in membership**—Count of all students whose names have been entered on the roll, minus those whose names have been withdrawn, on or before the closest school day to October 1. Membership counts at the district level may include students for whom the district is providing educational services through some other agency or institution.

**regular school**—A public elementary/secondary school that does not focus primarily on vocational, special, or alternative education. It is possible for a regular school, as it is for a vocational, special, or alternative education school, to have no students in membership.

**regular school district**—Agency responsible for providing free public education for school-age children residing within its jurisdiction. This category excludes local supervisory unions that provide management services for a group of associated school districts; regional education service agencies that typically provide school districts with research, testing, and data processing services; state and federally operated school districts; and other agencies that do not fall into these groupings.

**revenues**—Additions to assets that do not incur an obligation that must be met at some future date, do not represent exchanges of fixed assets, and are available for expenditure by the local education agencies in the state. Revenues include funds from local, intermediate, state, and federal sources.

school administrators—Staff members whose activities are concerned with directing and managing the operation of a particular school.

**schools having membership**—Schools at which students are counted for administrative purposes, even though the students may attend one or more other schools for all or part of their school day.

**special education school**—A public elementary/secondary school that (1) focuses primarily on special education, including instruction for any of the following: hard of hearing, deaf, speech impaired, health impaired, orthopedically impaired, mentally retarded, seriously emotionally disturbed, multi-handicapped, visually handicapped, deaf and blind; and (2) adapts curriculum, materials, or instruction for students served.

**state revenues**—Includes both direct funds from state governments and funds in lieu of taxation. Revenues in lieu of taxes are paid to compensate a school district for nontaxable state institutions or facilities within the district's boundary.

**teacher**—A professional school staff member who instructs students and maintains daily student attendance records.

**Title I school**—A Title I school is a school designated under appropriate state and federal regulations as being high poverty and eligible for participation in programs authorized by Title I of P.L. 107-110.

**Title I school-wide**—A program in which all the students in a school are designated under appropriate state and federal regulations as eligible for participation in programs authorized by Title I of P.L. 107-110.

**vocational education school**—A public elementary/secondary school that focuses primarily on vocational, technical, or career education, and provides education and training in one or more semiskilled or technical occupations.

**White**—A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East.
