
Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in Mississippi was 137. This was lower than the average score of 151 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Mississippi in 2011 (137) was higher than their average score in 2009 (132).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in Mississippi at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 49 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 2009 (49 points).
- The percentage of students in Mississippi who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 19 percent in 2011. This percentage was greater than that in 2009 (15 percent).
- The percentage of students in Mississippi who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 47 percent in 2011. This percentage was greater than that in 2009 (41 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2011 to Other States/Jurisdictions



- not significantly different from those in 2 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 37 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (36 points).
- Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2011, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2011, male students in Mississippi had an average score that was higher than female students by 8 points.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 29 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (30 points).
