
Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in Pennsylvania was 151. This was not significantly different from the average score of 151 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Pennsylvania in 2011 (151) was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (154).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in Pennsylvania at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 47 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 2009 (45 points).
- The percentage of students in Pennsylvania who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 33 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (35 percent).
- The percentage of students in Pennsylvania who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 66 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (68 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2011 to Other States/Jurisdictions



Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 43 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (38 points).
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 45 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (41 points).
- In 2011, male students in Pennsylvania had an average score that was higher than female students by 8 points.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 33 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (32 points).
