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Iowa Kids Count 2010

The most recent Iowa Kids Count data book, *Iowa Kids Count 2010: Trends in the Well-Being of Iowa Children*, provides data on 20 different indicators of child and family well-being at the United States, Iowa, substate and county level. The annually produced data book presents health, education, welfare and economic data including infant mortality, reading and mathematics proficiency, food assistance and child poverty. These indicators provide an extensive cross-section of data and information for policy makers, researchers, educators and others to use.

While 2010 data were available for the majority of indicators, Iowa Kids Count had to rely on older data for a few of the indicators. The child poverty data provided by the Census Bureau and the earned income tax credit data from the Internal Revenue Service have 2009 and 2008 as their most recent years of data, respectively. In addition, an aggregate of the Census Bureau's preschool data from 2005-2009 was necessary to provide data for all 99 counties for this indicator.

In addition to providing data at the county, state and national levels, Iowa Kids Count also groups the counties in Iowa together by population size (see county maps on page five for further review and analysis). Counties whose

largest city has a population of less than 5,000 people are in the rural category; counties whose largest city has a population of 5,000 – 49,999 are considered small urban; and counties with the largest city's population being 50,000 or more are in the metropolitan county category.

As in the past few years, Iowa Kids Count was unable to provide certain birth and mortality indicator data. In an effort to protect the confidentiality of individuals, the Iowa Department of Public Health does not make available administrative data that include incidences of three or less at the county level. Iowa Kids Count was able, however, to provide full data for the substate, state and national levels.

The Annie E. Casey Foundation annually produces and disseminates a National Kids Count Data Book comparing the 50 states and the District of Columbia. In comparison to the other states, Iowa always has done quite well and, almost without exception, ranks among the top group of states annually.

It is important, however, to compare where Iowa is presently to where Iowa was a decade ago. Whenever possible, Iowa Kids Count has tried to use the year 2000 as its baseline year to show

where Iowa has improved or deteriorated over the last ten years. When the indicators presented this year are reviewed over this time span, unfortunately, the results are mixed. Of the 20 indicators included in this year's data book, 10 have shown slight or moderate improvement while eight have shown slight to significant deterioration at the state level primarily from 2000 to 2010. The remaining two indicators produced insignificant change. This is very similar to the findings from the previous year's data book.

Five of the eight health indicators presented in this year's data book have shown improvement with two showing deterioration and one with no change. Two of the three mortality indicators, child deaths (age 1-14) and infant mortality (before age one), have seen significant rate decreases from 2000 to 2010 with child deaths decreasing 38 percent and infant mortality decreasing 23 percent. The other mortality indicator, teen deaths (age 15-19), increased six percent during this time period.

Three of the four birth-related indicators in the health area have shown improvement to 2010. Both teen births and teen unmarried births experienced rate decreases of approximately 16 percent from 2000 to 2010 while the percentage of mothers receiving prenatal

care (health care during their first trimester of pregnancy) increased six percent from 2007 to 2010. The baseline year of 2007 is reflective of the new methodology used to produce the prenatal care data. The lone birth-related indicator deteriorating was the percentage of babies born at low birthweight (less than 5.5 pounds) which increased 14 percent from 2000 to 2010. The remaining indicator in the health area, children receiving WIC (Women, Infants and Children Program) services, remained virtually unchanged from 2003 to 2010.

When indicators presented this year are reviewed over this time span (2000 – 2010), unfortunately, the results are mixed.

In the education area, three of the five indicators presented in this year's Iowa Kids Count data book improved while one worsened and one remained unchanged. Student tests scores, which measures the percentage of students who are proficient in fourth grade reading and eighth grade mathematics on the Iowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS), showed improvement to 2010 with fourth grade reading improving three percent and eighth grade mathematics improving seven percent. The third indicator showing improvement was the percentage of three and four year-olds enrolled in preschool, which increased five percent.

The percentage of students who were eligible for free or reduced-price lunches increased 39 percent from 2000 to 2010,

with more than one-third of the students in Iowa presently eligible for free or reduced-price lunches. High school graduation, or students entering ninth grade who graduate with their class four years later, showed an increase of less than one percent from 2000 to 2010.

Three of the four welfare indicators included in the data book deteriorated from 2000 to 2010. Food assistance (nationally known as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or SNAP) increased 168 percent during this time period while child abuse and neglect, and single parent families increased 34 percent and 23 percent, respectively. The economy not only has caused financial hardship for families, but has increased stress as well. The fourth welfare indicator, the percentage of individuals receiving Family Investment Program (FIP) financial assistance, decreased 16 percent.

Two of the three economic indicators in this year's data book deteriorated while the other showed improvement. The percentage of individuals in the labor force but unemployed has more than doubled, increasing 137 percent from 2000 to 2010. In addition, the percentage of children who lived below the poverty level increased 45 percent from 2000 to 2009. The rate increases

for both of these indicators was to be expected considering the state of the economy the last few years. The one economic indicator which did experience improvement was the percentage of income tax filers who received an earned income tax credit, increasing 30 percent from 2000 to 2008.

As annually reported in the National Kids Count Data Book, Iowa does very well on these child and family well-being indicators in comparison to other states and the United States as a whole. At the state level, the health and education indicators, for the most part, have shown improvement since 2000. However, other indicators, particularly the economic-related indicators, child abuse and neglect, and single parent families, continue to deteriorate or stagnate. The rapid and significant deterioration of some of the economic-related indicators the past few years is of utmost concern for the continued well-being of children and families in Iowa. Because of this, it is most important that the data contained in this year's Iowa Kids Count data book are made available for decision makers and others to review as policies concerning the well-being of children and families are discussed.






