
## **Overall Results**

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in Indiana was 265. This was not significantly different from the average score of 264 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Indiana in 2011 (265) was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (266) and was not significantly different from their average score in 2002 (265).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in Indiana at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 41 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 2002 (42 points).
- The percentage of students in Indiana who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 32 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (32 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2002 (32 percent).
- The percentage of students in Indiana who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 78 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (79 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2002 (77 percent).

## **Score Gaps for Student Groups**

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 22 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (20 points).
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 14 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2002, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2011, female students in Indiana had an average score that was higher than male students by 10 points.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 19 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (16 points).
