



U.S. Higher Education System

Higher education institutions in the United States include both community colleges (2-year institutions) and 4-year colleges and universities.

Community Colleges

These 2-year institutions, also known as technical or junior colleges, award associate degrees upon completion of a 2-year program of study. An associate degree enables students to:

- ► Transfer to a 4-year college or university for an additional 2 years of study to obtain a bachelor's degree
- ▶ Begin a career immediately in the workplace that does not require a 4-year degree

Four-Year Colleges and Universities

Four-year institutions offer bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees. Most 4-year degree programs accept course credits

Accreditation

Regional accreditation agencies recognized by the U.S. Department of Education are responsible for evaluating academic programs at both community colleges and 4-year institutions to ensure the quality and acceptability of an individual institution. Because community colleges and 4-year institutions must meet the same accreditation standards for the first two years of a university education, community college students are able to transfer their course credits to 4-year colleges or universities.

Freedom of Choice

Students choose their own courses and class schedules. Advisers offer advice and provide information to help students make decisions and develop a plan that will meet their educational goals.

Undergraduate Academic Year

The academic year is usually 9 months, divided into two semesters or three quarters. A full-time student takes four or five courses each semester, or three to four courses each quarter.

During the 1st and 2nd academic years of higher education (freshman and sophomore years) students usually focus on general studies. Students at a community college are eligible to obtain an associate degree upon completion of their first 2 years of study.

By the 3rd (junior) academic year, students begin intensive study in their chosen majors. The 4th (senior) year is the final academic year toward obtaining a bachelor's degree.

It is common to refer to students by their academic year of study: freshmen, sophomores, juniors, or seniors.

Course Credits

Students receive a certain number of credits for each course successfully completed. The number of credits is directly related to the number of hours assigned to the course by the institution. For example, successful completion of a course that meets for 1 hour, three times a week equals a total of 3 credits. The same course with an additional hour of lab work equals 4 credits.

Course Grades

Grades received at the end of a course indicate how well the student performed. Grades range from A to F, with A as the best possible grade. All grades received during a course of study are combined to determine the student's grade point average (GPA).

Overview of U.S.Community Colleges

ommunity colleges are higher education institutions in the United States that provide the first 2 years of a university education. ✓ Whether they are large or small, located in big cities or rural settings, community colleges have a common mission to promote and support learning and student success.

Established over 100 years ago, community colleges offer affordable, convenient, and accessible higher education opportunities. The network of nearly 1,200 community colleges in all 50 states serve more than 11 million students.

In 2007-2008, more than 86,000 international students enrolled at U.S. community colleges to obtain an affordable education in a supportive and academically challenging environment. First-rate faculty, a high ratio of teacher-student dialogue and interaction, state-of-the-art facilities, and smaller class sizes are characteristics of a community college education.

Because community colleges are accredited by the same regional agencies and their academic courses meet the same standards as universities, students are able to transfer their course credits to a university degree program.

Many students who began at a community college have made notable contributions and achieved high recognition as astronauts, doctors, business leaders, celebrated artists, government leaders, sports legends, and renowned scientists.

Community college alumni include Arnold Schwarzenegger, governor of California; George Lucas, producer/director of the "Star Wars" movie series; Tom Hanks and Clint Eastwood, film actors; Veronica Campbell-Brown, 2008 Olympic gold medalist (women's 200-meter race); and Calvin Klein, fashion designer.





Almost half of all undergraduates in the United States begin their higher

education studies at community colleges, which are affordable and provide individualized attention.



The Top 10 Benefits of Attending a U.S. Community Collge

International students attend community colleges as a stepping stone to 4-year colleges and universities in the United States. The top 10 benefits of attending a U.S. community college are:

Lower Tuition Costs = Savings

Community college tuition and fees are approximately 50% lower than those at 4-year colleges and universities. By starting at a community college, students can substantially lower the total cost of obtaining their bachelor's degree.

Flexible English Proficiency Requirements

Community colleges may accept lower scores for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and/or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS). Both tests measure the ability of non-native speakers of English to use and understand English as it is spoken, written, and heard in college and university settings.

Some community colleges waive English proficiency requirements because of their excellent Intensive English Programs (IEP) and English as a Second Language (ESL) courses. They administer their own English placement test after students arrive on campus and before they register for classes.

Focus on Teaching

Community college faculty primarily focus on teaching and providing personal attention to students, whereas 4-year college and university faculty mainly concentrate on conducting research and publishing articles and/or

books. Students attending community colleges often gain a real-world perspective because faculty members usually have practical work experience in the subjects they teach.



Smaller Class Sizes

Smaller class sizes provide an atmosphere in which students can easily ask questions, dialogue with their instructors and classmates to grasp concepts and build relationships. Smaller classes also help international students adjust to the pace of academic life and provide additional opportunities to practice English language skills.

Additional Year of Optional Practical Training (OPT)

Students are eligible for 1 year of OPT in their field of study upon completion of an associate degree and an additional 1 to 2½ years after completion of a bachelor's degree. OPT can build your resume and be advantageous when seeking a job. (For more information about OPT, see pages 6 and 24.)

Use of the Latest Technologies

Community colleges, working with their local businesses and industries, use state-of-the-art technologies in cutting-edge fields such as biomedical engineering, biotechnology, renewable energy technologies, robotics, laser optics, Internet and computer technologies, and geographic information systems.

Hundreds of Programs to Choose From

Nearly 1,200 regionally-accredited U.S. community colleges offer a wide variety of programs in all major fields of study, ranging from art to political science to zoology. Popular programs include accounting, business management, computer graphics and computer design, early childhood education, engineering, environmental conservation, hotel and restaurant management, multimedia, and psychology.

Opportunities to Experience U.S. Culture

Community colleges offer international students a unique opportunity to experience different aspects of life and culture in the United States—both on and off campus. Recreational, social, and multicultural activities that enrich the lives of students and local citizens include art exhibitions, concerts, community forums, health fairs, sporting events, and theatrical productions.

Excellent Student Support Services

Community colleges offer a variety of support services including tutoring, study skills workshops, academic advising, counseling, and career planning—many of which are designed specifically for international students.

Support services especially for students with disabilities may include adapted software or assistive equipment for people with mobility, vision, learning, or hearing disabilities.



Course Credits Transfer to University

Articulation agreements with 4-year universities allow credits earned at a community college to transfer towards a Bachelor's Degree. State universities often guarantee junior (3rd) year standing if all course requirements are completed.



Complete 2 years at a Community College plus 2 years at a University and receive a Bachelor's Degree.

Selecting a U.S. Community College

Determine Your Higher Education Goals

Consider the following questions when thinking about your overall goals, determining what you want to achieve and identifying the type of higher education institution to attend.

What type of program are you seeking?

Community colleges offer programs in nearly all fields of study. Many students in the United States spend their first 2 years at a college or university taking different classes to explore interests and opportunities. Where a major can be determined at any time, students often wait to make a decision at the end of their second year of study.

Do you eventually want to earn a bachelor's degree?

Most community colleges have 2 + 2 transfer (articulation) agreements with 4-year colleges and universities. You can begin your higher education studies at a community college and then transfer your course credits to a 4-year college or university to earn a bachelor's degree.

Do you want to improve your English?

Studying in the United States will provide extensive exposure to the English language. Many community colleges offer courses for students who need to improve or enhance their English skills before beginning an academic program.

Are you interested in U.S. culture?

U.S. community colleges provide international students extensive opportunities to interact with members of the local community and to experience U.S. culture.

Where do you want to live in the United States?

Community colleges are in each of the 50 states, some in big cities and some in smaller towns and rural areas. If your desired program of study is available at several community colleges, you may decide which institution to attend based on a state or region of the United States in which you would like to live.

Are you a student athlete?

More than 500 U.S. community colleges have excellent athletic facilities and offer students access to training, coaching, and a large variety of playing opportunities. The National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) organizes student athletic competitions in 17 sports: baseball, basketball, bowling, cross-country, diving, American football, golf, half marathon, ice hockey, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball, and wrestling.

The California Community College Athletic Association (CCCAA) organizes competitions in the same sports plus water polo and badminton.

Are you a student with a disability?

Community colleges offer a unique learning environment with smaller classes, more individualized attention, and a supportive atmosphere. Tutoring centers and mentoring programs are often provided to teach students with learning disabilities the study strategies needed to succeed in college. Accommodations may be made for sign language interpreters, accessible classrooms, note-takers in classes. Braille materials, and extended

time for taking tests. Adapted software or assistive equipment for people with mobility, vision, learning, or hearing disabilities are usually available. However, personal care attendants, hearing aids, and wheelchairs are not typically provided.

Selecting a U.S. Community College

Estimate Expenses and Identify Financial Resources

You will be required to show that you have existing financial resources necessary to cover your expenses for at least 1 year of study in the United States.

Costs vary depending on college location, but, in general, you should expect to spend between US\$10,000 and US\$20,000 each year. Financial resources may come from any dependable source, including family funds, your own finances, sponsorships, and scholarships.

Although F-1 visa students are not allowed to work off-campus during the school year, they can take advantage of work-study programs on campus for up to 20 hours per week.

Students may be awarded small scholarships after the first year of study based on their academic achievements.

Some community colleges offer scholarships (grant-in-aid) to outstanding student athletes. Scholarship sports for men are baseball, basketball, cross-country, golf, outdoor track and field, soccer, and tennis. Scholarship sports for women are basketball, cross-country, fast-pitch softball, outdoor track and field, soccer, tennis, and volleyball. If you are a student athlete in one of these sports, ask your college about athletic scholarship opportunities.

Other Important Criteria to Consider

Regional Accreditation

You want to make sure that the college you plan to attend is regionally accredited See the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) Web site **www.chea.org** for a list of accredited colleges and universities.

All community colleges profiled in this guide and listed on pages 156–163 are regionally-accredited institutions.

SEVP-Approved Colleges

International students are eligible to attend only U.S. colleges and universities that are approved by the Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP).

All community colleges profiled in this guide and listed on pages 156–163 are SEVP-approved institutions.

Applying to a U.S. Community College

Since admission requirements vary, learn the specific requirements about the colleges you would like to attend. You may apply for admission to a community college during your final year of secondary school (high school).

Items typically required for admission to a community college include the following:

Application Form

An application form to enroll as an international student can be found on the college Web site as well as a list of the documents you are required to submit along with your application form. Some community colleges accept applications shortly before the start of a semester, while others allow students to apply at any time.

Test Scores

Community colleges may require test scores from the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) or IELTS (International English Language Testing System). To learn when and where those tests are administered, visit www.EducationUSA.state.gov or contact your local EducationUSA advising center.

Some community colleges do not require either the TOEFL or IELTS because they administer their own English placement test after students arrive on campus and before they register for classes.

Students with adequate skill levels will be allowed to immediately begin an academic program. If skill levels are below English proficiency requirements, students must complete an Intensive English Program (IEP) before taking an academic courses.



Students with adequate skill levels will be allowed to immediately begin an academic program.

The SAT is a standardized exam with three parts (critical reading, math and writing) that measures what students learn in the classroom and how well they apply that knowledge. The SAT also tests critical thinking skills that lead to success in college. Although the SAT is usually not required by community colleges, taking the test shows your interest in and commitment to studying in the United States.

Students with disabilities may qualify for special testing arrangements. These may include extended time or additional breaks during an exam, a separate testing room, special editions of the test, or a provision for a reader or scribe. For general information about services for students with disabilities, see the Mobility International USA Web site at www.miusa.org/ncde

▶ Academic Transcripts and Records

Academic transcripts and other documents showing your previous education and grades are required. These documents are usually required in English and colleges may have them professionally evaluated before offering admission.

Statement of Financial Support

The statement of financial support is a document certifying that you have sufficient assets to cover the costs related to college and living expenses for at least 1 year while studying in the United States. Expenses include tuition, room and meals, health insurance, books and supplies, and personal expenditures.

Financial resources may come from any dependable source, including:

- ♦ Family funds
- ♦ Your own finances
- ♦ Sponsorships
- ♦ Scholarships

Extracurricular Activities

Extracurricular activities demonstrate your areas of interest, ability to work with others, and potential as a future leader. These activities do not need to be directly related to your academic course of study or education goals. They may include:

- ♦ Memberships in clubs
- ♦ Volunteer work
- ♦ Personal interests
- ♦ Hobbies
- ◆ Playing a musical instrument in a band

Let the college know about your extracurricular activities, as well as any prizes, awards, certificates, or medals you have won in competitions.



Proof of Immunization

Most community colleges require that you submit a record of your immunizations, signed by a physician. U.S. customs may also require a record of certain immunizations before you are allowed to enter the United States.

▶ Letters of Recommendation

Colleges may ask for letters of recommendation from teachers, employers, or others who can describe your talents, goals, interests, aptitude, and character. Family members are not usually allowed to write these letters.

Personal Essays

Colleges may require that you write an essay, either on a specific topic or on a topic of your choice.

Obtaining an F-1 Student Visa

Eligibility

F-1 student visas are granted to full-time students who have been accepted to a degree-granting academic or approved language program. For information about other types of student visas, see Internet resources listed on page 155.

Students seeking an F-1 visa must be able to demonstrate the following:

- ◆ Eligibility for the program of study
- ◆ Adequate financial resources for at least 1 year of studying in the United States
- ◆ Intent to return to your home country after completing your education goals

Visa Application Process

An F-1 student visa can be issued up to 120 days before the program start date as stated on your SEVIS Form I-20. Since visa processing times can vary widely, apply for a visa as early as possible to begin the process.

Four steps are required to apply for an F-1 visa:

Once you have been accepted by a college, you will be given a SEVIS Form I-20 from that institution. The SEVIS Form I-20 is required to apply for a visa but does not guarantee that one will be granted. (See page 21 about U.S. Entry and Customs requirements.)

Pay the SEVIS I-901 Fee
All F-1 visa students must pay a SEVIS I-901 fee
of US\$200 and show the payment receipt when
applying for a visa. The fee must be paid and fully processed
before you arrive at the U.S. embassy or consulate for a visa

Schedule and Attend a Visa Interview

You are required to have a brief face-to-face interview at the U.S. embassy or consulate that has jurisdiction over the area where you live. It may take several days to schedule an interview, so plan ahead. The interview is very important in determining whether you will be issued a visa.

For more information about the specifics of scheduling an interview in your country, contact your Education USA office or visit the Web site of your local embassy or consulate.

Be on time for the interview and remember to bring all items identified in the checklist on right.

Traveling to the United States

Once you have been admitted to a college and obtained your F-1 student visa, start making preparations to travel to the United States.

Prior to Departure

Secure Housing Arrangements

Ask the college for assistance with housing and confirm your arrangements before you arrive.

Housing options include:

- ◆ Dormitories on or near campus
- ◆ Homestays/Host Families
- ◆ Apartments
- ◆ Rooms to rent

Schedule Your Arrival

Pay special attention to visa and customs requirements for entering the United States. You may be refused entry into the United States if you arrive more than 30 days before or after the program start date, as stated on your Form I-20.

Make Medical Preparations

☐ Visit your doctor and ask about any vaccinations required for your trip. You can also check the U.S. Center for Disease Control (CDC) Web site for requirements

at www.cdc.gov/travel

In addition, contact your college's international office to find out about any special vaccination requirements.

Ask your doctor for signed prescriptions of any medications you use, particularly those that contain narcotics or are administered by syringe. You will need this documentation in order to

- bring these medications into the United States. Penalties for smuggling narcotics into the United States are severe.
- Obtain an updated prescription from your eye doctor if you wear glasses or contact lenses in case you need a replacement while in the United States.
- ☐ Call the airline to learn the rules for carrying medications that are liquids or gels in your carry-on luggage. If not allowed, place these items in your checked baggage.

Copy Important Documents

- ☐ Make copies of your SEVIS Form I-20 and the passport pages containing your photograph, passport number, expiration date, and the U.S. visa stamp.
- ☐ Keep these copies separate from the original documents. Put one copy in your carry-on luggage and one in your checked luggage. Leave one at home with your family.

Prepare For Your Flight

☐ Check the airline's baggage allowances before packing your bags. You may have to pay extra for bags that exceed maximum weight and size allowances.



- Reconfirm your flights 72 hours before departure and arrive at the airport at least 2 hours before your flight.
- ☐ Pack a change of clothing in your carry-on bag in case your checked luggage is delayed or lost.

Upon Arrival in the United States

U.S. Entry and Customs Requirements

Be sure you are in compliance with U.S. regulations to ensure you will be allowed to enter the United States. Your student visa does not guarantee entry into the United States. It allows you to travel to the United States only as far as the port of entry. The immigration and customs officers make the final decision to allow or deny entry based on compliance with customs and immigration regulations.

Basic Requirements for Entry

- ◆ You must be healthy.
- ◆ Provide proof of vaccination if you were recently in a country with epidemics such as cholera or yellow fever.
- ◆ Show statement of financial support.
- ♦ State your intent to leave the United States upon completion of your studies and any OPT in which you participate.

Items You Cannot Bring Into the United States

- ♦ Drugs or medications without a doctor's prescription
- ♦ Fruits and vegetables
- ◆ Living plants
- ♦ Meat and meat by-products
- ♦ Firearms and ammunition
- ◆ Products made from certain protected animals

U.S. Customs and Immigration Procedure

Upon arriving in the United States, and before claiming your luggage, you will first need to answer questions from U.S. customs officials and present required documentation.

Documents Required by U.S. Customs and Immigration

- Passport, valid for at least 6 months beyond the proposed date of entry into the United States
- SEVIS Form I-20
- ☐ College acceptance letter
- Evidence of financial resources
- ☐ Paper receipt for the SEVIS fee, Form I-797
- ☐ Name and contact information for your designated school official (DSO), including a 24-hour emergency contact number at the college
- Completed Customs Declaration Forms (CF-6059)

 Available from a flight attendant or at the port of entry.
- ☐ Completed Arrival/Departure Record Form (I-94)

 Available from a flight attendant or at the port of entry.

Questions U.S. Customs Officials May Ask

Keep your answers simple and direct.

- Q: What is your purpose for entering the United States?
- Q: What is the name of the college you plan to attend? (Note: You must provide the name of the college that issued your SEVIS Form I-20 and is listed on your visa.)
- Q: Where will you be living while in the United States?
- Q: Are you bringing any prescriptions or narcotics, such as barbiturates, amphetamines, or marijuana, into the United States? (Note: These are illegal in the United States unless you have a prescription from your physician.)

- Q: Do you have anything of value (not for your own personal use) to declare?
- Q: Are you bringing any money into the United States with you? How much?
- Q: Are you bringing any plants, fruits, meats, vegetables, clothing made from the skins of endangered animals, ivory, lottery tickets, obscene articles or publications, or switchblade knives into the United States? (Note: These are all prohibited.)

Maintaining F-1 Student Visa Status

As long as you remain a full-time student and attend the college that issued your SEVIS Form I-20, you will legally maintain your student status, even if your student visa in your passport expires. **You also need to:**

- ► Make ongoing progress toward completing your course of study.
- ▶ Maintain a grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or better.
- ▶ Report any change of address to your college's international office within 10 days of the change.
- ▶ Obey federal, state, and local laws.
- ➤ Engage in employment only when specifically authorized under visa regulations.



Duration of Status (D/S)

F-1 visa students are permitted to remain in the United States for a D/S that includes:

- ► The time you are enrolled in college
- Any additional period of Optional Practical Training (see pages 6, 10 and 24)
- ➤ An additional 60 days after you complete your studies or OPT to prepare for departure from the United States.

Living in the United States

The best source for information, advice, and support about living in the United States is the international office at the college you are attending. It is also a good idea to purchase a travel guide for the region of the United States where you will be living. Such books offer general information about living in the United States and detailed information about specific regions and states.

Housing

Plan to make housing arrangements through your college before you arrive. There are several options for consideration, either on or off campus.

Dormitories

Over 250 community colleges have campus dormitories (dorms)—buildings with rooms for students attending that college. Living in a dorm allows you to interact with fellow students and experience the camaraderie that is typical of college life. Most dorms provide meals in a common dining hall.

Dorms may be all female, all male, or coed (female and male students living in the same building) and consist of single rooms, shared rooms, or suites (bedrooms joined by a common living area). Bathrooms in dorms are often shared with other students.

Homestays

The homestay arrangement is designed to provide you with a rich intercultural experience. Living with a host family will provide you with excellent opportunities to practice English and experience U.S. life and culture. Many community colleges arrange homestays with a family for a semester, a year, or other time period. Some host families include meals, family activities, and transportation to the college. Host families often treat students as one of the family and spend time showing them around the local community.

Apartments

Apartments provide opportunities to live on your own or with other students. There are two types of apartments for rent:

- ◆ Furnished apartments include essential furniture such as beds, couches, chairs, and tables.
- ◆ Unfurnished apartments may have only kitchen appliances, such as a refrigerator and stove.

Renting a Room

Families and individuals in the local community may rent bedrooms in their homes, usually with kitchen privileges.

Managing Your Money

U.S. Currency

Paper money (also referred to as bills or cash) is all the same size and mostly green in color. Common U.S. denominations are \$1, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, and \$100. Larger denominations are not circulated.

Checking Accounts

Students usually open a checking account with cash or travelers checks to pay bills such as rent and utilities. Money can be deposited by wire transfer from your home bank for an additional fee. The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insures all U.S. bank accounts against loss up to US\$100,000.

Savings Accounts

If you want to keep money for future use and have it earn interest, you may want to open a savings bank account. You can transfer money from a savings to a checking account, and you can withdraw savings at any time; however, you cannot write checks from a savings account.

ATM and Debit Cards

Your bank will give you an automated teller machine (ATM) card to let you withdraw money from your checking or savings account. Some ATM cards are also debit cards that you can use like a credit card to make purchases. If you have an ATM card from a non-U.S. bank, ask the bank whether your personal identification number (PIN) will work in the United States.

Credit Cards

If you already have a major credit card (MasterCard, Eurocard, Access, Chargex, Visa, Barclaycard, Carte Bleue, or American Express), bring the card with you. This will allow U.S. banks to check your credit limit and help you obtain a credit card in the United States.

Travelers Checks

Travelers checks are a safe way to transport money. Do not countersign or date the checks until you are ready to use them. If the travelers checks are lost or stolen, you can easily get them replaced.

Exchanging Money

You can exchange foreign currency at most banks, airports, major hotels, Travelex, and American Express offices. A fee may be charged. Daily exchange rates are available on the OANDA Web site at **www.oanda.com** and on the XE Web site at **www.xe.com/ucc**

Public Transportation

Many cities have public transportation such as subways, buses, or commuter trains.

Working in the United States

F-1 students are not allowed to work off campus but may be eligible to work on campus. Prior to starting work, you must obtain a social security number and complete a Form I-9 (Employment Eligibility Verification).

On-campus student employment is limited to 20 hours per week while college is in session, but you may be able to work full time on campus during vacation or break periods as long as you are registered for classes in the following semester.

F-1 visa students completing an associate degree can work for up to 1 year through an Optional Practical Training (OPT) program in their fields of study. OPT may be available on or off campus both during and after completion of your program of study. You do not need to change your visa status if you obtain OPT, but you will need authorization from your college's international student adviser.

Experiencing U.S. Culture

Culture Shock

It is natural to miss your family, friends and home country. Culture shock is the process of adjusting to a new country and a new culture, which may be dramatically unlike your own. Differences include types of food, climate, lifestyle, scenery, the pressure and fast pace of U.S. academic life.



Knowing some things about U.S. culture will help you understand and adjust to your new enviroment

Do not lose your sense of humor. Laugh at your mistakes and learn from them. As you begin adjusting to U.S. culture and attitudes and start knowing your way around, it will seem easier to adapt to and understand your new way of life and surroundings.

Be sure to ask both international and U.S. students to explain things that are unfamiliar to you. College counselors are available to talk with you about issues or problems you may experience.

Values

There may be circumstances and situations that are not accepted in your culture which are part of American life. These may include relationships between men and women, the informality of people, social behaviors, or religious attitudes. Make sure you know what to expect before you arrive.

Living in the United States

People

- ◆ People in the United States value independence and individuality.
- ♦ Students often dress casually and express their ideas on politics, film, or fashion.
- ◆ Students are expected to participate actively in classes.
- ◆ The U.S. is quite diverse and made up of people from all over the world. Any one community may have a variety of places to worship—churches, mosques, synagogues, and temples.
- ◆ Ethnic minorities and women are represented in all types of occupations and social positions, including government and business.

Language Challenges

- ♦ Americans tend to talk quickly.
- ◆ Accents vary greatly in the United States.
- ◆ Americans often use a lot of slang and jargon. Their speech is colorful and full of descriptions.
- ◆ Humor, wit, and sarcasm are an integral part of American English and should be interpreted as a mark of friendliness rather than a show of disrespect.
- If you do not understand something, simply ask the meaning. Do not be afraid to make mistakes. This will all be part of your learning experience.

Popular Culture

◆ American popular culture is in nearly every medium, including movies, music, and sports. Some familiar names and terms include: Mickey Mouse, Madonna, Aerosmith, Michael Jackson, Babe Ruth, jazz, the blues, rap & hip hop, the Simpsons, Superman, Michael Jordan, Indiana Jones, and Sesame Street.

Fashion

- ◆ Except for professional business attire, fashion in America is diverse. In general, blue jeans, t-shirts, and sneakers or flipflops are considered every-day casual wear by most young people.
- Business attire—suits, ties, dress shirts and shoes—are usually worn to job interviews, business offices, and sometimes to special events like weddings, funerals, or receptions.

Sports

- ◆ Sports are an important part of American culture. Although soccer is an extremely popular sport in the rest of the world, it is not a top sport in the United States.
- Major sports in America include baseball, football, basketball, and ice hockey.

Time

- ♦ It is customary to arrive at the specified time or a few minutes early for an appointment.
- Classes almost always start at the exact time for which they are scheduled.
- ◆ Exams start at an exact time. Never arrive late for an exam unless you have the instructor's permission.
- ♦ Always be on time for a job interview or other formal appointment.
- ♦ Although doctors' offices often run behind schedule, you should arrive on time.
- ◆ The continental United States (not including Alaska or Hawaii) has four major time zones: Eastern, Central, Mountain, and Pacific. The time differences vary from 1-3 hours.

Dates

◆ Dates are usually written with the month first, the day second, and the year last: February 8, 2010, or 2/8/10.

Restaurants

- ◆ A service charge is usually not included in the restaurant tab, but customers are expected to leave the server a 15% tip.
- ♦ At self-serve and fast-food restaurants, it is not necessary to pay a tip.
- ♦ Most restaurants and public places do not allow smoking.


Socializing


- ◆ People usually stand at least 2 feet apart when speaking to each other
- ♦ Eye contact is an indication of openness, honesty, and enthusiasm.
- ◆ People shake hands in formal settings or when meeting someone for the first time.
- ◆ Friends often greet each other with a hug or a kiss on the cheek.

Laws and Regulations

◆ Learn the laws and regulations of your new American community. Traffic laws may be different than those to which you are accustomed. College campus rules and regulations may differ by location. If you have any questions, ask the student adviser at your college.

Arizona

Mormon pioneers, who traveled across the U.S. desert to what they believed to be "the promised land," settled the state. Students in Utah can visit the Great Salt Lake and Rainbow Bridge and listen to the famous Mormon Tabernacle Choir.



Colorado

Situated in the Rocky Mountain region of the United States, Colorado offers the charms of mountain living and outstanding winter sports activities. Home to wild rivers and plains, Colorado, known for its mountain resorts like Aspen and Vail, is an excellent environment for students wishing to study and enjoy the great outdoors at the same time.



Washington

Washington, well known for its incredible salmon fisheries, is home to several large international corporations including Amazon.com, Microsoft, and Starbucks. 
South Carolina

2 + 2 Transfer – An agreement whereby students complete 2 years of education at a community college and then transfers to a 4-year college or university to obtain a bachelor's degree.

Academic Advising –Assistance provided by faculty members to help students decide the courses needed to meet all requirements for earning a certificate or degree.

Academic Year –The period of formal instruction usually from September to June. An academic year may be divided into semesters, trimesters, of quarters.

Accreditation – The process used to approve the program quality of U.S. higher education institutions. Community colleges and universities are accredited by the same nationally-recognized regional accrediting agencies.

Articulation Agreement – An agreement between community colleges and universities that allows course credits to be transferred from one institution to another.

Associate Degree – Degree awarded upon completion of approximately 2 years of full-time study (60 credit hours) which includes three parts: general education requirements, major requirements, and electives.

Bachelor's Degree –Degree awarded upon completion of approximately 4 years of full-time study in the liberal arts and sciences or professional subjects.

Campus – The land on which the buildings of a college are located.

Coed – A college that admits both male and female students..

College – A postsecondary institution that provides undergraduate degree programs and, in some case, master's degrees.

College Catalog – An official publication which includes information about academic programs, facilities, entrance requirements, and student life at a college.

Course – Regularly scheduled class sessions of 1–5 hours (or more) per week during a semester or quarter. A degree program, comprised of required and elective courses, varies from institution to institution.

Course load – The number of course or credits taken in a semester or quarter.

Credits – Units colleges use to record the completion of courses with passing grades that are required for an academic degree.

Culture Shock – The mental shock of adjusting to a new country and a new country, which may be dramatically different from your own.

Degree – A diploma conferred by a college, university or professional school upon completion of an approved program of studies.

Department – Administrative subdivision of a college through which instruction in a certain field of student is given.

Dormitory ("dorms") – Housing facilities on a college campus reserved for students.

Electives – Courses that students may choose to take for credit toward their intended degree, rather than courses they are required to take.

English as a Second Language (ESL) – A program used to teach English to students whose first language is not English.

Extracurricular Activities – Non-academic activities taken outside of college courses.

Faculty – Members of the teaching staff of a college and responsible for designing the plans of study offered by institution.

Fees – An amount charged by colleges, in addition to tuition, to cover costs of institutional services.

Freshman – A first-year student at a college or university.

Full-Time student – A student who is enrolled at a college and taking at least the minimum number of credits (usually 12) to meet the institution's requirements.

Grade Point Average (GPA) – A system of recording achievement based on a numerical average of the grades attained in each course.

Graduate – A student who has completed a course of study, either at the college or university level.

Homestay – An arrangement where the student lives with an American family in the local community and has the opportunity to experience life as it is lived day to day.

Intensive English Program (IEP) – A term used to describe programs that teach English to nonnative speakers.

International Student Adviser (ISA) – The person at a college who is in charge of providing information and guidance to international students in government and visa regulations, academic requirements, social customs, language, financial or housing issues, travel plans, insurance and/or legal matters.

Junior – A third-year student at a college or university.

Liberal Arts – A term referring to academic studies of subjects in the humanities, the social sciences, and the sciences.

Major – The subject in which a student wishes to concentrate.

Minor – A subject in which the student takes the second greatest concentration of courses.

Optional Practical Training (OPT) – A program in which international students are entitled to work in their field of study upon the completion of a degree—associates, bachelor's, master's and beyond.

Placement Test – An examination used to test a student's academic ability in a specific field so that he or she can be placed in courses at the appropriate level in that field.

Prerequisite – A program or course that a student is required to complete before being permitted to enroll in a more advanced program or course.

Registration – Process through which students select courses to be taken during the academic year.

Room and Board – Terms used to describe living facilities (room) and food (board).

Senior – A fourth year student at a college or university.

SEVIS - An internet-based system developed by the U.S. government to track and monitor non-immigrant students throughout the time they are approved to be part of the higher education system in America

SEVIS Forum I-20 – After a person is accepted to a college, he or she will receive a Form I-10 from the institution. This form includes information required to apply for a visa: name of the college, field of study, dates student expects to begin and complete studies, and the student's ability to pay for his/her education.

Social Security Number (SSN) – Everyone who works in America is required to have a SSN. The number is issued by the U.S. government and often used by colleges and universities as the student's identification number.

Sophomore – A second-year student at a college or university.

Transcript – A certified copy of a student's educational record.

Tuition – The money an institution charges for instruction and training (not including the cost of books).

Undergraduate Studies – Two-year or four-year programs at a college or university undertaken after secondary school graduation and leading to an associate or bachelor's degree.

University – A large postsecondary institution that offers both undergraduate and graduate degree programs.

Vocational or Technical College – A college offering programs that prepare students with skills relevant to the needs of employers and the economy.

Withdrawal – The administrative procedure of dropping a course or leaving a college.

Zip Code – A series of numbers in mailing addresses that designate postal delivery districts in the United States.
