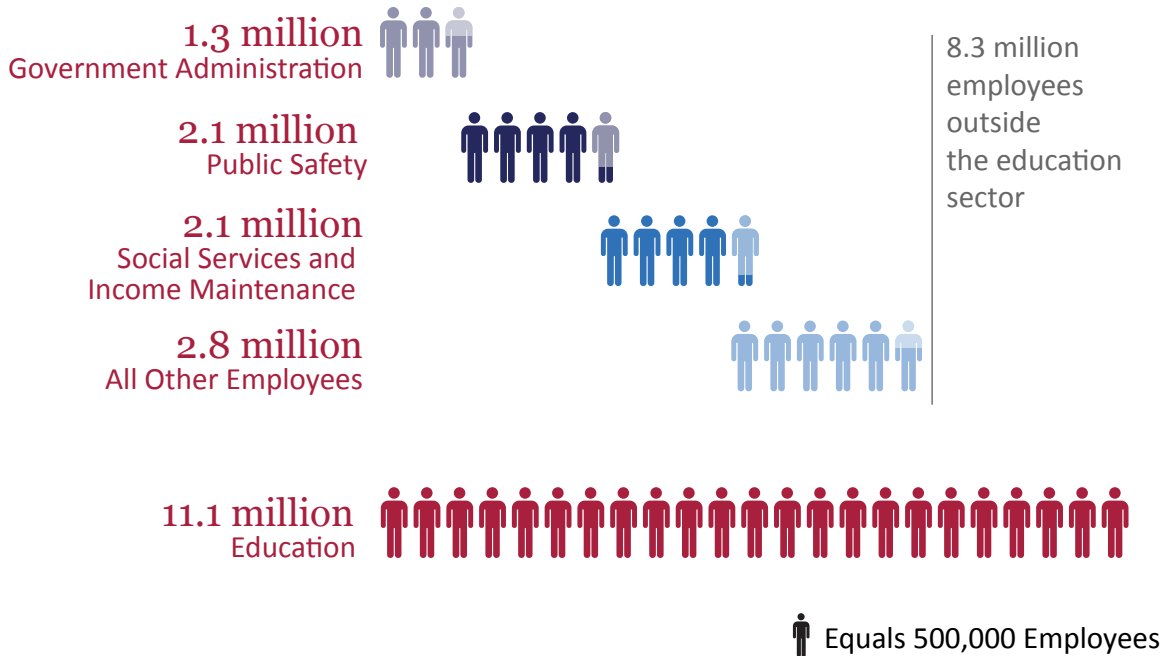


The Face of Government: Education

State and local government employees provide critical services that citizens depend on every day including police and fire protection, roads and public transit systems, social services, public health and hospitals, and education services. The U.S. Census Bureau collects statistics on the nation's governments every five years in the Census of Governments and every year in the Annual Survey of Public Employment and Payroll.

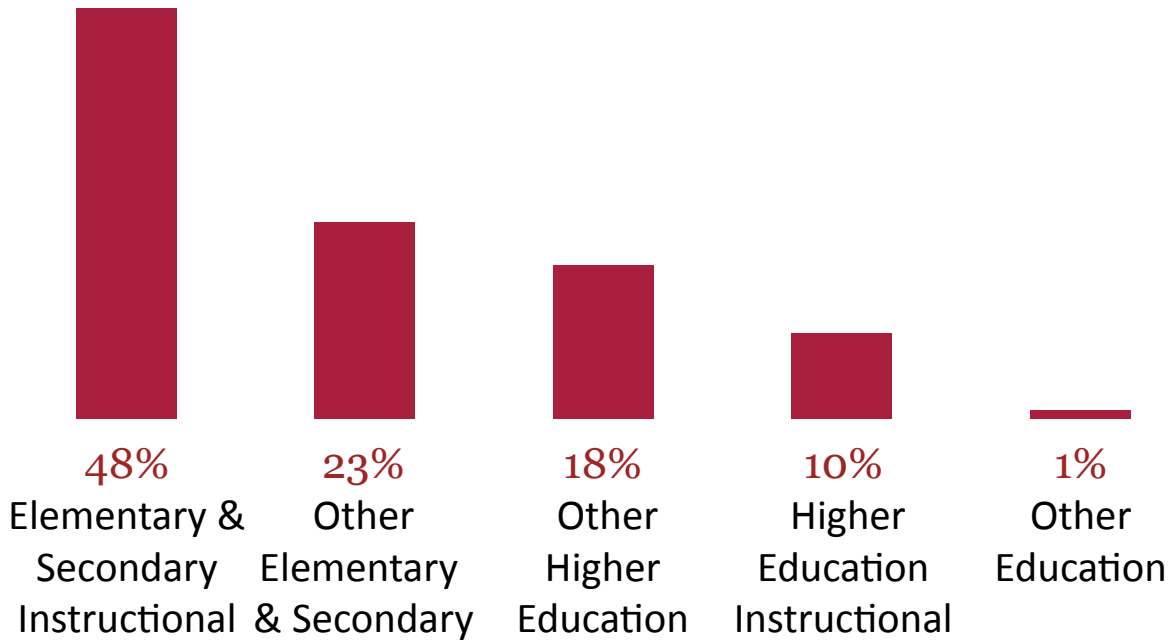
Who are the nation's state and local government workers?

Total Number of Employees: 19,412,955

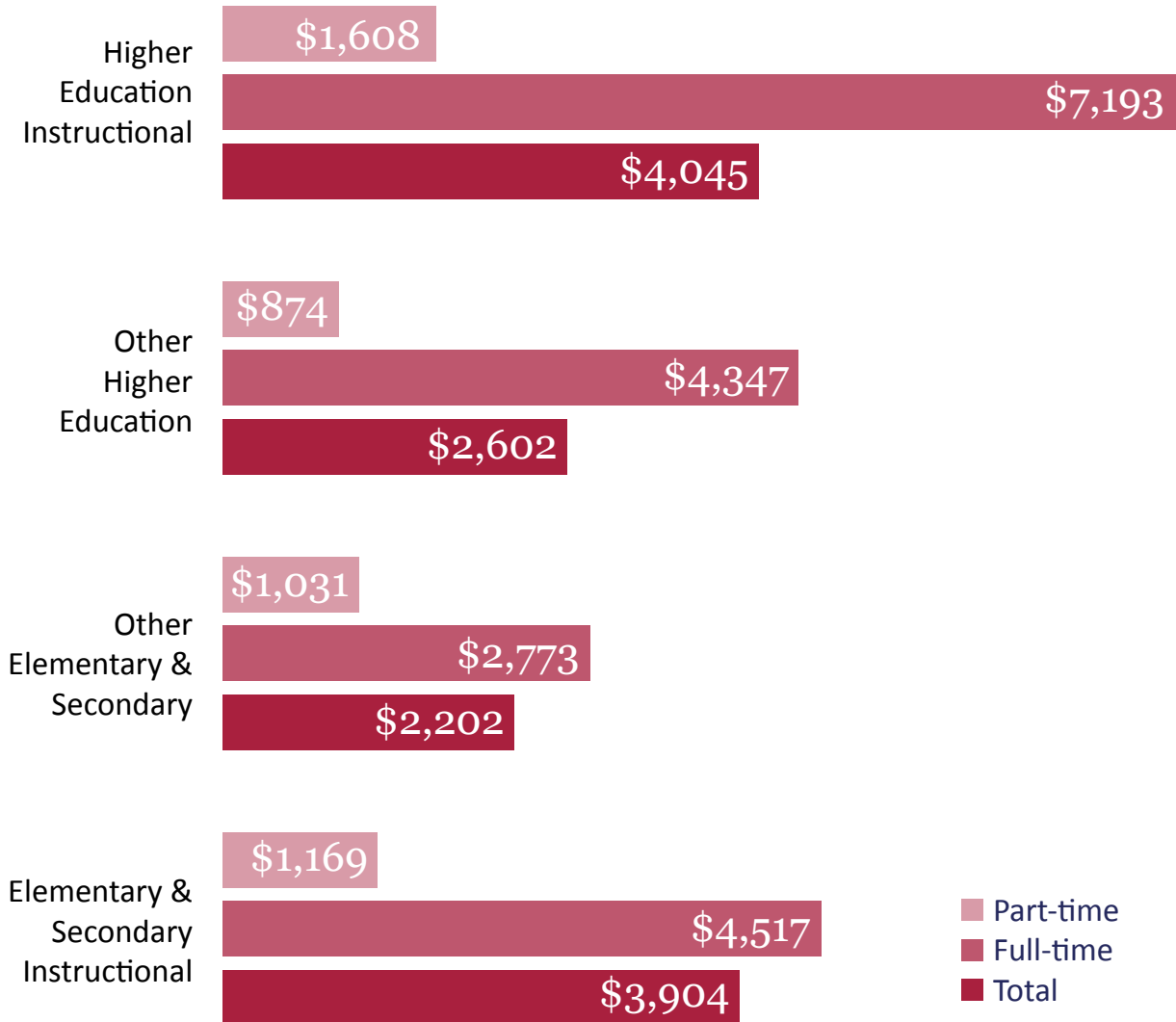


Education services account for 57% of total state and local government employees.

Education Employees: 11,103,272

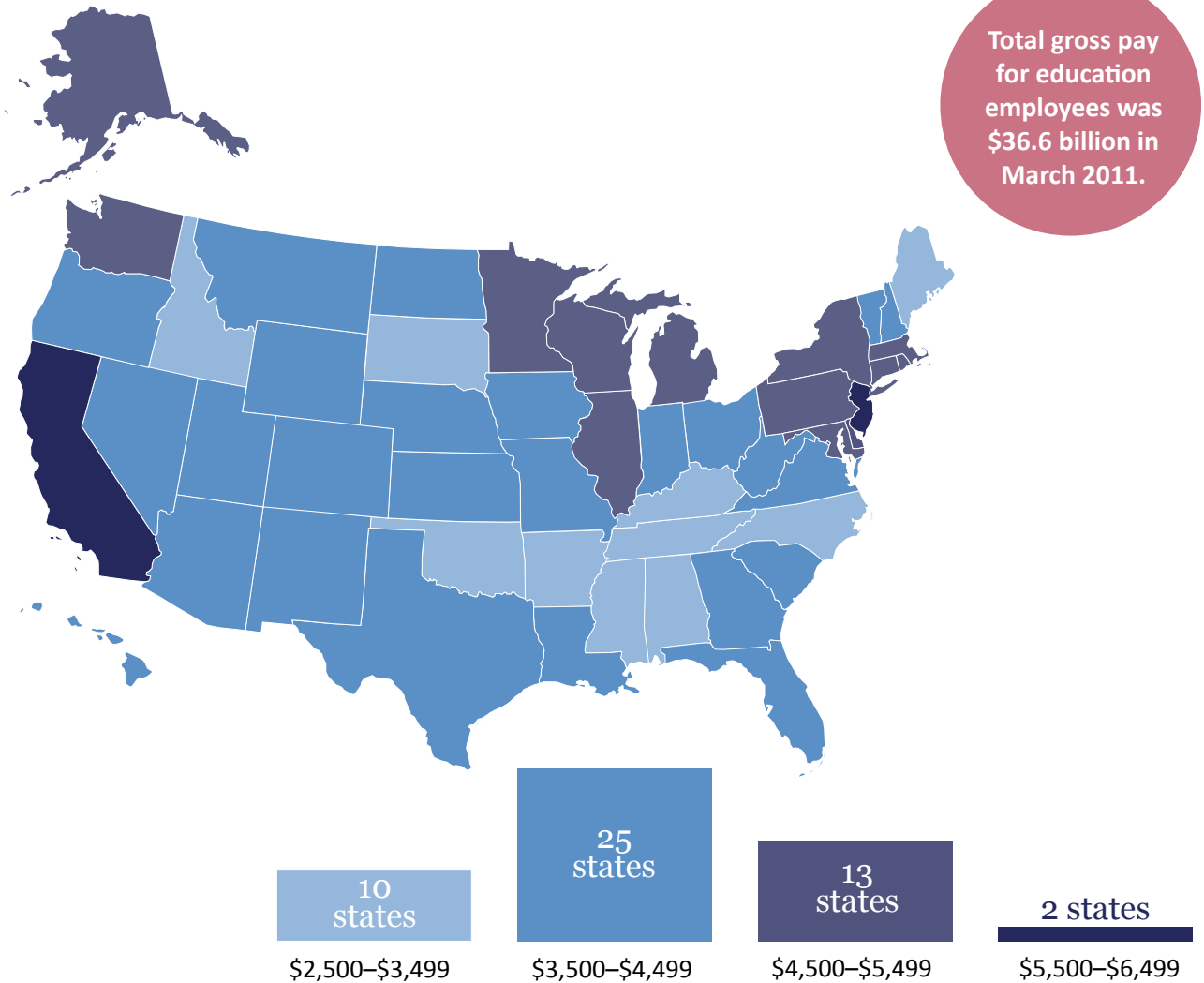


Average Monthly Pay for Education Employees by Job and Work Status



How much are education employees paid?

The monthly pay for a full-time education employee averaged \$4,278 in March 2011, up from \$3,268 in March 2001.
