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Trends in the Well-Being of Iowa Children

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he latest annually produced Iowa Kids Count data book, Iowa Kids Count 2009: Trends in the Well-Being of Iowa Children, provides data on 18 different indicators of child and family wellbeing at the United States, Iowa, substate and county level. The 18 indicators presented in the data book contain an expanse of data from economic, welfare, education and health areas including child poverty, child abuse and neglect, high school graduation and low birthweight. These indicators provide an extensive crosssection of data and information for policy makers, researchers, educators and others to use.

While 2009 data were available for the majority of indicators, Iowa Kids Count had to rely on older data for a few of the indicators. The child poverty data provided by the Census Bureau and the earned income tax credit data from the Internal Revenue Service have 2008 and 2007 as their most recent years of data, respectively. In addition, the Iowa Department of Public Health has instituted new methodologies for producing child immunization data and prenatal care data. Presently, 2008 data were the most recent available for child immunization, while prenatal care data have been collected in their present form since 2007 making comparisons to previous years inaccurate and unreliable.

In addition to providing data at the county, state and national levels, Iowa Kids Count also groups the counties in Iowa together by population size (see county maps on page five for further review and analysis). Counties whose largest city has a population of less than 5,000 people are in the rural category; counties whose largest city has a population of 5,000 – 49,999 are considered small urban; and counties with the largest city's population being 50,000 or more are in the metropolitan county category.

As in the past few years, Iowa Kids Count was unable to provide certain birth and mortality indicator data. In an effort to protect the confidentiality of individuals, the Iowa Department of Public Health does not make available administrative data that include incidences of three or less at the county level. Iowa Kids Count was able, however, to provide full data for the substate, state and national levels.

The Annie E. Casey Foundation annually produces and disseminates a National Kids Count Data Book comparing the 50 states and the District of Columbia. In comparison to the other states, Iowa always has done quite well and, almost without exception, ranks among the top group of states annually.

At the same time, however, it is important to compare Iowa presently to where Iowa was a few years ago. Whenever possible, Iowa Kids Count has tried to use the year 2000 as its baseline year to show where Iowa has improved or deteriorated over the last decade. When the indicators presented this year are reviewed over this time span, unfortunately, the results are mixed. Of the 18 indicators included in this year's data heads.

this year's data book, 10 have shown slight or moderate improvement while the other eight have shown slight to significant deterioration at the state level primarily from 2000 to

2009. This reflects a slight improvement from the previous year's data book which showed a few more indicators deteriorating than improving during the 2000 to 2008 time period.

Two of the three economic indicators in this year's data book deteriorated while the other showed improvement. The percentage of individuals in the labor force but unemployed has more than doubled, increasing 130 percent from 2000 to 2009. In addition, the percentage of children who lived below the poverty level increased 32 percent from 2000 to 2008. The rate increases for both of these indicators should not come as a surprise considering the state of the economy the last few years. The one economic indicator which did experience improvement was the percentage of income tax filers who received an earned income tax credit, increasing 19 percent from 2000 to 2007.

Two of the three welfare indicators included in the data book, food assistance (nationally known as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or SNAP) and child abuse and neglect, deteriorated from 2000 to 2009. The percentage of individuals receiving financial assistance for food skyrocketed 140 percent during this time period while the rate of children confirmed to have been abused or neglected increased

35 percent. The economy not only has caused financial hardship for families, but has increased stress as well. The third welfare indicator, the

percentage of individuals receiving Family Investment Program (FIP) financial assistance, decreased 20 percent.

Only one of the three education indicators presented in this year's Iowa Kids Count data book improved while the other two worsened. Student test scores, which measures the percentage of students who are proficient in fourth grade reading and eighth grade math on the Iowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS), showed moderate improvement to 2009 with fourth grade reading improving seven percent and eighth grade math improving eight percent.

The percentage of students who were eligible for free or reduced-price lunches increased 29 percent from 2000 to 2009, with more than one-third of the students in Iowa presently eligible for free or reduced-price lunches. High school graduation, or students entering ninth

grade who graduate with their class four years later, showed a slight decrease of two percent from 2000 to 2009.

Seven of the nine health indicators presented in this year's data book have shown improvement with the other two showing deterioration. All three of the mortality indicators, infant mortality (before age one), child deaths (age 1-14) and teen deaths (age 15-19), have seen

significant rate decreases from 2000 to 2009 with infant mortality decreasing 28 percent, child deaths 16 percent and teen deaths 12 percent during this time period.

Three of the four birth-related indicators in the health area have shown improvement to 2009. Teen unmarried births and teen births experienced rate decreases of seven percent and six percent, respectively, from 2000 to 2009 while the percentage of mothers receiving prenatal care (health care during their first trimester of pregnancy) increased four percent from 2007 to 2009. The baseline year of 2007 is reflective of the new methodology used to produce the prenatal care data. The lone birth-related indicator deteriorating was the percentage of babies born at low birthweight (less than 5.5 pounds) which increased 10 percent from 2000 to 2009.

The two other indicators in the health area are children receiving WIC (Women, Infants and Children Program) services, which showed a rate increase

of two percent and child immunization (children fully immunized at age 24 months), which showed a decrease of 15 percent.

As mentioned earlier in this report, Iowa does very well on these child and family well-being indicators in comparison to other states and the United States as a whole. The health indicators, for the most part, have shown improvement

since 2000.
However, some of the indicators, particularly the economic-related indicators and child abuse and neglect, continue to slip, showing deterioration or stagnation instead

of improvement. Also noteworthy is the fact that some of the economic-related indicators have shown a very rapid and significant deterioration the past few years.

It is likely that 2011 will be a very difficult year financially for the state of Iowa with regard to child and family well-being, among other areas. It will be the third consecutive year that resources for improvements to and expansions of child and family programs and services, if available at all, most likely will be small. It is most important that data like the 18 child and family indicators presented in this year's Iowa Kids Count data book are made available for citizens and decision makers to review to ensure the wellbeing of children and families is kept in the forefront.


