Conducting research to inform the education policy process

- Analyzing labor markets for teachers, using household surveys to determine compensation optimality
- Developing tools and techniques for analyzing productivity of various inputs in the education sector (e.g., "production function" analysis)
- Carrying out macrolevel efficiency and equity analysis to inform funding and management reforms
- Analyzing schooling and vocationaleducation costs to develop funding norms for subnational governments, as well as schools and colleges

- Carrying out comparative international analyses to provide countries with information about their relative standing on achievement and equity issues
- Providing assistance to government and nongovernmental research units to build up their own institutional and research capacity

Education (continued)

- Developing and piloting a valid set of instruments for assessing the extent to which early-grade primary-school children are learning to read with an acceptable degree of comprehension and at an acceptable rate of fluency
- Creating institutional demand for information-based decision making and accountability
- Employing the national accounts methodology, developed in the health sector, to develop a National Education Account methodology that will analyze the flow of funds from financing sources to education inputs
- Supporting dialogue and assessment to create demand for change and improvement while paying explicit attention to the political environment and perceived obstacles to education reform
- With RTI's Information Communication and Technology program, developing education management and geographic information systems and embedding them within education management systems

Facilitating and enabling participation

- Increasing stakeholder participation in system management to build analytic capacity and effective demand for information at each level
- Creating opportunities for local assessment and dialogue, embedding them in institutional policies and processes, and demonstrating their value and efficacy in improving education decisions
- Promoting diversification of education provision through public-private partnerships and strategies, including privately funded and administered schools
- Using multimedia tools to educate and empower youth and adults
- Using information systems, media, and other communications tools and processes to respond to demands, inform choices, and support dialogue

Facilitating decentralization

- With RTI's Center for Democratic Governance, analyzing public policy and decision making, assisting in the improvement of governance systems, emphasizing broad participation and accountability
- With RTI's Public Finance and Economic Growth program, supporting the planning and implementation of decentralized finance and administration policies, practices, and mechanisms

- Developing planning mechanisms for school grants and school improvements to encourage effective school autonomy and decentralization
- Providing support and training to parental governing bodies

Establishing and using education standards as a research, management, and accountability tool

- Developing standards of input provision to facilitate dialogue about the fairness and efficiency of allocation of schooling inputs
- Developing norms and standards for education funding from national to subnational levels and from subnational to school levels
- Analyzing learning results data to promote better teaching
- Promoting simple standards for reading achievement to support policy dialogue and parental empowerment
