
Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in Arizona was 144. This was lower than the average score of 151 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Arizona in 2011 (144) was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (141).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in Arizona at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 45 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 2009 (48 points).
- The percentage of students in Arizona who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 23 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (22 percent).
- The percentage of students in Arizona who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 56 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (54 percent).

- not significantly different from those in 6 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 30 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (32 points).
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 26 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (31 points).
- In 2011, male students in Arizona had an average score that was not significantly different from female students.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 23 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (26 points).
