
Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in District of Columbia was 242. This was lower than the average score of 264 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in District of Columbia in 2011 (242) was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (242) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (236).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in District of Columbia at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 53 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 1998 (51 points).
- The percentage of students in District of Columbia who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 16 percent in 2011. This percentage was greater than that in 2009 (14 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (11 percent).
- The percentage of students in District of Columbia who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 51 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (51 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (44 percent).



Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 53
 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for
 White students in 1998, because reporting standards were
 not met
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 53 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for White students in 1998, because reporting standards were not met
- In 2011, female students in District of Columbia had an average score that was higher than male students by 15 points.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 23 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (25 points).
