
Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in New Hampshire was 162. This was higher than the average score of 151 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in New Hampshire in 2011 (162) was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (160).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in New Hampshire at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 37 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 2009 (37 points).
- The percentage of students in New Hampshire who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 42 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (39 percent).
- The percentage of students in New Hampshire who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 79 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (77 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2011 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2011, the average score in New Hampshire (162) was

- lower than those in 0 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 42 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 9 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2011, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 27 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (30 points).
- In 2011, male students in New Hampshire had an average score that was higher than female students by 5 points.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 13 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was narrower than that in 2009 (20 points).
