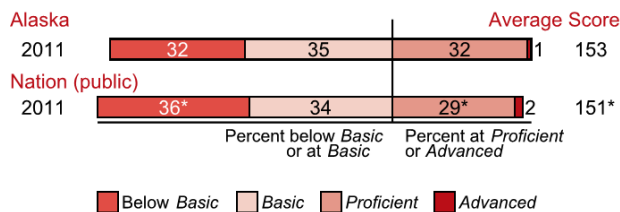


Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in Alaska was 153. This was higher than the average score of 151 for public school students in the nation.
- The percentage of students in Alaska who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 34 percent in 2011. This percentage was greater than the nation (31 percent).
- The percentage of students in Alaska who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 68 percent in 2011. This percentage was greater than the nation (64 percent).

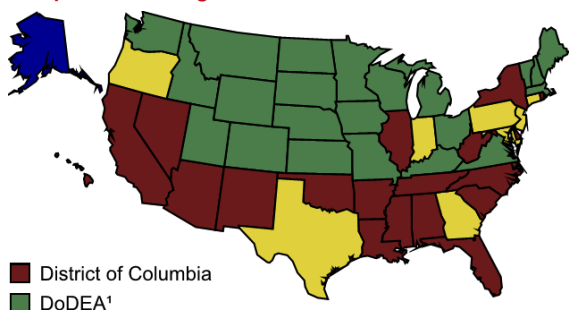
Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results

Compare the Average Score in 2011 to Other States/Jurisdictions

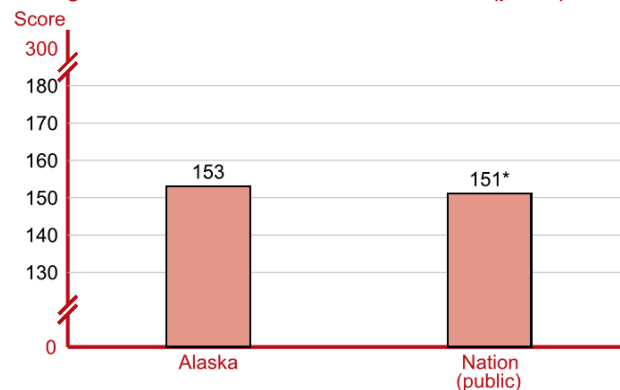

In 2011, the average score in **Alaska** (153) was

- lower than those in 23 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 20 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 8 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 33 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from the nation (35 points).
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 20 points lower than White students. This performance gap was narrower than the nation (27 points).
- In 2011, male students in Alaska had an average score that was not significantly different from female students.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 25 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from the nation (27 points).
