

This special edition of the KOS contains information based on the 2007 and 2008 Annual Institutional Reports (AIR) submitted by ACICS-accredited institutions. The AIR is submitted on September 15 each year by ACICS-accredited institutions. It reflects activity during a reporting year that begins on July 1 and concludes on June 30. With each submission of the AIR, accredited institutions provide a comprehensive back-up list used during on-site evaluation visits to verify the accuracy of the data submitted.

We look forward to working with our member institutions in the coming year to strengthen educational outcomes and to ensure that a top-quality education is given to all students enrolled at ACICS-accredited institutions.

ABOUT ACICS

ACICS, the Accrediting Council for Independent Colleges and Schools is an independent, national, institutional accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA). ACICS accredits over 650 institutions in this country and abroad. The stated mission of ACICS is to advance educational excellence at independent, nonpublic career schools, colleges, and organizations in the United States and abroad. This is achieved through a deliberate and thorough accreditation process of quality assessment and enhancement as well as ethical business and educational practices whereby ACICS attempts to maintain minimum standards, policies, and procedures leading to institutional effectiveness.

Dating back to 1912, ACICS has been recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education since 1956 – just four years after the recognition process was introduced. The Secretary's recognition confirms that ACICS is a "reliable authority concerning the quality of post secondary education or training offered by educational institutions" which it accredits. The scope of ACICS recognition by the Secretary of Education is defined as accreditation of private postsecondary institutions offering certificates or diplomas, and postsecondary institutions offering associate, bachelor's, or master's degrees in programs designed to educate students for professional, technical, or occupational careers, including those that offer programs via distance education.

ACICS is also recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation. Recognition by CHEA affirms that standards and processes of accrediting organizations are consistent with quality, improvement, and accountability expectations that CHEA has established. ACICS is eligible for CHEA recognition because more than half of ACICS' accredited institutions are degree-granting.

The Council is composed of fifteen commissioners, each of whom must be either elected by the membership or appointed by the Council. Each commissioner is a member of the Board of Directors, and in this capacity they oversee both the administrative and corporate activities of the Council.

The Council is subdivided into three committees for the purpose of reviewing materials for initial or continuing accreditation. These committees are equally comprised of commissioners with various credentials, so that every committee can review applications at each level (certificate/ diploma, occupational associate, academic associate, bachelor, and master's degrees). Appointed commissioners may be representatives from within education – member institutions, other institutions of higher education, or education-related government agencies – or from the general public, representing industry, business, or the professions. Elected commissioners represent member institutions. A minimum number of commissioners, including at least one member of the Board of Directors, must be from the public.

Retention Data

Institutions report retention outcomes based on the total enrollment and withdrawals during the reporting period. Institutions are provided with the following definitions to be used in determining the appropriate retention classification.

Withdrawal

A student who is no longer enrolled at the institution and (1) has failed to attend the full length of the program; (2) has not maintained satisfactory academic progress; (3) has failed courses or substitute courses permitted by the institution; (4) has not attained speeds or competencies required; (5) is not eligible for a credential; or (6) failed to meet the institution's attendance and/or graduation requirements.

Retention Rates

Retention rates are calculated for each institution according to standard formulas adopted by the Council.





Placement Data

Institutions report placement outcomes for graduates and completers as of the submission date of the AIR. Institutions are provided with the following definitions to be used in determining the appropriate placement classification:

Completer

A student who is no longer enrolled at the institution and who either has completed the time allowed or has attempted the maximum allowable number of credits for the program of study, but who did not accomplish one of the following graduation requirements: (1) achieved a grade point average of at least 2.0; (2) attained required competencies or speed skills; or (3) satisfied non-academic requirements.

Graduate

A student who has (1) achieved a grade point average of 2.0 or greater at graduation; (2) successfully passed all courses in the program or substitute courses permitted by the institution; (3) attained required competencies or speed levels in all courses; (4) met all clinical, internship, and externship requirements; (5) satisfied all non-academic requirements such as payment of tuition and fees, return of books, etc.; (6) satisfied all other academic requirements for graduation; (7) received the appropriate credential; and (8) ceased enrollment at the institution.

In-Field

A graduate is employed in a position that requires direct use of the skills taught in the program.

Related Field

A graduate is employed in a position that requires indirect use of the skills taught in the program.

Out-of-Field

A graduate is employed in a position that does not require use of the skills taught in the program.

Not Available

A graduate is documented as unavailable for placement because of pregnancy or other health-related situations; continuing education; active military service; ineligibility for placement in the United States due to visa status; or completion of a stand-alone English as a Second Language program for which placement typically is not offered.

Placement rates are calculated for each institution according to standard formulas adopted by the Council.





Average Placement Rates by Credential Level





Average Placement Rates by Reporting Year




2007 Top Programs by Number




2007 Top Programs by Enrollment

Program Length and Tuition and Fees

The Council is required to monitor the average program lengths and tuition and fees of similar programs of study of its accredited institutions in order to maintain compliance with the U.S. Department of Education accrediting agency recognition provisions. In keeping with this requirement, Section 2-1-808 of the *Accreditation Criteria*, Program Length and Tuition and Fees, states that the Council will collect and provide data relative to program length and tuition and fees to all ACICS-accredited institutions.

The charts on the following pages identify the average program length and tuition and fees charged by credential for selected programs. The data were derived from the statistical information reported on the 2007 and 2008 Annual Institutional Reports (AIR) by all ACICS-accredited institutions. The program codes given correspond with those used to report program data on the AIR. To maintain confidentiality, ACICS does not publish information for programs that are offered by fewer than ten institutions (regardless of credential level).
