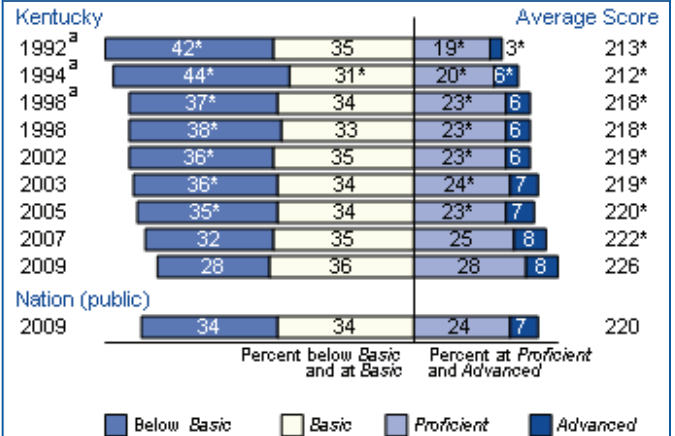


Overall Results

- In 2009, the average score of fourth-grade students in Kentucky was 226. This was higher than the average score of 220 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Kentucky in 2009 (226) was higher than their average score in 2007 (222) and was higher than their average score in 1992 (213).
- In 2009, the score gap between students in Kentucky at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 43 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 1992 (44 points).
- The percentage of students in Kentucky who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 36 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (33 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (23 percent).
- The percentage of students in Kentucky who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 72 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (68 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (58 percent).

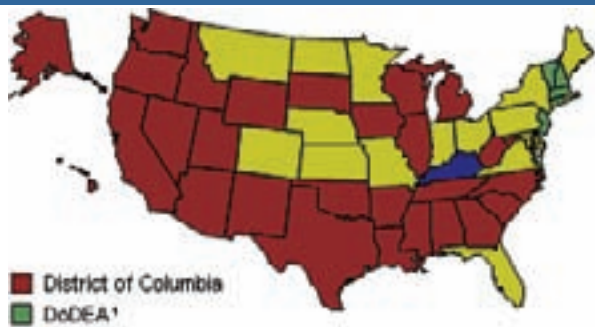
Achievement Level Percentages and Average Score Results

Compare the Average Score in 2009 to Other States/Jurisdictions

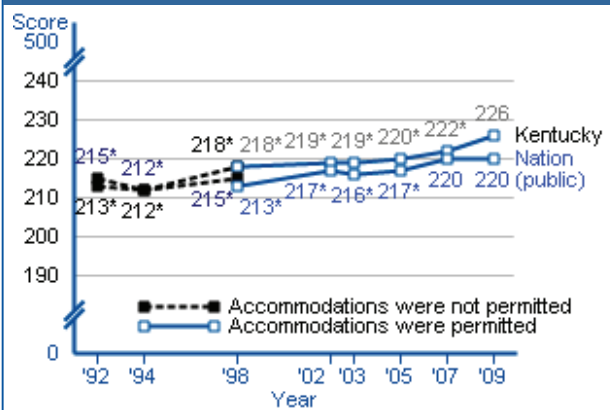

In 2009, the average score in **Kentucky** was

- lower than those in 6 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 28 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 17 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2009, female students in Kentucky had an average score that was higher than that of male students.
- In 2009, Black students had an average score that was 25 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (18 points).
- In 2009, Hispanic students had an average score that was 13 points lower than that of White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 1992, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2009, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low income, had an average score that was 21 points lower than that of students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (21 points).

NOTE: Statistical comparisons are calculated on the basis of unrounded scale scores or percentages.
