
Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in Kansas was 156. This was higher than the average score of 151 for public school students in the nation.
- The percentage of students in Kansas who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 35 percent in 2011. This percentage was greater than the nation (31 percent).
- The percentage of students in Kansas who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 71 percent in 2011. This percentage was greater than the nation (64 percent).


Compare the Average Score in 2011 to Other States/Jurisdictions

In 2011, the average score in Kansas (156) was

- lower than those in 15 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 26 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 10 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 35 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from the nation (35 points).
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 30 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from the nation (27 points).
- In 2011, male students in Kansas had an average score that was higher than female students by 6 points.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 24 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from the nation (27 points).
