
Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in Alabama was 140. This was lower than the average score of 151 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Alabama in 2011 (140) was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (139).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in Alabama at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 46 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 2009 (49 points).
- The percentage of students in Alabama who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 19 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (19 percent).
- The percentage of students in Alabama who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 53 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (51 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2011 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2011, the average score in Alabama (140) was

- lower than those in 45 states/jurisdictions
- higher than that in 1 state/jurisdiction
- not significantly different from those in 5 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 34 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (36 points).
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 16 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (23 points).
- In 2011, male students in Alabama had an average score that was not significantly different from female students.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 28 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (27 points).
